VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended July 4, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.-The total births were 83. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.1,* as against 22.9 in the preceding week and 25.1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 118, including 2 deaths of town residents who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.1,† as against 38.7 in the previous week and 30.7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.-Two persons died of cholera (both being patients in the Lunatic Asylum), the last previous case of cholera in the city having been in May last. There were 14 deaths registered from enteric fever (of which 11 in Maradana hospitals), the largest number registered in any week. There was 1 death from smallpox, the patient being a Moor in Slave Island; 11 persons died of phthisis; 22 of bronchitis and pneumonia; 17 of diarrhœa and dysentery; and 9 of infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.-Of the 118 total deaths, 28 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
