MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council held at the Municipal Office on March 18, 1909, at 1.80 p.m.

Present: Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Dr. E. Ludovici; Mr. F. E. Abeysundera; Mr. M. Macan Markar; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. F. Perera; and Dr. J. H. Ebell.

- 1. Minutes of the Meeting held on February 13, 1909, were read and confirmed.
- 2. Report of the Special Committee re-appointed on February 13, 1909, to report on the proposed amendments of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as published in the Government Gazette No. 6,288 of January 21, 1909.

The Chairman moved that the report be adopted and forwarded to Government. Dr. E. Ludovici seconded.—Carried.

Report of the Special Committee appointed on February 13, 1909, to report on the Infectious Diseases Hospital and Segregation Camp at Dadalla as to what would be best use to which they can be put.

The Chairman moved that the report be adopted, and that the Council do take steps to carry out the recommendations contained therein, (2) that the Special Committee be thanked for the report, (3) that the Hon the Director of Public Works be asked to kindly inform the Council what would be the probable cost of extending the water main as suggested in the last paragraph of the report under reference, (4) that the Chairman do place himself in correspondence with Government with regard to the admission of patients suffering from infectious diseases from outside the Municipal limits into the hospital which it is intended to erect on the new land at Dadalla, situated within Municipal limits, and also with regard to the cost of land, erection and maintenance of buildings, &c.

Mr. F. E. Abeysundera seconded.—Carried.

Letter No. 116 dated March 6, 1909, from the Provincial Engineer, Southern Province, intimating that Government have sanctioned an estimate for the conversion into an iron one of the present wooden bridge over the Moragoda-ela on the Galle-Matara road, and that a temporary wooden bridge would be provided during the time the work in progress.
