#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, June 19, 1908.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 13, 1908.

*Present* :—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. G. H. Alston; and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene.

With reference to item No. 8 of the Agenda submitted to Council at its last Meeting it was resolved that the Minutes be corrected so as to read as follows:—

“The Chairman moved as a further amendment that the consideration of paragraphs 16 to end of the Report be deferred to next Meeting of Council.”

Resolved that the Minutes of May 20, 1908, be confirmed, subject to the amendment aforesaid.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked what steps the Medical Officer of Health or his Department is expected to take, when information is received of a case of disease which a Medical Practitioner or person professing to treat diseases is required to give information of, under the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897 (Notification dated December 18, 1903), such as a case of enteric fever. The Chairman in reply explained the procedure adopted in such cases.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved for a return showing the number of cases of enteric fever of which information has been received from January 1, 1908, to May 31, 1908, the return to show the number of cases which have occurred in each particular Ward.

The Chairman laid the return on the table.

By leave of Council, Mr. H. L. de Mel presented a petition addressed to the Council from certain residents of Bambalapitiya regarding the fly nuisance and defective drainage.

The petition was read.

3. To appoint a Member to the Cemeteries Committee in place of Dr. W. H. de Silva, deceased, and to consider the question of adding an additional Member to the Committee.

The Chairman moved that Messrs. H. L. de Mel and A. Fairlie be appointed as Members of the Cemeteries Committee to complete the work begun and report to the Council as early as possible.

Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.—Carried.

4 and 5. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 10, 1908, and Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of June 11, 1908, were laid before the Council :—

- (3) Supplemental vote to Estimate No. 308 of 1904, for conversion of night-soil cart bodies into flushing carts, Rs. 665.  
To be provided in Supplemental Budget.
- (7) Papers *re* illness of Mr. Thompson, Assistant Superintendent, Colombo Fire Brigade, and payment of his expenses at the Hatton Nursing Home and Medical attendance.  
It is recommended that the expenses incurred for medical attendance and nursing at the Hatton Home, over and above the amount of salary drawn by Mr. Thompson during the period of his detention at the Home, be defrayed by the Council.
- (8) Papers *re* retirement of Overseer K. L. G. Silva.  
Recommended that a pension be granted to Mr. K. L. G. Silva, at the usual rate, from October 1, 1908, and that 3 months' privilege leave from July 1 next, prior to retirement, be sanctioned.
- (9) Papers *re* telephone communication to Chairman's house.  
Recommended that half the cost of a Telephone connection to the Chairman's residence be defrayed by the Council, Rs. 45 per annum.
- (12) Letter from Municipal Engineer No. 346 of April 10, 1908, requesting authority to expend a sum of Rs. 320 in mounting and fixing two complete sets of Town Plans into 8 volumes.

- (13) To strike off water rate Rs. 5·37 due on premises No. 163, St. Joseph's street, for 4th quarter, 1907, as the whereabouts of the party responsible for the payment cannot be traced.  
May be struck off.
- (14) To strike off the following premises from the assessment books acquired for Municipal purposes, viz. :—Nos. 10a, Church Yard lane; 54/58 and 59, Galpotta street; 65, 66/67, 68/69, 64, 63, 62, 61, 59/60, 58 and 57, Jampettah street; and 41, Shoemakers' lane.  
May be struck off.
- (15) To strike off assessment of lots Nos. 15 and 16, New Reclamation Grounds, as they have been taken over by Government.  
May be struck off.
- (16) To waive costs on premises Nos. 84f and 84g, Colpetty, for 3rd and 4th quarters, 1907, as payment was made before warrant was issued, Rs. 11·76.  
Costs may be waived.
- (17) To waive costs for 4th quarter, 1907, on premises Nos. 25a, 25a/1, and 25b, College street; 16, 17, 18, and 29, Pickering's road; 3b, Rosmead Place; and 2½, Gregory's road; Rs. 14·59, as payment was made before issue of warrant.  
Costs may be waived.
- (18) To waive costs due on Lady de Soysa's properties and Chairman's minute thereon.  
Costs may be waived on the condition that a sum of Rs. 25 is remitted as remuneration to the collector for the work done by him in connection with the warrant.
- (19) To waive costs due on No. 7, Edinburgh Crescent, for the 4th quarter, 1907, as payment was made before warrant was issued, Rs. 8·10.  
Costs may be waived.

- (2) Papers *re* amendment of section 12 of draft regulations, under section 15 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1891, Cattle Disease Ordinance.  
Amended in accordance with the Hon. the Attorney-General's suggestions and recommended to Council.—(See A).
- (3) Papers *re* increase of stall rents and fees in Edinburgh Market.  
Recommended that the following rates be charged from August 1, next, viz. :—  
Vegetable stalls, Rs. 3 per mensem.  
Vegetable spaces for casual vendors, 10 cents per diem.  
and that the talipot ceiling asked for be provided as soon as possible after that date.
- (5) Papers *re* site for Segregation Camp, Mr. Mendis' land.  
The acquisition of Mr. Mendis' land is strongly recommended for purposes of a Segregation Camp in lieu of site originally chosen.
- (6) Papers *re* sale of about 3 acres of ground at the Kanatte Cemetery to the Roman Catholic Mission, and question as to the length of graves.  
The Committee recommends the Council to reconsider, under the circumstances stated by the Archbishop, the resolution passed at the meeting held on September 13, 1907, and to transfer the extent asked for without payment, on condition, that half the amount recovered by sale of grants shall be paid into the Municipal fund.

The Committee further recommends that the present scale of charges for grants of land for graves be revised and fixed as follows :—

The charge for a vault appears to the Committee to be capable of even a further increase.

Walles & Co.'s tender for an additional stretcher (Rs. 75) be accepted, provided that it is found on further inquiry not to be possible to obtain a lower tender; also, that an Ambulance cooly be engaged on a salary of Rs. 15, rising by annual increments of 50 cents. per month up to Rs. 18 per mensem.

The Chairman moved that paragraph 16 of the Report omitting the last sentence be adopted, viz :— Chief Assistant Medical Officer of Health. The Committee recommends that a Chief Assistant be engaged under four years' agreement on a salary of Rs. 6,000 rising to Rs. 8,000 by annual increments of Rs. 500 (the maximum being reached in seven years), and allowance for one horse at Rs. 50 per mensem.

Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the Chairman declared that seven were in favour of the motion and nine against. Whereupon the motion was lost.

## A.

*Regulations under Section 15 of Cattle Diseases Ordinance No. 9 of 1891.*

1. It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council, Colombo, to establish a station in or near Colombo for the purpose of quarantine of all cattle, sheep, and goats imported to Colombo from Asiatic and African ports.
2. All cattle, sheep, and goats imported from Asiatic and African ports shall be detained at the Quarantine Station for a period of ten days from the date of arrival, except as provided for in regulation 3.
3. All cattle, sheep, and goats that are required for slaughter in Colombo will be allowed to be removed, if required, from the Quarantine Station direct to the slaughter-house, before the expiration of ten days, under due supervision.
4. The Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, or any Officer appointed by the said Chairman for the purpose, shall have the power to detain any animal for a longer period than ten days or to refuse to allow any animal to be removed from the Quarantine Station, if, in his opinion, such detention or refusal is necessary for the prevention and control of infectious or other diseases of cattle, sheep, and goats.
5. No sale of cattle, sheep, or goats shall be held within the Municipal limits of Colombo without the sanction of the Chairman, Municipal Council, except at licensed markets or at markets established by the Municipal Council.
6. It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council, Colombo, to establish a Cattle Market in Colombo for the sale of cattle, sheep, and goats.
7. All animals detained at the Quarantine Station and the Cattle Market shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such animals.
8. When such owner neglects to feed or attend on such animals, the officer in charge of the establishment or any other person authorized by the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, is empowered to feed and attend on such animals, and the cost of such feeding and attention shall be paid by the owner of such animals.
9. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for animals admitted to the Quarantine Station and Cattle Market :—
  - Cattle, for each month or part of a month, Re. 1 each.
  - Slaughter cattle removed within ten days under regulation 3, 35 cents each.
  - Sheep and goats, for each month or part of a month, 25 cents each.
10. When any owner fails to pay any charges due under rule 8 or 9, the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, or any officer authorized by the said Chairman, shall be empowered to sell the animals, in respect of which such charges are due, by public auction after due notice, for the recovery of such dues, and the proceeds of sales in excess of such dues shall be payable to the owner of the animal concerned.
11. The person authorized to carry out the provisions of these regulations and of such further regulations as may hereafter be framed under section 15 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1891, shall be the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, and it shall be lawful for him to appoint any officer or officers to assist him in carrying out such provisions.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 25, 1908, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated July 21, 1908.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. G. F. Soysa; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. S. A. Owen; and Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 27, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1907 to June 30, 1908, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Assessment Tax Account, (No. 2) Water-rate Accounts.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for June.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for June.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Inspectors' reports on laundries, bakeries, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during June.

Resolved—That bakeries be given two months' notice to conform to by-law 298 and one month's notice to conform to by-law 299.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter of July 3 from Dr. Anderson Smith, the late Medical Officer of Health of the Kandy Municipality, that he may be given a gratuity for his 7½ years' service.

Mr. Beven moved that the Council regret that they are unable to comply with the request of Dr. Anderson Smith as their rules relating to pensions and gratuities do not allow of it.

Mr. Soysa seconded—Carried.

5. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

(4) That the Assessment Clerk be allowed to draw the fees recovered for extracts from the assessment register.

*Municipal Works.*

(1) That the Estimate for the following works be sanctioned :—

(a) Constructing shelves for the record room, Rs. 648.48.

(b) Improving the central cricket pitch, Bogambra, Rs. 47.55.

(2) That house service pipes be allowed on usual conditions to—

(a) No. 959, Peradeniya road, D. T. Karunaratne.

(b) Nos. 960 to 961, Peradeniya road, Mrs. Atukorala.

*Scavenging.*—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month.

*Drainage.*—The drainage of the town is much as it was; all the open roadside drains should be made and cemented. The drains both made and unmade have been kept clean.

*Water supply.*—Good.

*Alleys.*—These ill-built, overcrowded, ill-ventilated tenements have been kept as clean as possible—thanks to my Inspectors—*vide* my many reports.

*Laundries.*—Generally well kept.

*Dairies.*—The known dairies are all well kept, but the milk supply of any town is of the utmost importance. Much more stringent by-laws should be passed for the dairies. *Vide* my report on the milk supply of the town.

*Bakeries.*—All fairly well kept.

The market-keeper has been doing his work much better lately.

*Cattle passed this month.*—519 cattle, 95 buffaloes, 114 sheep, 198 goats.

*Slaughter-house exposing shed.*—Always well kept.

*Cooly lines.*—All fairly well kept.

*Boutiques.*—Generally well kept

*Night soil depôt.*—Well kept.

*Latrines.*—Generally well kept.

*Public health.*—Good. Five cases of chickenpox, one case of measles, and eight cases of enteric fever were reported during the month, of these seven were brought into the town from places without the Municipal limits. *Vide* my Infectious Diseases Book.

In this my last report I would thank all my Inspectors and all under me for their good and zealous work. Kandy to-day is about the healthiest town in the Island, and would compare well with most country towns in England, may it be always so.

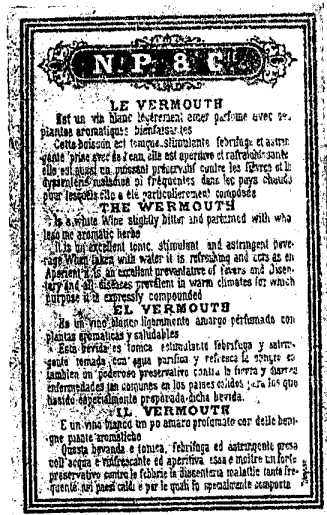
