WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Central Circuit, three times at least in each year at Kandy, and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, August 1, and on December 1 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Badulla, a place included within the said Central Circuit:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Badulla, in the said Central Circuit, on or about Monday, September 21, 1908.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twentieth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundered and Eight.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on August 4, 1908, at the Council Chamber, for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the year 1909:—

- (1) Western Province: Negombo District.
- (2) Northern Province: Jaffna District.
- (3) North-Central Province: Anuradhapura District.
- (4) Province of Uva: Badulla District.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the price that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above, both the name and number of the rent being inserted in the tender.

Tenders, properly sealed, may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Mr. Hugh Clifford, C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Controller of Revenue on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount, the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4:50 per gallon.

Hugh Clifford; Colonial Secretary. THE following rules made by the District Committee, Kegalla, under section 12 of "The Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, 1905," which have been approved by the Governor and the Executive Council, are published for general information.

RULES REFERRED TO.

- 1. The President of the District Committee or in his absence the President for the time being elected under rule 2 and one member shall form a quorum.
- 2. In the absence of the President at any meeting, one of the members present shall be elected as President for the occasion.
- 3. The Committee shall appoint one of their members as Honorary Secretary, and shall employ as many clerks and messengers as may be found necessary.
- 4. The Honorary Secretary shall enter in a book the business to be placed before each meeting, and shall record in another book the minutes of the proceedings of each meeting; and the minutes shall be read and confirmed from time to time at every subsequent meeting, the President signing such confirmation.
- 5. Every question coming before the meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. Whenever the votes of members present happen to be equal, the President shall, besides his vote as a member, have a casting vote.
- 6. The meetings of the District Committee shall be held on first Saturday of every alternate month at 3 P.M. at Kegalla Buddhist School or in any other place notified by the President.
- 7. The President shall have the power to convene a special meeting of the Committee at any time by giving the other members not less than forty-eight hours' notice thereof in writing, and it shall be his duty to convene such meeting if and whenever any two or more members by an application in writing request him to convene such meeting.
- 8. The President shall have three registers as per forms hereto annexed marked A, B, and C, showing lists of movable and immovable properties, statement of income and expenditure of each temple, and names of priests belonging to each temple.
- 9. Every charge or charges preferred in writing against any Buddhist priest by two or more Dayakayas of any temple shall be inquired into by the District Committee; and if it appears that the charge is true, the District Committee shall report the same to the Sangasabhawa of the Nikaya to which such priest belongs. If the Sangasabhawa shall not take any steps within a month from the date of such report, or within any extended time that shall be granted by the District Committee, the District Committee shall call upon such priest to show cause within a stated time why the trustee of the temple should not be ordered to withhold maintenance of such priest from temple funds. If the priest fails within such time to show sufficient cause, the District Committee shall order the trustee to refuse maintenance from temple funds.
- 10. Each temple shall contribute an amount proportionate to its income for defraying the expenses already incurred or to be incurred by the Committee in carrying out the provisions of the Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance.
- 11. Each trustee shall on or before March 31 in each year prepare and transmit to the District Committee :—
 - (a) Estimates showing the probable receipts of each temple within its jurisdiction for the ensuing year.
 - (b) Estimates of proposed disbursements for the next ensuing year.

The President of the District Committee likewise shall make yearly estimates of the proposed disbursements in his department, and submit them to the District Committee with the estimates of the trustees.

- 12. The District Committee shall carefully revise the estimates laid before them by the trustees, and shall assess and determine the amounts which each temple shall contribute. The President of the District Committee shall then return estimates to the respective trustees, who shall recover from the different temples the amount payable by each.
- 13. Trustees shall recover and remit to the District Committee all sums so assessed due by the different temples on or before June 30 in every year. The District Committee shall then remit, on application, to each of the trustees the amounts sanctioned in the estimates that have been received and passed.

- 14. The President of the District Committee shall deposit in a bank selected by the Committee all contributions from temples as well as all income derived from other sources, and shall make disbursements under the directions of the Committee. At every meeting of the Committee held under rule 6 the President shall submit a statement of receipts and expenditure, and produce his bank books and cheque books for inspection.
- 15. At the end of each financial year the trustees shall remit to the District Committee all surplus funds which they may have in their hands. The President shall deposit such moneys as a special fund, and shall, under the directions of the Committee, advance from time to time such amounts as trustees may actually require for the use and benefit of the different temples.
- 16. All trustees shall make full returns of all movable property and moneys in their hands within one month of the publication of these rules in the Government Gazette. Thenceforth they shall make quarterly returns to the District Committee.
- 17. No trustee shall on any pretext whatever sell or otherwise dispose of any movable property of any temple without first obtaining the sanction in writing of the District Committee. And in the case of such sanction being obtained, the sale shall be by public auction.
- 18. It shall be the duty of the President of the District Committee to prosecute trustees who may be found disobedient or neglectful of the duties imposed on them by law.
- 19. Every trustee shall within two months of the publication of these rules in the Government Gazette furnish full and correct lists of lands belonging to the different temples which were sold, mortgaged, or otherwise alienated before the passing of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889.
- 20. Every trustee who shall, with the permission of the District Committee, grant a lease of land belonging to any temple, shall forward a certified copy of such lease to the District Committee to be filed in their office.
- 21. No trustee shall grant any lease of temple land without the sanction in writing of the District Committee. And where such sanction has been obtained, it shall be the duty of the trustee to put up the right of possession for sale by public auction after one month's clear notice of the sale. The highest bidder at such sale shall be entitled to obtain a lease from the trustee, subject to the approval of the District Committee.
- 22. No trustee shall absent himself from the district in which he resides for any period exceeding seven days without the permission in writing of the District Committee.
- 23. The District Committee shall have power, whenever it seems to them necessary or expedient, to authorize one or more of their members to inspect and report upon the condition and management of any temple, and the expenses of such inspection shall be paid out of the funds of the particular temple concerned.
- 24. The District Committee shall have the power to inspect and examine all the books and movable property and moneys of any temple and the accounts and papers of any trustee by deputing one or more of their members for the purpose at any time and as often as the Committee deem such inspection necessary.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended July 18, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 67. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.4,* as against 22.6 in the preceding week and 24.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 131, including 5 deaths of town residents who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 42.3†, as against 42.6 in the previous week and 31.3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—Two persons died of cholera in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta, one being a patient in the Lunatic Asylum, Colombo (making the fourth death from cholera in that institution registered in about a fortnight), and the other a recent arrival from India. There were 10 deaths registered from enteric fever, against 12 in the preceding week (of which Kotahena claimed 4 deaths and Kollupitiya and Maradana each 3); 14 persons died of phthisis; 26 of bronchitis and pneumonia; 19 of diarrhœa and dysentery; and 8 of infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 131 total deaths, 32 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
