DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to make provision for the performance of the Statutory Duties attached to the Offices of the Auditor-General and the Assistant Auditor-General.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the offices of Auditor-General and Assistant Auditor-General have been abolished, and it is expedient to make provision for the performance of the statutory duties attached to those offices: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Audit Ordinance, 1908."

Statutory duties of Auditor-General assigned to Controller of Revenue.

2 All powers and duties vested in or assigned to the Auditor-General or to the Assistant Auditor-General by any Ordinance, or by any rules, regulation, or by-law made thereunder, shall be respectively exercised and performed by the Controller of Revenue or the Assistant Controller of Revenue; but the Governor may from time to time, by order in the *Government Gazette*, assign any of such powers and duties to the Colonial Auditor, and thereupon the same may be lawfully exercised and performed by that officer.

Saving of certain acts of Controller of Revenue.

3 No act, matter, or thing done or transacted before the commencement of this Ordinance by the Controller of Revenue or by the Assistant Controller of Revenue shall be invalidated by reason only that the same ought to have been done or transacted by the Auditor-General or by the Assistant Auditor-General.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE purpose of this Ordinance is to provide for the performance of the duties which, by various Ordinances, are assigned to the Auditor-General or to the Assistant Auditor-General.

These duties are assigned generally to the Controller of Revenue and the Assistant Controller of Revenue; but power is reserved for the Governor to assign any of these duties to the Colonial Auditor

Section 3 saves any acts done by the Controller or Assistant Controller, which should legally have been done by the Auditor-General or Assistant Auditor-General.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 18 of 1908.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 5 of 1890, relating to Mines of Gold, Silver, and Precious Stones in Lands other than Crown Property.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Gemming Ordinance, 1890" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"): Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title and construction.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Gemming (Amendment) Ordinance, 1908," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance.

Addition of a new section.

2 After section 10 of the principal Ordinance, the following section shall be added and numbered 10 A, namely:

Extension of rules to Crown lands when leased for mining.

10 A Rules made under section 10, whether before or after the enactment of this section, shall extend to Crown lands if and so long as the right to open or work mines thereon has been leased to any person.

No. 19 of 1908.

An Ordinance to restrict the Traffic in Dried Meat in
certain Districts.

HENRY MCCALLUM.

Preamble.	<p>WHEREAS it is expedient to restrict the traffic in dried meat in certain districts in order to check the wasteful destruction of game: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:</p>
Short title.	<p>1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Dried Meat Ordinance, 1908."</p>
Definition.	<p>2 Except where the context otherwise requires, the expression "dried meat" means the dried or salted flesh of any animal, but does not include dried or salted fish or any dried or salted meat which has been imported from beyond the seas. The onus of proving that any dried meat has been so imported shall in any proceedings under this Ordinance be on the accused.</p>
Application of Ordinance.	<p>3 (1) The Governor in Executive Council may from time to time by Proclamation declare that it shall be unlawful to remove dried meat from any revenue district or chief headman's division therein named (which revenue districts and chief headmen's divisions are in this Ordinance referred to as "proclaimed areas").</p> <p>(2) The Governor in Executive Council may from time to time vary, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation.</p>
Prohibition of removal of dried meat.	<p>4 It shall be unlawful for any person to remove dried meat in quantities exceeding fifteen pounds from any proclaimed area.</p>
Penalty.	<p>5 Any person who removes or attempts to remove dried meat from any proclaimed area shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and, in default of payment, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months; and on a second or subsequent conviction he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, and, in default of payment, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months. Upon any conviction the dried meat in respect of which such conviction was had and all vessels containing the same, and every wagon, cart, boat, vessel, animal, or other conveyance used for or employed in the removal of the same may be forfeited.</p>
Power of certain officers to examine carts, &c.	<p>6 It shall be lawful for any Assistant Conservator of Forests or for any police officer not below the rank of a sergeant, or for any other forest officer or headman who is authorized in writing by the Government Agent to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance, upon reasonable suspicion, to stop and examine any cart, carriage, boat, pack animal, or other means of conveyance for the purpose of ascertaining whether dried meat is contained therein or carried thereby; and if the person in charge of such cart, carriage, boat, pack animal, or other means of conveyance refuses to allow such officer to examine the same, or prevents or obstructs him from so doing, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, or in default of payment to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months. Where upon such examination any quantity of dried meat exceeding fifteen pounds in weight is found, such officer may seize such dried meat, together with the vessel, cart, carriage, boat, pack animal, or other means whereby or wherein the same is conveyed, and bring the same before the nearest Police Court to be dealt with according to law.</p>

Where person found removing dried meat suspected to have been illegally removed.

7 Where any person is found removing dried meat in any quantity exceeding fifteen pounds in such circumstances as to give rise to reasonable suspicion that he has brought it from a proclaimed area in contravention of this Ordinance, he may be charged with removing dried meat in contravention of this Ordinance; and if the person so charged does not prove to the satisfaction of the Police Magistrate that he did not remove such dried meat in contravention of this Ordinance, and the Police Magistrate is satisfied that, having regard to the place where the dried meat was found and to all the circumstances of the case, there are reasonable grounds for believing that the person charged removed the dried meat in contravention of this Ordinance, such person may be convicted of an offence under section 4 of this Ordinance, and shall be liable to the penalty provided by section 5.

Reward to informer.

8 Any offence under this Ordinance may be inquired into, tried, and determined by the Police Court of the district in which the offence was committed wholly or in part, and such court shall have jurisdiction to award the maximum punishment prescribed therefor, and to declare and adjudge any dried meat, vessel, conveyance, animal, or thing liable to be confiscated under section 5 of this Ordinance forfeited and to condemn the same, whatever may be the amount or value thereof, anything in the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898, to the contrary notwithstanding; and any Police Magistrate by whom any person is convicted of an offence under this Ordinance may direct that a portion not exceeding one-half of the fine actually recovered, and also a like portion of the proceeds of the sale of any thing or animal forfeited as aforesaid, shall be paid to any person giving information which has led to the conviction.

Power of Governor to prohibit exportation of dried meat.

9 The Governor in Executive Council may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of dried meat during such period as may seem expedient, and may in like manner alter, amend, or revoke any such Proclamation.

After any such Proclamation and during the period therein named, it shall be unlawful for any person to export dried meat; and any person exporting or attempting to export dried meat during such period, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to both, and the dried meat in respect of which such conviction was had and all receptacles containing the same shall be forfeited.

Powers of Assistant Government Agents.

10 The powers and duties by this Ordinance assigned to the Government Agent may be exercised and performed by any Assistant Government Agent within the limits of his district.

Exception with regard to service tenures.

11 Whenever the tenant of any land in the Kandyan provinces is bound, in respect of his tenure, to supply dried meat in any specified quantity, nothing in this Ordinance shall be taken to prevent such tenant from removing meat in such quantity as may be necessary to enable him to render such service.

Whenever, in any proceedings under this Ordinance, it is alleged by way of defence that any dried meat was removed for the purpose of rendering any such service as aforesaid, the burden of proving that the dried meat was removed *bona fide* for such purpose and in no larger quantity than was necessary therefor shall lie on the person alleging such defence.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice

No. 20 of 1908.

An Ordinance to define the Rates and Contributions leviable
in respect of the Maintenance of certain Irrigation
Works in the North-Central Province, and of the
payment of Interest on the Cost of
constructing the Works.

HENRY MCCALLUM.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to define the rates and contributions leviable in respect of the maintenance of the works known as the Kalawewa Yoda-ela irrigation works, and of the payment of interest on the cost of constructing the work: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Kalawewa Yoda-ela Irrigation Ordinance, 1908."

Interpretation.

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Works" include the Kalawewa and Balaluwewa tanks and channels, the channel known as the Kalawewa-Yoda-ela, and the Tissawewa and Basawakulam tanks, and also any extension of the works which may be made for the irrigation of any lands shown by any existing specification or amendment thereof as irrigable from the works as hereby defined. But the said term does not include any other extension of the works, nor the Maha Illuppalama tank.

"Irrigable lands" include all lands shown by any specification prepared before the commencement of this Ordinance, or under the provisions of this Ordinance as being capable of being irrigated by or from the works as hereinbefore defined.

"Irrigation interest" means the interest on the cost of constructing, reconstructing, or restoring the works.

"Maintenance" means the cost of maintaining, controlling, and repairing the works.

Rates and contributions in labour.

3 In lieu of the contributions heretofore made by the owners and occupiers of irrigable land in money and labour in respect of the interest on the cost of constructing the works and of the cost of their maintenance, all such land shall be subject to the annual rate per acre prescribed by the next following section, and the owners and occupiers of such lands shall also be liable to make the contribution in money or labour provided by section 5.

Liability of irrigable lands to rates.

4 (1) Where any irrigable lands have been alienated by the Crown subject to the condition that a specified annual rate per acre should be paid in perpetuity, such rate shall continue to be levied.

(2) Nothing in this Ordinance shall be taken to preclude the alienation by the Crown after the commencement of this Ordinance of irrigable lands subject to the payment of such annual rate in perpetuity in respect of irrigation interest and maintenance as the Governor may appoint.

(3) Irrigable lands which are not subject to any such condition as is mentioned in the two last preceding subsections shall be liable to an annual rate in perpetuity of one rupee per acre.

Liability to contribute labour.

5 In addition to the rates prescribed in the last preceding section, proprietors and occupiers of irrigable lands, in respect of which contribution has hitherto been made towards the maintenance of the works in their character of village tanks, shall continue to make such contribution to the extent and in the manner following; that is to say, they shall contribute

n each year four days' labour in respect of each acre or any part thereof in such manner as the Government Agent shall appoint; provided that it shall be lawful for such proprietors and occupiers to commute such labour by a payment at the rate of one rupee per acre or any part of an acre per annum; and provided also that their liability to contribute labour or money towards the construction or maintenance of village tanks and works connected therewith under rules passed under "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," or under any Ordinance thereby repealed, shall be correspondingly reduced.

Rates and charges in sections 3 and 4 to be a first charge on the lands liable.

6 All rates and charges mentioned in sections 3 and 4 shall be a first charge on the lands liable thereto, and shall take precedence of all mortgages, hypothecations, and encumbrances whatsoever. The provisions of chapter IX. of "The Irrigation Ordinance, 1906," shall be applicable to the enforcement and recovery of such rates.

Power to prepare further specifications.

7 If it shall appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the allotments of land which are or may be irrigable by the works are not completely shown by any existing specifications, or that any such specification is invalid, or of doubtful validity, or is defective in any material particular, then, and in any such case, the Governor in Executive Council may direct such further specification or specifications, as the occasion may require, to be prepared; and the specifications so prepared shall be conclusive on the point that the several allotments therein mentioned are liable to the payment of rates for irrigation interest and maintenance.

Legalization of past recoveries.

8 All contributions in money or in labour heretofore levied, recovered, or enforced, and all seizures, sales, and other proceedings for the recovery of such contributions shall be deemed to have been lawful.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 21 of 1908.

An Ordinance to prevent Thefts of Rubber.

HENRY MCCALLUM.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make special provision to prevent thefts of rubber: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Rubber Thefts Prevention Ordinance, 1908."

Definitions.

2 In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears—

"Rubber plant" includes any of the following plants, namely—

- (1) *Hevea Brasiliensis* (Para rubber).
- (2) *Manihot Glaziovii* (Ceara rubber).
- (3) *Castilloa elastica*.
- (4) *Ficus elastica* (Rambong).
- (5) Any rubber-producing plant which the Governor, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, may declare to be a rubber plant for the purposes of this Ordinance.

“ Rubber ” includes marketable rubber prepared from the latex of any rubber plant and the latex of any such plant, whether fluid or coagulated, in any stage of the treatment to which it is subjected during the process of conversion into marketable rubber; but “ rubber ” does not include any manufactured article wholly or partly made of rubber.

“ Wet rubber ” means the latex of any rubber plant, whether fluid or coagulated, in any stage of preparation before the completion of the drying process.

“ Licensed dealer ” means a person licensed to deal in rubber under this Ordinance.

“ Licensed premises ” means the place where a licensed dealer is authorized to deal in rubber.

“ Purchase ” includes the taking of rubber in exchange for other goods or on account of any claim or indebtedness.

“ Peace officer ” means any headman appointed in writing by a Government Agent to perform police duties.

“ Government Agent ” includes an Assistant Government Agent.

Purchase of rubber by unlicensed person prohibited.

3 From and after the commencement of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to purchase rubber unless he has been licensed under this Ordinance to deal in rubber, or has received from the Government Agent a permit authorizing him to do so. Any person who purchases rubber without being so licensed, or without such permit, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Power of Government Agent to issue licenses to deal in rubber.

4 (1) The Government Agent may issue free of charge licenses under his hand authorizing the persons to whom the same are granted to deal in rubber.

(2) Every such license may be in the form marked A in the schedule or in such other form as the Governor may from time to time prescribe, and shall state the name and residence of the licensee and the premises at which he is authorized to deal in rubber.

(3) Every such license shall expire, unless it is determined otherwise, on the thirty-first day of December next following the date when it was issued.

(4) The Government Agent may in his discretion issue permits in writing under his hand authorizing the Superintendents or Assistant Superintendents for the time being of the estates therein named to purchase rubber.

Such permits shall remain in force until revoked by the Government Agent.

Power of Government with regard to refusal to issue license, &c.

5 (1) The Government Agent may at his discretion refuse to grant a license or permit to any applicant or to renew any license which has expired, and may revoke any license or permit already issued.

(2) Any person who is aggrieved by the refusal of the Government Agent to grant or renew a license, or to grant a permit, or by the revocation of a license or permit, may appeal to the Governor in Executive Council, who may confirm or reverse such refusal or revocation as may appear just.

Duty of licensed dealers in rubber to paint words “ Licensed Dealer in Rubber ” on licensed premises.

6 Every licensed dealer shall cause the words “ Licensed Dealer in Rubber ” to be painted in conspicuous letters in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages upon his licensed premises. Any licensed dealer who fails to comply with the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Provisions with regard to partners.

7 (1) Two or more persons carrying on business in partnership shall not be obliged to obtain more than one license in respect of the same premises. A license to two or more persons shall not be determined by the death or retirement from business of any one or more of the partners.

(2) No license shall be assignable or shall authorize any person to deal in rubber by reason of his being executor or administrator of any person to whom such license has been granted.

Offences.

8 (1) It shall be unlawful—

- (a) For any person to sell or to offer for sale or to deliver, or for any licensed dealer to purchase or to take delivery of, any rubber except between sunrise and sunset, or at any place other than licensed premises; or
- (b) For any licensed dealer to purchase or to take delivery of rubber from any person who is not personally known to him, or from any person whom he knows or has reasonable grounds for believing is under the age of twelve years, or from any estate labourer; or
- (c) For any licensed dealer to purchase or take delivery of wet rubber from any person whatsoever.

(2) Any person who does any act in contravention of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Book to be kept by licensed dealer.

9 (1) Every licensed dealer shall keep on the premises at which he is authorized to deal in rubber a book which shall be supplied to him by the Government Agent, and shall enter therein, immediately upon the delivery at his licensed premises of any rubber purchased by him in the form marked B in the schedule hereto, or in such other form as the Governor may prescribe, the following particulars, namely:

- (a) The day, month, and year of such delivery.
- (b) The weight of rubber delivered.
- (c) The name and residence of the person from whom the rubber was purchased.
- (d) The price paid for the rubber.
- (e) Where the person from whom the rubber is purchased is not a licensed dealer, the description and situation of the lands of which such rubber is or is alleged to be the produce.

(2) Whenever any rubber which has not been purchased is brought into any licensed premises, whether the same is or is not the produce of land in the possession or occupation of the licensed dealer, the licensed dealer shall forthwith enter in the said book, or in such other form as may be prescribed for the purpose, the following particulars with regard to such rubber, namely:

- (a) The day, month, and year when the rubber was brought into the licensed premises.
- (b) The weight of such rubber.
- (c) The manner in which the rubber was acquired, and, if grown on land in the possession or occupation of the licensed dealer, the description and situation of such land.

(3) Whenever the licensed dealer removes any rubber from his licensed premises, whether the same has been acquired by purchase or otherwise, the licensed dealer shall forthwith enter in the said book the date when the same was removed, and the name and residence of the person to whom the same was delivered.

Inspection of licensed premises.

10 It shall be lawful for any Police Magistrate, or for any police officer not below the rank of a sergeant, or for any headman not below the rank of korala or vidane arachchi authorized in writing by the Government Agent to inspect licensed premises, to enter any licensed premises at any time between sunrise and sunset and to call for, inspect, and take extracts from any book required to be kept by this Ordinance, and if the licensed dealer or any one on his behalf fails to produce any such book, or refuses to allow such extracts to be made, or if any entry, which ought to have been made is not in such book, or if any entry in such book is false in any particular, such licensed dealer shall be guilty of an offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court

that such entry was made without his knowledge or consent or through a *bonâ fide* mistake, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment which may extend to three months.

Responsibilities of partners.

11 When a license is granted under this Ordinance to two or more persons carrying on business in partnership, every such person shall be liable for the acts and omissions of the other or others of them, unless the person held liable for the acts of his partner proves to the satisfaction of the court that he is innocent, and that he has in no way directly or indirectly contributed to the breach of the provisions of this Ordinance with which his partner is charged.

Forwarding of proceedings, on conviction of licensed dealer, to Government Agent.

12 When any licensed dealer is convicted of an offence against this Ordinance, the Police Magistrate shall forward a copy of the proceedings to the Government Agent for his information.

Duty of licensed dealer to keep scales on licensed premises.

13 Every licensed dealer shall keep on his licensed premises scales capable of weighing up to 100 lb. at the least, and whenever he is called upon to do so by any officer authorized by section 10 of this Ordinance to inspect licensed premises he shall forthwith weigh all the rubber on his premises, and shall give every facility and assistance to such officer to compare the weight of the stock of rubber upon such premises with the weights thereof as entered in the books which the licensed dealer is required by this Ordinance to keep.

Where discrepancy between weight of rubber in licensed premises and weight according to books.

14 Whenever the weight of rubber found on the premises of a licensed dealer does not agree with the weight which, according to his books, ought to be on such premises, he shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance. Provided that if he satisfies the Government Agent that such discrepancy is due to natural causes, or has arisen through some *bonâ fide* mistake, or owing to some loss, the Government Agent may direct that no prosecution shall be instituted against the licensed dealer.

Where inspecting officer is refused admittance.

15 A licensed dealer shall at any time between sunrise and sunset give admittance to any officer who is authorized by section 10 of this Ordinance to inspect licensed premises, and if any such officer is refused admittance to inspect the licensed premises or the dealer's books, the licensed dealer carrying on business in such premises shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance. Provided, however, that if such officer has reasonable grounds for believing that any offence has been committed upon the licensed premises against this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for him to demand admittance and to inspect the same and the dealer's books, though it be after sunset and before sunrise, and unless he is admitted into the premises forthwith the licensed dealer shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and it shall be lawful for such officer to break into the licensed premises.

Possession of wet rubber reasonably suspected to have been stolen.

16 (1) Any person who is found in possession or charge of any wet rubber which is suspected to have been stolen may be charged with being in possession of rubber which is reasonably suspected of having been stolen; and if such person does not give an account to the satisfaction of the Police Magistrate as to how he came by such rubber, and the Police Magistrate is satisfied that, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, there are reasonable grounds for suspecting such rubber to have been stolen, such person may be convicted of an offence under this Ordinance.

(2) Where any police officer or peace officer finds any person in possession or charge of wet rubber which he suspects to have been stolen, such rubber may be seized; and such person may be brought before a Police Magistrate and charged as aforesaid.

(3) Upon a conviction under this section the Police Magistrate may direct the rubber in respect of which the accused was convicted, if the same has been seized, to be restored to any person who he is satisfied is the lawful owner thereof, otherwise he shall order the same to be forfeited.

(4) An appeal shall lie to the Supreme Court from every conviction or order under this section, the provisions of section 335 of "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1898," notwithstanding.

Punishment for false information and complaints.

17 Whenever any person gives information or makes complaint against another person of an offence against the last foregoing section, and it appears to the Police Magistrate who takes cognizance of the case that such information or complaint was false and was maliciously or corruptly given or made, he may sentence the informant or complainant to pay a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, or to undergo simple or rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month, and he may also award such compensation not exceeding fifty rupees to be paid by the informant or complainant to the person against whom the information was given or the complaint was made, as the Police Magistrate thinks fit.

Punishment for offences.

18 Any person who is convicted of an offence against this Ordinance for which no punishment is specially provided by this Ordinance shall be liable to simple or rigorous imprisonment, which may extend to six months, or to a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees.

Power to frame rules.

19 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make rules and to frame forms for giving effect to the provisions of this Ordinance.

An Ordinance to amend "The Vehicles Ordinance, 1901."

HENRY MCCALLUM.

- Preamble. **W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars "The Vehicles Ordinance, 1901" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"): Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :
- Short title. **1** This Ordinance may be cited as "The Vehicles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1908," and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and Ordinance No. 1 of 1902, intituled "An Ordinance to amend 'The Vehicles Ordinance, 1901,'" shall be read and construed as one Ordinance.
- Substitution of new section with regard to numbering vehicles. **2** For section 11 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted :
- 11.** At the time when any vehicle shall be licensed the proper authority shall see that a number corresponding to that under which such vehicle is entered in the register is painted, branded, stamped, or cut, as he shall consider best, on some conspicuous part thereof, or shall cause such number to be so painted, branded, stamped, or cut, and shall thereafter issue to the applicant the license aforesaid.
- The proper authority shall also, on the deposit with him by the applicant of a sum of one rupee, issue to him a plate to be fixed upon the vehicle as hereinafter provided. The plate shall have legibly painted or marked on it a number corresponding with the number mentioned in the license of the vehicle; and the year in which the license is granted shall be indicated on the plate by means of figures, letters, or colours.
- The plate shall be fixed upon the vehicle in such manner that the year, if indicated by letters or figures, and the number shall be at all times plainly and distinctly visible.
- In the case of carts, the plate shall be fixed on the off or right side of the frame opposite to and within the circumference of the wheel and in front of the axle. But the Governor in Executive Council may by by-law made under section 19 direct that in any specified part of the Island the plate may be fixed in some other position. The plate shall be kept and continued so fixed during the continuance of the license; and the proprietor of the vehicle shall, at the expiration of the period for which the license has been granted, return the plate to the office from which he received it. On such return, if the plate be found to be in good order and condition, the deposit aforesaid shall be returned to the proprietor, or a new plate for a fresh period, if necessary, issued to him free of cost. When any plate has become indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the proprietor shall return the same to the proper authority, and shall be entitled, on making a further deposit as aforesaid, to receive a fresh plate. Any proprietor who fails to return as aforesaid any plate which has become indistinct or defaced shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to the punishment prescribed by section 42 of this Ordinance.
- Amendment of section 42. **3** For sub-section (3) of section 42 the following sub-section shall be substituted :
- (3)** Neglecting or omitting to fix the plate issued under section 11 in such manner that the number thereon shall at all times be plainly and distinctly visible, and in the

case of carts, in the position prescribed by section 11 or by any by-law under section 19; or failing to keep such plate fixed as aforesaid on any vehicle belonging to him or in his charge or care during the continuance of the license relating thereto.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Plant Pests Ordinance, 1907" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"): Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Plant Pests Ordinance, 1908," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance.

Construction.

2 After section 13 of the principal Ordinance there shall be added the following section, which shall be numbered 13 A:

Addition of new section as regards Chairman's signature to notices, &c.

13 A. A notice, order, or authority shall be deemed to comply with the requirements of the last preceding section as regards signature by the Chairman, if the Chairman's signature is affixed thereto by means of a stamp or facsimile, unless it is proved that the Chairman has not in fact authorized the issue of the notice, order, or authority.

Chairman's signature to notice, &c., how affixed.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the contingent expenditure required for the service of the Government of this Island for the year One thousand Nine hundred and Nine, and not otherwise provided for, has been estimated at the sum of Thirty-four million One hundred and Seventeen thousand Six hundred and Eighty rupees: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Rs. 34,117,680 to be charged upon the revenue of this Island for the Contingent Services for the year 1909.

1 A sum not exceeding Thirty-four million One hundred and Seventeen thousand Six hundred and Eighty rupees shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue and other funds of this Island for the Contingent Services for the year One thousand Nine hundred and Nine, and the said

Amount of labour to be supplied under the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884.

2 And whereas by the 31st section of the Ordinance No. 31 of the year 1884, intituled "An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, entitled 'An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Public Thoroughfares in this Colony,'" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to propose the estimates prepared in pursuance thereof, or such of them as to him may appear expedient, in the Ordinance for making provision for the contingent expenditure of the Colony for the ensuing year, to be dealt with in like manner as any other estimate to be so proposed: And it is thereby also provided that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, for the performance of any work or works for which an estimate or estimates may have been so proposed by the Governor, and approved of by the Legislative Council, shall be distinctly stated in the Ordinance enacted for the same, and that the same shall not exceed two-thirds of the whole amount of labour due from the district or districts within which it may be required to be performed: It is enacted that the amount of labour to be supplied under the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be in conformity with the estimates specified in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Treasurer to pay the above at such times as the Governor by warrant shall order.

3 The Treasurer of the said Island shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore-mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the revenues and other funds of the said Island.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance hereof.

4 The said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be herein mentioned; and he shall and may receive credit for the same accordingly.
