### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, December 18, 1908.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 12, 1908.

Present:—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. R. S. Templeton, Mr. L. B. Fernando, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alwis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; and Mr. F. C. Allen.

The Minutes of General Meeting of November 20, 1908, having been printed, and a copy thereo having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of November 20, 1908, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader presented a petition from the dhobies in Norris road, Butchers' lane, and Maliban street, Pettah, praying for a grant to them of a suitable plot of ground, in consequence of the site now used by them having been acquired by Government, and moved that it be referred to the Works Committee. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.

After discussion the motion was withdrawn with the permission of the Council,

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved for a reduction of the fees chargeable for special licenses to slaughter cattle, sheep, and goats, as set down in the Chairman's memorandum relating to the subject (vide extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of November 5, 1908). Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.

Resolved-That the matter be referred back to the Standing Committee for consideration.

3 to 5. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 4, 1908, on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 8, 1908, and on Municipal Works of December 9, 1908, were brought before the Council.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 4, 1908.

- (6) Supplementary Estimate for Lake dredging, 1908, Rs. 2,000; to transfer the amount from savings under vote No. 150, Scavenging.
  - Passed against the Scavenging Vote.
- (7) Report and estimate in connection with the improvement of the town water supply; to advise as to the manner in which the necessary funds should be provided.
  - The Committee is satisfied that the provision of Rs. 302,500 made in the budget for interest and sinking fund on loans is sufficient to cover the cost of a Waterworks loan, and recommends that a local 4 per cent. loan for a sum not exceeding Rs. 500,000 be raised at the earliest possible date
- (8) Letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re taking over of the Labugama bungalow by the Municipality and paying a compensation of Rs. 582 57 to the Chairman, Provincial Road Committee.
  - The Committee recommends the payment of Rs. 582.57 as compensation to the Provincial Road Committee for buildings and furniture taken over.
- (10) Letter from the Municipal Engineer No. 1,395 of November 24, 1908; for authority to continue Waterworks Advance Account (hitherto kept by the Director of Public Works) on the lines of the General Store Advance Account.
  - Recommended that authority be given to continue the Waterworks Advance Account on the lines of the General Store Advance Account to an amount not exceeding Rs. 50,000.
- (12) Chairman's memorandam on the subject of "Annual Value."
  - The Committee recommends the amended definition of Annual Value" for the approval of the Council.
- (13) Chairman's memorandum re licensing of private markets.
  - The Committee approves the proposed scale, except in the following cases:-
  - Bakeries should be Rs. 12: rice stores should be Rs. 20. The question of a fee on "fruit and vegetables" to be laid over, pending consideration by the Sanitation Committee. A fee on common lodging houses should also be imposed according to extent of accommodation.
- (18) Application from the Draughtsman to the Assessor for a rickshaw allowance. Recommended.
- (22) Waiving of cost of No. 8a, Front street.

  May be waived.
- (23) Striking off properties Nos. 19c/1, 20g, and 24a, Drieberg's lane, from the assessment books from 2nd quarter, 1907, acquired by Government.

  May be struck off.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 8, 1908.

- (4) Papers re supplying of bicycles to Supervisors, Health Department.
  - Recommended that four cushion tyred bicycles, at a cost not exceeding Rs. 150 each, be procured for the use of the night supervisors when on duty.
- (5) Papers re revision of market rents.
  - The new rates are recommended as being more in conformity with the rents new ruling in Colombo than the present scale, and as tending to secure greater uniformity in rents in the several public markets. (See A.)
- (8) Chairman's memorandum re licensing of private markets.
  - The Committee is of opinion that in view of the expressed intention of the Council to undertake the proper supervision of the food supply of the town, all private markets requiring such supervision should pay a suitable fee by way of contribution to the cost involved and recommends the imposition of the following license fees under section 280 of the Municipal Ordinance, viz.:—

5. The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 9, 1908, be adopted.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Resolved—That Council do resume and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted.

- Mr. C. P. Dias moved that paragraphs 1 and 2 of the report be adopted, and that paragraph 3 be laid over for further consideration.

7. Appointment of a Superintendent for the Cattle Mart and Quarantine Station was brought before the Council.

The Chairman moved that Mr. A. M. Fernando be appointed.

Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

8. Supplemental Budget for 1908 was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

- 9. Further correspondence on the subject of additional sources of Municipal revenue was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
- Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the recommendations of the Finance Committee be adopted, and with regard to the suggestion of the employment of an additional valuer the Council notes that it will be more satisfactory to the Government if an independent gentleman of experience in local values be associated with the Council's assessing officers in the work of the revision of the assessment roll, and recognizes the importance of adopting any measures which are calculated to strengthen the confidence of the public in the matter of assessment and that the Council gladly agrees to the association of the gentleman named by His Excellency in the work of the assessment of the Government property, which is about to take place, as well as in all cases in which the Council's expert requires assistance in the matter of local values; and further that the thanks of this Council are due to His Excellency for the suggestion and for the offer to facilitate its adoption.

- Mr. H. A. Jayewardene moved that this Council while thanking the Government for the facilities promised in their letter No. 191 regrets that they have not seen their way to confirm the Council in the control of the public streets which has been vested in them by the Municipal Ordinance.

William Jackson,-" Improvements in apparatus for drying tea-leaf, or other produce."

Abstract.—Air is forced by a fan or other blower, first through the air heater and then through the drying chamber. The air supply to the fan is taken from a casing round the sides and the top of the drying chamber. The sides of the casing are made removable preferably by being made flexible so that they can be rolled on rollers. A bye pass from the air supply to the heater may be made when required for forcing the draught of the furnace of the heater.

(19) To cause or permit any debenture stock, bonds, debentures, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens, or securities of or belonging to or made or issued by the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred, or satisfied, as shall be thought fit, also to pay off and re-borrow the moneys secured thereby or any part

### ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE HINGURUGAMA TEA AND RUBBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

IT is agreed as follows:-

1. Table C not to apply; Company to be governed by these Articles.—The regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Aritcles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

Power to alter the regulations.—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

#### INTERPRETATION.

4. Interpretation clause. - In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz :: -

Company.-The word "Company" means "The Hingurugama Tea and Rubber Company, Limited," incor-

porated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

"The Ordinance.—" The Ordinance " means and includes " The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinances, 1861 to 1907." and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special resolution.—" Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by "the Ordinance."

These presents.—"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

Capital.—" Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of

the Company.

Shares.—"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided. Shareholder.—"Shareholder" means a Shareholder of the Company.

Presence or present.—"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy

or by attorney duly authorized.

Directors.—"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors

assembled at a Board.

Board.-" Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled

at a Board Meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

Seal.—" Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Seat.— Seat means a calendar month.

Wonth.—"Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and plural number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa.

Masculine and feminine gender.—Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and vice versa.

### BUSINESS.

5. Commencement of business.—The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed or applied for or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or

6. Business to be carried on by Directors.—The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these

presents.

### CAPITAL.

Nominal capital.—The nominal capital of the Company is Seven hundred and Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 750,000), divided into Seven thousand Five hundred shares of Rupees One hundred (Rs. 100) each.

8. Arrangement on issue of shares.—The Company may call up the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls.

9. Payment of amount of shares by instalments.—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company

by the holder of the share.

· 10. Increase or reduction of capital and subdivision or consolidation of shares.—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution from time to time, increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct, and the Company in General Meeting may by special resolution reduce the capital as such special resolution shall direct, and may by special resolution subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company or any of them.

11. New shares.—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential.

deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct; and if no direction be given, as the

Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting.

12. How carried into effect.—Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by tilem, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company.

13. Same as original capital.—Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents,

any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payments of calls and instalments, transfer and transmission,

forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise.

#### SHARES

14. Issue.—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares shall first be offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company. Provided also that the Directors may at their discretion allot any shares in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company.

15. Acceptance.—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

16. Payment.—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

17. Shares held by a firm.—Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies.

18. Shares held by two or more persons not in partnership.—Shares may be registered in the name of two or more

persons not in partnership.

19. One of joint-holders other than a firm may give receipts; only one of joint-holders resident in Ceylon entitled to 19. Une of joint-holders of a share other than a firm may give receipts; only one of joint-holders resident in Ueylon entitled to vote.—Any one of the joint-holders of a share other than a firm may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint Shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

20. Survivor of joint-holder, other than a firm, only recognized.—In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

21. Joint and several liability of joint-holders.—The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

22. Company not bound to recognize any interest in share other than that of registered holder or of any person under clause 38.—The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto, in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 38 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

23. Certificates.—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company, and signed by two

Directors or by one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company.

24. How issued.—Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the number of the share in respect of which it is issued.

25. Renewal of certificate.—If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors they may order the same to be cancelled and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors may deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed

certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

26. Certificate to be delivered to the first named of joint-holders not a firm.—The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

### TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. Exercise of rights.—No person shall exercise any rights of a member until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Members and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share

in the Company held by him. 28. Transfer of shares. -Subject to the restriction of these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of

his shares by instrument in writing.

29. No transfer to infant or person of unsound mind.—No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind. 30. Register of Transfers.—The Company shall keep a book or books to be called "The Register of Transfers,"

in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

31. Instance of transfer.—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

32 Board may decline to register transfers.—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them.

33. Not bound to state reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the

Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

34. Registration of transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a vered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2-50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 32, 33, and 35, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder, and retain the instrument of transfer.

35. Directors may authorize registration of transferees.—The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors

expedient, authorize the registration of statistics of that purpose.

36. Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of transfer.—In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the shares, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but, if at all, upon the transferee only.

37. Transfer Books when to be closed.—The Transfer Books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately accepted Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared for the

preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the meeting; also at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding on the whole

twenty-one days in any one year.

### TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

Title to shares of deceased holder.—The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder

shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

39. Registration of persons entitled to shares otherwise than by transfer.—Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or manager of his estate, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares on payment of a fee of Re. 1;

or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

40. Failing such registration, shares may be sold by the Company.—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 39 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money, and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitle the Company to sell the same, and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

#### SHARES (SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE).

42. If call or instalment be not paid, notice to be given to Shareholder. - If any Shareholder fail to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder, or his executors or administrators, or the trustee or assignee in his bankruptcy, requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

Terms of notice.—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a

place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice, shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and the place appointed, the shares in respect

73. Powers of Directors.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director, and with the assistance of the Colombo Commercial Company, Limited, as Agents and Secretaries of the Company, and the Directors shall have power to appoint a Managing Director; and when the Colombo Commercial Company, Limited, shall have ceased to be Agents and Secretaries, the Directors may appoint any Agent or Agents for such period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors may pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of any lands, estates, or property and the opening, clearing, planting, and

cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

106. The Directors shall have power to purchase, lease, take in exchange, or otherwise acquire for the Company any estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire at such price or prices as they may think proper and without investigation or requiring the production of the vendor's, assignor's, or lessor's title, and notwithstanding any real or apparent defect in the same, and generally to waive any defect in any title to such estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, or privileges, and to accept such title as in their opinion may be, or may be deemed to be, reasonably sufficient, and to acquire through or cause any such estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, or privileges to be held by any individual or company as Trustee or Agent for the Company. and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit; and to make, and they may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may appoint such managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration, and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, officers, visiting agents, inspectors, clerks, or servants for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause.

107. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company on such terms as they may consider proper, and from

time to time to revoke such appointment.

108. The Directors shall have power to open on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signature as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interest of the Company

109. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares effectors, respectively, to any company or companies, person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit; and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company is not by law necessary.

Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

110. The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers accountants and other consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artisans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinance and of these presents, and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed

111. In furtherance, and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the

Directors shall have the powers, following, that is to say:-

(1) To institute, conduct, defend, compound or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by and against the Company or its officers, or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due, and of any claims and

demands by and against the Company

(2) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the award. (3) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands of the Company.

(4) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept

the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, or inspector, or any similar office.

(5) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.

(6) From time to time to provide for the management of the affairs of the Company abroad in such manner as they think fit, and may establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company abroad, and to appoint any persons to be members of such local board, or any managers or agents and to a point any persons to be members of such local board, or any managers or

agents, and to fix their remuneration.

(7) From time to time and at any time to delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained; and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of and at any time to remove such Director or other person or company, and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any agent of the Company or other person, except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers.

#### PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

112. Meeting of Directors.—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. wise determined two Directors shall be a quorum.

113. A Director may summon meetings of Directors.—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

114. Who is to preside at meetings of Board.—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one

been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall

choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

115. Questions at meetings how decided.—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes, the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in

addition to his vote as a Director.

116. Board may appoint committees.—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

117. Acts of Board or committee valid, notwithstanding informal appointment.—The acts of the Board or of any committee appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed,

and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

118. Regulation of proceedings of committees.—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and be not superceded by the express terms of the appointment of such committees respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

119. Resolution in writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a meeting of Directors.—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called

and constituted.

120. Minutes of proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, videlicet:—

(b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.

(e) Of all orders made by the Directors.

121. Signature of minutes of proceedings and effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be primal factic evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairresolutions, and the accurate that regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was

122. The use of the seal.—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed or instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof, such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, attorney, or agent of the said firm signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Secretaries.

#### ACCOUNTS. .

123. What accounts to be kept.—The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being or if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be kept in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directo a think fit.

124. Accounts how and when open to inspection.—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the statutes or authorized by the

Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

125. Statement of accounts and balance sheet to be furnished to General Meetings.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the profit and loss account of the preceding year and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the previous year.

126. Report to accompany statement.—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount which the Directors recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the

Directors.

127. Copy of balance sheet to be sent to Shareholders .- A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

### DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

128. Declaration of dividend.—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

129. Interim dividend.—The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend

to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend on the then current

year.

130. Reserve fund.—Previously to the Directors recommending any dividend, they may set aside, out of the profits of the Company, such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and shall invest the same in such securities

as they shall think fit, or place the same in fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

131. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portion as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

132. Unpaid interest or dividend not to bear interest.—No unpaid interest or dividend or bonus shall ever bear

interest against the Company.

133. No Shareholder to receive dividend while debt due to Company.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares or otherwise (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares or otherwise

134. Directors may deduct debt from the dividends.—The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

135. Notice of dividend; forfeiture of unclaimed dividend.—Notice of all interest or dividends or bonuses to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto; and all interest or dividends or bonuses unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of the Company, and if the Directors think fit may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

136. Shares held by a firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

137. Joint holders other than a firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several

persons jointly other than a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons

### AUDIT.

138. Accounts to be audited.—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correct-

ness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

139. Qualification of Auditors.—No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

140. Appointment and retirement of Auditors.—The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration; and all future Auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

141. Retiring Auditors eligible for re-election.—Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.
142. Remuneration of Auditors.—The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the

Casual vacancy in number of Auditors how filled up.—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the appropriate of th to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.

144. Duty of Auditors.—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers

relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting generally or specially as he may think fit.

145. Company's accounts to be opened to Auditors for audit.—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

147. Shareholders to register address.—Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon, which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

153.
