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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, January 15, 1909.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 8, 1909.

Present :—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. F. C. Allen; and Mr. G. H. Alston.

The Minutes of Special Meeting and General Meeting of December 18, 1908, having been printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of Special Meeting and General Meeting of December 18, 1908, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel asked what the existing rules are for the granting of water service, extra taps, &c., to boarding houses and clubs, and moved for a return showing the number of boarding houses and clubs having metered and unmetered supply of water, and for papers regarding the applications made for water service by No. 12, Green path, and No. 9, Union place.

The Chairman replied that there were no rules other than those published, and that the return and papers asked for will be furnished.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel asked why the Enteric Hospital, for which money was specially voted, so far back as July last year, has not yet been completed and opened to the public, and moved for papers.

The Chairman intimated that the hospital will be opened on the 16th instant, and that the papers will be laid on the table.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that this Council desires to urge on Government the necessity of placing the sanitation of the rural areas outlying the Municipal limits of Colombo in charge of Health Officers and providing special facilities for the isolation and treatment of patients.

Resolved—That this item be taken with item No. 6 on the agenda.

4. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of Members for the four Standing Committees for 1909, in terms of section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman as follows :—

- (1) The Committee on Law and General Subjects: Major A. W. de Wilton, Mr. H. Tiruvilangam, and Mr. L. B. Fernando.
- (2) The Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation: Sir Allan Perry, Kt., Mr. H. L. de Mel, and Dr. David Rockwood.
- (3) The Committee on Finance and Assessment: Mr. H. A. Jayewardene and Mr. A. Fairlie. For the third seat on this Committee it was found that Messrs. Arthur Alvis and G. H. Alston had an equal number of votes, and as Mr. Alston, as well as other Members, had left the meeting before the result was declared, it was resolved that the election of the third Member be postponed for the next meeting.
- (4) The Committee on Municipal Works: Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. E. G. Jayewardene.

5. Reappointment of the following Special Committee :—

Widening, improvement, and extension of Maradana road.

The Chairman moved that the Special Committee appointed to deal with the question of the widening, improvement, and extension of Maradana road be reappointed, and that Messrs. Cooper, Templeton, and E. G. Jayewardene, if willing to serve, be elected thereto *vice* Messrs. Lovegrove, Warren, and C. Perera.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

6. Letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 201 of December 4, 1908, *re* prevalence of Enteric Fever in the suburbs and suggesting the inclusion of Wellawatta within Municipal limits was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved—That Council do go into Committee.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the Council is of opinion that Wellawatta should be included within the Municipal limits, and that arrangements be made with all convenient speed for a due supply of water to this suburb. Dr. David Rockwood seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to the Works and Sanitation Committees for consideration and report. Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded.

Mr. G. H. Alston moved as a further amendment that this Council confirms the resolution passed at the meeting held on August 21, 1908, that "it is inopportune to recommend to Government, under existing circumstances, the inclusion of Wellawatta within Municipal limits and that the consideration of the matter be deferred," and considers that it is the duty of the Government to effectively secure the proper sanitation of villages adjoining Municipal limits. Mr. F. C. Allen seconded.

The further amendment was put to the meeting, and on a show of hands being taken the Chairman declared the further amendment carried by 8 to 5 votes.

The Council then resumed, and it was proposed that the resolution passed in Committee be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried, Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. A. Fairlie, and the Chairman dissenting.

7. Letter from the Inspector-General of Police, No. 5,148 of December 22, 1908, *re* cattle seizing in Colombo, was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

The Chairman moved that as a temporary measure and as a step towards the transfer to the Police Department of the entire duty of regulating the traffic and preventing obstructions, the proposals of the Inspector-General of Police be approved.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

8. Papers *re* selection of an Assistant Superintendent for the Fire Brigade were brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

The Chairman moved that Mr. P. H. Lanaway be appointed Assistant Superintendent, Fire Brigade, from the date on which he leaves England, and that the Chief Officer of the London Fire Brigade be thanked for his kind assistance in the matter.

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.—Carried.

9. Chairman's memorandum on the subject of "Annual Value" was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the matter be referred to the Law Committee and to the Council's Lawyers.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.—Carried.

10. Papers *re* meat stall at No. 104a, Barber street, were brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved—That the recommendations of the Ward Member be adopted, and that the stall be closed.

11. Application from Mr. R. Skelton, Municipal Engineer, for six months' leave to proceed to England from April 2, 1909, was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

The Chairman moved that the leave applied for be granted, and that Mr. Ingram be appointed to act as Municipal Engineer during Mr. Skelton's absence, and further that the matters referred to in paragraphs 5 and 6 of the Municipal Engineer's letter No. 1,519 of December 17, 1908, be referred to the Works Committee for a recommendation, as well as the question of the appointment of a Wateworks Engineer.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

12. To adopt the revised assessments of the following Wards for 1909, viz., Fort, Pettah, Crown lands.

The Chairman moved that the revised assessments of the following Wards, viz., Fort, Pettah, Crown lands be adopted for 1909, subject to such alterations as the Assessment Committee may from time to time consider necessary.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.—Carried.

13. Authority required by Audit to pass the payments as per further remark No. 7 on the accounts for November, 1906.

The Chairman moved that the necessary authority be granted.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

14. Excess of leave over 30 days granted to Mr. H. R. Wickremesinghe, owing to ill-health, on December 7, 8, and 9, 1908.

The Chairman moved that the leave granted by him be confirmed.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

15. Report of the Resident Engineer of the Colombo Drainage Works for the month of November, 1908, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

16. City Analyst's reports on the Town water for December, 1908, was printed and laid on the table

17. Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to December 31, 1908, and Progress Report of Work done for December, 1908, were not ready.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 23, 1909, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 19, 1909.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. W. D. Gibbon; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardana; Mr. S. A. Owen; Mr. W. C. Price.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 19 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1907 to December 31, 1908, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for December.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December.
- (e) The Reservoir Reading for December.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during December.

The Chairman said that Bakery by-law 298 was not as clear as it might be, and proposed that the Colombo Municipal Council by-laws *re* bakeries and eating houses be adopted at once.

Mr. Wijegoonewardane moved that the by-laws be referred before adoption to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Messrs. Beven, Jonklaas, and the mover.

This was seconded by Mr. Saravanamuttu and carried.

4. (a) Letter No. 21 of December 23, 1908, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* Opium Licenses.—Read.

(b) Letter No. 901 of December 22, 1908, from the Police Magistrate *re* inadequate punishment inflicted in a prosecution before the Police Court of Kandy for concealment of a case of smallpox.

Resolved—That the explanation of Mr. Rajaratnam, the Magistrate, who tried the case, be circulated.

(c) Letter No. 6,022 of January 4, 1909, from the Postmaster, Kandy, *re* Telephones.

Mr. Beven moved that the Council is not prepared for the present to incur the expense of having a Telephone Service at the Municipality. Mr. Price seconded.

On the motion being put to the house there were 4 for and 4 against the motion.

The Chairman being unwilling to exercise his right of giving the casting vote, the matter was put off for the next meeting, when all the members were likely to be present.

(d) Letter of January 14, 1909, from the Accountant *re* surplus balances.

Mr. Jonklaas moved that a sum of Rs. 20,000 from No. 1 Account and Rs. 25,000 from No. 2 Account be placed in the Mercantile Bank in the fixed deposit for a period of twelve months.

Mr. Wijegoonewardane seconded.—Carried.

5. Papers *re* sick leave to be granted to Mr. J. S. A. Goonewardane, Supervisor of Conservancy.

The Chairman moved that Mr. Goonewardane be given six weeks full-pay leave from January 1.

Mr. Wijegoonewardane seconded.—Carried.

6. Papers *re* increase of salary to the Accountant.

Mr. Wijegoonewardane moved that the services of the Accountant be retained, and that he be granted at once his maximum salary of Rs. 1,000 per annum.

Health Officer's Report for December, 1908.

Scavenging.—The scavenging was unsatisfactorily performed during the latter half of the month.

Water supply.—Good, but not sufficient.

Drainage.—Both superficial, and barrel drains were regularly flushed and cleaned.

Alleys.—These were kept in as sanitary a state as possible.

Bakeries.—Clean and well kept. All the bakers were prosecuted for the breach of by-laws Nos. 298 and 299. The cases were postponed for February 6, 1909, pending the decision of the Supreme Court.

Cooly lines.—Clean and well kept. All the temporary ones should be demolished without delay.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—These were paid surprise visits. They are in good order, and the articles exposed for sale fit for human consumption.

Market.—Clean and well kept.

Laundries.—Well kept.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept.

Latrines.—Clean and well kept.

Night soil depot.—In good order.

Food supply.—Good and ample. 537 cattle, 108 buffaloes, 114 sheep, and 206 goats were inspected and passed as fit for food.

Public health.—The health of the town during the month has been satisfactory; two cases of enteric fever four cases of measles, and six cases of chickenpox were reported. There was one case of smallpox; Mr. D. M. Dias, a clerk employed at the Kandy Kacheheri, was the victim. He was removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital on the 22nd. The patient's mother was removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital with a severe attack of smallpox on November 26; his nephew was removed on the day following of the same disease. Both these patients resided in a house in Katukele. Mr. Dias was not an inmate of this house. He lived in a house in Trincomalee street, known as the "Clivedon Boarding House"; he attended the Kacheheri on the 19th ultimo; on the 20th he took ill. Inspector Abeyaratne saw him on the 21st; he then had fever and a severe headache.

This was reported to me by him on the same evening. On the next morning he reported that Mr. Dias had developed a rash. I proceeded to the spot and found it to be a case of smallpox. I ordered the patient to be removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital and took all the necessary steps.
