MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

OF COLOMBO. MUNICIPALITY

Y virtue of the powers vested in me under rule 37, chapter VIII., of the by-laws enacted under section 4 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901, I, Edward Morrieson de Coucy Short, Chairman of the Municipal Council and Mayor of Colombo, do hereby prohibit persons from committing any of the following acts within the limits of the public grounds known as Price park, Victoria park, Campbell park, Havelock park, Gordon Gardens, Racquet Court, and the Municipal lands behind Slave Island market, Union place at Darley road, and Rifle street at Saunder's Court.

That is to say :-

- (1) Permitting the grazing of poultry or cattle without a license.
- (2) The selling or offering for sale of any goods whatsoever without a license from the Municipal Council.

- (3) Depositing rubbish of any description.

(4) Sleeping within the ground at night.
(5) Erecting any tent, shed, or other building or any fence or post without a license.

(6) Laying out cricket pitches or golf greens or otherwise appropriating any portion of the ground to the exclusion of other persons for the purpose of playing cricket, golf, or other games without a license.

Any person who shall commit a breach against the foregoing rules shall be liable, on prosecution by any Municipal or Police Officer, to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees (Rs. 20), and in case of a continuing breach or disregard to a further fine of ten rupees (Rs. 10) a day for each day such breach or disregard is continued.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, March 20, 1908.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 14, 1908.

Present:—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. C. A. Lovegrove; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. W. H. de Silva; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. W. Shakspeare; Mr. A. Fairlie; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; and Mr. Arthur Alvis.

With the permission of Council, the Chairman moved that this Council do place on record its sense of the great loss sustained by Mr. Peiris's resignation, of a seat which he has filled with so much credit to himself and benefit to the community for the last ten years, and its regret at the severance of so long and close a connection.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Minutes of February 14 having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of February 14, 1908, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. H. de Silva asked if any permits have been granted to the "Varietes Francais" and to Harmston's Circus to put up their tents at the Racquet Court; if any were granted, under what conditions and on whose responsibility?

The Chairman replied that the following permits have been granted:-

Harmston's Circus for a month from April 1 to 30, 1908.

Varietes Français from April 8 to 13, 1908, both days inclusive.

These permits have been issued on the same conditions which have held good for many years past, a copy of which is laid on the table. The question of responsibility does not appear to have been raised previously, and the Council has expressed no opinion thereon. It is desirable that it should be fully considered and settled.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council decide that Mr. Chas. Perera continue to be a Councillor, although he has failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded—Carried.

- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Shakspeare moved that the General Meeting of Council, usually held on the second Friday of the month, be changed to the third Friday.

 Mr. C. P. Dias seconded—Carried.
- 4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. H. de Silva presented a petition from some of the leading residents of Cinnamon Gardens and Bambalapitiya praying for the widening of Laurie's road, which was received by the Council.
- 5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. H. de Silva moved that immediate steps be taken to widen Laurie's road, Bambalapitiya.

Mr. A. Fairlie seconded.

By leave of Council, Dr. W. H. de Silva amended his motion as follows:—That in the opinion of this Council the question of widening Laurie's road, Bambalapitiya, is one demanding early consideration, and that the Works Committee be asked to report upon it at an early date.

Mr. A. Fairlie seconded-Carried.

- Papers re acquisition of land for the better protection of the Labugama reservoir reserve. Recommended.
- Papers re accident to Mr. Thompson, Assistant Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, whilst on duty, and payment of his hospital expenses.
 The Committee recommends that Mr. Thompson's hospital expenses be paid by the Council.
- 10. Papers re allowance to the officer for writing out boat licenses at Master Attendant's office. Recommended that a commission of 5 per cent. on the value of boat licenses issued be paid in recognition of the fact that the officer concerned has to work overtime in this connection.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 5, 1908.

- 2. Estimate for erection of a public latrine at Havelock park, Rs. 3,057. Approved on the lines suggested by Sir Allan Perry, Kt.
- Amended estimates for upkeep of Gordon Gardens and Galle Face esplanade, to transfer a sum of Rs. 130 99 from vote No. 167 to vote No. 166 of 1907, to meet the over-expenditure in the latter vote.
- Papers re acquisition of land for the better protection of the Labugama reservoir reserve. The Committee considers that the additional strip of land is desirable for the better protection of the reserve, and recommends acquisition.
- Papers re drains through private lands, as regards widening of Lascoreen street and Shoemakers' lane.
 - The Committee recommends that the scheme be proceeded with by fixing street lines in accordance with the plans submitted, and not by acquisition.
- 8. Papers re closing of Galle Face drive entirely to motor traffic. Recommended the entire closing of Galle Face drive to motor traffic.
- Extracts from Draft Ordinance on Ceylon Telegraphs re the construction of lines and the erection
 - The following Draft Resolution is recommended to the Council: "That this Council protests in the strongest manner against the passing into law of the provisions of the Draft Telegraph Ordinance, published in the Government Gazette of November 29, 1907. In the opinion of this Council the priority proposed to be given to the Telegraph System over all other measures designed for the benefit and convenience of the public is unreasonables, and the powers proposed to be given to the officers of the Telegraph Department will create dual control over the public streets, will infringe the rights of the public, and will defeat the purpose of the Municipal Ordinance. For these reasons the Council begs for a reconsideration of the Draft Ordinance and for such a readjustment of the powers proposed to be conferred by it as will secure to the Council the full control over the public streets intended to be conferred upon it by the Municipal Ordinance."
- 10. Draft Ordinance to prevent removal of sand, stones, &c., from seashore, and minute by Chair-
 - The Committee suggests that, within the limits of Colombo, His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council should be the authority for purposes of this Ordinance.
- Colombo Waterworks, schedule of materials required to cost about Rs. 6.700. Recommended on the presumption that the quantity proposed to be ordered is not greatly in excess of the year's requirements.

The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee to consider items 6 and 7 on the agenda. Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.

(Council in Committee.)

- The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 28, 1908, be adopted. Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded—Carried.
- The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 5, 1908, be adopted.

 The Chairman moved that Council do resume and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
- Report of the Special Committee reappointed on January 17, 1908, to consider the application of the Municipal Engineer for an increased Clerical Staff was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

9. Further report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the statement read to the Council by Mr. E. L. Mansergh, on January 17, 1908, as regards paragraph (j) of the report dated February 10, 1908, was printed and laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.—Carried.

- 10. Papers re Colombo Telephone System were brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
- The Chairman moved that in the opinion of this Council the procedure proposed to be adopted in paragraph 2 of Colonial Secretary's letter No. 27 of February 12 last is not consistent with the letter and spirit of the Municipal Ordinance, and that it is necessary in the public interests that the authority responsible for street works shall have the control over the location of posts for telephones and telegraphs.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Auditor's remark No. 14 on the accounts for May, 1907, for authority of Council to pass the refund of Rs. 46 96 being rent of gala closed for seven days in April, 1907, owing to cattle disease.
