Particulars.—The characters of the buoys marking outer shoal, South Banguey channel and the shoals extending north-eastward from Billean island, Mallawalle channel have been altered, and they are now as follows:—

1. Name.—Outer shoal.

Position.—From the buoy, the north-west point of 60 feet islet bears S. $43^{\circ} E.$, distant 5 miles, and the summit of Molleangan island N. $48^{\circ} E.$

Lat. $7^{\circ} 2\frac{1}{2}' N.$, long. $117^{\circ} 0\frac{1}{4}' E.$

Description.—Can-buoy, painted in red and white vertical stripes.

2. Name.—Billean dangers.
