HEREAS by the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island," it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to make such regulations or orders as may seem necessary or expedient to provide for the steps to be taken in reference to certain cases, and for the following objects amongst other things:-

> In case of any infectious or contagious disease of a malignant nature, whether in man or beast, breaking out or spreading in any town or district of this Colony under circumstances which render it advisable that measures should promptly be taken for securing the public health:

And whereas the disease of cholera has broken out in Kalpitiya and Puttalam, whereby it has become necessary that measures should promptly be taken for securing the public health:

It is hereby notified that the following regulations have been made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him under and by virtue of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, and as applicable to the Revenue Districts of Kalpitiya and Puttalam: and the same are published for general information.

REGULATIONS made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island."

1. The following officers shall be deemed "authorized persons" under and for the purposes of carrying out these regulations in their respective towns or places as hereinafter specified:—

> The Chairman of the Local Board, The Police Magistrate,

The Superintendent of Police,

The Government Agent of the Province,

The Assistant Government Agent of the District / In any place situated in the Revenue of Puttalam.

The Colonial Surgeon of the Province,

Any Government Medical Officer of the District,

In Puttalam Local Board limits.

District of Puttalam outside the Local Board limits.

- It shall be lawful for any authorized person to cause persons infected with cholera in any house or place hereunder described to be removed to some public hospital or other place provided by Government :-
  - (1) In any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale.

(2) In any house or place of public resort.

(3) In any building in which there are no means of isolating the patients from the other inmates, or in any building where the retention of the patient is likely to prove a source of danger to others.

Provided that it shall be competent for any such authorized person as aforesaid, in case the removal of any person so infected in any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale is objected to, and the house or place is not otherwise open to objection, to allow the patient to be retained, on condition, however, that the sale of goods shall not be carried on in such house or place during such time as any person shall remain so infected in such house or place.

Provided further, that it shall be lawful for any such authorized person as aforesaid to allow any patient to be removed to any locality which such patient or his or her friends may choose, and to which the medical authorities of the town or place, if any, do not object, instead of to the public hospital or place provided by Government.

- 3. Except as provided by these regulations, and except as provided by the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove or assist in removing any person suffering from cholera from the house or place in which such person shall be to any other house or place, without the sanction in writing of some duly authorized person.
- It shall be lawful for any authorized person to prohibit the removal for interment of the corpses of persons who have died of any contagious disease along any particular thoroughfare, and to prescribe the thoroughfares leading to the place of interment along which such corpses shall be carried. Information of such prohibition shall be given by notice in writing under the hand of some authorized person, which shall be posted in two or more conspicuous places in the prohibited thoroughfare, and by publication in such other way as may be deemed necessary by such authorized person.
- These regulations shall come into operation from the date hereof, and shall continue in force until the 30th June next, or to such other time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive. Council, shall extend the same.

He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of the Crown Counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Crown Proctor for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of recistoring the security hand.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, December 8, 1893.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 2, 1893.

Present:—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuick, Mayor and Chairman; Major R. E. Firminger; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. H. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; and Mr. C. M. Fernando.

The Minutes of November 3 and December 1, 1893, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of November 3 and December 1, 1893, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the Council do again strongly urge upon the Government the necessity of raising the marshy ground between the Colombo Kachcheri and Cramer's lane, which is a source of great danger to the health of the residents of the neighbourhood, the officers of the Government establishments, and of the pupils attending the schools and colleges in close proximity to the swamps in question."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.

The Chairman stated that any attempt to fill up the marshy ground referred to before entirely altering the existing drainage would, in the opinion of the Superintendent of Works, lead to the submersion of the surrounding lands; as regards the danger to health, the Sanitary Officer had reported that the health of the people living in the neighbourhood of the locality referred to in the motion was not exceptionally affected by its existence.

Mr. Dias expressed a wish to withdraw his motion for the present; this was allowed.

The Council are of opinion that in any case the work of rebuilding should not be commenced until the beach has recovered to a sufficient extent from the extensive denudation to which it has been subjected to allow of the probability of the repairs being durable.

The Council considers that all removal of sand from the Galle Face beach should be stopped, and that licenses

to private individuals should not be issued.

New Zealand—Stephen's Island—Exhibition of a Group Flashing White Light on Stephen's Island, Western. Entrance to Cook Strait.

The following Notice to Mariners, No. 39 of 1893, issued by the Government of New Zealand, is republished for general information, in continuation of No. 222, dated October 3 last, issued by this office.

With reference to preliminary notice No. 35 of 1893, issued by this Department on August 18 last, it is hereby notified that on and after Monday, January 29, 1894, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse which has been erected on Stephen's island, the position and characteristics of which are as follows:

The lighthouse is situated at the northern end of Stephen's island, western entrance to Cook strait, New

Zealand.

The tower is 50 ft. in height from base to top of the

lantern, is built of iron, and painted white.

The light will be a first-order group flashing white light, showing two distinct flashes in quick succession every half minute, and will show over an arc of 293° all round seaward as far as the land will allow.

The light is elevated about 600 ft. above the sea, and, allowing 15 ft. for the height of the eye, it will be visible at a distance of about thirty-two nautical miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

## Rules relating to Quarantine for the Port of Kalpitiya.

- 1. All vessels arriving within the limits of the port with cases of cholera, smallpox, chicken-pox, measles, yellow fever, scarlet fever, and plague on board, or with cases of the aforesaid diseases having occurred on board within ten days previous to date of arrival, shall be placed in quarantine, and anchored in the quarantine anchorage, and kept there until the Port Surgeon grants pratique; and the master or person in charge of any such vessel shall permit the Pilot or Officer acting under orders of the Master Attendant to place her in quarantine, and shall not remove her until duly released.
- 2. Any vessel liable to be placed in quarantine as aforesaid shall be allowed to coal and provision in quarantine, provided the coal or provisions be only handed on to a stage on the outside of the vessel, or into a boat alongside from the shore boats, and removed from there by the vessel's crew; and that no further communication be held between the vessel and the shore boats than is absolutely necessary for that purpose. Provided also, that the men engaged in such shore boats shall not land or go on board of any other boat or vessel without being previously disinfected, if the Port Surgeon considers that to be necessary.
- 3. Whenever the master or any other person in charge of any vessel arriving within the port is unable to produce a clean Bill of Health obtained from the proper authority at the port last visited, such vessel shall, if the Port Surgeon considers it to be necessary, be placed in quarantine of observation in the quarantine anchorage for a period not exceeding forty-eight hours; and the master or person in charge of any such vessel shall permit her to be placed in quarantine of observation, and not remove her until duly released.
- 4. It shall be lawful for the Port Surgeon, under supervision of the Colonial Surgeon, to cause any patient to be landed from any vessel in quarantine for treatment in hospital, or to cause the removal of any person or persons on board of any vessel in quarantine to any place appointed by Government for performing quarantine on shore; and to provide accommodation at such place for as many persons as may be landed. Before any patients are removed to such hospital, the agents of the vessel in which such patients have been brought to the Colony shall give a guarantee for the payment of the expenses of such patient in such hospital, according to the scale approved by the Government.
- 5. It shall be lawful for mails to be landed from any vessel in quarantine, provided they are disinfected previous to being landed to the satisfaction of the Port Surgeon.
- 6. Whenever it is necessary for any vessel arriving within the port to be placed in quarantine, it shall be the duty of the Port Surgeon to request the Master Attendant to place her in quarantine, and thereupon the Master Attendant shall place her in quarantine, and keep her there until requested by the Port Surgeon to release her; and all vessels in quarantine shall fly the quarantine flag.
- 7. All persons on board of vessels in quarantine are hereby prohibited from communication of any sort with the shore or with any boat or vessel in port; and all persons are hereby prohibited from communication of any sort with persons on board of or with vessels in quarantine, without the previous sanction of the Port Surgeon, excepting only such communication as is authorized under the second clause of these regulations.
- 8. All persons performing quarantine on shore under the provisions of the fourth clause of these regulations, and all persons employed in attending upon them, or in enforcing quarantine rules, are hereby prohibited from communication of any sort with any person or thing beyond the quarantine boundary, or from going beyond such boundary; and all persons outside of such boundary are hereby prohibited from going within the boundary, or communication of any sort with any person or thing within the boundary, without the previous sanction of the Colonial Surgeon or Port Surgeon.
- 9. Any person doing anything contrary to the true and plain meaning, or refusing to do or permit to be done anything required, of any of these rules, and all persons aiding or abetting, shall be liable to prosecution under section 11 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1866.
