## VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1893.

### I.—Population.

THE estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 3,131,892, an increase of nearly 5,000 on the previous quarter.

Table I. in the appendix gives the area and estimated population of each Province and district of the Island in the quarter.

*Arrivals and Departures of Indian Coolies.*—The arrivals of Indian coolies this quarter (22,267), though larger than the average number for the third quarter in the period 1887–90 (21,638), is far below the numbers for the corresponding quarter in the last two years, when the arrivals were respectively 33,278 (third quarter of 1891) and 46,625 (third quarter of 1892). The number of departures in the quarter, instead of showing a decrease proportionate to the fall in the arrivals, was larger than in the third quarter of any previous year since 1887, except 1892.

### II.—Marriages.

*Marriages.*—The number of general marriages—*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Mohammedan—registered in this quarter was 2,844, and of Kandyan marriages 1,528.

Table VII. in the appendix shows the marriages solemnized among the general community in every Province and district of the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnisation, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the register, &c.

Table VIII. gives similar information in respect of Kandyans.

*First Marriages; Re-marriages.*—Of the 2,844 general marriages, 2,494 (equal to 88 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 57 between bachelors and widows, 245 between widowers and spinsters, 45 between widowers and widows, 3 between divorced men and spinsters. Of the 1,528 Kandyan marriages, 1,242 (equal to 81 per cent.) were between bachelors and spinsters, 59 between bachelors and widows, 148 between widowers and spinsters, 37 between widowers and widows, 22 between divorced men and spinsters, 3 between divorced men and widows, 12 between divorced women and bachelors, 2 between divorced women and widowers, and 3 between divorced men and divorced women.

*Age at Marriage.*—The mean age at marriage for the general community was 27·1 for males and 19·7 for females; and for Kandyans 28 for males and 21 for females.

*Minors.*—In the general community 8 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 74 per cent. of the brides were under 21, and amongst the Kandyans 12 per cent. of the bridegrooms and 63 per cent. of the brides were under 21.

*Mixed Marriages.*—There were 18 mixed marriages in the quarter: 4 between Europeans and Burgers, 6 between Burgers and Sinhalese, and 8 between Sinhalese and Tamils.

*Signature in Marriage Register.*—Of the 5,683 persons married among the general community this quarter, 50 men and 2,253 women signed the register with marks; that is to say, 77 per cent. of the men and 21 per cent. of the women were able to write their names. Of the 3,056 persons married among the Kandyans, 643 men and 1,463 women signed the register with marks; or, in other words, 58 per cent. of the men and 4 per cent. of the women were able to write their names.

### III.—Births and Deaths.

*Births.*—The births registered in the quarter numbered 23,150, and were in the proportion of 30·4 to 1,000 persons living, as against 28·5, the average of the corresponding period for the ten years 1883–92, and 31·1, the rate in the third quarter of last year.

*Deaths.*—The deaths registered in the quarter amounted to 22,443, including 24 Europeans, 108 Burgers, 1,067 Sinhalese, 5,520 Tamils, 1,623 Moors, 63 Malays, and 38 others, and corresponded to an annual rate of 29·5 per 1,000, as against 23·7, the average of the corresponding period for the ten years 1883–92.

*The Births and Deaths and their Rates* in this quarter are compared in the following statement with those obtained in the previous quarter of the year, the third quarter of last year, and the average of the corresponding quarter for the ten years 1883-92 :—

It will thus appear that the birth-rate of the Island in the present quarter, though nearly the same as in the previous quarter, and slightly higher than the average of the corresponding quarter in the period 1883-92, is below the death-rate for the quarter, which is considerably in excess of the average, though an improvement on the last quarter.

Table II. in the appendix gives similar information to Table A in respect of each Province and district in the Island. Table I gives the births and deaths according to sex, and births according to legitimacy; Table IX. the births according to nationality and sex; and Table X. the deaths for each month of the quarter according to nationality for every Province and district. The causes of death for every Province and district are shown in Table XI., for the estates in the Central and Uva Provinces in Table XII., and for the town of Colombo (according to Wards) in Table XIII. Table XIV. shows the period of life at which the deaths of the various races occurred in every district.

*Age at Death.*—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 3,722, and were in the proportion of 161 deaths to 1,000 births. The rate of infant mortality varied greatly in different districts from 304 in Mullaittivu, 273 in Mátalé, 240 in Kurunégala, 215 in Trincomalee, to 85 in Kalutara and 76 in Colombo.

*Sex.*—Of the total number of births (23,150) 11,992 were males and 11,158 were females, i.e. 107 males to 100 females. Of the total number of deaths (22,443) 11,716 were males and 10,727 were females. Out of equal numbers living of each sex there died 964 males to 1,000 females.

#### IV.—STATE OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

The general health of the population this quarter (29·5), though better than in the first (34·5) and second quarter (33·7) of the year, was worse than in the corresponding period of any previous year since 1881.

Tables III., IV., V., and VI. in the appendix show the births and deaths and the death-rates for all ages and for infants in the several districts of the Island, and in the subdivisions of those districts for this quarter and for the corresponding period of the last two years 1891-92. The rates shown are for the Sinhalese only in the Sinhalese districts and for the Tamils only in the Tamil districts. These separate rates furnish more trustworthy data for comparing the relative sanitary condition of those districts and divisions of the Island than if the rates included other nationalities temporarily resident in them. In the Puttalam District, where the Sinhalese and Mohammedans are found in almost equal numbers, and in the Batticaloa District where Tamils and Mohammedans are almost in equal numbers, the rates of the different sections of the population as well as of all races are given.

The healthiest Province in the Island this quarter was the Northern (with a death-rate of 18·7), the healthiest District Jaffna (17·7), the healthiest sub-division Alutkuru Korale South in the Colombo District (11·8).

*Western Province.*—The health of the 663,100 Sinhalese estimated to be living in the Western Province at the beginning of the quarter though better than on the two immediately preceding quarters of this year (20·0) is worse than in the corresponding quarter of 1891 or 1892, when the rates recorded were respectively 16·6 and 17 per 1,000. The unhealthiness of the Province during this period was confined to Colombo and Negombo Districts, which have continued to be unhealthy from quarter to quarter since the beginning of the year. The Kalutara District maintains, however, its normal state of health. As usual the Alutkuru Kóralé South division of Colombo District takes the lead among the healthy districts of the Island, with a death-rate of 11·8, and an infantile mortality of 44, which is about one-tenth of the infantile mortality of the Colombo Municipality (436).

*Southern Province.*—The mortality of the Sinhalese population in the Southern Province, estimated at 467,561, was in the quarter at the annual rate of 29·9, being about 25 per cent. above the mean rate for the corresponding period of the last two years (24·1).

The District of Galle was in particular very unhealthy during the period. The death-rate, 25·7 and 27·4 in the two immediately preceding quarters, increased to 30·4, a great increase here, which had been third quarter in 1891-92 (20·7). The increase was shared by every division in the district, on the mean rate for the were not only in excess of the rates for the corresponding quarters of 1891 and 1892, but the death-rates recorded the first and second quarters of this year, when the district was less healthy than usual, even exceeded the rates for

The Mátara District experienced this quarter a death-rate (30·2) as high as that of the Hambantota, generally a malarious district and unhealthier than Galle or Mátara, as the Galle District (30·4), while for either of those districts.

*North-Western Province.*—The North-Western Province, which has an estimated population of the quarter of 271,357 Sinhalese, is healthier in the quarter (39·6) than in the corresponding population year (first quarter 70·8, second quarter 48·8) and than in the corresponding quarter of the two preceding years, than in the third quarter of last year, when the death-rate was 25·1 per 1,000.

The Kurunégala District, the most important district in the Province, experienced during the year an abnormally high death-rate, owing chiefly, as I pointed out in my report for the last reference is requested), to an outbreak of malarial fever, aggravated by want of wholesome food, due to the deficiency of rainfall in 1892. This quarter the death-rate of the whole district fell to 53·9 in the second quarter, fell to 43·4, which, though lower than that of 1891, which had been 82·3 (47·0), greatly exceeded the rate in the third quarter of 1892 (27·9). The rate for the corresponding Dambadeni hatpattu. Here the death-rate during the first quarter (9·9) was the unhealthiest division for the period in 1891-92 (42·7), and during the second quarter (817) was 133 per cent. in excess of the rate (42·7). The rate this quarter (50·2), though a great decline on 1891 (47·7) it was 71 per cent. in the period in 1891 (47·7) and 1892 (31·6). The lowest death-rate in the last two quarters, is yet in Wanni hatpattu division (36·0).

*Central Province.*—The health of the Sinhalese population in the Central Province, estimated at 249,711 was in the quarter at the annual rate of 32·4 per 1,000, being slightly in the Central Province, during the corresponding period in the previous two years (30·2). In the Kandy District per cent. above the mean rate from a mean rate for the third quarter in 1891-92 of 26·3; in Mátalé District the Sinhalese death-rate fell to 47·8 from a mean rate of 44·6 in the past quarters of this year all the three districts of the Province—lower than the average (28·3) considerably during the quarter in health. The death-rate of the Kandy, Mátalé, and Nuwara Eliya Districts fell to 34·4 in the second quarter; the death-rate of the Mátalé District fell to 29·6 this quarter, 50·5 in the second quarter; and in Nuwara Eliya District the death-rate of the District fell to 47·8 from 52·0 in the first and 34·4 in the second quarter; the death-rate of the Mátalé District fell to 29·6 this quarter, 50·5 in the second quarter; and in Nuwara Eliya District the death-rate of the District fell to 23·0 from 28·3 in the first and second quarters.

*Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—The mortality among the 220,610 Singhalese estimated to be living in the Province of Sabaragamuwa at the beginning of the quarter was at the annual rate of 34·7, which, though still above the usual mortality of the Province, is a decline on the rates for the first and second quarters of this year.

The District of Kégalla, which suffered very severely during the last two quarters, chiefly from fever and want of wholesome food, shows this quarter an improvement, the death-rate falling to 34·9 from 39·0 and 48·0 per 1,000 in the first and second quarters respectively. The reduction in the death-rate is noticeable in every division of the district, but it was most marked in Kingoda kóralé. In this kóralé the death-rate, which increased from 26·4 in the third quarter of last year to 34·6 in the fourth quarter, and from which to 58·7 and 63·5 in the first and second quarters of this year, fell to 43·1 this quarter. The Panawa kóralé division shows a still greater reduction in the death-rate from 55·3 in the last quarter to 22·2 this quarter.

*Province of Uva.*—The health of the Singhalese population in the Province of Uva, which in the past two quarters (first quarter 39·5, second quarter 36·5) was better than usual, shows this quarter a still greater improvement, the death-rate being 31·7, as against a mean rate for the corresponding quarter in 1891-92 of 40·4 per 1,000. The improvement was general, and shared by every division of the district.

*Northern Province.*—The death-rate of the Tamils in the Northern Province, who are estimated at 309,643, was in the quarter the lowest for any Province in the Island, being at the annual rate of 18·7 per 1,000, a rate lower than the Northern Province showed in the corresponding period in 1891-92 (20·3), and in the preceding quarters of the year 23·3 (first quarter) and 21·9 (second quarter).

In the Jaffna District, which contains more than nine-tenths of the Tamils living in the Province, the death-rate for the quarter (17·7) was about the average for the period in 1891-92 (17·9). As usual, Valikámmam East and North, in the Jaffna District, came next to Alutkúru Kóralé South, the healthiest division in the Island.

The improvement in health was mainly in the other districts of the Province, chiefly in Mannár, where the death-rate (19·3) fell exactly by half from a mean rate for the period in 1891-92 of 38·6.

In the Mullaittivú District the rate was slightly higher, being 53·6 this quarter, as against a mean rate of 49·5 in the third quarter of 1891-92, while in the Vavuniya District the rate fell from 47·7 to 26·7.

*Eastern Province.*—In the Eastern Province the health of the population this quarter was below the average. The death-rate of the Tamils living in the Batticaloa District was 29·7, which, though the same as the rate for the corresponding quarter of last year, exceeded the rate for the period in 1891 (26·0). But it is among the Mohammedans of this district that the death-rate was much heavier than usual, which accounts for the high death-rate of the Province in the quarter. The rate was 34·5, as against a mean rate for the third quarter in 1891-92 of 27·3, and 21·2, and 18·1 respectively in the first and second quarters of this year. In the Trincomalee District the death-rate was about the average.

#### V.—Causes of Death.

The causes of death registered in the Island during the quarter are given in detail in Table XI. in the appendix. They may be summarised as follows :—

*Fever and Diarrhoeal Diseases.*—Of the 22,438 deaths registered in the quarter, 6,132 were reported due to various forms of fever and 6,334 to diarrhoeal diseases, i.e., fever contributed 27 per cent. and diarrhoeal diseases 28 per cent. of the total deaths from all causes. Under the head "Diarrhoeal Diseases" is included Cholera, which accounted for 137 deaths, and to which cause probably many deaths, really due to acute diarrhoea, have been attributed.

Smallpox accounts for 3 deaths this quarter (2 in Colombo and the other in Kégalla) and measles 50 (Jaffna 22, Colombo, Galle, and Kurunégala 6 in each).

The other chief natural causes of death were infantile convulsion 1,474, phthisis 663, general dropsy 320, debility 188, worms 558, anaemia 554, pneumonia 325, old age 323, puerperal convulsion 315, thrush 165, rheumatism 155, ulcer 151, bronchitis 123, scrofula 96 (of which 49 in Kurunégala), premature birth 94 (of which 52 in Badulla), starvation and want of breast milk 91 (of which 36 in Kandy, 28 in Badulla), asthma 89, dochmias duodenalis 64 (of which 25 in Badulla, 22 in Kandy), parangi 58 (of which 35 in Kurunégala).

*Deaths by Violence.*—Of the 453 deaths attributed to these causes, 106 are attributed to fall from trees, 84 to drowning, 40 to snake-bite, 31 to burns and scalds, 27 to injury at birth, 13 to gunshot wounds, 10 to fall of heavy substances, 4 to wasp stings, 3 to crocodiles, 1 to elephant, 1 to buffalo, 4 to sunstroke, 1 to lightning, 4 to being run over by carts, and 2 to being run-over by railway trains. 32 deaths are attributed to suicide (20 by hanging, 5 by poison, 4 by gunshot wounds, 1 by cut or stab wound, 1 by drowning, and 1 by other and undefined means).

19 deaths were attributed to murder and other forms of homicide (Kandy 4, Negombo, Hambantota, Kurunegala, and Badulla 2 in each, Colombo, Kalutara, Nuwara Eliya, Galle, Matara, Chilaw, and Ratnapura, 1 in each).

Two men were judicially executed this quarter.

#### VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

The total number of births reported for registration this quarter from the estates in the Central and Uva Provinces was 1,299 (of which 11 were Europeans, 2 Burghers, 14 Sinhalese, 1,269 Tamils, 1 Moor, 1 Malay, and 1 other), and the total number of deaths was 1,906 (of which 3 were Europeans, 7 Sinhalese, 1,893 Tamils, 1 Moor, and 2 Malays), corresponding respectively to an annual rate of 24·0 and 35·2 per 1,000. The causes of deaths are given in detail in Table XII., and may be summarized as follows:—

*Kandy District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Kandy District was 558, of which 3 were Europeans, 10 Sinhalese, 541 Tamils, and 1 Malay; and the deaths numbered 899, of which 891 were Tamils, 4 Sinhalese, 2 Europeans, and 2 Malays. The Tamil birth-rate in the quarter was equal to 23·4, as against a mean rate of 29·4 in the corresponding period of 1891-92, and the Tamil death-rate was equal to 38·5, as against a mean rate of 27·8 in the third quarter of 1891-92. As usual the most fatal cause was diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 414 deaths (216 from diarrhoea and 198 from dysentery), or nearly 46 per cent. of the total number of deaths (899). The other chief causes of death were debility 93, including mostly deaths of infants from inability to suck milk, fever 54, infantile convulsion 34, pneumonia 34, general dropsy 31, starvation and want of breast milk 24, old age 22, dochmias duodenalis 18, bronchitis 15.

*Matalé District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Matalé District was 91 (of which 88 were Tamils, 1 European, 1 Sinhalese, and 1 of other nationality), and the deaths numbered 156 (of which 154 were Tamils and 2 Sinhalese), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 24·3 (against a mean rate of 23·9 in the corresponding period of 1891-92) and a death-rate of 42·6 (against a mean rate of 30·9 in the third quarter of 1891-92) respectively. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 72 deaths, i.e., 46 per cent. of the total number of deaths (156), fever caused 17, debility 11 (mostly of infants from inability to suck milk), pneumonia 10, bronchitis 6, general dropsy 5, want of breast milk 4, old age 4, and infantile convulsion 4.

*Nuwara Eliya District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Nuwara Eliya District was 440 (3 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 2 Sinhalese, and 434 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 599 (1 European, 597 Tamils, and 1 Moor), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 27·8 (against a mean rate of 22·2 in the corresponding quarter of 1891-92), and a death-rate of 38·3 (against a mean rate of 23·1 in the third quarter of 1891-92) respectively. Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal in 293 cases, or nearly 49 per cent. of the total deaths (599). 92 are attributed to debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck milk), 33 to pneumonia, 26 to fever, 24 to general dropsy, 16 to old age, 16 to influenza, 10 to bronchitis, 10 to infantile convulsion, 9 to burns and scalds and 7 to child-birth.

*Badulla District.*—The total number of births reported for registration from the estates in the Badulla District was 210 (1 European, 1 Burgher, 1 Sinhalese, 1 Moor, and 203 Tamils), and the deaths numbered 252 (1 Sinhalese and 251 Tamils), and corresponded to an annual birth-rate of 27·3 (against a mean rate of 26·9 in the corresponding period of 1891-92), and a death-rate of 33·2 (against a mean rate of 28·2 in the third quarter of 1891-92), respectively. Dysentery and diarrhea were fatal in 88 cases, or nearly 35 per cent. of the total deaths (252), debility in 32 (mostly of infants from inability to suck milk), dochmias duodenalis in 18, pneumonia in 17, infantile convulsion in 12.

#### VII.—Health of the Town of Colombo.

The deaths recorded in the town of Colombo this quarter and the last two preceding quarters largely exceed the numbers for any previous quarter since 1887, when the vital statistics of the town were first collected. This is due, as explained in my last report, to the improved system of registration of deaths in force in the town from the beginning of the year.

The total number of births registered during the quarter was 671, representing an annual rate of 20·8 per 1,000, an increase of 3·7 per 1000 on the mean rate for the period in the preceding six years 1887-92.

The total number of deaths registered during the quarter numbered 1,061, corresponding to an annual rate of 32·9 per 1,000, a rate though lower than in the last is higher than the rate for the first quarter of this year. The infantile mortality rose as high as 436 per thousand, and was almost the highest recorded in any division in the Island; an index not so much of the inferior healthiness of the Colombo Municipality as of greater accuracy in registration.

As usual the death-rate exceeds the birth-rate, which is due mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among the Europeans and among the Indian Tamils and Mohammedans), and to the presence of hospitals and jails which add to the normal mortality of the town. The death-rate this quarter was 58 per cent. in excess of the birth-rate.

The subjoined table gives the births and deaths and their rates of each nationality living in the Colombo Municipality for the third quarter of this year and of 1892, and the average of the corresponding period in the previous seven years:—

The town death-rate this quarter (32·9), though lower than in the last (38·9), shows a great increase in the mean rate for the corresponding period in the preceding six years, the increase being due, as I have said to improved registration. The increase was most marked among the Burghers, the death-rate increasing nearly three-fold, from a mean rate for the third quarter in 1887-92 of 7·8 to 25·3 per cent. Among the Tamils the increase was two-fold (increasing from 16·1 to 38·1) and among the Sinhalese the increase was about the same, increasing from 16·9 to 21·3. The Moorish death-rate shows, on the other hand, a decline, which is probably owing to the evasion of the new law, which is not popular with that community.

The number of births and deaths of the different races in the different wards in the town, their rates per 1,000, the principal zymotic causes of death, &c., are shown in the following table:—

There were no deaths in the quarter from cholera or smallpox. Dysentery and diarrhoea were fatal to 263 (267 in the previous quarter), infantile convulsions to 111 (140 in the previous quarter), fever to 163 (233 in the previous quarter), malarial cachexia to 24 (17 in the previous quarter), phthisis to 90 (88 in the previous quarter), bronchitis and pneumonia to 26 (63 in the previous quarter), childbirth to 7 (18 in the previous quarter), premature birth to 10 (3 in the previous quarter), debility to 59 (41 in the previous quarter), old age to 25 (23 in the previous quarter), ancylostomiasis to 4 (10 in the previous quarter). Measles was fatal to 3, whooping cough to 2, and influenza to 4.

There were 31 accidental deaths this quarter, of which 15 (10 in St. Paul's Ward) were attributed to injury at birth, 3 to drowning, 3 to being run over by railway and other carriages, 2 to fall of heavy substances, 1 to gun-shot wound, 1 to burns, 1 to being tossed by a bull, and 5 to other causes.

One death resulted from homicide.

The town population of Colombo comprises different nationalities, who are found in every ward or division of the town in varying proportions as to sex and age. The race, sex, and age distribution of the population of the different wards not being known, their true sanitary condition cannot be ascertained. The only means now available is to correct the death rates of the wards by the birth-rates, and by the race and sex distribution as found at the last Census, and which was as follows :—

The preponderance of males over females, though noticeable all over the town, varies in the different wards. It is greatest in those divisions of the town inhabited by immigrants, who are for the most part adults. The age constitution of a population, which contains a large proportion of adults is more favourable towards producing a low death-rate than a population in which the proportion of the sexes is more or less equal.

The lowest death-rate in the town this quarter was in the Pettah Ward (15·9). But the rate for this ward is untrustworthy for purposes of comparison, as it comprises for the most part a male population, mainly adults, and less stationary than in any other ward of the town. Omitting this and the Fort Ward, of which the population consists of only the residents in the hotels and the workmen employed in the harbour, the death-rate is lowest in the Kollupitiya Ward being 20·9 per 1,000. Next in point of health comes the Maradana Ward. Here the death-rate 27·3, though not the next lowest, is lower than the birth-rate (30·5), which can be said of no other ward in the town. The healthiness of these two wards (which cover more than half the area of the town), is due to the population being less dense than in the other wards, and to the fact that in these two wards reside the wealthier classes. The Kotahena Ward comes next (excluding St. Paul's Ward, where, as in Pettah, the population is more or less a floating one, and contains an undue proportion of male adults) with a death-rate of 25·6. The density of this ward is almost the same as that of Maradana, but some parts of it are thickly populated, principally by fishermen, which probably tends to lower the sanitary condition of this ward. Then comes the New Bazaar and St. Sebastian Wards, and last comes the Slave Island Ward with a death-rate of 38·4, the highest in any division of the town.
