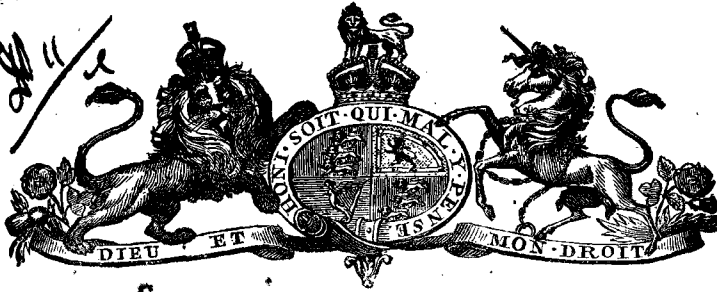

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 22 of "The Butchers' Ordinance, 1893," a building has been erected on the land adjoining the General Cemetery at Madampe, and situated within the limits of the town of Madampe, in the North-Western Province, for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, and whereas such building has been certified to the Governor by the proper authority, to wit, the Chairman of Board of Health of Madampe aforesaid, as sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house:

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 12th day of August, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,422 of the 14th August, 1896, the Crown lands situated in the village Ingiriya specified in the Schedule thereto was constituted a village forest, and whereas it is expedient to exclude from the said Proclamation certain portions of land, and to that extent to vary the said Proclamation :

SIR,—WITH reference to your reply to my Circular Despatch of February 19, 1906, respecting the adhesion of the Colony under your Government to the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation with Roumania of October 31, 1905, I have the honour to transmit for your information a copy of an Order of the King in Council of February 29, 1908, applying section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to Roumania for the recovery and apprehension of seamen deserters.

Present :

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country, His Majesty may by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order :

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Government of His Majesty the King of Roumania will give due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country :

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare that from and after the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the King of Roumania at any of the following ports or places within His Majesty's Dominions, that is to say, the British Islands, British Honduras, Ceylon, Gold Coast, Hong Kong, Leeward Islands, Malta, St. Helena, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Southern Nigeria, or Straits Settlements, shall be liable to be apprehended and conveyed on board their respective ships in accordance with the provisions of the section above-mentioned.

SIR,—WITH reference to my Circular Despatch of May 29, 1906, transmitting revised regulations for the entry of Naval Cadets, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have recently decided to require the parents or guardians of candidates for Naval Cadetships to give an undertaking that, in the event of their son, or ward, withdrawing or being withdrawn from the Royal Naval College or from the Navy before being confirmed as a Sub-Lieutenant, they will pay to the Admiralty, if demanded, the sum of £25 per term in respect of each term passed by him at the Royal Naval Colleges, Osborne and Dartmouth, from the date of his entry to the date of his withdrawal, as a contribution towards the balance of the cost of his training and maintenance not covered by the annual contribution of £75. Copies of a fly-leaf as to this requirement, which is now being issued with the regulations, are enclosed.

2. Copies of the revised Form A, which has been amended in consequence of the above rule, are also enclosed, and I have to request that they may be substituted for those now in use, a supply of which accompanied my predecessor's Circular Despatch of November 30, 1905.

With reference to paragraph 4 of the "Regulations for Entry of Naval Cadets," parents or guardians will be required to undertake, on the entry of a Cadet, that, in the event of his withdrawing or being withdrawn from the College or from the Navy before being confirmed as a Sub-Lieutenant, they will pay to the Admiralty, if demanded, the sum of £25 per term in respect of each term passed by

him at the R. N. Colleges, Osborne and Dartmouth, from the date of his entry to the date of his withdrawal, as a contribution towards the balance of the cost of his training and maintenance not covered by the annual payment of £75.

This undertaking does not apply to Cadets withdrawn at the request of the Admiralty under paragraphs 15-18 of the "Regulations for Entry of Naval Cadets."

NOTE 1.—The above undertaking to pay, on a Cadet's withdrawal, a supplementary contribution towards the cost of his education, does not apply in cases where Cadets are withdrawn at the request of the Admiralty under paras. 15-18 of the "Regulations for Entry of Naval Cadets."

NOTE 2.—It is important that any changes that take place in the addresses in columns 2 and 5 should be communicated at once.

NOTE 3.—The name and place of the school at which the candidate has been educated and also the name and address of the private tutor who may have prepared the candidate for this examination should be stated. In each case the dates of joining and leaving the school or tutor should be given.

AN examination for admission into the Post and Telegraph Department will be held at the Ferguson Memorial Hall, Colombo, on September 21, 1908, and the following day.

7. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part will be a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allotted for Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, respectively, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects mentioned in paragraph 6 of this notice. Attention is drawn to the addition of Sinhalese and Tamil to the subjects for examination. Candidates will be required to read and translate specimens of ordinary handwriting in these languages, and in selecting candidates consideration will be given to those who have obtained marks in the vernacular.

8. Candidates who have passed either the London Matriculation Examination or the Madras Matriculation or the Calcutta Entrance Examination in the First or Second Division, or the Senior or Junior Cambridge Local Examination in (1) English, (2) Euclid and Algebra, in addition to the compulsory subjects, will only be required to pass in Dictation and either Sinhalese or Tamil.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended April 4, 1908. is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 94. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26·9,* as against 22·3 in the preceding week and 27·7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 120. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38·7,† as against 41·6 in the previous week and 29·2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—1 person died from cholera; 18 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 15 from phthisis; 15 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 6 from enteric fever; and 15 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 29 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
