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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 23, 1908, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated May 19, 1908.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman, Mr. E. Beven, Mr. G. F. Soysa, Mr. C. A. Hamy Wittatchy, Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene, Mr. S. A. Owen, Mr. W. C. Price.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 25, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
 - The following documents were submitted:—
 - (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1907 to April 30, 1908, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for April.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for April.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during April.

4. Correspondence:--

- (1) Letter No. 6 of April 27, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re compensation for local rates on Government buildings.—Read.
- (2) Letter No. 7 of April 29, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re the Sanitary state of Kandy.

Resolved—That Government be informed that the drainage of the town is being gradually improved, and that the question whether it is possible to get an additional feeder to the Reservoir as also that of raising the rates would be considered. That that it be also pointed out that the death-rate of Kandy according to the Registrar-General's return for April compares very favourably with that of Colombo, the former being only 22 per 1,000, while the latter was 35.

- (3) Letter No. 9 of May 9, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary authorizing the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 207:45 to W. D. Charles, late peon and process server of the Municipal Council of Kandy.—Read.
- (4) Copy of letter of May 12 to Mr. W. C. Price from the Colonial Secretary, nominating him to be a Councillor of the Municipal Council of Kandy.—Read.
- (5) Letter No. 12 of April, from the Colonial Auditor re Collection of Municipal dues.

Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by Mr. Wittatchy.

That in the opinion of the Council, the system suggested by the Colonial Auditor would be most inconvenient to the public, especially to the poorer inhabitants, and would not tend to the more prompt recovery of dues, and that the Council is not prepared to change a system to which the people have been accustomed for 40 years without clearer evidence of its advantages.—Carried.

(6) Letter of May 14, from Mr. E. Beven re Report of Special Committee on objections to assessment.

Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by the Chairman.

That the report of the Special Committee be adopted.—Carried.

(7) Letter No. 693 of May 20, from the Chairman, Provincial Road Committee, inquiring whether the Municipal can advance Rs. 2,500 to be repaid next year, to pay compensation for the acquisition of lands for Lady Blake Drive.

Proposed by the Chairman, seconded by Mr. Beven.

That the Council advance this sum to be repaid next year.—Carried.

- 5. The Colonial Auditor's queries and observations on January, February, and March accounts were laid on the table.
- 6. The Colonial Auditor's query No. 15, on the accounts for February, 1908, for authority of Council to pass the payment of Rs. 67 50 made to the Commutation Collector for serving schedules and writing register.

Proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by the Chairman.

That the necessary authority be granted.—Carried.

7. Papers re Fish Culture in the Kandy lake.

The Chairman said he was hardly ready to make any suggestions, but for the present asked for a vote of Rs. 200 for experiment including the provision of a wire screen at entrance to the moat.

This was agreed to.

- 8. Election of a Member for Standing Committees.
 - (1) B-Market and Sanitation.
 - (2) D-Municipal Works.
- Mr. Beven proposed that Mr. W. C. Price be elected to serve on both Committees.
- Mr. Soysa seconded.—Carried.
- 9. Estimate for Rs. 261 for three flights of steps leading to the bund.

The Chairman proposed—That the estimate be sanctioned.

Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.

Health Officer's Report for April, 1908.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month. I would again call the attention of the scavenger to see that the gratings in the side drain are cleared daily.

Water Supply.—Good.

Alleys.—The alleys are just the same as I have so often reported ill-constructed, ill-ventilated, and over-crowded. I would again urge their re-construction on sanitary principles.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.-Well kept.

Bakeries .- All fairly well kept.

Market.—Only fairly well kept. The market-keeper is too weak with the stall renters. I have spoke to him many times on this matter: he does not see that the stalls are properly swept out and cleaned daily.

Cattle passed this Month.—Cattle, 553; buffaloes, 119; sheep, 112; goats, 202. All food stuffs exposed for sale were examined by me and found good.

Slaughter-houses and Exposing Sheds.—Well kept.

Night Soil Depôt.-Well kept.

Cooly Lines.—All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health.—Good. Two cases of enteric fever, both brought into hospital from outside Municipal limits.

Four cases of measles and fifteen cases of chicken-pox, of this eight occurred in the Police Barracks. Every precaution were taken to prevent any further spread of the diseases.

Abstract. - A rotating conducting plate, disk, drum, or cylinder dipping in the latex and connected to the positive pole of a source of electricity forms the anode; or a moving conducting endless belt, on one surface of which latex is poured, connected to the positive pole of a source of electricity forms the anode. In the latter instance, which is the one illustrated by drawings, the cathode is a fixed adjustable plate extending over the upper surface of a horizontal moving belt and the latex is poured between. Rubber is deposited on that moving belt by the action of the electric current.

The deposited rubber and the belt passes between rolls to consolidate the rubber. The rubber is then guided off the belt and doubled and passes again through rolls to consolidate it. It is then led through hot water to heat it and wash it; and it is then led through rolls again, which are heated, and the rubber is finally consolidated and polished and partially dried thereby.

The claims include, besides the use of a rotating or moving anode, the process for obtaining a continuous sheet of rubber by the mechanical arrangements described and set forth in the drawings.
