HEREAS it is expedient to alter the limits of the divisions of Kandy and Nuwara Eliya as defined in Schedule II. of Ordinance No. 24 of 1901, intituled "An Ordinance to amend The Courts Ordinance, 1889'":

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Also by section.

4 of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, and after consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby alter the limits of the aforesaid divisions by substituting therefor the limits set out in the Schedules I. and II. hereto.

SCHEDULE I. Kandy.

The Medapalata and Gangapalata korales of the revenue division of Udunuwara, the revenue divisions of Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Harispattu, so much of the Pallegampaha korale of the division of Lower Dumbara as comprises the villages of Kahalla, Mahagama Megodagama, and Mahagama Egodagama, with so much of the village of Polgolla of the same korale as lies between the road from Katugastota to Madawela and the Mahaweli-ganga, as well as that portion of the Udagampaha korale of the said revenue division of Lower Dumbara as is comprised within the following boundaries:—

North-west: by the road from Katugastota to Madawala;
North and North-east: by the road from Madawala to Upper Rajawela;
East: by road from Upper Rajawela to Rajawela ferry; and
South, South-west, and West: by the Mahaweli-ganga and the Maha-oya.

The revenue division of Pata Hewaheta and the villages Hindagala, Payingamuwa, and Kalugamuwa in the revenue division of Udapalata, the Vedehette estate, the Nilambe estate, and all other estates in the said division of Udapalata lying north of the Nilambe-oya between Nilambe and Peradeniya.

SCHEDULE II. Nuwara Eliya:

The revenue divisions of Uda Bulatgama, Uda Hewaheta, Walapane, Kotmale, and those parts of Udapalata and Yatipalata of the division of Udukinda which are contained within the boundaries set out below:—

South-west and South.—Maha Eliya ridge between Calsay and Kelly Hill estates, the eastern boundary of Kelly Hill to its junction with the Dombagastalawa-oya, the Dombagastalawa-oya to the Railway Gorge, thence along the Sudugala ridge and Totapola ridge, thence following the Province of Uva boundary as far as the head of Nonpareil Valley, thence to the trigonometrical station called Horton Plains No. 1, and thence closely following the Bilihul-oya minor road, crossing it at a point half mile below Land's End No. 2, continuing thence along the southern edge to the Maha Eliya Plateau to a point on the ridge where it joins the Central Province boundary between Galagama and Bogawantalawa, two miles south-east of Kingalpotta Peak.

East.—From Totupola ridge following the Province boundary to the Narabutgala trigonometrical station, thence a straight line to the Idampolakota trigonometrical station, and a straight line from thence to the 26th milepost on the road from Badulla to Nuwara Eliya.

North-east and East.—The Nuwara Eliya to Badulla road to the boundary of the Nuwara Eliya revenue district, thence along this boundary to the eastern boundary of Walapane.

THE following by-laws framed by the Local Board of Ratnapura, under section 38 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1899, and confirmed by HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

By-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. In the town of Ratnapura (which has been proclaimed under section 31 of the Births and Deaths Ordinance, No. I of 1895) no dead body shall be buried, cremated, or otherwise disposed of, except in a cemetery or burial ground duly established or registered under the provisions of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899.
- 2. No dead body shall be removed outside the town for burial, cremation, or other disposal in any place other than a cemetery or burial ground duly established or registered, except with the written permission of the Chairman of the Local Board, or in his absence of the Assistant Colonial Surgeon.
- 3. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Local Board to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.
- 4. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial or cremation ground is made shall be held to be the keeper of that ground, and to be responsible for any breach of regulations.
- 5. In the event of the death or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected, except on the special license of the Chairman of the Local Board, or in his absence of the Secretary or of the Sanitary Officer of the Board.
- 6. No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial or cremation ground.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial or cremation ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is a keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Local Board, and within

twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the Local Board Office and to the Office of the Registrar of Deaths.

- 8. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Local Board, the Inspector-General of Police, the Registrar-General, or any person authorized in writing by any one of them for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and to have access to all books and documents thereto.
- 9. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Local Board.
- 10. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth nor less than three feet distant from the nearest grave.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 39 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to confirm the by-law hereunder made under the provisions of sub-section (3) of section 38 of the said Ordinance by the "proper authority," to wit, the Government Agent of the North-Central Province.

By-LAW REFERRED TO.

Burial grounds within the limits specified in Schedule I. hereto shall be registered in a register to be kept for the purpose by the Chairman of the Village Committee elected in accordance with the provisions of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," for the subdivisions specified in Schedule II. hereto.

SCHEDULE I.—LIMITS.

- 1. Nuwaragam korale: bounded on the north by Northern Province and Wilachchiya korale; east by Kende, Kanadara, and Ulagalla korales; south by Eppawala korale; west by Wilachchiya korale.
- 2. Kende korale: bounded on the north by Kadawat and Kunchuttu korales; east by Kalpe, Uddiyankulama, and Kanadara korales; south by Kanadara korale; west by Nuwaragam korale.
- 3. Kadawat korale: bounded on the north by Northern Province and Kunchuttu korale; east by Kunchuttu and Kende korales; south by Kende korale; west by Northern Province and Kende korale.
- 4. Kanadara korale: bounded on the north by Kende korale; east by Uddiyan-kulama korale; south by Uddiyankulama, Ulagalla, and Nuwaragam korales; west by Nuwaragam korale.
- 5. Eppawala korale: bounded on the north by Wilachchiya and Nuwaragam korales; east by Ulagalla and Kalagam korales; south by North-Western Province and Negampaha korale; west by North-Western Province.
- 6. Wilachchiya korale: bounded on the north by Northern Province; east by Nuwaragam and Eppawala korales; south by Eppawala korale and North-Western Province; west by North-Western Province.
- 7. Ulagalla korale: bounded on the north by Kanadara korale; east by Uddiyan-kulama and Matambuwa korales; south by Kalagam and Maminiya korales; west by Nuwaragam and Eppawala korales.
- 8. Uddiyankulama korale: bounded on the north by Kalpe and Mahapotana korales; east by Sinhala pattu; south by Matambuwa and Ulagalla korales; west by Ulagalla and Kanadara korales.
- 9. Kunchuttu korale: bounded on the north by Northern and Eastern Provinces east by Eastern Province and Mahapotana korale; south by Kalpe, Kende, and Kadawat korales; west by Kadawat korale and Northern Province.
- 10. Mahapotana korale: bounded on the north by Kunchuttu korale and Eastern Province; east by Eastern Province; south by Sinhala pattu and Uddiyankulama korale; west by Kalpe and Kunchuttu korales.

- 11. Matambuwa korale: bounded on the north by Uddiyankulama korale; east by Sinhalapattu; south by Central Province; west by Kalagam, Maminiya, Ulagalla, and Uddiyankulama korales.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended April 11, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 109. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.6.* as against 26.9 in the preceding week and 20.1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 129. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 41.6,† as against 38.7 in the previous week and 28.9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 19 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 13 from phthisis; 18 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 10 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions

Infantile deaths.—Of the 129 total deaths, 30 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
