MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of the Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Wednesday, September 12, 1906, at 3 p.m.

Present :—Mr. B. Horsburgh, Acting Chairmnn ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene ; Mr. M. L. M. Zainu Deen ; Dr. C. W. Van Geyzel ; Dr. W. H. de Silva ; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam ; Mr. M. F. Khan ; Mr. W. Shakspeare ; Mr. L. B. Fernando ; Mr. A. Fairlie ; Mr. G. H. Alston ; and Dr. C. T. Griffin.

This meeting was convened by the Chairman under section 91 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 by notice dated 6th September, 1906, for the following purpose :—To consider the truth or otherwise of the grievances complained of by the cart-drivers of single and double bullock carts with a view to taking such precaution or measures as may be necessary for the prevention of any abuse or misuse of the by-law prohibiting cart-drivers from sitting in carts driven by them, and the protection of carters against any unnecessary hardship, and that for that purpose Government be asked to defer the proclamation and enforcement of the by-law referred to.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved that the Council do go into Committee.
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

(Council in Committee.)

Mr. Chas. Perera read a report signed by the Committee appointed at a meeting of cart owners and others interested in carts held at "Brodie House" on the 7th instant.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved that the by-law relating to cart drivers be rescinded.
Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.

Mr. G. H. Alston moved as an amendment that no decision be arrived at until the Council receives the report of the Committee appointed by His Excellency the Governor to consider the complaints of extortion by the Police.

Mr. W. Shakspeare seconded.

Dr. C. T. Griffin moved as a further amendment that this Council request the Chairman to take whatever steps may be recommended by the Council's Lawyers to postpone the operation of the by-law in question until the report of the Commission appointed by His Excellency the Governor on Police extortion be received and considered by this Council.

Mr. W. Shakspeare seconded.

With the permission of the Council the original motion and the amendment were withdrawn in favour of the further amendment.

Mr. H. A. Jayawardene thereupon moved as an amendment that the by-law be referred to the Standing Committee on Law with Messrs. A. Fairlie and W. Shakspeare to consider and report upon it, and that the Chairman be requested not to enforce the by-law till the report of the Committee is received.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Thursday, September 13, 1906.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 7, 1906.

Present :—Mr. B. Horsburgh, Acting Chairman; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. M. L. M. Zainu Deen; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. W. Shakspeare; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; and Dr. C. T. Griffin.

The Minutes of August 10, 1906, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of August 10, 1906, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. Tiruvilangam asked—What is the practice in vogue at present as to service of notices and orders required by section 188 of the Municipal Ordinance in connection with limewashing and cleansing of houses and buildings?

The Chairman replied that the procedure prescribed in section 269 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 had been followed as regards the service of notices.

2. In the absence of Mr. H. A. Jayawardene Mr. L. B. Fernando moved—That the motion standing in the name of Mr. Jayawardene be postponed to next Meeting of Council.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The report of the Committee appointed by the cart owners and others interested in carts at a Meeting held at "Brodie House" was brought before the Council by the Chairman and was laid on the table.

"The Municipal Council may, from time to time, by notification in the "Ceylon Government Gazette" and such newspapers as the Chairman may determine, prohibit motor traffic on any street within the Municipality either wholly or during such hours as the Municipal Council may think fit, and any person who after such prohibition shall drive any motor car, motor lorry, or motor cycle on such street or during such hours shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable to pay a fine not exceeding Rs. 50."

- (2) Letter from Colonial Secretary, No. 158 of July 2, 1906, suggesting that the ambulance carts should have rubber tyres to minimise the jolting which is dangerous to patients in a critical condition.
The Committee consider that in the circumstances in which the Council ambulance carts are used, it will be sufficient if one cart be fitted with rubber tyres, and they recommend that a vote of Rs. 125 be taken for that purpose.
- (3) Letter from Acting Medical Officer of Health, No. 434 of August 10, 1906, suggesting the employment of a man at Rs. 25 per mensem to work the steam disinfector and to supply him with six suits of clothing (three of khaki and three of drill) for his wear.

Resolved—That the standard suggested by Messrs. Bamber and Bruce be adopted, and that Government be asked to give the Council legal power to enforce it.

9 and 10. Mr. C. P. Dias moved—That these two items be postponed to next Meeting of Council, and that the connected papers and Mr. Chas. Perera's dissents be circulated.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

11. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of a Member for the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects in place of Major A. W. de Wilton resigned. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. L. B. Fernando, who was accordingly elected a Member of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

12. Papers re new road at head of Graving Dock, were laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

13. Auditor-General's further remark No. 556 on the Revenue accounts for December, 1904, for authority of Council to strike off as irrecoverable the rent of Grandpass market from July to December, 1904, at Rs. 550 per mensem, Rs. 3,800.

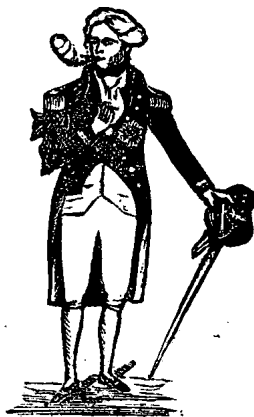
