WHEREAS the rules set forth in the schedule hereto were made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 9 of the Poisons Ordinance, No. 11 of 1901, and published in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette*, namely, of January 10 and 17, 1908, in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and laid before the Legislative Council:

And whereas the said rules were not objected to by the said Legislative Council then in session within forty days after their having been so laid before the said Council:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us by sub-section (3) of section 10 of the said Poisons Ordinance, No. 11 of 1901, do hereby proclaim the rules set forth in the schedule hereto, and declare that the same shall take effect as from and after the date hereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eight.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the term "cocaine" shall include all preparations of cocaine and salts of cocaine and their preparations, and the term "doctor" shall mean a medical practitioner registered as such under Ordinance No. 2 of 1905.

2. In issuing any license under section 4 of the Ordinance the Government Agent may in express terms exempt from the rights granted by such license the right to sell cocaine, and it shall not be lawful for the licensee on a license containing such an exemption to sell or expose or offer for sale cocaine in any quantity.

3. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by retail, shall sell cocaine by retail to any person other than a person known to him or introduced by some person known to him.

4. No licensed person shall sell by retail more than six grains of cocaine in a dry state or any solution containing more than ten grains of the active drug to the same person on the same day, unless the buyer is a qualified medical practitioner or a chemist or druggist licensed to sell poisons.

5. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by retail, shall keep in stock more than one ounce of cocaine.

6. None of the foregoing regulations shall apply to cocaine when forming part of the ingredients of any medicine dispensed by an apothecary or chemist and druggist on a doctor's prescription; but all prescriptions, if containing cocaine, shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose, to be called the Prescription Book, with the name of the person to whom it was sold and the name of the doctor prescribing. The name and address of the seller shall be attached to the receptacle containing the medicine prescribed.

7. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale, shall sell cocaine by wholesale, except—

- (a) To persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale or retail.
- (b) To a qualified medical practitioner.

8. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale—

- (a) Shall sell to any person whomsoever cocaine in less quantities than one ounce of dry cocaine.
- (b) Shall sell cocaine to retail dealers or to qualified medical practitioners, save in quantities of one ounce.
- (c) Shall sell cocaine in quantities exceeding one ounce, except to persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by wholesale.

9. All cocaine arriving in the Island consigned to any wholesale dealer shall be declared at the Customs premises as cocaine, and shall only be removed from the Customs or Post Office with a permit on the following form:—

1. *Market leases.*—It shall be lawful for the Chairman to lease the market or any portion thereof for any time not exceeding one year, and for that purpose to call for tenders or dispose off the right by public auction.
2. *Leases to be executed by Chairman.*—Such lease or leases may be executed by the Chairman in his name, and may be signed by him on behalf of the Board. The lease or leases so executed shall be binding on the Board and the lessee.
3. *Restrictions on sale of dry fish, &c.*—It shall not be lawful for any person to expose for sale dried or salted fish or chillies or curry stuffs or other odoriferous merchandise, save on a permit issued by the Chairman, and in such place as he shall in that permit allow.
4. *Licenses not transferable.*—No person shall transfer a license or ticket issued to him for any stall or space in a public market to any other person, or shall sub-let any such stall or space or any part thereof, and no person shall use or hold or occupy any stall or space or any part thereof under any alleged transfer without the permission of the Chairman.
5. *No other than licensee to sell.*—No person other than the person holding a license or ticket shall use or occupy any stall or space or any part of any stall or space in a public market or sell goods therein, unless such person shall be named in the license or ticket as a person authorized by the Chairman of the Board to sell on behalf of the licensee or ticket holder.
6. *Only licensee and ticket holder and registered agents permitted to sell goods in stalls.*—No person holding a license or ticket for any stall or space in the public market shall, under any pretence whatsoever, suffer or permit any other person, excepting a person authorized as provided for in the preceding by-law to use or occupy such stall or space or any part thereof, or to sell or expose for sale any goods, articles, or things of any description whatsoever without the authority of the Chairman.
7. *Licenses and tickets to be returned.*—All licenses and tickets issued under these by-laws shall be returned to the Secretary of the Board by the person holding such license or ticket on his quitting the stall or space.
8. *Occupation of ground beyond limits prohibited.*—No person holding a license or ticket for any stall or space in a public market shall use or occupy or permit or allow any person acting on his behalf to use or occupy, and no servant of a person holding such license or ticket shall use or occupy any ground beyond the limits of the stall or space rented by him.
9. *Persons convicted of theft and defaulting stall holders cannot be employed.*—No person convicted of theft or other similar offence, or who has been a defaulting stall holder, shall occupy a stall or space, or be employed at any public market by any person holding a license or ticket for any stall or space in a public market.

*By-laws made by the Local Board of Matale under the provisions of Sections 15 and 19a of "The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887."*

1. *Petroleum not to be hawked without license.*—Petroleum otherwise than in bulk as defined by Ordinance No. 6 of 1887 and rules thereunder shall not be removed from any authorized store for the storage of petroleum or hawked about within the Local Board limits except with a license from the Chairman of the Board.
2. *Form of petroleum license.*—Such license shall be in the form in Schedule A of Ordinance No. 2 of 1901, and shall be in force for the period mentioned therein and no longer, which period shall not be more than twelve months or less than one month.
3. *Fee for petroleum license.*—Such license shall be paid for in advance at a rate not exceeding 50 cents for each month, provided that it shall be lawful for the Board at any time to cancel any such license or licenses.

THE following by-laws framed under section 5 of "The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901," for the town of Dqanduwu in the Wellaboda pattu, in the Galle District of the Southern Province, are published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. A registration fee of 25 cents per annum shall be paid upon each dog kept within the said town.
2. Such registration fee shall be due on and after May 1, 1908, and shall be paid in advance before June 1 in each year.
3. To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every house within the said town shall, on or before December 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Government Agent, Galle, to demand the same a list in the form in schedule annexed of the dog or dogs kept in such house, and the names of the owners thereof.
4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.
5. Every inhabitant within the said town becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3 shall furnish the officer appointed by the Government Agent mentioned in the said by-law with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.
6. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.
7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to refuse to issue a certificate of registration, or to cancel a certificate already issued, for any dog which in his opinion is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Government Agent at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Government Agent shall think fit.
9. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to seize all stray dogs and deal with them in terms of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 10 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 14, 1908.

**Births.**—The total births registered were 87. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.2,\* as against 27.0 in the preceding week and 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 114, including 3 deaths of town residents, who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.8, † as against 54.9 in the previous week and 36.1 in the corresponding week of last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 114 total deaths, 33 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

**Causes of Death.**—There was one death registered from Cholera; origin not ascertained. The patient was a Sinhalese cooly from New Bazaar, who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital. The last previous death from Cholera occurred on July 16 last.

Ten deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 21 in the previous week), of which 5 were from Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each from Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena, and New Bazaar, and 1 in the General Hospital (of a prisoner from Welikada jail); 19 deaths were registered from Diarrhoea and Dysentery; 15 from Bronchitis and Pneumonia; and 13 from Infantile Convulsions.

Eight deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 11 in the previous week and 3 and 8 in the two preceding weeks), of which 2 each were in St. Sebastian and Kollupitiya, 2 in the General Hospital (of a patient from outside the town, and one whose residence was not known), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). During the week 32 cases of illness from Enteric Fever were reported to the Municipal authorities (against 33 in the previous week).

Four deaths were registered from Smallpox in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta (against 4 in the previous week), of which 1 was from Maradana and the other from Kollupitiya, and the two others from Kanatta and Wellawatta, just outside the town. Only the two former deaths are here taken into account against the town. During the week 21 cases of Smallpox were reported (against 25 in the previous week); also 20 cases of Measles and 10 of Chickenpox.

Other details are given in the annexed Tables.
