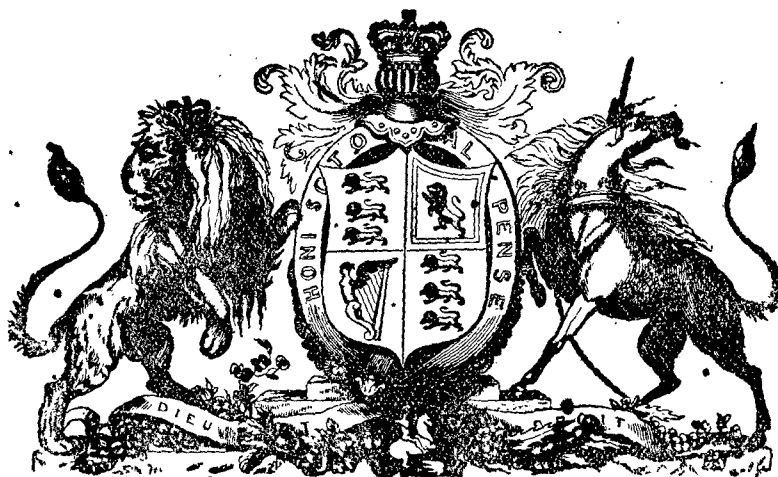

PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 32 of "The Pawnbrokers' Ordinance, 1893," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall have effect only within such limits as the Governor shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the said Ordinance into effect within the limits of the District of Colombo, in the Western Province, defined and set out in the schedule hereto:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby appoint that the said Ordinance shall, as from and after the 2nd day of April, 1894, be brought into effect within the limits of the District of Colombo, in the Western Province, as defined and set out in the schedule hereto.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Second day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.
