By His Excellency Sir Henry Edward McCallum, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date April 7, 1904, made by his Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Sugar Convention Ordinance," 1903," it was ordered that from and after May 1, 1904, and subject to any such provision by Ordinance or Resolution of the Legislative Council as therein mentioned, all sugar from Denmark, Russia, and the Argentine Republic (not including molasses and sugar-sweetened products) should (except in transit) be prohibited to be imported or brought into Ceylon, and that in relation to the said Proclamation the regulations in the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation were to be deemed as made and prescribed:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 5 (1) of the said "The Sugar Convention Ordinance, 1903," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the date hereof, revoke the above-recited Proclamation of April 7, 1904.

#### SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

#### Section VII.

- (24) The Master Attendant, when licensing any boat under the Master Attendant's Ordinance, shall issue together with the license a metal plate showing the number and description of the boat mentioned in the license thereof and the year in which such license has been granted, and it shall be the duty of every tindal, owner, or other person in charge of a licensed boat to see that the plate so issued is fixed upon such boat in a conspicuous place and so kept during the whole period for which the license has been granted.
- (25) The owner, tindal, or other person in charge of a licensed boat shall not allow or suffer to remain fixed in any boat the plate issued with the license of the boat after such license shall cease to be in force.
- (26) A plate issued with the license of a boat shall be used by and for that particular boat only, and no owner, tindal, or other person in charge of a boat shall fix or use or suffer to be fixed or used a plate which has not been issued for such boat by the Master Attendant.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- (1) A registration fee of twenty-five cents per annum shall be paid upon each dog kept within the town limits.
- (2) Such registration fee shall be due on and after July 1, and shall be paid in advance before August 1 in each year.
- (3) To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee, the occupier of every house within the town shall, on or before June 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Government Agent to demand the same a list in the form in schedule annexed of dog or dogs kept in such house and the names of the owners thereof.
- (4) On payment of the registration fee on any dog, the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.
- (5) Any dog found in any street, thoroughfare, or public place without a collar duly stamped by the proper authority or by any Local Board or Municipality within the Island, may be seized by any officer or other person specially authorized in that behalf by the proper authority, and may, if unclaimed, or if claimed, and a sum of 25 cents, together with a charge of 5 cents per diem for every day during which such dog shall be under seizure, be not forthwith paid by the claimant, be destroyed after the expiration of forty-eight hours after such seizure.
- (6) Every inhabitant within the town limits becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3 shall furnish the Government Agent or other person authorized by the Government Agent with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner, of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.

# VITAL STATISTICS.

#### COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended May 23, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 91. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.4,\* as against

24.6 in the preceding week and 18.0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 106, including 2 deaths of town residents who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34 2,† as against 37 4 in the previous week and 31 0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—1 person died from cholera, 22 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 9 from phthisis; 16 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 4 from different kinds of fever; and 13 from infantile

convulsions.

Infantile dea'hs.—Of the 106 total deaths, 23 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

\* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
