SIR,—WITH reference to your reply to my Circular Despatch of February 19, 1906, respecting the adhesion of the Colony under your Government to the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation with Roumania of October 31, 1905, I have the honour to transmit for your information a copy of an Order of the King in Council of February 29, 1908, applying section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to Roumania for the recovery and apprehension of seamen deserters.

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country, His Majesty may by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Government of His Majesty the King of Roumania will give due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from

British ships in that country:

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare that from and after the publication of this Order in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who desert from merchant ships belonging to subjects of His Majesty the King of Roumania at any of the following ports or places within His Majesty's Dominions, that is to say, the British Islands, British Honduras, Ceylon, Gold Coast, Hong Kong, Leeward Islands, Malta, St. Helena, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Southern Nigeria, or Straits Settlements, shall be liable to be apprehended and conveyed on board their respective ships in accordance with the provisions of the section above-mentioned.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of May 29, 1906, transmitting revised regulations for the entry of Naval Cadets, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have recently decided to require the parents or guardians of candidates for Naval Cadetships to give an undertaking that, in the event of their son, or ward, withdrawing or being withdrawn from the Royal Naval College or from the Navy before being confirmed as a Sub-Lieutenant, they will pay to the Admiralty, if demanded, the sum of £25 per term in respect of each term passed by him at the Royal Naval Colleges, Osborne and Dartmouth, from the date of his entry to the date of his withdrawal, as a contribution towards the balance of the cost of his training and maintenance not covered by the annual contribution of £75. Copies of a fly-leaf as to this requirement, which is now being issued with the regulations, are enclosed.

2. Copies of the revised Form A, which has been amended in consequence of the above rule, are also enclosed, and I have to request that they may be substituted for those now in use, a supply of which

accompanied my prodecessor's Circular Despatch of November 30, 1905.

With reference to paragraph 4 of the "Regulations for Entry of Naval Cadets," parents or guardians will be required to undertake, on the entry of a Cadet, that, in the event of his withdrawing or being withdrawn from the College or from the Navy before being confirmed as a Sub-Lieutenant, they will pay to the Admiralty, if demanded, the sum of £25 per term in respect of each term passed by

him at the R. N. Colleges, Osborne and Dartmouth, from the date of his entry to the date of his withdrawal, as a contribution towards the balance of the cost of his training and maintenance not covered by the annual payment of £75.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended April 4, 1908. is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 94. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.9,* as against 22.3 in the preceding week and 27.7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 120. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.7,† as against 41.6 in the previous week and 29.2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—1 person died from cholera; 18 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 15 from phthisis; 15 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 6 from enteric fever; and 15 from infantile convulsions

Infantile deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 29 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
