## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 27, 1908, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated June 23, 1908.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman, Mr. E. Beven, Dr. G. P. Schokman, Mr. G. F. Soysa, Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene, Mr. S. A. Owen, Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 23, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1907 to May 31, 1908, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Assessment Tax Account, and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for May.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the Month of May.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for May.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Inspectors' reports on laundries, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during May.

Resolved—That Inspectors be requested to submit monthly reports on bakeries as well, and to send in special report meanwhile as to whether the by-laws *re* bakeries are enforced.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 10 of June 4, from the Colonial Secretary, *re* drains round public offices in Kandy.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 23,203 of June 9, from the Postmaster-General, that the number of postal deliveries in Kandy will be reduced from 5 to 3 a day.

Resolved—That the Postmaster-General be informed that there is no objection on part of Council.

(3) Circular letter No. 90 of June 9, from the Colonial Secretary, *re* opium licenses.

Resolved—That for further consideration be postponed.

(4) Circular letter No. 87 of June 19, from the Colonial Secretary, *re* prevention of malaria.

Resolved—That Government be informed that the Council does not consider that special measures for the destruction or prevention of the breeding of mosquitoes are necessary in Kandy, but that instructions will be issued to the Inspectors to see that facilities for the breeding of mosquitoes are reduced to a minimum.

(5) Letter No. 11 of June 25, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that provision for a contribution of Rs. 450 for building the open drain running from the General Hospital into the stream at Deiyannewela will be included in the Estimates for next year.—Read.

5. Papers re resignation of Dr. Anderson Smith, the Medical Officer of Health.

Dr. Schokman proposed that the resignation of Dr. Anderson Smith be accepted as from July 1, and that Dr. Hay be appointed Medical Officer of Health on three months' probation.

Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.

Mr. Beven moved as an amendment that applications for the post be called.

This fell through for want of a seconder.

The original motion was then put to the Meeting and carried, Mr. Beven dissenting.

6. The Chairman's Annual Report for 1907.

Resolved—That a Special Committee consisting of Mr. Beven, Dr. Schokman, and Mr. Price be appointed to consider the report.

7. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Law and General Subjects.*

(1) Amendments to By-laws :—

For By-law 122 substitute—

122. "Every dog kept within the limits of the Municipality shall be provided by its owner with a proper leather or metal collar, which shall have affixed to it a metal label or badge bearing the registered number of the dog. Such label or badge shall be furnished free by the Municipal Council, on payment of the annual registration fee, provided in by-law 118."

(b) In by-law 118 substitute "Re. 1.25" for "one rupee."

(c) In by-law 306 substitute "at the instance of a Municipal or Police Officer" for "with the previous sanction of the Chairman."

*Market.*—Fairly well kept. All food stuff exposed for sale were daily examined by me.

*Cattle passed this month.*—Cattle, 537; buffaloes, 94; sheep, 111; goats, 191.

*Slaughter-houses and exposing sheds.*—Well kept.

*Night Soil Depot.*—Well kept.

*Cooly Lines.*—All fairly well kept.

*Boutiques.*—Generally well kept.

*General Health.*—Good. Five cases of measles, eleven of chickenpox, and four cases of enteric fever were reported during the month. Of the latter three cases were brought into Kandy from outside Municipal limits, and the fourth (Alfred Wijewardene) not a permanent resident of the town. Every precaution was taken to prevent any further spread of the diseases.

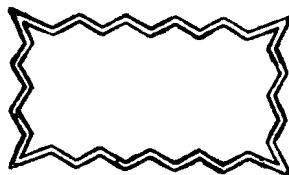
