MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office held on Friday, September 18, 1908.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 12, 1908.

Present :—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. G. H. Alston; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; and Dr. David Rockwood.

The Minutes of August 21, 1908, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of August 21, 1908, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that this Council do co-operate with the Principal Civil Medical Officer in maintaining a separate ward at the Infectious Diseases Hospital for Muhammadan female patients suffering from smallpox, and in employing female Muhammadan attendants to serve in such ward.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Chairman do cause a building to be set apart for the detention of Muhammadan female contacts removed to the Segregation Camp.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Chairman do request the Medical Officer of Health—
(1) to employ female inspectors only to search houses in which Muhammadan females live, and in which small-pox patients are suspected to be concealed; (2) to order a female inspector or female Muhammadan attendant to accompany Muhammadan female patients suffering from smallpox to the Infectious Diseases Hospital.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood moved that steps be taken to prevent the employment of deaf persons as drivers of vehicles and rickshaw coolies.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Resolved.—That the matter be referred to the Standing Committees on Finance and Assessment and on Law and General Subjects for consideration and report.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood asked what has been done in the matter of the use of motor horns on vehicles other than automobiles.

The Chairman replied that the question of the use of motor horns and flare lamps has been laid before the Government, and a decision is expected shortly.

6. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood moved that a return be made of the total amount of tax paid under warrants during the year, 1907, and the charges respectively recovered under sections *a, b, c, d,* and *e* of clause 150 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—The return was laid on the table.

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood inquired what steps have been taken to widen Laurie's road, Bambalapitiya, and moved for papers.

The Chairman intimated that the matter is under the consideration of the Works Committee and undertook to make inquiries into the matter of the improvement of the junction of Laurie's road with the Galle road.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood moved that the improvement of the Kollupitiya end of Turret road corner, which was sanctioned by the Council, be included in next year's Budget.

Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood presented a petition from the residents of Polwatta in regard to the insanitary condition of Polwatta ditch.

10. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that the selection of Mr. H. P. Beling of the General Treasury for the post of Head Clerk, Secretary's Department, made in accordance with the Council's resolution No. 13 of August 21, 1908, be confirmed by the Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on October 10, 1908, at 2 p.m.

Present: Mr. L. W. Booth, Chairman; Dr. E. Ludovici; Mr. F. E. Abeysundera; Mr. F. J. de Vos, Mr. E. D. Perera; Mr. M. Makan Markar; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; and Mr. A. C. Hayley.

1. The Minutes of Meeting held on September 12, 1908, were read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. F. Tomalin moved—That the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railways, be requested to consider the necessity for revising the arrangements at the Galle Railway Station so as to give greater convenience to passengers using the railway.

Mr. F. E. Abeysundera seconded.

Resolved—That Mr. Tomalin be requested to submit the details of his complaint in writing, to be forwarded to the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railways for favourable consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. C. Hayley moved—(1) That this Council do draw the attention of the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railways to the delay of nearly 10 minutes that is occasioned to the 2.55 p.m. Down train from Maradana by its having to wait at Gintota to enable the 6 p.m. Up train from Galle to pass, and to request that this be obviated by enabling the Down train to arrive at Galle prior to the departure of the Up train.

The Health Officer's Report for the Month of October, 1908.

Scavenging was well attended to.

Drainage.—The flushing of built drains was not satisfactorily attended to. The bazaar drains require repairs and cementing very badly. Some drains are wanting in fall and cannot be kept clean.

Water supply.—Drinking water from Labodowa was good. The water supply from Bikke to the Fort has proved a failure as some houses up Church street and Middle street get very little or no water.

Alleys were kept clean.

Dairies were well kept.

Bakeries were kept in good order.

Markets were well kept.

Cattle 240 and goats 211 were passed during the month.

Slaughter-house and cattle shed were well kept.

Night soil depot was well kept.

Latrines were well kept.

General Health.—Two cases of chickenpox, two of measles, and two of enteric (one doubtful) were reported during the month. The last (9th) smallpox patient who got the infection from Henry Goonesekera's (who was infected in Colombo, and whose case was reported on August 19) house, was Talpe Liyanage Asena of house No. 16, Minuwangoda, who was removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital on September 18. No other cases occurred in connection with Henry's case. On the 16th instant Asing Atchy of Ettiligoda was removed to the Infectious Disease Hospital, suffering from smallpox of seven days' duration—infection from Colombo. Her two daughters, Kaija Umma and Isa Umma developed smallpox in the Segregation Camp, and were removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital on the 25th and 28th respectively.

The Registrar of Deaths has reported 12 deaths from phthisis and 6 from other tubercular diseases this month, out of a total of 95 deaths. Tubercular diseases count about double the number of deaths from any other disease; the mischief those suffering from this infectious disease can do is not recognized, and healthy members living in the same house expose themselves to the contagious influence in a variety of ways, and the disease continues to spread, claiming more victims than any other infectious disease. The necessity for taking preventive measures as suggested in my quarterly report of December 31, 1897, is apparent and urgent and deserves the serious consideration of the Council. Since my report of 1897 referred to, wherein I drew attention of the Council to the dangers of leprosy, an Ordinance has been passed for the segregation of lepers. I hope the Council will take action in this more infectious and fast spreading disease.
