The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 22, 1908, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated August 19, 1908.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. G. F. Soysa; Mr. C. A. Harny; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. S. A. Owen.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 25, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1907 to July 31, 1908, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for July.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved that the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during July.

4. Correspondence:—

Letter No. 12 of August 3, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, re private burial ground for use of the Talwatte family.—Read.

5. Supplementary Budget No. 1 of 1908 as approved by the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment on June 27, 1908.

Resolved that the budget be adopted.

6. Recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health:—

That the cesspit previes in the following premises be converted into dry-earth closets:—

(1) No. 146, Castle Hill street.

(2) No. 7, Bahirawakande.

Resolved that the recommendation be approved.

7. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Finance and Assessment.

- (1) That the Kandy convent be charged a fixed sum of Rs. 50 a quarter for water consumed in excess of allowance.
 (2) That the scavenging overseer be retired from September 1, receiving a month's pay in lieu of notice, and that an Inspector be appointed to supervise the conservancy.

Municipal Works.

- (1) That the over-expenditure of Rs. 173·25 for constructing the barrel drain in Mahaiyawa be sanctioned.
 (2) That the estimate (Rs. 53) for culvert across the Slaughter-house road be passed.

Market and Sanitation.

- (1) That the cost of erecting a vegetable market be provided for in next year's budget.
 (2) That a hydrant and hose with couplings be obtained for the market and slaughter-house.
 (3) That a watcher at Rs. 15 a month be appointed to relieve the market-keeper during day and to be on duty at night after 8 P.M.
 (4) That an additional latrine for the market be provided.
 (5) That a latrine for females be put up in Malabar street.
 (6) That an additional cooly be engaged for market work.
 (7) That by-laws 83, 84, and 85 re market coolies' working for hire be strictly enforced.

Health Officer's Report for July, 1908.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been satisfactorily carried out, considering the want of co-operation by the inhabitants and the indifferent manner in which the scavenging coolies do their work; no private employer of labour would tolerate the leisurely and lazy manner in which the work is done for a moment.

Drainage.—The condition of the drains, both superficial and deep, were on the whole satisfactory owing to the flushing they received from the frequent and heavy showers that fell during the month.

Water supply.—Good and sufficient.

Bakeries.—All the bakeries in town were inspected by me in company with the Chief and Ward Inspectors. Bakeries in premises No. 26, Castle Hill street, and 215, Colombo street, were not satisfactory, and cases were instituted against their owners for not complying with the regulations.

Notices were served on all bakery owners to desist from using bakeries as dwelling places, and also to do away with cesspits situated within a radius of 30 ft., (*vide* letter No. 255 of July 21, 1908, and special reports on the subject).

Alleys.—Most of the alleys are in an insanitary condition. Every effort is being made to keep them clean, but not much improvement can be expected till they are taken in hand, one by one, broken down, and rebuilt.

Public latrines.—Clean and well kept, considering the habits of the inhabitants who use these. The scavenging overseers had sent in his papers for retirement. His post is in my opinion the most important one in my Department. I beg to suggest that a responsible officer of the grade of an Inspector be appointed on the fixed establishment.

Cooly lines.—The cooly lines are in a satisfactory condition, except the temporary ones which are over-crowded and ill-ventilated; these should be pulled down and permanent ones substituted.

Market.—The market was clean and well-kept; it is over-crowded on vegetable days, Mondays and Fridays.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept.

Eating-houses.—All fairly well kept; these should be annually registered. A register of common lodging houses should be kept, and by-laws framed as in Colombo.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept. These were inspected by me. I found the articles exposed for sale of good quality and fit for human consumption.

Night soil depot.—Well kept, and the arrangements quite satisfactory except the pond in which the night soil buckets are washed. It is infested with flies and emits noxious odours. During the dry months water is insufficient, and has to be brought in carts. This arrangement is very unsatisfactory, and an effort should be made to have a good supply of water at all times. The pond should be filled, and a cement tank built.

Food supply.—Ample and of good quality. 556 cattle, 78 buffaloes, 109 sheep, and 225 goats were inspected and passed as fit for food. The supply of fresh ripe fruit was good.

Dry fish boutiques.—The dry fish boutiques were found well kept, and the fish sold good and wholesome.

Public health.—The health of the town during the month under review was good. Eight cases of chickenpox, 4 cases of measles, and 7 cases of enteric fever were reported during the month. Of these, 1 case of enteric fever was brought into the hospital from outside the Municipal limits.
