GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR MARCH, 1894.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

The maha harvest is over. The muttes paddy plants in Siyané Kóralé East and West have continued to suffer from drought, but those in Héwágam kóralé are in better condition.

The preparations for the yala cultivation, which had been retarded by the dry weather, have been facilitated by the rain that had recently fallen.

Other Food Supplies.—Breadfruit, jak, and plantains are fairly plentiful, but the weather has been unfavourable to the cultivation of vegetables. The cocoanut crop throughout the district is small. Medium price, about Rs. 37 a thousand, except in Héwágam kóralé, where it has fallen to about Rs. 29, owing to a decrease in the demand for oil.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

The maha crop has been reaped, the dry weather being favourable for harvesting work. On the whole, the yield was good. The preparations for the ensuing yala have been retarded by the drought. Much-needed rain has recently fallen, and the yala cultivation is in progress. There had been no intermediate cultivation.

Vegetables are plentiful and cheap. Jak abundant in Rayigam and Pasdun kóralés, but not in the Totamunes. Breadfruit source. Cocoanut crop, fair; price Rs. 30 to Rs. 35 a thousand.

NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

The maha paddy crops in Alutkúru Kóralé North and Hapitigam kóralé have been reaped and threshed. The crops of the former were fair, and those of the latter short owing to drought.

The young muttes paddy crops of Alutkúru Kóralé North are doing well. There was no muttes crop in Horitigam kóralé Thankara to the fair Hapitigam korale. The prospects of the few fields cultivated for second maha were not good owing to unfavourable

Jakfruits have been plentiful in both the kóralés, and breadfruit and plantains scarce owing to drought; cocoanut crops are poor; the price of all the above is high. The fields are now being prepared for the yala harvest.

CENTRAL PROVINCE

KANDY DISTRICT.

Udunuwara, Udapaláta, and Uda Bulatgama: maha paddy harvesting nearly over, crops good; yala paddy fields being ploughed. Yatinuwara: maha paddy being harvested, crops good; yala kurakkan and hill paddy chenas being cleared. Tumpane: maha paddy harvesting commenced, crops fair. Harispattu: maha paddy being harvested, crops fair; hill paddy harvested, crops fair; yala kurakkan chenas being cleared. Páta Dumbara: maha hatiyal paddy being harvested; hondarawala and bála-wi blossoming; kurakkan harvested, crops bad. Páta Héwáheta: maha paddy being harvested, maha kurakkan harvested; crops good. Uda Dumbara: maha paddy ripening, crops fair; maha kurakkan harvested, crops bad; yala kurakkan cultivation commenced.

MATALÉ DISTRICT.

Severe drought all over the district, and a large acreage of fields has died therefrom. Fields under streams gave a fair crop; maha chenas have all been reaped, crop was fine.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Kotmalé: paddy reaping continued; three-quarters good, one-quarter bad, owing to drought; chenas being cleared for kurakkan. Uda Héwaheta and Walapane: paddy young plants, kurakkan crops being reaped, half good.

NORTHERN PROVINCE.

JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Heavy rain throughout district on 15th and 16th accompanied by thunder and lightning, and partial showers on 17th, 19th, and 20th, which, it was feared, would interfere seriously with harvesting operations. Very little damage, however, reported, reaping having been mostly over before rain. Threshing of paddy continues in Vadamaradchy East, Punakary, and Karaichy divisions; advantage taken of rain to sow dry grains extensively, and plants looking well; tobacco in plants.

MANNAR DISTRICT.

Paddy and dry grain crops in Mantai division good, and reaped. Paddy in Muchali divisions failed, but dry grain good, and reaped. Dry grain in Mannár island reaped and threshed.

MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Heavy rain in third week saved the paddy in Mulliavalai and Tunukkai, where there will be a fair harvest. Very heavy paddy crop reaped in maritime pattus. Tobacco crops are doing well. General health good.

VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

Heavy rains in third week saved many crops from withering in Kilakkumulai; crops in blossom and ear doing well, especially under restored tanks; fair crop reaped in Panankámam, and reaping continues. In Melpattu and Cheddikulam half to three quarter crop expected; good crop of kurakkan reaped everywhere; gingelly being sown. Health good.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Cultivation for yala commenced, but the want of rain has interfered with the sowings; crop too young to judge of condition.

MATARA DISTRICT.

Crop prospects good throughout the district.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy reaping and harvesting; maha crops: outturn generally good, middling under small village tanks owing to deficient rainfall. Fine grain: small clearings in West Giruwa pattu for yala cultivation; prices steady. Weather: partial drought for three weeks, succeeded by heavy rain towards end of month. Cattle: condition good; supply of fodder average. Health: fever and dysentery among inland villages subsiding.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Crops on 50,000 acres early munmari ripe, and being reaped; crop on whole fair; unirrigable fields suffered slightly from drought; rain middle of this month saved crop.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Munmari crops, which survived the drought, stacked and partly threshed; pinmari lands are being sown. Rainfall during this month not sufficient to moisten the soil for trampling; more rain desirable.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Weather extremely hot; a few light showers fell very unequally distributed; clearing of chena lands proceeded sowing delayed for want of rain; ploughing for yala delayed from same cause; reaping of late maha continued; harvesting will go on until after Sinhalese new year; tanks in Wanni and Hiriyala still very low; maha crop con siderably below average as to crop and cropped area; yala prospects so far not encouraging; people and cattle healthy

CHILAW DISTRICT.

In the Northern and Central divisions maha crop mostly reaped and stacked. Threshing delayed owing to recent rains; crops good; cultivation for yala with dewareddiri paddy being carried on, and preparations for sowing bala-wi commenced in Central division; fine grain in southern division gathered; crop good. Cultivation for yala commenced; sowing operations impeded by recent rains; no fine grain cultivated.

PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Paddy being reaped and stacked in all pattus of the district except Demala hatpattu, in some places of which paddy is earing, and prospects are good and fair. Fine grain gathered in Puttalam and Demala hatpattus; crop moderate; none in Kalpitiya division.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

In the North-Central Province there has been moderate rainfall from the beginning to the sixteenth of this month. Paddy crops cultivated for the maha harvest have ripened, while those cultivated later are maturing and blossoming; condition, generally good; a small extent of paddy chenas and fields are reported to have died; kurakkan crops have been harvested. While late cultivations are being reaped the kurakkan chenas are being cultivated with gingelly. Some tanks are full, while others are half full and quarter full; a few tanks have very little or no water. Cattle murrain prevails in some villages of Hurulupalata.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

Chena crops good throughout the Province, and now being harvested. Paddy extensively sown, and crop maturing.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy maha crop has been harvested throughout the district except in Kolonna kóralé. Second maha crops coming on well in Kuruwiti. Atakalan, Kadawata, and Meda kóralés. Cultivation for yala harvest progressing favourably. It is feared that owing to continued drought many yala fields in Nawadun kóralé and many peramas fields in Kadawata and Meda korales will have to be abandoned. Fine grain: amu, kurakkan, and el-wi reaped and gathered throughout the district. No standing crop on chena lands now; weather favourable for cultivation of yala chenas.

KÉGALLA DISTRICT.

Late maha fields being harvested; crops generally poor owing to recent drought; ploughing operations for yala just commenced in parts of Galboda and Kinigoda kórálés, Beligal kóralé and Three Kóralés and Lower Bulatgama; rain much needed; chenas being prepared throughout the district for cultivation of fine grain; district free from cattle disease.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

> An Ordinance to repeal the Ordinance No. 5 of 1879, and to make certain offences against the Indian Act No. X. of 1887 punishable in Ceylon.

Preamble.

HEREAS by the Ordinance No. 5 of 1879, intituled "An Ordinance to repeal the Ordinance No. 10 of 1862, and to make certain offences against the Indian Act No. VIII. of 1876 punishable in Ceylon," certain offences against the said last mentioned Act are made punishable in Ceylon: And whereas the said Indian Act No. VIII. of 1876 has been repealed by the Indian Act No. X. of 1887, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Native Passenger Ships," which said last mentioned Act came into force in India by notification in the Gazette of India dated the 26th day of May, 1887: And whereas it is expensive father than the content of dient to make punishable in Ceylon certain of the acts and defaults made punishable by the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887: It is therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :-

Repeal of Ordinance No. 5 of 1879. Interpretation clause: Ship. Master.

1 The said Ordinance No. 5 of 1879 is hereby repealed.

Penalty on master bringing passengers without certificates required by Indian Act or from

unauthorized

port.

2 In this Ordinance the word "ship" means any vessel to which the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887 applies.

The word "master" includes every person (other than a

pilot) having command or charge of a ship.

3 The master of any ship who shall bring any passengers to Ceylon, without the certificates required by the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, or who shall bring to Ceylon any passengers from any port or place within British India other than such ports or places as the Indian local Government having jurisdiction in respect thereof shall appoint in that behalf, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees for every passenger conveyed in such ship, or to imprisonment not exceeding one month, or to both.

Penalty on owner or master failing to post up copy of certificates.

4 Any owner or master of a ship bringing passengers to Ceylon which shall not have a copy of each of the certificates required by the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887 posted up in a conspicuous part thereof so as to be visible to persons on board, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month, or to both.

Penalty on master failing to comply with sections 22, 23, and 24 of Indian Act.

Any master of any ship arriving in Ceylon who shall fail to produce to the collector of customs of the port of arrival the statement of passengers required by section 22 of the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, and the additional statements (if any) required by section 24 of the said Act, with the deaths of the passengers duly noted, as required by section 23 of the said Act, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both.

Penalty for failing to supply passengers with prescribed provisions.

6 Any master of a ship arriving with passengers at any port of Ceylon who shall have wilfully and without satisfactory excuse omitted to supply to any passenger during the voyage the allowance of food, fuel, and water-prescribed by any rule made under the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, and for the time being in force, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees for every passenger who has sustained detriment by such omission.

Penalty for excess of number specified in certificate. '7 If any ship has on board any number of passengers which is greater than the number allowed by the certificate required by the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, or if arriving from a port where no certificate could be procured has on board a number of pasengers exceeding the number allowed by the said Indian Act, the owner and master shall for every passenger over and above the number allowed by the certificate or by the said Act, as the case may be, be each liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

Penalty for landing passenger at a place other than that at, which he has contracted to land. 8 If the master of any ship lands any passengers at any port or place other than the port or place at which he may have contracted to land, unless with his previous consent, or unless such landing is made necessary by perils of the sea or by unavoidable accident, the master shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred rupees, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month, or to both.

Principal officer of customs empowered to enter and inspect ships. Penalty for obstructing officer of customs. 9 The principal officer in charge of the customs at the port at which any ship shall arrive in Ceylon carrying passengers from India; or any person authorized by him in writing, shall be at liberty at all times to enter and inspect any such ship and the fittings, provisions, and stores therein; and any person impeding or refusing to allow such entry or inspection shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both.

Ship may be detained until penalties paid.

10 Any ship whose owner or master shall have become liable to a penalty under this Ordinance may, if found within two years in any port of Ceylon, be seized and detained by the principal officer of customs of the port or any person authorized by him in writing in that behalf, until all such penalties have been adjudicated and the payment thereof with all costs has been enforced.

Offences punishable by the police court. 11 All offences against this Ordinance, wherever committed, may be tried by the police court of the district in which the offender is found; and such police court shall have power to sentence the offender to the full amount of the penalty or punishment prescribed by this Ordinance for his offence, notwithstanding that such penalty or punishment may be beyond the ordinary jurisdiction of such police court.

Ship may be seized for payment of fine.

12 If the owner or master of any ship who has been sentenced to pay any fine shall fail to pay the same within the time and in the manner prescribed by the sentence, the police magistrate may, in addition to the means otherwise prescribed by law for enforcing payment of fines or penalties, direct by warrant the amount remaining unpaid to be levied by seizure and sale of the ship, her tackle, furniture, and apparel or any part thereof.

Application of penalties.

13 Any police magistrate imposing any penalties under this Ordinance may, if he thinks fit, direct the whole or any part thereof to be applied in compensation to any person for any detriment which he may have sustained by the act or default in respect of which such penalty is imposed, or in or towards payment of the expenses of the prosecution.

Proof of certificates and statements.

14 Every document which shall purport to be an official copy of any certificate or statement required by the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, and shall purport to be certified as correct by the collector of sea customs at the port of departure of the ship to which such statement or certificate refers, shall, if accompanied by a certificate purporting to be made by the Principal Collector of Customs of this island that such copy has been received from the said port of departure, be admissible, without further proof, as evidence of such certificate or statement and of the contents thereof; and it shall not be necessary to prove that the person so certifying to the correctness of such copy was such collector of sea customs at the said port of departure.

Proof of rules.

15 Any rules published in the Government Gazette by the authority of the Governor, and purporting to be rules made by the Governor-General of India in Council under section 53 of the said Act No. X. of 1887, shall, without further proof, be taken to be the rules in force made by the said Governor-General in Council under the said 53rd section of the said Act.

Schedule contains true copy of Indian Act. 16 The Act set out in the schedule hereto shall be taken as a true copy of the said Indian Act No. X. of 1887, and shall be admissible in evidence for all purposes connected with or relating to this Ordinance, without proof.

SCHEDULE.

Act No. X. of 1887.

Passed by the Governor-General of India in Council.

Received the Assent of the Governor-General on the 24th February, 1887.

An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Native Passenger Ships.

WHEREAS it is expedient to consolidate and amend the law relating to native passenger ships: It is hereby enacted as follows:—

CHAPTER I.

PRELIMINARY.

Extent and application.

Title.

- 1 This Act may be called the Native Passenger Ships Act, 1887.
- 2 (1) It extends to the whole of British India, and applies—
- (a) to all subjects of Her Majesty within the dominions of Princes and States in India in alliance with Her Majesty;

(b) to all native Indian subjects of Her Majesty without and beyond British India; and

- (c) subject to the exceptions mentioned in sub-section (2), to ships carrying as passengers more than thirty natives of Asia or Africa.
- (2) But it does not apply-
- (i.) to any ship-of-war, troopship, transport, or other ship belonging to the Royal Navy or Her Majesty's Indian Marine Service, or
- (ii.) to any other ship for the time being in the service of Her Majesty, or
- (iii.) to any ship-of-war belonging to any Foreign Prince or State, or
- (iv.) to any steamship not carrying as passengers more than sixty natives of Asia or Africa, or
- (v.) to any ship not intended to carry natives of Asia or Africa as passengers to or from any port in British India.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything in sub-sections 1 and 2, the Local Government may, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, declare all or any of the provisions of this Act to apply to sailing ships, or any class of sailing ships, carrying as passengers more than fifteen natives of Asia or Africa, and to steamships, or any class of steamships, carrying as passengers more than thirty such natives.

Commencement.

3 This Act shall come into force on such day as the Governor-General in Council, by notification in the Gazette of India, appoints.

Repeal.

- .4 (1) On and from that day the enactments mentioned in the schedule shall be repealed to the extent specified in the third column thereof
- (2) But all ports, places, and officers appointed, rules, declarations, and exemptions made, bonds executed, directions given, and certificates granted under any of those enactments shall, so far as may be, be deemed to be respectively appointed, made, executed, given, and granted under this Act; and
- (3) Any enactment or document referring to any enactment hereby repealed shall be construed to refer to this Act or to the corresponding portion thereof.

Definitions.

- 5 In this Act, unless there is something repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (1) "Ship" means a ship to which this Act applies:
- (2) "Passenger" means a passenger by a ship who is a native of Asia or Africa of the age of twelve years or upwards and is not on the articles of the ship as one of the crew; but it does not include either a passenger in attendance on a person who is not a native of

Asia or Africa, or a child under one year of age; and, in the computation of passengers for any of the purposes of this Act, two persons of the age of one year or upwards and under the age of twelve years shall be reckoned as one passenger:

- (3) "Long voyage" means, subject to the provisions of this Act, any voyage during which the ship performing it will in ordinary circumstances be one hundred and twenty hours or upwards continuously out of port:
- (4) "Short voyage" means, subject to the provisions of this Act, any voyage during which the ship performing it will not in ordinary circumstances be one hundred and twenty hours continuously out of port:
- (5) "Voyage," when used without the prefix "long" or "short," means the whole distance between the ship's port or place of departure and her final port or place of arrival:
- . (6) "Chief customs officer" means the chief executive officer of sea-customs in any port or place to which this Act applies : and \cdot
- (7) "Magistrate" means a person exercising powers not inferior to those of a magistrate of the second class.

CHAPTER II.

RULES FOR ALL VOYAGES.

Ships to sail only from places appointed by the Government.

- 6 (1) A ship carrying passengers shall not depart or proceed from, or discharge passengers at, any port or place within British India other than a port or place appointed in this behalf by the Local Government.
- (2) After a ship has departed or proceeded on a voyage from a port or place so appointed, a person shall not be received on board as a passenger except at some other port or place so appointed.

Notice to be given of day of sailing.

- 7 (1) The master, owner, or agent of a ship so departing or proceeding shall give notice to an officer appointed in this behalf by the Local Government that the ship is to carry passengers, and of her destination, and of the proposed time of sailing.
- (2) The notice shall be given not less than twenty-four hours before that time.

Power to enter on and inspect ship.

8 After receiving the notice, the officer aforesaid or a person authorized by him shall be at liberty at all times to enter on the ship and inspect her and her fittings and the provisions and stores in her.

Ship not to sail without two certificates.

- 9 (1) A ship intended to carry passengers shall not commence a voyage from a port or place appointed under this Act, unless the master holds two certificates to the effect mentioned in the two next following sections.
- (2) The officer whose duty it is to grant a port-clearance for the ship shall not grant it unless the master holds those certificates.

Contents of certificate A.

10 The first of the certificates (hereinafter called "certificate A") shall state that the ship is seaworthy and properly equipped, fitted, and ventilated, and the number of passengers which she is capable of carrying.

Contents of certificate B.

- 11 The second of the certificates (hereinafter called "certificate B") shall state—
 - (a) the voyage which the ship is to make, and the intermediate ports, if any, at which she is to touch;

(b) that she has the proper complement of officers and seamen;

(c) that food, fuel, and pure water over and above what is necessary for the crew, and the other things, if any, prescribed for the ship by the rules under this Act, have been placed on board, of the quality prescribed by the rules, properly packed, and sufficient to supply the passengers on board during the voyage which the ship is to make (including such detention in quarantine as may be probable) according to the scale for the time being prescribed by those rules;

(d) that the master holds certificate A;

- (e) if the ship is to make a short voyage in a season of foul weather, and to carry upper-deck passengers, that she is furnished with substantial bulwarks and a double awning, or with other sufficient protection against the weather;
- (f) if she is to carry passengers to any port in the Red Sea, that she is propelled principally by steam, and, if she is to carry more than one hundred passengers to any such port, that she has on board a medical officer licensed in accordance with the
- rules under this Act; and
 (g) such other particulars, if any, as may be prescribed by those

Grant of certificates.

12 The person by whom certificate A and certificate B are to be granted shall be the officer appointed under section 7.

Substitute for certificate A.

13 Where the master of a ship produces to that officer either of the following certificates, namely—

 (a) a valid certificate granted by the Board of Trade or by a British Colonial Government, or

(b) a certificate granted under the authority of a British Indian Government, on a date not more than one year before the proposed day of sailing, and in force and applicable to the voyage on which the ship is to proceed, or the service on which she is about to be employed,

the officer may, if the particulars required by section 10 are certified thereby, take the certificate as evidence of those particulars, and it shall then be deemed to be a certificate A for the purposes of this Act.

Survey of ship.

14 (1) After receiving the notice required by section 7, the officer appointed under that section may, if he thinks fit, cause the ship to be surveyed at the expense of the master or owner by competent surveyors, who shall report to him whether the ship is, in their opinion, seaworthy and properly equipped, fitted, and ventilated for the voyage which she is to make:

Provided that he shall not cause a ship holding a certificate mentioned in section 13, clause (a) or clause (b), to be surveyed, unless, by reason of the ship having met with damage or having undergone alterations, or on other reasonable ground, he considers it likely that she may be found unseaworthy or not properly equipped, fitted, or

ventilated for the voyage.

(2) If the officer causes a survey to be made of a ship holding any such certificate, and the surveyors report that the ship is seaworthy and properly equipped, fitted, and ventilated for the voyage, and that there was no reasonable ground why the officer should have thought it likely that she would be found unseaworthy or not properly equipped, fitted, or ventilated for the voyage, the expense of the survey shall be paid by the Local Government.

Discretion as to grant of certificate.

- 15 (1) The officer authorized to grant a certificate under this Act in respect of a ship shall not grant it unless he is satisfied that she has not on board any cargo likely from its quality, quantity, or mode of stowage to prejudice the health or safety of the passengers.
- (2) But, save as aforesaid, and subject to the provisions of subsection (3), it shall be in the discretion of the officer to grant or withhold the certificate.
- (3) In the exercise of that discretion that officer shall be subject to the control of the Local Government, and of any intermediate authority which that Government appoints in this behalf.

Copy of certificates to be exhibited.

16 The master or owner shall post up in a conspicuous part of the ship, so as to be visible to persons on board thereof, a copy of each of the certificates granted under this Act in respect of the ship, and shall-keep those copies so posted up throughout the voyage.

Supply by passengers of their own food.

17 If an officer appointed in this behalf by the Local Government is satisfied that a passenger has brought on board a ship for his own use food of the quality and in the quantity for the time being prescribed by the rules under this Act, the requirements of this Act respecting the supply of food for passengers shall not apply so far as regards the supply of food for that passenger.

· CHAPTER III.

Rules for Short Voyages.

Space to be available for passengers.

- 18 (1) For seasons of fair weather, a ship performing a short voyage shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, contain in the between-decks at least six superficial feet and thirty-six cubic feet of space available for every between-decks passenger, and on the upper-deck at least four superficial feet available for each such passenger and six superficial feet available for each upper-deck passenger.
- (2) For seasons of foul weather, a skip propelled by sails and performing a short voyage shall, subject as aforesaid, contain in the between-decks at least twelve superficial feet and seventy-two cubic feet of space available for every between-decks passenger, and on the apper-deck at least four superficial feet available for each such passenger and twelve superficial feet available for each upper-deck passenger.
- (3) For seasons of foul weather, a ship propelled by steam, or partly by steam and partly by sails, and performing a short voyage, shall, subject as aforesaid, contain in the between-decks at least nine superficial feet and fifty-four cubic feet of space available for every between-decks passenger, and on the upper-deck at least four superficial feet available for each such passenger and nine superficial feet available for each upper-deck passenger.

(4) But in seasons of foul weather a ship shalt not carry upper-deck passengers unless she is furnished with substantial bulwarks and a double awning, or with other sufficient protection against the weather.

Ship taking additional passengers at intermediate place.

- If a ship performing a short voyage takes additional passengers on board at an intermediate port or place, the master shall obtain from the officer appointed at that port or place under section 7 a supplementary certificate stating-
 - (a) the number of passengers so taken on board, and
 - (b) that food, fuel, and pure water over and above what is necessary for the crew, and the other things, if any, prescribed for the ship by the rules under this Act, have been placed on board, of the quality prescribed by the rules, properly packed, and sufficient to supply the passengers on board during the voyage which the ship is to make (including such detention in quarantine as may be probable) according to the scale for the time being prescribed by those rules.

· Provided that, if the certificate B held by the master of the ship states that food, fuel, and pure water over and above what is necessary for the crew, and the other things, if any, prescribed for her by the rules under this Act, have been placed on board, of the quality prescribed by the rules, properly packed, and sufficient to supply the full number of passengers which she is capable of carrying, the master shall not be bound to obtain any such supplementary certificate.

Deaths on voyage.

20 When the ship reaches her final port or place of arrival, the master shall notify to such officer as the Governor-General in Council appoints in this behalf the date and supposed cause of death of every passenger dying on the voyage.

CHAPTER IV.

RULES FOR LONG VOYAGES.

Space to be available for passengers.

Statements concerning passengers.

- 21 (1) A ship propelled by sails and performing a long voyage shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, contain in the between-decks at least twelve superficial feet and seventy-two cubic feet of space available for every passenger.
- (2) A ship propelled by steam, or partly by steam and partly by sails, and performing a long voyage, shall, subject as aforesaid, contain in the between-decks at least nine superficial, feet and fifty-four cubic feet of space available for every passenger.

22 The master of a ship departing or proceeding on a long voyage from any port or place in British India shall sign two statements, specifying the number and the respective sexes of all the passengers, and the number of the crew, and shall deliver them to the officer appointed under section 7, who shall thereupon, after having first satisfied himself that the numbers are correct, countersign and return

to the master one of the statements.

23 The master shall note in writing on the statement returned to him, and on any additional statement to be made under the next following section, the date and supposed cause of death of any passenger who may die on the voyage, and shall, when the ship arrives at her port or place of destination, or at any port or place at which it may be intended to land passengers, and, before any passengers leave the ship, produce the statement, with any additions thereto made, to a person lawfully exercising consular authority on behalf of Her Majesty at the port or place or to the Chief Customs Officer thereat or the officer (if any) appointed there under section 7.

· Deaths on voyage.

24 (1) In either of the following cases, namely,—
(a) if after the ship has departed or proceeded on a long voyage any additional passengers are taken on board at aport or place within British India appointed under this Act for the embarkation of passengers, or

(b) if the ship upon her woyage touches or arrives at any such port or place, having previously received on board additional passengers at any place beyond British India,

the master shall obtain a fresh certificate to the effect of certificate B from the officer appointed at that port or place under section 7, and shall make additional statements specifying the number and the respective sexes of all the additional passengers.

(2) All the foregoing provisions of this Act with respect to certificate B and statements concerning passengers shall be applicable to any certificate granted or statement made under this section

A ship carrying passengers from or to any port in British India to or from any port in the Red Sea shall be propelled principally by steam.

26 A ship carrying more than one hundred passengers from or to any port in British India to or from any port in the Red Sea shall have on board a medical officer licensed in accordance with the rules under this Act.

27 A ship carrying passengers from or to any port in British India other than Aden to or from any port in the Red Sea shall touch at Aden, and shall not leave that port without having obtained from the proper authority a clean bill of health.

Ship taking additional passengers at intermediate place.

Certain ships to be propelled by steam.

Certain ships to carry medical officer.

Ships carrying passengers to or from port in Red Sea to touch at Aden. Bill of health at Aden.

28 The authority at Aden empowered to grant the bill of health shall refuse to grant it if the ship has on board a greater number of passengers than the number allowed for the ship by or under this Act, and may refuse to grant it if the requirements of any rule under this Act are not complied with on board the ship.

Bond where ship clears for port in Red Sea.

- 29 In the case of a ship carrying passengers from any port in British India other than Aden to any port in the Red Sea, the officer whose duty it is to grant a port-clearance for the ship shall not grant the clearance unless and until the master, owner, or agent of the ship and two sureties resident in British India have executed in favour of the Secretary of State for India in Council a joint and several bond, for the sum of five thousand rupees, conditioned—
 - (a) that the ship shall touch at Aden on the outward voyage and there obtain a clean bill of health, and shall do the same on the homeward voyage if the ship continues to carry more than sixty passengers, and
 - (b) that the master and medical officer (if any) of the ship shall comply with, on the outward voyage, and also on the homeward voyage if the ship continues to carry more than sixty passengers, the provisions of this Act and of such rules relating to ships carrying passengers between ports in British India and ports in the Red Sea as the Governor-General in Council may make under this Act.

Power for Local Government to direct medical inspection of passengers.

- 30 (1) The Local Government may direct that no passengers shall be received on board any ship or any ship of a specified class carrying passengers from any port in British India to any port in the Red Sea unless and until the passenger has been inspected, at such time and place, and in such manner, as the Local Government may fix in this behalf, by a medical officer to be appointed by that Government for the purpose.
- (2) If in the opinion of the officer making an inspection under this section a passenger is suffering from any dangerously infectious or contagious disease, the passenger shall not be permitted to embark.

CHAPTER V.

PENALTIES.

Penalty for ship unlawfully departing or receiving passengers on board. 31 If a ship departs or proceeds on a voyage from, or discharges passengers at, any port or place within British India in contravention of the provisions of section 6, sub-section (1), or section 9, or if a person is received as a passenger on board a ship in contravention of the provisions of section 6, sub-section (2), the master or owner shall, for every passenger carried in the ship, or for every passenger so discharged or received on board, be punished with fine which may extend to one hundred rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one month, or with both, and the ship, if found within two years in any port or place within British India, may be seized and detained by a Chief Customs Officer until the penalties incurred under this Act by her master or owner have been adjudicated, and the payment of the fines imposed on him under this Act, with all costs, has been enforced, under the provisions of this Act:

Provided that the aggregate term of imprisonment awarded under this section shall not exceed one year.

32 If a person impedes or refuses to allow the entry or inspection authorized by or under this Act, he shall be punished with fine which

may extend to five hundred rupees for each offence, or with imprison-

month, or with both.

ment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.

33 If a master or owner without reasonable excuse, the burden of proving which shall lie upon him, fails to comply with the requirements of section 16 with respect to the posting of copies of certificates, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one

Penalty for not complying with requirements as to statements concerning passengers and certain other matters. 34 If a master fails to comply with any of the requirements of section 22 or section 23, as to the statements concerning passengers, or wilfully makes any false entry or note in or any such statement, or without reasonable excuse, the burden of proving which shall lie upon him, fails to obtain any such supplementary certificate as is mentioned in section 19, or to report deaths as required by section 20, or to obtain any such fresh certificate, or to make any such statement of the number of additional passengers as is mentioned in section 24, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees for every such offence, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.

Penalty for fraudulent alteration in ship after certificate obtained. 35 If a master, after having obtained any of the certificates mentioned in section 9, section 19, or section 24, fraudulently does or suffers to be done anything whereby the certificate becomes inapplicable to the altered state of the ship, her passengers, or other matters to which the certificate relates, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to two thousand rupees, or with imprisoment for a term which may extend to six months, or with both.

Penalty for failing to supply passengers with prescribed provisions.

Penalty for having excessive number of passengers on board.

Penalty for bringing passengers from foreign port in excess of authorized number.

Penalty for landing passenger at a place other than that at which he has contracted to land.

Penalty for making voyage in contravention of contract with passengers.

Penalty on master and owner of certain ships not propelled by steam.

Penalty on master of certain ships sailing without medical officer.

Penalty for not obtaining bill of health at Aden.

Penalty on master or medical officer of certain ships disobeying rules.

Penalty on master receiving passenger in contravention of section 30.

- 36 If a master without reasonable excuse, the burden of proving which shall lie upon him, omits to supply to any passenger the allowance of food, fuel, and water prescribed by the rules under this Act, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to twenty rupees for every passenger who has sustained detriment by the omission.
- 37 (1) If a ship carrying passengers to or from any port or place in British India has on board a number of passengers which is greater than the number allowed for the ship by or under this Act, the master and owner shall, for every passenger over and above that number, be each punished with fine which may extend to twenty rupees, and the master shall further be liable to imprisonment for a term which may extend to one week in respect of each such passenger:

term which may extend to one week in respect of each such passenger:
Provided that the aggregate term of imprisonment awarded under this section shall not exceed six months.

- (2) Any officer authorized in this behalf by the Local Government, may cause all passengers over and above the number allowed by or under this Act to disembark, and may forward them to any port at which they may have contracted to land, and recover the cost of so forwarding them from the master or owner of the ship as if the cost were a fine imposed under this Act, and a certificate under the hand of that officer shall be conclusive proof of the amount of the cost aforesaid.
- 38 If a ship carrying passengers from any port or place beyond British India to any port or place in British India has on board a number of passengers greater either than the number allowed for the ship by or under this Act or than the number allowed by the license or certificate, if any, granted in respect of the ship at her port or place of departure, the master and owner shall, for every passenger in excess of that number, be each punished with fine which may extend to twenty rupees.
- 39 If the master of a ship lands any passenger at any port or place other than the port or place at which the passenger may have contracted to land, unless with his previous consent, or unless the landing is made necessary by perils of the sea or other unavoidable accident, the master shall, for every such offence, be punished with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one month, or with both.
- 40 If a ship, otherwise than by reason of perils of the sea or other unavoidable accident, touches at any port or place in contravention of any express or implied contract or engagement with the passengers with respect to the voyage which the ship was to make and the time which that voyage was to occupy, whether the contract or engagement was made by public advertisement or otherwise, the master and owner shall each be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.
- 41 If a ship carrying passengers from or to any port in British India to or from any port in the Red Sea is not propelled principally by steam as required by section 25, the master and owner shall each be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with imprisonment which may extend to three months, or with both.
- 42 If a ship carrying more than one hundred passengers from or to any port in British India to or from any port in the Red Sea has not on board a medical officer as required by section 26, the master of the ship shall be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with impresonment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.
- 43 If in the case of a ship to which section 27 applies the master without reasonable excuse, the burden of proving which shall lie upon him, fails to touch at Aden, or leaves that port without having obtained a bill of health under that section, he shall, for every such offence, be punished with fine which may extend to two thousand rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months, or with both.
- 44 If in the case of any such ship as is referred to in the last foregoing section the master or the medical officer, if any, of the ship, without reasonable excuse, the burden of proving which shall lie upon him, breaks, or omits, or neglects to obey, any rule under this Act applicable to the ship, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three months, or with both.
 - 45 If the master of a ship to which a direction under section 30 applies knowingly receives on board the ship any person in contravention of that section, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees for each person so received, or with imprisonment which may extend to three months, or with both.

Procedure.

Adjudication of offences, and levy of fine by distress on ship.

- 46 (1) Offences against this Act shall be punishable by a Magistrate.
- (2) If the person on whom a fine is imposed under this Act is the master or owner of a ship, and the fine is not paid at the time and in the manner prescribed by the order of payment, the magistrate may, in addition to the ordinary means prescribed by law for enforcing payment, direct by warrant the amount remaining unpaid to be levied by distress and sale of the ship, her tackle, furniture, and apparel.

Jurisdiction.

47 For the purpose of the adjudication of penalties under this Act, every offence against its provisions shall be deemed to have been committed within the limits of the jurisdiction of the magistrate of the place where the offender is found.

Authority to institute proceedings for penalties.

48 The penalties to which masters and owners of ships are made liable by this Act shall be enforced only on information laid at the instance of officers appointed to grant certificates under this Act, or, at any port or place where there is no such officer, at the instance of the Chief Customs Officer.

Application of fines.

49 A magistrate imposing a fine under this Act may, if he thinks fit, direct the whole or any part thereof to be applied in compensating any person for any detriment which he may have sustained by the act or default in respect of which the fine is imposed, or in or towards payment of the expenses of the prosecution.

Depositions of absent witnesses.

50 (1) Whenever in the course of any legal proceeding under this Act the testimony of a witness is required in relation to the subject-matter of the proceeding, any deposition which he may have previously made in relation to the same subject-matter before any justice or magistrate in Her Majesty's dominions (including all parts of India other than those subject to the same Local Government as the port or place where the proceeding is instituted), or before any British consular officer elsewhere, shall be admissible in evidence on proof that the witness cannot be found within the jurisdiction of the court in which the proceeding is instituted:

Provided that the deposition shall not be admissible unless-

- (a) it is authenticated by the signature of the justice, magistrate, or consular officer:
- or consular officer;
 (b) it was made in the presence of the person accused; and
- (c) the fact that it was so made is certified by the justice, magistrate, or consular officer.
- (2) It shall not be necessary in any case to prove the signature or official character of the person appearing to have signed any such deposition; and in any criminal proceeding such certificate as aforesaid shall, unless the contrary is proved, be sufficient evidence of the accused having been present in manner thereby certified.

CHAPTER VI.

SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

Information to be sent to ports of embarkation and discharge.

- by the Local Government in this behalf, at any port or place within British India at which a ship carrying passengers touches or arrives, shall, with advertence to the provisions of this Act, send any particulars which he may deem important respecting the ship, and the passengers carried therein, to the officer at the port or place from which the ship commenced her voyage, and to the officer at any other port or place within British India where the passengers or any of them embarked or are to be discharged.
- (2) The Chief Customs Officer, or other officer, if any, appointed by the Local Government in this behalf, at any port or place in British India at which a ship to which this Act applies touches or arrives, may enter on the ship and inspect her in order to ascertain whether the provisions of this Act as to the number of passengers and other matters have been complied with.

Report of Consul.

- 52 In any proceeding for the adjudication of any penalty incurred under this Act any document purporting to be a report of such particulars as are referred to in sub-section (1) of the last foregoing section, or a copy of the proceedings of any court of justice duly authenticated, and also any like document purporting to be made and signed by any person lawfully exercising consular authority on behalf of Her Majesty in any foreign port, shall be received in evidence, if it appears to have been officially transmitted to any officer at or near the place where the proceeding under this Act is had.
- 53 (1) The Governor-General in Council may make rules consistent with this Act to regulate, in the case of any ship or class of ships, all or any of the following matters:—
 - (a) The scale on which food, fuel, and water are to be supplied to the passengers or to any class or classes of passengers, and the quality of the food, fuel, and water;

Power for Governor-General in Council and Local Government to make rules.

(3)

- (b) The medical stores and other appliances and fittings to be provided on board for maintaining health, cleanliness, and
- (c) The licensing and appointment of medical officers in cases where they are required by this Act to be carried;
 The boats, anchors, and cables to be provided on board;
- The instruments for purposes of navigation to be supplied;
- (f) The apparatus for the purpose of extinguishing fires on board, and the precautions to be taken to prevent such fires;
- (g) The provision of appliances for saving life and of means for making signals of distress, and the supply of lights inextinguishable in water and fitted for attachment to life-buoys;
- (h) The functions of the master, medical officer (if any), and other officers of the ship during the voyage;
- The access of between-decks passengers to the upper deck; and (j) Generally to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- (2) The Local Government may, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, make rules consistent with this Act to regulate, in the case of any ship or class of ships,
 - (a) the local limits within which, and the time and mode at and in which, passengers are to be enbarked or discharged at any
 - port or place appointed under this Act in that behalf; and
 (b) the time within which the ship or any ship of the class is to depart or proceed on her voyage after commencing to take passengers on board.
- (3) In making a rule under this section the authority making it may direct that a breach of it shall be punishable with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees, and when the breach is a continuing breach with a further fine which may extend to twenty rupees for every day after the first during which the breach continues.
- (4) The power to make rules under this section is subject to the condition of the rules being made after previous publication.
- 54 The Local Government shall appoint such persons as it thinks fit to exercise and perform the powers and duties which are conferred and imposed by this Act or may be conferred and imposed there-
- The Governor-General in Council may declare, by notification in the Gazette of India, what shall be deemed to be, for the purposes of this Act, "seasons of fair weather" and "seasons of foul weather," and, for sailing-ships and steamships respectively, a "long voyage" and a "short voyage.
- 56 The Governor-General in Council may by order prescribe in the case of any ship or class of ships and for all or any voyages the number of superficial or of cubic feet of space to be available for passengers; and the order shall be alternative to, or override, as the Governor-General in Council may direct, the provisions of sections 18 and 21 so far as they apply to that ship or class of ships.
- 57 (1) The Local Government, with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council, may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, exempt any ship or class of ships from any provision of
- (2) In imposing a condition under this section the Local Government may direct that a breach of it shall be punishable with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees, and when the breach is a continuing breach with a further fine which may extend to twenty rupees for every day after the first during which the breach continues.

3. Submitted correspondence with Government in regard to the regulations contemplated by sections 9 and 10

of the Rabies Ordinance.

The Chairman explained the aim and object of the Ordinance, and promised to draft out a set of regulations, which will be circulated among the Members previous to their being brought up for consideration at the next meeting.

4. Submitted a letter from the Director of Public Works to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarded to the Government Agent, Southern Province, and referred by him to the Municipal Council on the subject of the Moragoda flood-outlet, with a reply from the Contament Agent.

flood-outlet, with a reply from the Government Agent.

Resolved,—That the Council accepts the proposal of the Director of Public Works as to work on a section of the Moragoda-ela during the current year as a first instalment, and hopes that further provision will be made by Government for its completion. The resources of the Municipality are insufficient to undertake the work the Director of Public Works proposes to impose on it. The Council has frequently pressed on the Government the necessity for flood-outlets, and the answer His Excellency the Governor was graciously pleased to give on the last occasion, when his notice was called to it, led the Council to believe that the work will be done at the cost of Government. The Council is not aware that any arrangement was made by which a portion of the cost of the work was to be borne by the Municipality

- 5. Submitted a letter from the Sanitary Officer recommending certain sites for the erection of public latrines. Resolved.—That the matter lie over for the present.
- 6. The Chairman submitted for the information of the Council a statement of works already undertaken for the current year, and of those he proposed to commence at an early date:—

Works undertaken.—(1) Clearing the bed of the Bikke reservoir; (2) paving the channel to the reservoir; (3) building a wall to separate the temple premises from the catchment area of the reservoir; (4) clearing the catchment area of jungle; (5) building a cart shed; (6) building a betel shed opposite the Police Court; (7) building a betel shed by the side of new China Garden road; (8) clearing the Kepu-ela; (9) building a smallpox cart; (10) clearing the rampart walls; (11) building a pigsty and slaughter-house; (12) renewing sea bathing place No. 2; (13) supporting Bone bridge; (14) renewing Podlar street sewer. Bope bridge; (14) renewing Pedlar street sewer.

Works proposed to be undertaken.—(1) Improving the Petigalla-ela; (2) erecting additional latrines; (3) providing additional lamps to Ward No. 2; (4) improving the Municipal Office; (5) repairing the foot-bridge over the Kepu-ela; (6) improving the esplanade.

7. The Chairman informed the meeting of the action he had taken as Government Agent in selecting a site for a general cemetery. The land chosen lay on the east of the Colombo road near the 70th milestone, and consisted of about 12 agent.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 79 of 1894) that depôts containing provisions and clothing for the use of ship-wrecked seamen have been established by the vessel-of-war Eure on Kerguelen, St. Paul, and Amsterdam islands.

Kerguelen Island,—The depôt is situated in the south-eastern part of Jachmann peninsula, Hillsborough bay, near the south-western shore of the eastern lake, and about half a mile northward of the coast, opposite Gazelle basin It is in a cave at the foot of the west cliff of a rocky chasm, running north and south, and its position is indicated by a stone cairn, 111 ft. in height, and about 14 ft. broad at the base, erected on the summit of the west cliff of the chasm:

This cairn, visible from Gazelle basin, is painted black, and shows clearly against the gray rocks which form the background.

The entrance to the cave has been closed by large stones, and on cliff a few yards above it is the inscription "Vivres et Vêtements, Eure, Janvier, 1893."

Approximate position: lat. 49° 16′ 45″ S., long. 69° 40′ .30″ E.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE NEW COLOMBO ICE COMPANY, LIMITED. It is agreed as follows:--

1. Table C not to apply: Company to be governed by these Articles.—The regulations contained in the table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies" Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

2. Power to alter the Regulations.—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles

INTERPRETATION.

3. Interpretation Clause.—In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz.:

Company.—The word ".Company" means "The New Colombo Ice Company, Limited," incorporated or

established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—"The Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

These Presents.—"These Presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of

Directors.—"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a Meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled

*Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company. Seal.—"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month.—"Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and Plural Number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Masculine and Feminine Gender.—Words importing masculine gender only include the feminine, and vice versâ.

PRELIMINARY.

Preliminary.—The Company shall forthwith purchase and acquire from James Weir, Patrick William Gordon Spence, Edward Toby Delmege, Thomas Walker, carrying on business as the Ice Manufacturing Company, and Villiers Alexander Julius, the plant, goodwill, and business of the Ice Manufacturing Company, and that lately belonging to the Colombo Ice Company, Limited, and shall pay for the same the cost price of the stores, stock in trade, and working plant of the Ice Manufacturing Company and the sum of rupees two hundred and ten thousand (Rs. 210,000) for the goodwill of the said business and the several leases of the said premises, of which sum rupees one hundred and forty thousand (Rs. 140,000) shall be paid in cash and rupees seventy thousand (Rs. 70,000) by the issue of fully paid up shares in the Company to the vendors or their nominees.

21. Certificate to be delivered to the first-named of Joint-holders not a Firm.—The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm, shall be delivered to the person first-named on the register.

Transfer of Shares.

22. Transfer of Shares.—Subject to the restriction of these Articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares. The instrument of transfer of any share shall be in writing signed both by transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

23. No transfer to Infant or Person of Unsound Mind .- No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or

person of unsound mind. 24. Form of Transf Form of Transfer.—Shares when transferable may be transferred by any usual common form of instrument of transfer.

25. Register of Transfers,—The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

26. Board may decline to register Transfers.—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them.

27. Not bound to state Reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

Registration of Transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor or his right to transfer his shares, and a fee of rupees two and cents fifty (Rs. 250), or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 26 and 27 and 29 shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of a

The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of Transfer. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the

dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only, if at all, upon the transferee.

31. When Transfer Books may be closed.—The transfer booksmay be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the first General Meeting, also when a dividend is

declared for the three next days ensuing the meeting.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

32. Title to Shares of Deceased Holder.—The executors or administrators of a deceased Shareholder shall be the

only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

33. Registration of Persons entitled to Shares otherwise than by transfer.—Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall upon securing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares, or may, subject to the regulations as to

transfers herein before contained, transfer the same to some other person.

34. Failing such registration Shares may be sold by the Company.—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 33 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event of the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if, in the case of the death of any Shareholder no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money, and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the net proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

35. Exercise of Rights.-No person shall exercise any rights of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the register of Shareholders, and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on

every share in the Company held by him.

SHARES (SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE).

36. The Directors may accept surrender of Shares.—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders

who may be desirous of retiring from the Company.

37. If Call or Instalment be not paid, notice to be given to Shareholder.—If any Shareholder fail to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may, at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder, requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

38. Terms of Notice.—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice)

and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares

in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

39. In default of payment Shares to be forfeited.—If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before anyment of calls or instalment, interest, and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

40. Shureholder still liable to pay Money owing at time of for feiture. - Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture, until payment, at nine per cent. per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

41. Surrendered or forfeited Shares to be property of Company, and may be sold, &c.—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise

disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

- 42. Effect of surrender or forfeiture.—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.
- 43. Certificate of surrender or forfeiture.—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Secretary, that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture; and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

44. For feiture may be remitted.—The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with

such further sum of money by way of redemption money, for the deficit, as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per cent. on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share, bond fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 41 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

45. Lien on Shares.—The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders, for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders, or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls, resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not

have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons, and such lien shall extend to all dividends declared on such shares. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

46. Lien how made available.—Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors, or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

47. Proceeds how applied.—The net proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

48. Certificate of Sale.—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Secretary

that the power of sale given by clause 46 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

49. Transfer on sale how executed.—Upon any such sale, two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such shares.

50. Directors may make Calls.—The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the holders of registered shares in respect of moneys uspaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call. If any Shareholder fail to pay any call due from him on the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of nine per cent. per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment. Any such call may be made payable either in one sum or two or more instalments.

51. Calls, Time when made.—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution author-

izing the call was passed at a Board Meeting of the Directors.

52. Extension of time for pagment of Call.—The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

53. Liability of Joint-holders.—Joint-holders of a share should be severally as well as jointly liable for all instalments and calls in respect thereof.

54. Payments in anticipation of Calls.—The Directors may at their discretion receive from any Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the amount of his shares beyond the sum actually called up, and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof from time to time and at any time thereafter, as exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon, and due in respect of the shares on account of which such advances are made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholder and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, six per cent. per annum.

Borrowing Powers.

55. Power to Borrow.-The Directors may from time to time at their discretion borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed rupees ten thousand (Rs. 10,000); only with the sanction of a General Meeting the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or two Directors to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned.

56. Security for repayment.—For the purposes of securing the repayment of any such moneys so borrowed or raised or for any other purpose the Directors may create and issue any mortgages, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, property, and rights of the Company, both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or by giving, accepting, or endorsing on habile of the Company, and property any promissory notes or bills of exchange. behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange. 57. Assignment of Security.—Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may have been issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

58. First General Meeting.—The first General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than

twelve months after the registration of the Company as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings.—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

60. Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.—The General Meetings mentioned in clauses 58 and 59 shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General

Meetings.

Extraordinary General Meeting.—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, and shall do so upon a requisition being made in writing by one or more Shareholders holding in

the aggregate not less than one-fourth of the issued capital.

62. Requisition to state object of Meetina if Directors for Requisition to state object of Meeting; if Directors fail to call Meeting, Shareholders may do so:—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, shall be signed by the Shareholders making the same, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition the requisition of the requisition the requisition of the requi delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. Seven days' notice of Meeting to be given.—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, day, hour of meeting, and, save as hereinafter provided, the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given to the Shareholders entitled to be present at such meeting in manner hereinafter mentioned, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

64. Business not requiring Notification.—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the auditors, and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever, of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convered.

Notice of other business to be given.—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially

mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

66. Quorum.—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business five or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

67. If Quorum not Present.—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved; but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place. And if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

68. Chairman of General Meeting.—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman, and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

Business confined to election of Chairman while Chair vacant.—No business shall be discussed at any General

• Meeting, except the election of a Chairman whilst the chair is vacant.

70. Chairman with consent may adjourn Meeting.—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall

71. Minutes of General Meeting.—Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

Young at Meetings.

72. Votes.—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present in person or by proxy, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder, and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by at least three members present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company shall be

sufficient evidence of the fact, without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

73. Poll.—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of

any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

74. Poll how taken.—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing, signed by three Shareholders present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting yets in addition to any votes to meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

75. No Poll on election of Chairman or on question of Adjournment.—No poll shall be demanded on the election

of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

76. Number of votes to which Shareholder entitled.—On a show of hands every Shareholder shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share up to ten, an additional vote for every five shares beyond the first ten up to one hundred, and an additional vote for every ten shares beyond the

first hundred up to four hundred, beyond which shares will not carry votes.

77. Guardian of Infant, &c., when not entitled to vote.—The parent or guardian of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or

deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

78. Voting in Person or by Proxy.—Votes may be given personally or by proxy. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in print or in writing, and shall be under the hand of the appointor, or if such appointor is a corporation under its common seal. Except that a corporation being a Shareholder may appoint as proxy a member or officer of its own, no purson shall be expected as a shareholder may appoint as proxy and ember corporation under its common seal. Except that a corporation being a Shareholder may appoint as proxy a memoer or officer of its own, no person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a member of the Company and qualified to vote. Any Shareholder residing in foreign parts may deposit in the office of the Company an instrument of proxy (properly stamped for this purpose) valid for all meetings whatever during such absence and until revocation.

7). When Proxy to be deposited.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote, but no instrument appointing a proxy-shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months from the date of its execution, except that it may be used on the adjournment of the meeting for

which it was originally intended to be given, and except that any member absent abroad may deposit an instrument

of proxy in the office as provided by clause 77.

80. Validity of vote in event of death of Principal.—A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death of the principal or revocation of the appointment, unless notice in writing of the death or revocation shall have been received at the office of the Company twenty-four hours at least before the meeting.

81. Member in Arrear not to vote.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or vote on any question, either personally or by proxy, or as proxy for another Shareholder, except only as proxy for a corporation of which he is a member or officer, at any General Meeting, or upon a poll, or be reckoned in a quorum whilst any call or other sum shall be due and payable to the Company in respect of any shares of such Shareholder.

82. Form of Proxy.—Any instrument appointing a proxy shall be as nearly as circumstances will admit in the

following form :-

83. Objection to validity of vote.-No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy) except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

84. No Shareholder to be prevented from voting by being personally interested in result.—No Shareholder shall be

prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

85. Shareholder should be registered for three months previous to Meeting before he can vote.—Every Shareholder not disqualified by the preceding Articles, who has been duly registered for three months previous to the General Meeting, shall be entitled to be present and to speak and vote at all meetings.

PREFERENCE SHARES AND MEETINGS OF CLASSES OF SHAREHOLDERS.

86. Preference and deferred shares.—Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such guarantee or any such right of preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital or both, or any such other privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, or with any such right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time determine in General Meeting.

87. Resolutions affecting a particular class of Shares.—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders consent on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares, and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it.

88. Meeting affecting a particular class of Shares.—Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member not being a Director shall be entitled to notice thereof, or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing

by any five members personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

DIRECTORS.

89. Number of Directors.—Unless otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of Directors shall

never be less than four nor more than eight.

90. Their qualification and remuneration.—The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least fifteen shares. A first Director may act before acquiring his qualification, but shall in any case acquire the same within one month from his appointment. As a remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding rupees three thousand (Rs. 3,000) annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special cr extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company.

91. Appointment of First Directors, and duration of their Office.—The first Directors shall be Stanley Bois of Colombo, Archibald Forsyth of Colombo, Villiers Alexander Julius of Colombo, the Honourable William Wilson Mitchell of Colombo, William Stephen Tudor Saunders of Dikoya, and Garlick Wilhelm Suhren of Colombo, who shall hold office till the first Ordinary Meeting, when they shall all retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

92. Directors may appoint Managing Director or Directors: his or their remuneration.—One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Managing to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Managing Director or Managing Directors, and the Directors may devolve on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be devolved on any Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration of the company of the company are services.

for such services either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

93. Appointment of Successors to Directors.—'The General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent

General Meeting.

94. Board may fill up Vacancies and add to their number. - The Board shall have power at any time and from time to time before the first Ordinary Meeting to supply any vacancies in their number arising from death, resignation, or otherwise.

95. Duration of Office of Directors appointed to Vacancy.—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors subsequent to first Ordinary Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

96. Two to retire Annually.—At the second Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year two of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 97.

97. Retiring Directors how determined.—The Directors to retire from office at the second and third Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office, but a Managing Director shall not, while he holds such office, be subject to retire by rotation.

98. Retiring Directors eligible for re-election.—Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

99. Decision of Question as to retirement.—In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

100. Number of Directors how increased or reduced.—The Company in General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors and alter their qualification, may also determine to what rotation such. increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

101. If election not made, retiring Directors to continue until next Meeting.—If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place, the place of the retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting, until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

102. Resignation of Directors.—A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by leaving the same at the office, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office shall

become vacant

103. When office of Director to be vacated.—The office of Director shall be vacated (a) if he accepts or holds any office or place of profit (other than Managing Director or Secretary) under the Company; (b) if he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors; (c) if by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting; (d) if he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office; (e) if by notice in writing to the Company he resigns

No Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company, either as vender, purchaser, or otherwise; nor shall any such contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Company or partnership of or in which any Director shall be a member or otherwise interested be avoided: nor shall any Director so contracting or being such a member or so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason only of such Director holding that office or of the fiduciary relation thereby established; but no Director shall vote in respect of any such contract or arrangement, and the nature of his interest where it does not appear on the face of the contract shall be disclosed by him at the meeting of the Directors at which the contract or arrangement is determined on, if his interest then exists, or in any other

case at the first meeting of the Directors after the acquisition of his interest.

105. How Directors removed and Successors appointed.—The Company may by a special resolution remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead, and the Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

106. Indemnity to Directors and others for their own acts and for the acts of others.—Every Director or officer and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him respectively in or about the discharge of his respective duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults, and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer with acts or defaults, and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, shall be liable for any other Director or officer, or for joining in any receipt or other acts of conformity, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortuous act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his respective office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default. unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

107. No contribution to be required from Directors beyond amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares.—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

Powers of Directors.

108. Powers of Directors.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through the Managing Director, or by any agent or agents, secretary or secretaries of the Company in such manner as the Directors shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses as well preliminary as otherwise paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the

Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company.

109. The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient, and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on expecient, and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artizans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject nevertheless to the provisions of any such Ordinance, and of these presents, and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, but no regulation made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to

act or the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

110. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may a point such managers, agents, secretaries, officers, clerks, and servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, officers, clerks, or servants for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and any of the managers, agents, officers, clerks, or servants for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause.

The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may, appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, and sign cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements and other documents on behalf and for the purposes of the Company, also proxy or proxies

to any proctor or proctors.

112. The Directors shall also have power to appoint an agent or secretary, or agents or secretaries, and to enter into agreements in connection therewith, also to appoint a proctor or proctors, attorney or attorneys, and whatever other officers they may consider necessary to assist in carrying on the business of the Company, and from time to time to revoke such appointments. They shall from time to time determine as they shall see fit the duties of the agent or secretary, or agents or secretaries, and of the Managing Director and other officers, and may delegate to him or them all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained, and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of such agent or secretary, or agents or secretaries, and Managing Directors or other officers. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any agent of the Company or other person except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and the conditions under which they may be so used, and such limitations and conditions shall be an essential part of the powers so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers. Directors shall also have the power to bring or defend any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings in the

name of the Company.

113. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other Company or individual or individuals. or for the sale or disposal of the business, estate, and effects of the Company or any part thereof, respectively, to any Company or person upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose, and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall thereupon

be dissolved.

114. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting.

Proceedings of Directors.

115. Meetings of Directors. - The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined two Directors shall be a quorum.

116. A Director may summon Meetings of Directors.—A Director may, and the Secretary at the request of

any Director shall, at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

117. Who is to preside at Meetings of Board.—The Board may elect a Chairman and Deputy Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which they are to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman if one has been elected and is present, or in his absence by the Deputy Chairman, but if the offices of Chairman and Deputy Chairman be vacant, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman and Deputy Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

118. Questions at Meetings how decided.—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall

be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote

in addition to his vote as a Director.

- 119. Board may appoint Committees.—The Board may delegate any of their powers to Committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board may think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such Committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes; but every Committee so fo med shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board.
- 120. Acts of Board or Committees valid notwithstanding informal appointment.—The acts of the Board and of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.
- Regulation of Proceedings of Committees.—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and be not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committees respectively or any regulation imposed by the Board.
- 122. Resolution in writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.
- 123. Minutes. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, videlicet:-

(a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.

(b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors, and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.

- (c) Of the proceedings of all General Meetings.
 (d) Of the proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.
- 124. Signature of Minutes of Proceedings and effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or B and Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, and all minutes purporting to have been signed by the Chairman of any such General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be prima facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction of occurrences of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as chairman.

 125. When the business of the Company shall commence.—The Directors shall be at liberty to carry on the business of the Company as soon as they shall think fit, notwithstanding the whole capital may not have been subscribed for a taken.

subscribed for or taken.

COMMON SEAL.

Common Seal.—The Directors shall provide a common seal of the Company and shall provide for the safe custody thereof, and it shall never be used except by the authority of the Directors previously given and in the presence of two Directors at the least, who shall sign every instrument to which the seal is affixed, and every such instrument shall be countersigned by the Secretary or some other person appointed by the Directors.

ACCOUNTS.

127. Accounts.—The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company, and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

128. Inspection of Accounts.—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent,

and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account, or book, or document of the Company except as conferred by the statutes, or authorized by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

129. Balance Sheet.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities

of the Company made up to the end of the previous year.

130. Report to accompany Statement.—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report of the Directors as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

131. Copy of Bulance Sheet to be sent to Shareholders.—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at or posted to the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

132. Declaration of Dividend.—The Company may in General Meeting from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares, but no dividend shall be payable except out of net profits. No larger dividend shall be declared than is recommended by the Directors. The Company in General Meeting may however declare a smaller dividend.

133. Interim Dividend.—The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to

be paid to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend on the then current year.

134. Reserve Fund.—Previously to the Directors recommending any dividend they may set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as reserve fund, and shall invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit, or place the same in fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

135. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portion as they think fit of the

reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing, or maintaining, or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair, or renewal, or extension of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

Unpaid Interest or Dividend not to bear Interest .- No unpaid interest or dividend shall ever bear interest

against the Company.

- 137. No Shareholder to receive Dividend while Debt due to Company.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares or otherwise
- Directors may deduct Debt from the Directors may deduct from the dividend payable to
- any Sharedolder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

 139. Notice of Dividend; Forfeiture of Unclaimed Dividend.—Notice of all interest or dividends to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto; and all interests or dividends unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years, after notice thereof is given, may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the bornels of the Company, and if the Directors think for many be conflicted by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of the Company, and if the Directors think fit may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

140. Loss of Dividual Warrent.—The Company shall not be responsible for the loss of any chaque, dividend

warrant, or post office order which shall be sent by post in respect of dividends.

141. Shares held by a Firm. – Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

142. Joint-holders other than a Firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly other than a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

AUDIT.

143. Accounts to be audited.—The accounts of the Company shall once at least in every year be examined and the correctness of each balance sheet ascertained by, one or more auditor or auditors

144. Auditors. The number of auditors, the person or persons to fill the office of auditor or auditors, and the remuneration of the auditor or auditors and his or their term of office may from time to time be determined and

varied by the Company in General Meeting.

145. Appointment of First Auditors.—Subject to the last Article the Directors may appoint the first auditor or auditors to audit the accounts of the Company until the first Ordinary General Meeting, when he or they shall

retire. but shall be eligible for re-election, and the Directors may fix his or their remuneration.

146. Retirement of Auditors.—The auditor or auditors for the time being shall retire at the first Ordinary General Meeting in every year, but shall be eligible for re-election. If on the retirement of an auditor as aforesaid no person shall be appointed his successor by the Ordinary General Meeting at which his retirement shall take place, he shall be considered as we elected for most by the Ordinary General Meeting at which his retirement shall take place, he shall be considered or re-elected for another year, although no resolution to that effect shall be passed or proposed. If any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of auditor the Directors shall forthwith fill up same.

147. Duty of Auditors. - Every auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.

148. Accounts to be open to Auditors.—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the auditors for the purpose of audit.

Notices.

149. Notices how authenticated.—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the agent or secretary, agents or secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so

150. Shareholders to register Address.—Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

151. Service of Notices. — A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by sending through post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode; and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless and until his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the agent or secretary, or agents or secretaries of the Company their own or some other address.

152. Notice to Joint-holders of Shares other than a Firm.—All notices directed to be given to a Shareholder shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled other than a firm, be given to whichever of such persons is named

respect to any snare to which persons are jointly entitled other than a helit, be given to whichever of such persons are first in the register of Shareholders, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

153. Date and Proof of Service.—Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address; and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post office or post box; and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any

notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

154. Non-resident Shareholders must register Addresses in Ceylon.—Every Shareholder residing out of Ceylon shall name and register in the books of the Company an address within Ceylon at which all notices shall be served upon him, and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named and

registered such an address he shall not be entitled to any notices.

155. Period for Notices.—Where a given number of days notice, or a notice extending over any other period is required to be given, the day of service shall, but the day upon which such notice will expire shall not be included on such number of days or other period.

ARBITRATION. 156. Directors may refer Disputes to Arbitration.—Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other Company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as they may think fit.

EVIDENCE.

157. Evidence in Action by Company against Shareholders .- On the trial or hearing of any action of suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was when the claim arose on the register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company. and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS ON WINDING UP.

Distribution.—If the Company shall be wound up, and there shall be any surplus assets after payment of all debts and satisfaction of all liabilities of the Company, such surplus assets shall be applied first in repaying to the holders of the preference shares (if any) the amounts paid up or reckoned as paid up thereon, and the balance in repaying to the holders of the ordinary shares, the amounts paid up or reckoned as paid up on such ordinary shares. If there shall remain any surplus assets after repayment of the whole of the paid up capital, such surplus assets shall be divided among the Shareholders in proportion to the capital paid up or reckoned as paid up on the shares which are

be divided among the Shareholders in proportion to the capital paid up or reckoned as paid up on the shares which are held by them respectively at the commencement of the winding up.

159. Purchase of Company's Property by Shureholders.—Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, or whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

160. Payment in Specie and vesting in Trustees.—If the Company shall be wound up the liquidator, whether voluntary or official, may, with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator with

of the assets of the Company, in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator with the like sanction shall think fit.
