MINUTES BY THE GOVERNOR.

THE Governor having noticed that petitioners frequently address Government prematurely, *i.e.*, before they have first sought redress at the hands of the Head of the Department immediately concerned, has directed the publication of the rules set forth below. His Excellency wishes it to be understood that the rules are not intended in any way to interfere with that right of appeal to His Majesty's representative which is open to all His Majesty's subjects, but that they have been framed on the general principle that application to the Governor is to be in all cases the means of redress, which, while open to all, is the one that should be the last used, and that it is for petitioners to show, when they apply to the Governor, that they have exhausted all other constitutional means of obtaining satisfaction.

Rules referred to.

1. The Governor will not entertain any petition for promotion or any application to Government by a public servant, unless it is forwarded through the Head of the applicant's Department.
2. The Governor will not entertain any petition which is not legibly written. If the petition is not in the handwriting of the petitioner, it must bear the signature in legible characters of the person by whom it is written, in addition to the signature or mark of the petitioner. It must also contain the address of the petitioner and of the petition drawer.
3. When petitions are not in the handwriting of the petitioners, the petition drawer must append the following certificate:—

"I, A. B., Petition Drawer, do hereby certify that this petition has been read and explained by me to the petitioner herein named, who is personally known to me, and that the petitioner declared in my presence and hearing this day that the statements herein are true, and that he is prepared to substantiate them, and in my presence he affixed his mark to this petition this day."

If the petitioner is not personally known to the petition drawer, the words "who is personally known to me" may be omitted.

4. The Governor will not entertain a petition on any matter unless it shall appear that the petitioner has first applied to the Government Agent or the Head of the Department immediately concerned. The answer or orders of such Government Agent or Head of Department, if any shall have been given, must be annexed to the petition addressed to His Excellency. If no reply has been received within a reasonable time, a copy of the petition to the Government Agent or Head of Department must be annexed to the petition addressed to His Excellency.

5. Where the law prescribes a particular mode of obtaining redress—*e.g.*, by appeal to the Supreme Court, application to a minor court, or any other means—the Governor will not entertain a petition asking for redress at the hands of Government, unless such petition shall show on the face of it that the prescribed mode of seeking redress has first been tried unsuccessfully.

6. The Governor will not entertain any petition praying for relief from a judgment in a civil action or any order by a civil court in a case to which the Crown or a public officer is not a party.

7. *Exception (i).*—In all cases in which the law expressly provides a mode of application to the Governor or to the Governor in Executive Council, the above rules do not apply to the supersession of that mode of application.

8. *Exception (ii).*—The above rules do not apply to petitions for pardon by or on behalf of prisoners in jail under sentences of criminal courts.

9. Petitions or telegrams which merely invite attention to previous petitions presented within the preceding month will not be answered.

10. The Governor cannot entertain applications for employment. Such applications must be made to the Head of a Department where there is a vacancy, and it is for petitioners to ascertain where such vacancy exists.

11. The Governor cannot entertain petitions for charitable allowances; such applications are exclusively dealt with by the Government Agents, to whom all petitions of this nature should be addressed.

12. The above rules apply to all petitions addressed to Government, *i.e.*, to His Excellency the Governor or to the Colonial Secretary.

13. Petitions to the Legislative Council must be presented through a member of the Council.

14. Petitions to the Secretary of State must be submitted in triplicate.

P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo, and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, on March 20, on July 10, and on October 10, in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Chilaw, a place included within the said Western Circuit:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court; do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Chilaw, in the said Western Circuit, on or about Monday, August 31, 1908.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eight.

WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1880," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may for the purposes of the said Ordinance, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, group together estates into districts, and may in the same and in like manner from time to time amend such grouping, or abolish any district or create a new district or new districts:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated March 30, 1906, the several estates mentioned in the schedule thereto were grouped together into districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the grouping of the estates as in the said Proclamation mentioned and to group them in manner set forth in the first schedule hereto and to create a new district:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after July 10, 1908, substitute the first schedule hereto for the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation of March 30, 1906, and We do also create the new district set forth in the second schedule hereto.

Regulations referred to.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SUPERINTENDENTS OF ESTATES AND OF DISPENSERS IN CHARGE OF ESTATE DISPENSARIES.

AN estate or group of estates which maintains a Dispenser and a suitable building for a Dispensary will be allowed a certain amount of drugs free by Government. Government encourages the establishment of such Dispensaries in the hope that treatment being placed within easy reach of the labourer, he will avail himself of it at a much earlier period in his illness than he probably would of that at the Government Dispensary, which is, as a rule, at a considerable distance from him.

At the earlier period the illness would most probably yield to such ordinary treatment as the Estate Dispensers are qualified to give; this would tend to lessen the number requiring Hospital treatment, and eventually the Hospital mortality, but Estate Superintendents are reminded that the employment of a Dispenser does not free them from their obligations to their labourers under the Medical Aid Ordinance, No. 17 of 1880.

Estate Dispensers are not sufficiently trained, and are therefore not considered qualified to treat serious illness, and in all such cases the District Medical Officer should be sent for to see the patient in terms of section 22. Superintendents are requested to see this rule duly carried out.

2. Such a Dispensary will be known as an "Estate Dispensary," and the drugs supplied to it being for the exclusive use of the estate labourers must not be put to any other use whatever.

3. A list of the drugs which will be supplied free to Estate Dispensaries by the Government is noted in Appendix A.

4. These drugs will be issued only to a certain amount, calculated at the rate of 50 cents per annum for each resident labourer.

5. Requisitions for these drugs are to be forwarded to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals twice a year, only on such forms as will be supplied.

6. The half-yearly requisitions for medicines from Estates Dispensaries in the Central, North-Central, and Uva Provinces should be sent so as to reach the office of the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals on January 10 and July 10 each year; those in the Southern Province on February 10 and August 10; and those in the Western, North-Western, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces on March 10 and September 10.

7. The half-yearly requisitions will be complied with within a month of their receipt.

8. Should drugs be required in the interval, they should be applied for on the form which will be supplied for the purpose.

9. Intermediate requisitions referred to in paragraph 8 will be complied with, with as little delay as possible, provided the cost of the drugs will not exceed the amount allowed by Government.

10. All the columns in the half-yearly and intermediate requisition forms must be carefully and accurately filled in, and the "remaining" column should bear the exact date on which the requisition is made up, and must show the quantities of medicines actually in stock on that date.

11. All requisitions must be signed by the Superintendent, and a certificate according to Appendix B must be attached, otherwise they will not be entertained.

12. Drugs other than those specified in Appendix A (provided they be in stock at the Civil Medical Stores) will be issued on application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, but only on repayment of value.

13. On receipt of an application for drugs on payment, the applicant will first be informed of its cost, and the drugs will be issued without delay when cheque or postal or money order has been received.

14. All cheques or postal or money orders must be crossed, and made payable to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals.

15. Superintendents of scheduled estates can obtain from the Civil Medical Stores any drug on payment in the manner prescribed in paragraphs 12 and 13.

16. Medicines will not be compounded at the Civil Medical Stores, but such may be obtained from the District Hospitals and Dispensaries.

17. All applications for drugs should give full directions how the drugs are to be forwarded.

18. Surgical instruments and appliances, stationery, and equipment will not be supplied by Government.

19. Subject to the approval of the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals the appointment of a Dispenser to the charge of an Estate Dispensary, continued employment, leave of absence, and the appointment of a temporary substitute shall rest with the Superintendent, who will also pay his salary and supervise his work.

20. It is to be clearly understood that an Estate Dispensary and its Dispenser form no part of the Civil Medical Department or of Government service, and that no pension rights are attached to the office.

21. The Dispenser may collect for the Superintendent, to be forwarded to the District Medical Officer of the station, all reports of births and deaths on the estate under his charge immediately after they occur. These reports are not to be signed by the Dispenser or any other person on the estate, except by the Superintendent himself, or, in his absence, by the person acting for him. This is a duty imposed on the Superintendent by clause 20 (e) of Ordinance No. 17 of 1880.

22. The Superintendent may note on the death report whether the patient was attended by the Estate Dispenser; but the fact of his having been so attended does not free the Superintendent of his obligation to send for the District Medical Officer, in terms of clause 20 (d) of the Medical Ordinance. The attendance of the Estate Dispenser cannot be considered as fulfilling the requirements of the Medical Aid Ordinance in serious cases.

23. The Dispenser shall request the Superintendent of the estate to send for the Medical Officer of the District to see any serious case or cases for which he may require a higher opinion, or in which removal to the hospital might be injurious to the patient, and he shall do so in all cases of prolonged midwifery.

24. The Dispenser shall bring to the notice of the Superintendent the condition of the lines or their surroundings likely to injuriously effect the occupants, and suggest remedies.

25. The Dispenser shall submit monthly a return to the Colonial Surgeon of the Province of the diseases treated at the Estate Dispensary on the form which would be supplied him for the purpose.

26. The Dispenser shall keep a register of the patients treated by him, and a book in which he is to record all the prescriptions compounded by him.

27. Rules for the guidance of the Dispenser as to hours of attending the Dispensary and visiting lines on the estate will be drawn up by the Superintendent.

28. The supply of drugs to an Estate Dispensary will cease when an estate or group of estates will no longer maintain a Dispenser.

29. Whenever the District Medical Officer or assistant is sent for to see a case on any of the estates provided with a Dispensary, either the one or the other must attend in person. In no case is an unqualified assistant or Apothecary to be sent.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. All notices required to be published under the Village Communities' Ordinance shall be published by beat of tom-tom for a period of not less than eight days prior to the date referred to in such notice, and written notices may be affixed in conspicuous places in the village.
2. The works mentioned in the first sub-section of section 6 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889 shall be constructed and protected within the subdivision by the joint labour of the inhabitants of the subdivision and of the persons interested therein, and the work shall be allotted to those interested as hereinafter provided.
3. The construction and repair of schoolrooms for the education of the boys and girls, the construction, repair, and protection of Village Tribunal court-houses, the construction and maintenance within the subdivision of village paths not exceeding 12 feet in width, shall be performed by the joint labour of the inhabitants of the subdivision and of the persons interested therein, and the work shall be allotted to those interested as hereinafter provided.
4. The Committee of the subdivision shall frame a list for the subdivision of all the works under the second and third rules, distinguishing at their discretion between (a) those in which the whole subdivision is interested and (b) those in which part or parts only of the subdivision are interested; and this list shall be settled, altered, or amended at their discretion, and the decision of the Committee as set forth in such list shall be final on the question as to whether the whole subdivision or what part or parts of the subdivision is or are interested. Every male inhabitant between the ages of sixteen and sixty of the subdivision shall be liable to contribute towards the work specified in the list (b).
5. The Committee of the division shall decide the nature and extent of the work to be performed under the preceding rules, the time when such work shall be performed, and the number of days' labour that each person liable to contribute shall contribute towards it.
6. The headmen of each village shall prepare a list of names of all males residing within his village between the ages of sixteen and sixty, and shall order out labour by rotation. A list of such persons shall be prepared before February 1 in each year, and a copy of it shall be forwarded to the President.
7. If any person is unwilling to work, he can commute his labour by payment of 50 cents for each day.
8. Priests of all religions, immigrant coolies from India, beggars, and persons unable to work residing within the subdivision shall be exempted from performing works under these rules, as shall also those exempted from payment of road tax; provided that this latter exemption shall not apply to youths between the ages of sixteen and eighteen and adults between the ages of fifty-five and sixty.
9. Should the Committee decide on the necessity for any public well, market, Village Tribunal court-house, watering-place, gala, or burial ground, it shall be constructed by the joint labour of all the male inhabitants of the village of between the ages of sixteen and sixty. Provided that it shall be competent to the Government Agent to cause such works as are referred to in this clause to be executed from balance of fine money, if any be available.
10. If the Committee shall decide on the establishment of a school, the school house shall be built and repaired at the expense of the villagers residing within a radius of 3 miles from the site of the school house.
11. All children between the ages of seven and thirteen, both male and female, living within a radius of 3 miles of such schools that shall be established hereafter or of any other school the rules of which satisfy the Government Agent, shall

be sent to such schools by their parents or guardians at least for fourteen days in a month, unless they shall have made other satisfactory arrangements for the proper education of their children, or unless some satisfactory excuse can be shown for the default.

12. Any person who shall in any waters in which the inhabitants of the subdivision have the right of fishing, kill fish by means of poison, dynamite, or any other means not in accordance with local custom, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. No person shall open or block up a common canal, tank, pond, or amuna for the purpose of fishing.

14. It shall not be lawful for any person other than the proprietors of paddy fields or their agents to fish in paddy fields or tanks without the permission of such proprietors or their agents.

15. All wells, turavus, and other water pits shall be surrounded by a fence or wall at least 3 feet in height to be erected by the owners, or if for public use by such persons as the Committee shall decide. All wooden wells shall have well pipes not less than 3 feet above the ground, and all abandoned wells, &c., shall be filled up by or at the cost of the owners.

16. No person shall do any injury to waste or other land set apart for the common pasturage of cattle or for any other common purposes.

17. No cattle shall be removed from any village in the subdivision where there is cattle disease to or through any other village of the subdivision.

18. Every proprietor or herdsman in the subdivision shall be bound to separate every sick head of cattle belonging to him from the common herd and to put it in a secluded place to be determined by the headman, and to disinfect such place by fire or otherwise as the President may direct. In case of any head of cattle dying a natural death or by sickness, the proprietor or herdsman shall bury or completely burn the carcass without loss of time, and should the proprietor or herdsman be absent from the village at the time such head of cattle died, the headman shall forthwith proceed to bury or completely burn the carcass at the expense of the proprietor. If the proprietor is not known, the expense shall be met from the communal funds.

19. Every proprietor of cattle or herdsman who has a case of murrain or other contagious cattle disease amongst his cattle shall report the same to the headman without delay, and such headman shall see to the due observance of the rules, and shall report the same to the Chairman of the Village Committee or President.

20. The proprietor of any head of cattle that may have been stolen shall forthwith give information thereof to the headman of the village, and the headman shall report the theft with as little delay as possible to the President or Chairman of the Village Committee.

21. All householders shall keep their houses clean and their compounds clear of weeds and rubbish.

22. Boundaries of all private lands within the subdivision shall be marked by fences, ditches, or by burying stones according to the custom of the subdivision. Such boundaries shall be put up at the joint expense of the owners of both sides thereof.

23. No person shall alter, deface, or wilfully injure any such boundary.

24. No person shall befoul an ela, well, spring, or tank of water used for drinking purposes.

25. No person affected with any contagious disease shall bathe at a public well or ferry or tank.

26. No person shall use abusive language for the purpose of annoying any other person or of provoking a breach of the peace.

27. No spring gun shall be set up in any place frequented by people or cattle.

28. No person shall gamble or cockfight or allow other persons to gamble or cockfight in his house or premises.

29. No person shall loiter in the thoroughfares or public places within the subdivision or walk about the same after 9 P.M. without a light, unless he be able to show sufficient cause for so doing.

30. The sale of intoxicating liquor to females of any description is hereby constituted an offence.

31. The proprietors of paddy lands shall see that all the public paths leading through the paddy lands in the subdivision are not less than 3 feet in breadth. No person shall cut such path with intent of narrowing it or defacing it.

32. No person shall deface a village path that has been in existence for ten years, or cause any damage to such paths.

33. All buffaloes during cultivation season shall have wooden bells attached to their necks, and all known fence breachers or dangerous animals shall be yoked with others.

34. All buffaloes shall be driven to grazing grounds by day and folding grounds by night at places fixed after due inquiry by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, who shall also, after due inquiry select and fix for each village or group of villages their own proper cattle grazing and folding grounds, and no cattle of other villages shall be driven to those grounds without a special license from the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent whether they be cattle belonging to the natives of the district or cattle belonging to owners in other districts and pattus.

35. All black cattle, goats, and sheep shall be herded during the day and folded during the night outside the fields, and when in any village a place has been fixed on after due inquiry by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent as the

place in which black cattle, goats, and sheep shall be folded during the cultivation season, no proprietor shall fold his cattle, goats, or sheep in any place nearer than the one fixed on to the spring field, or village.

36. Proprietors of buffaloes, black cattle, goats, and sheep shall not suffer their cattle, goats, or sheep to trespass on the cultivation of any neighbouring village, nor shall they fold their cattle or drive them to pasture near the cultivation of or within the limits of any neighbouring village.

37. And whereas it is the practice to pasture cattle from Jaffna and other places near the cultivated fields in the Mullaitivu District, all persons owning, possessing, and tending such cattle, whether they be villagers or not, shall obtain from the Government Agent authority to pasture their cattle in the district only under a license indicating the name of the owner and the person in whose charge they are to be left, and the number and the description and brandmarks of the cattle. Such license shall be in force only for the period named in it.

38. All persons so licensed shall be subject to these rules and liable to the same penalties as the cultivators for breach of them.

39. All adult male inhabitants of a village, and all proprietors, whether male or female, of fields and compounds in the village, shall keep the paths leading from their village to the neighbouring villages clear of obstruction, bushes, &c., to a width not less than 6 feet half way between their villages and the neighbouring villages.

40. All adult male inhabitants of a village, and all proprietors, whether male or female, of compounds in the village, shall keep free of jungle a space round the outermost fences of the inhabited portion of the village of a width proportionate to the number of inhabitants, viz., villages containing fifty inhabitants and five valavus 200 yards, under fifty inhabitants and over twenty-five 100 yards, containing twenty-five and under 50 yards.

41. All private wells, water pits, or turavus used for drinking shall be kept clean by the owners. Public wells used by the villagers shall be kept clean by them, the labour being contributed by them in turn as directed by the President of the Village Committee.

42. Bulls intended to be reserved for breeding purposes shall be produced before the Committee for inspection, and if approved, a certificate of approval shall be given by Chairman to the owner.

43. All male black cattle not being certified bulls shall be properly castrated within two years of birth, and it shall be competent for the Chairman to order the immediate performance of the operation.

44. Castration shall be performed only by persons holding certificates from the Government Veterinary Surgeon, countersigned by the Government Agent, that they are competent to perform the operation, but this is not to interfere with the right of owners to castrate their own cattle.

45. Licensed castrators shall be entitled to recover from the owner the following fees:—

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended July 11, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 78. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22·6,* as against 24·1 in the preceding week and 22·7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 132, including 2 deaths of town residents who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 42·6,† as against 38·1 in the previous week and 31·9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—Two persons died of cholera, one being a patient in the Lunatic Asylum, Colombo, and the other a recent arrival from Tuticorin, both of whom died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. There had been two deaths from cholera in the Lunatic Asylum the previous week, and the origin of the epidemic remains a mystery. The patients were old residents of the Asylum which is well protected from risk of infection in the ordinary way. The Tuticorin passenger appears to have showed symptoms of cholera on the day of his arrival in Colombo, when he was removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital and died the next morning. There were 12 deaths registered from enteric fever, against 14 in the preceding week (of which 8 in Maradana hospitals), 17 persons died of phthisis, 18 of bronchitis and pneumonia, 14 of diarrhoea and dysentery, and 11 of infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 132 total deaths, 30 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
