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PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Edward McCallum, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the joint operation of a Proclamation dated February 5, 1875, and "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1871," the Chief Headman's division of Kuruwiti korale, in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, was brought within the operation of the said Ordinance:

And whereas by another Proclamation dated December 22, 1905, the Chief Headman's division of the Uda, Meda, and Palle pattus of Nawadun korale, in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, was brought within the operation of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889":

And whereas it is expedient to exempt certain portions of the said Chief Headman's divisions from the operation of "The Village Communities" Ordinance, 1889 ":

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 4 (a) of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from the 1131

operation of the said Ordinance that portion of the Chief Headman's division of Kuruwiti korale and that portion of the Chief Headman's division of Nawadun korale described in the schedule hereto, which are situated within the limits of the Local Board of Ratnapura, with effect from and after the date hereof.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirtieth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eight.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Ratnapura Town.

On the West.—A line from the north-western boundary of land appearing in title plan No. 99,563, following the eastern boundary of Galkadumukalana as far as the northern boundary of the land appearing in title plan No. 100,362, and thence a straight line to the river.

On the North and North-east.—Following the minor road to Weralupe from its junction with the Colombo road between the 54th and 55th mileposts to the bridge crossing the Katugas-ela, and thence along the Outer Circular road to the gate of the new cemetery, thence a line keeping to the west of the range of paddy fields to the bridge over Parakanda-ela on the minor road to Gilimale, and following this road as far as Alubokke-Kumbureela, and along this ela to its junction with Kalu-ganga.

On the East.—Along the Hin-ela from its junction with Kalu-ganga to the Dolas-wela-ela, and along the Dolas-wela-ela to the Koraliwalatotupola on the We-ganga.

On the South and South-west.—The We-ganga and Kalu-ganga as far as the point where the line described as the western boundary meets the Kalu-ganga.

IT is hereby notified that an examination under the Regulations of August 26, 1891, for gentlemen in the Civil Service will be held in the Council Chamber on Monday, January 18, 1909, at 10.30 A.M., and following days, namely:—

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth Class of the Civil Service, will also be held on January 19, 1909, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 15 of the Cattle Disease Ordinance, No. 9 of 1891, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations, namely:—

- 1. From and after January 1, 1909, no person shall import or cause the importation into Ceylon of any cattle through any port other than the port of Colombo or the port of Kayts.
- 2. It shall be lawful for the Collector of Customs or any Officer of Customs authorized by him to prevent the landing of cattle at any port of this Island other than the ports of Colombo or Kayts, and no person shall be entitled to any compensation for any loss or damage incurred by him by reason thereof.
- 3. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent, Northern Province, to establish a station in or near Kayts for the purpose of quarantine of all cattle, sheep, and goats imported to Kayts from oversea ports.
- 4. All cattle, sheep, and goats imported from oversea ports shall be detained at the quarantine station for a period of ten days from the date of arrival.
- 5. All cattle, sheep, and goats that are required for slaughter in Jaffna will be allowed to be removed, if required, from the quarantine station direct to the slaughter-house, before the expiration of ten days, under due supervision.
- 6. The Government Agent, Northern Province, or any officer appointed by the said Government Agent for the purpose, shall have the power to detain any animal for a longer period than ten days, or to refuse to allow any animal to be removed from the quarantine station, if in his opinion such detention or refusal is necessary for the prevention and control of infectious or other diseases of cattle, sheep, and goats.
- 7. All animals detained at the quarantine station shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such animals.
- 8. When such owner neglects to feed or attend to such animals, the officer in charge of the establishment, or any other person authorized by the Government Agent, Northern Province, is empowered to feed and attend to such animals, and the cost of such feeding and attention shall be paid by the owner of such animals.
 - 9. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for animals admitted to the quarantine station:-

VITAL STATISTICS.

Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 28, 1908.

Births.—The total births registered were 106. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.7,* as against 27.0 in the preceding week and 37.2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 148, including 2 deaths of town residents, who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 47:8,† as against 50.4 in the previous week and 34.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 148 total deaths, 35 were of infants under I year of age, as against 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Causes of Death.-1. There were 4 deaths registered from Cholera (against 5 in the previous week), 2 each from New Bazaar and the Welikada Jail, making in all 10 deaths since the beginning of the epidemic about a fortnight ago, of which 6 were in the Welikada Jail. During the week 3 cases of illness from Cholera (as against 9 in the previous week) were reported, 2 from Welikada Jail. 23 deaths were registered in the week from Diarrhea and Dysentery.

- 2. Fourteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 15 in the previous week), of which 5 were from Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 from Kotahena, 2 from New Bazaar, 1 each from Fort, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and 1 in the General Hospital (a patient whose residence was not known). 22 deaths were registered from Bronchitis and Pneumonia.
- 3. Eleven deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 13 in the previous week and 11 and 8 in the two preceding weeks), of which 5 were from Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 from Kollupitiya, 2 in the General Hospital (a patient from outside the town, and 1 whose residence was not known), and 1 from St. Sebastian. During the week 28 cases of illness from Enteric Fever were reported (against 34 in the previous week).
- 4. Six deaths were registered from Smallpox in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta (against 11 in the previous week): 1 from New Bazaar and the 5 others from outside the town. Only the former is here taken into account. During the week 14 cases of Smallpox were reported (against 16 in the previous week); also 21 cases of Measles and 7 of Chickenpox.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Edward McCallum, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY McCALLUM.

WHEREAS the town of Jaffna, in the Northern Province, was by Proclamation dated November 8, 1905, brought under the operation of "The Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," and the limits of the said town were thereby defined:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation by altering the limits of the said town as therein defined:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 4 of the Local Boards' Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby amend the said Proclamation as aforesaid, and declare that the limits of the said town of Jaffna, shall, as from and after the date hereof, be as the same are set forth in the schedule hereto.

And We do in all other respects confirm the said Proclamation of November 8, 1905.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eight.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Town of Jaffna.

From the Fort (Jaffna) by the shore of the lake westward to the limit between the villages of Vannarponnai West and Anaikkoddai, by that limit to the Punnalai road, along that road to the south-west corner of the tract of fields called Paddiveli, along the western and northern boundaries of those fields, along the boundary between the villages of Vannarponnai West and Kokuvil, and of Vannarponnai East and Kokuvil to the Nariyankundu road, by that road to the Kantharmadam road, the Point Pedro road, the Arasadi road, and the boundary between the Jaffna division and the Valigamam East division to the Semmani road near the western boundary of the salt pans, by that road to the Central road, by that road westward to the north-west corner of the tract of fields called Madattadivayal, by the western boundary of those fields and of those called Puthukkulavayal to the western boundary of the scoonut estate commonly called Mr. Price's estate, along that boundary to the shore of the lake, by the shore of the lake to a point twenty chains on the east from the junction of the Maravakulam road and the Beach road, from that point by a straight line to the south-eastern corner of the Reclamation road, by the Reclamation road westward to the south-western corner of the Reclamation road, and from that corner by a straight line to the Fort.
