#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 29, 1908, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated February 25, 1908.

Present: -The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; Mr. W. D. Gibbon; Mr. G. F. Soysa; Mr. C. A. Hamy; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. S. A. Owen.

- The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on January 25 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

Correspondence.—(1) Letter No. 3 of January 24, 1908, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, re

stamp duty on receipts.

Resolved-That it be pointed out to Government that the practice referred to has been as stated all along up to the present. and that there is no authority except long custom to justify it; that the parties who make the payments have been content with the receipts given them, and that the Municipal Council is not liliely to take objection to their being put in evidence in any court as proof of payment.

water-rate from 5 to 6 per cent.—Read.

- Draft lease of Roseneath and Amalgamated estates amended as required by resolution of Council at the previous meeting.

  Proposed by Mr. Wijegoonewardene, seconded by Mr. Owen, that the lease be adopted.—Carried.

7. Recommendation of Health Officer .- That cesspit privy in No. 904, Peradeniya road, be emptied of its contents and converted into a dry-earth closet.—Approved.

#### Health Officer's Report for January, 1908.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month. would call the attention of the scavenger to see that the gratings in the side drains are cleared daily.

Water supply.—Good. Vide attached analysis.

Drainage.—The drains have been kept clean and cleared.

Alleys.—The alleys of Kandy remain in much the same unsatisfactory condition as they have done for years. They have been kept as clean as such places could be.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.-Well kept.

Bakeries.—All fairly well kept.

Market.—Fairly well kept.

Cattle passed this month.—Cattle, 502; buffaloes, 169; sheep, 158; goats, 231. All good stuffs exposed for sale were examined by me and found good.

Slaughter-houses and exposing sheds.—Well kept.

Night soil depot.—Well kept.

Cooly lines. - All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health.-Good. Two cases of chickenpox, one of measles, and six cases of enteric fever were reported during the month. Of these, three are from Utumankanda, outside Municipal limits. All the houses were thoroughly disinfected, and every precaution taken to prevent any further spread of the disease.

#### Examination of a Sample of Drinking Water.

Source and possibility of contamination: from the main; apparently no possibility of contamination.

Chemical and Physical Examination: -

- Colour in 6 in. column: colourless. Turbidity: bright, clear.
- Odour: none.
- 3. Residue left on evaporation: virtually none; did not char on being subjected to strong heat.

Free ammonia: none, perceptible.

- Chlorine: under 2 grs. per gallon. Equivalent of common salt: about 3 grs. per gallon.
- 6. Nitrites: No indication of.
- Nitrates: No indication of.
- 8. Hardness: about 4 degrees.
- 9. Lead: none.
- Zine, iron, and copper: none. 10.
- Oxygen absorbed in 15 min. at 212° F.: about .05 grs. per gallon.

From the examination of the source of the water herein referred to, and the results obtained by analysis, I am of opinion that it is a pure water and well adapted for all domestic purposes.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

# Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 9, 1908, at 2 p.m.

Present:—Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena; Dr. E. Ludovici; Mr. F. E. Abeysundara; Mr. C. P. Hayley; Mr. F. J. de Vos; Mr. M. Makan Marcar; and Mr. R. A. Powell.

- 1. The minutes of the meeting held on February 8, 1908, were read (items 9 and 12 amended) and confirmed.
- 2. Mr. C. P. Hayley, with the leave of Council, mentioned that he had received a written reminder from the Secretary stating that he had been absent from two consecutive General Meetings of the Council, held on December 14, 1907, and February 8, 1908, respectively. He had attended an advertised meeting on January 11, 1908, which was not held owing to want of a quorum. He therefore submitted that he was not absent from two consecutive meetings of the Council, and wished the matter to be decided.

The Council having considered the question, resolved that a Member attending a meeting called in terms of section 89 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, which was not held owing to want of quorum as required by section 95, shall be deemed to have attended a meeting if the provision of section 96 of the said Ordinance were observed.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved that steps be taken to prevent the erection of fences of barbed wire on land adjoining a highway.

The Chairman seconded.

Mr. D. G. Goonawardena moved, as an amendment, that the matter be deferred for the next meeting.

Dr. E. Ludovici seconded.

The amendment on being put to the meeting was carried.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley asked: Whether refuse from hospitals, such as bandages and similar matter, is not destroyed in Colombo and other towns in Ceylon and elsewhere by incineration, and to propose that this method be adopted in Galle.

The question was amended, with the permission of Council, to read as follows:—That inquiries be made whether refuse from hospital, such as bandages and similar matter, is destroyed by fire; if not, how it is disposed of.

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

- 5. At this stage of the proceedings the Chairman, with the premission of Council, caused a ballot to be taken for the election of a member on the Standing Committee on Public Works in the room of Mr. L. M. Acland, who had left the Island.
  - Mr. R. A. Powell was unanimously elected.
  - 6. Submitted papers re erection of a drinking trough for animals.

Resolved—That the plan and site be approved of.

7. Submitted papers re building within 8 feet of the road at Ela-addarawatta.

Resolved—That when application is made for erection of a new building, if it is to replace an old building forming one of a row of buildings, permission may be granted; otherwise that the rule requiring buildings to be erected 8 feet from the side drain of the road should be enforced.

8. Submitted papers re additional land for night soil depot.

Resolved—That the matter be referred to a Special Committee composed of Messrs. C. P. Hayley, F. J. de Vos, and Dr. J. H. Ebell for report as to whethert he Ettiligoda site should be used; otherwise to fix on some other site.

9. Submitted papers re sale of Council's property at Boossa.

Resolved-That the sale be confirmed and that Government be asked for the necessary authority.
