In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Arthur Blake, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

HEREAS by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor dated the 14th day of December, 1906, a police force was established under section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," in the town of Wellawatta and Dehiwala, and the limits of the said town were defined by the said Proclamation:

And whereas by section 34 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that, for the purpose of creating a fund from which the expenses of the police force payable by each town not created a Municipality are to be defrayed, a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, on the 30th day of June, on the 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year, for the quarters ending on the said days respectively, on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town to an amount equal to such percentage on the bona fide annual value of

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such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements as the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of 25 cents a quarter, in all which excepted cases 25 cents a quarter shall be assessed and payable. Provided that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in such town except as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent aforesaid, from time to time to determine and appoint. Provided further, that buildings appropriated to religious worship and such as are placed in charge of military sentries shall be exempted from the payment of such tax:

And whereas the town of Wellawatta and Dehiwala has not been created a Municipality, and whereas the Governor, with advice and consent aforesaid, has determined and appointed that the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in the said town of Wellawatta and Dehiwala is Rs. 15,241.50:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent aforesaid, do hereby appoint that for the purposes aforesaid the tax payable on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever in the town of Wellawatta and Dehiwala aforesaid, within the limits specified in the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation dated 14th December, 1906, shall, save in such excepted cases as aforesaid and in the case of such buildings which are exempted from the payment of such tax as aforesaid, from and after the First day of January, 1907, be at the rate of 5 per cent. on the bona fide value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements aforesaid.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor dated the 14th day of December, 1906, a police force was established under section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," in the town of Sedawatta, and the limits of the said town were defined by the said Proclamation:

And whereas by section 34 of the said Ordinance it is enacted that, for the purpose of creating a fund from which the expenses of the police force payable by each town not created a Municipality are to be defrayed, a tax shall be payable on the 31st day of March, on the 30th day of June, on the 30th day of September, and on the 31st day of December in every year, for the quarters ending on the said days respectively, on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever within every such town to an amount equal to such percentage on the bona fide annual value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements as the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint, except in cases where such amount shall fall below the sum of 25 cents a quarter, in all which excepted cases 25 cents a quarter shall be assessed and payable. Provided that such tax shall not in the aggregate exceed the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in such town except as aforesaid, and which sum it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent aforesaid, from time to time to determine and appoint. Provided further, that buildings appropriated to religious worship and such as are placed in charge of military sentries shall be exempted from the payment of such tax:

And whereas the town of Sedawatta has not been created a Municipality, and whereas the Governor, with advice and consent aforesaid, has determined and appointed that the sum necessary for the maintenance of the force in the said town of Sedawatta is Rs. 11,017.50:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent aforesaid, do hereby appoint that for the purposes aforesaid the tax payable on all houses and buildings of every description and on all lands and tenements whatsoever in the town of Sedawatta aforesaid, within the limits specified in the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation dated 14th December, 1906, shall, save in such excepted cases as aforesaid and in the case of such buildings which are exempted from the payment of such tax as aforesaid, from and after the First day of January, 1907, be at the rate of 5 per cent. on the bona fide value of such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements aforesaid.

HEREAS by section 4 (a) of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 1 of Ordinance No. 14 of 1893, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation from time to time to be issued by him for that purpose, to exempt from the operation of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889." any chief headman's division or part thereof which shall have been brought within the operation of the said first-mentioned Ordinance under section 4:

And whereas by the joint operation of two Proclamations, dated respectively the Twenty-seventh day of June, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-nine, and the Ninth day of January, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-five, and of section 53 of the first-mentioned Ordinance, the divisions of the chief headmen of Paranakuru korale and Galboda and Kinigoda korales respectively, in the District of Kegalla, Province of Sabaragamuwa, were brought within the operation of the said Ordinance, and it is expedient to exempt from the operation of the said Ordinance certain portions of the said divisions:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the operation of the said Ordinance those portions of the said divisions of the chief headmen of the Paranakuru korale and Galboda and Kinigoda korales that lie within the limits of the Local Board of the town of Kegalla, as the same are set forth in the schedule hereto.

And We do in all other respects confirm the said two Proclamations of the 27th June, 1879, and the 9th January, 1875.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 15th December, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 83. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 25.0,* as against 29.2 in the preceding week and 27.3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 176. The death-rate per 1,000 was 53.0,* as against 46.3 in the previous week and 41.7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 49 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 32 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 14 from different kinds of fever; and 15 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 176 total deaths, 41 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 41 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
