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DRAFT ORDINANCE.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," in certain particulars: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Village Communities' Amendment Ordinance, 1906." It shall be construed and read as one with "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," hereinafter referred to as the "principal Ordinance."

To be read with Ordinance No. 24 of 1889.

The definition of petty assaults in section 28 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889 amended.

2 Section 28 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting under the heading "Criminal" for sub-clause (1) commencing with the words "petty assaults" and ending with the words "two weeks" at the end of the said sub-clause the following sub-clause:

- (1) Any of the following offences; that is to say:
- (a) Voluntarily causing hurt as defined by section 312 of the Ceylon Penal Code;
- (b) The use of criminal force as defined by section 341 of the Ceylon Penal Code;
- (c) Assault as defined by section 342 of the Ceylon Penal Code—

whenever the same is of such a nature that it may be adequately punished by no higher punishment than a fine of twenty rupees, or rigorous imprisonment for two weeks.
