WHEREAS a road 4 miles in length, leading from Golahenwatta to Yatawatta, in the District of Kandy, Central Province, has been partially constructed by the proprietor of the estate called Yatawatta :

And whereas such proprietor has applied to the Governor that such road may be treated as a branch road constructed under the Branch Roads Ordinance, No. 14 of 1896, and it is expedient to Us to declare that the said road shall be treated as a road made under the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 41 of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said road 4 miles in length, leading from Golahenwatta to Yatawatta, in the District of Kandy, Central Province, partially constructed by the proprietor of the state called Yatawatta, shall, as from and after the date hereof, be treated as a road made under the said the Branch Roads Ordinance, No. 14 of 1896.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1903, it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or should a police force have been already established there to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district or additional police to be employed there :

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereto annexed, it is desirable to quarter police in the said district :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 4 (1) of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein the said district in the Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one sergeant and six constables be quartered in the said district in the said Province, as from and after March 15, 1909.

And We do hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth Class of the Civil Service, will also be held on April 20, 1909, as well as at the Kandy Kacheheri.

17. These conditions only apply to that part of the Wannu which will not be benefited by the irrigation works known as the Karaichchi Scheme.

**BY-LAW REFERRED TO.**

The use of the following nets commonly called maha-del or karawali, vali-del or valivalai, rena-del or renavalai is hereby prohibited in the Taladuwa channel, the resthouse channel, and the Mankuli channel north of a line in continuation of the line of the road to St. Mary's church, Pitipana, and south of a line due west of Kuttidwva.

SCHEDULE I.

RULES.

1. Fishing by rod and line in lakes and streams and rivers is permitted throughout the year.
2. Fishing by kraals in such waters is prohibited during February, March, and April.

#### BY-LAWS AS AMENDED.

26. It shall not be lawful for any person who is not a licensed butcher within the Municipality to slaughter any cattle unless he shall have obtained a special license from the Chairman, and any person obtaining such special license shall not slaughter except at the place named in such license or under any conditions therein set forth. The application for such special license shall contain information with reference to the animal similar to that contained in Form A prescribed in the schedule to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, and shall be accompanied by a report from a police or municipal officer or headman of the applicant's district certifying that the animal belongs to the applicant. For this special license a fee not exceeding rupees five shall be charged.

39. It shall not be lawful for any person who is not a licensed butcher to slaughter any sheep, goat, or pig without a special license from the Chairman or contrary to the tenor of such license, and a fee not exceeding one rupee and fifty cents shall be levied for every such license. Provided that in cases of emergency, and where the slaughtering is not intended for purposes of sale, any municipal inspector or the officer for the time being in charge of any police station may issue the license, and shall recover the fee on behalf of the Council, and pay it over to the Secretary.
