#### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 27, 1909, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated March 28, 1909.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; Mr. W. D. Gibbon; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. S. A. Owen; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 27, 1909, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
  - 2. The following documents were submitted:-
    - (a) Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1908 to February 28, 1909, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 2) Water rate Accounts.
    - (b) Progress Report on Works brought up to the same date.
    - (c) Health Officer's Report for February.
    - (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February.
    - (e) The Reservoir Readings for February and March.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, dairies, bakeries, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February.
  - 4. Correspondence :--
- (1) Circular letter No. 29 of March 20, 1909, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re Opium Licenses.—Read.
- (2) Letter No. 62,481/04 of March 9, 1909, from the Postmaster-General re Erection of Telephones, and the Chairman's reply thereto.—Read.
- (3) Letter No. 81 of March 12 1909, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Surveyor-General rethe land gifted by Mr. Beven to the Kandy Municipal Council, for the information of the Council.

In this connection it was agreed to ask the Public Works Department to report on the drainage of the old Garrison burial ground, which was greatly spoilt by the rush of water which came down from the high ground adjoining this land.

The Chairman was of opinion that it might be advisable and practicable to acquire a portion of Mr. Beven's land immediately above the Garrison burial ground.

5. Application for further leave from Mr. A. S. A. Goonewardene, Supervisor of Conservancy.

Proposed by the Chairman.

Seconded by Mr. Owen.

That the leave applied for be granted.—Carried.

- 6. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved—That the Council do adopt the by-laws of the Colombo Municipal Council (Chapter XV.) with regard to over-crowding.
  - Mr. Owen seconded.—Carried.
  - 7. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

#### Law and General Subjects.

- (1) That the rent per term paid by St. Anthony's Cricket Club for the use of the reclamation ground be reduced from Rs. 7.50 to Rs. 5 for this year, but be raised to Rs. 7.50 again from next year.
- (2) That No. 28, Nittewela, purchased by the Council for default of taxes be sold to Messrs. W. D. Carolis for Rs. 100, excluding costs of transfer.
  - (3) That the following by-law be adopted:

It shall not be lawful for any person to stand, sit, squat, or recline on the parapet wall along the western and northern bunds of the lake.

#### Health Officer's Report for February, 1909.

Scavenging.—The scavenging was more satisfactorily done than in the previous month.

Water Supply.—Good, but not sufficient.

Drainage.—The drains were regularly flushed and well kept during the month.

Alleys.—These were kept in a sanitary state as possible.

Bakeries.—Clean and well kept.

Cooly Lines.—These were kept clean, and the grounds attached to them cleaned and swept daily. Night soil Depôt.—The trenching grounds will, in the opinion of the Superintendent, Municipal Works, be exhausted in two or three years. It is advisable to acquire suitable land in the same locality as soon as possible.

Dairies.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—I have received several complaints about the offensive odours from the market latrines, especially towards evening. The latrine accommodation here is absolutely insufficient, particularly on vegetable days; these latrines are used not only by stall holders and vegetable vendors, but also by boutiquekeepers, rickshaw men, servants, and others who have no latrine accommodation in their own houses. It is very important that there should be no offensive odours near the market where foodstuffs are exposed for sale and, therefore, I suggest that none but stall holders should be permitted to use these latrines, and that latrine accommodation be provided for the others on a suitable spot not far from the market.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Boutiques.—All well kept. The articles exposed for sale were of good quality and fit for human consumption.

Food Supply.—The food supply was good. 499 cattle, 77 buffaloes, 91 sheep, and 200 goats were slaughtered during the month. The salt and dry fish exposed for sale were of good quality and fit for food.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was satisfactory. One case of enteric fever, 11 cases of chickenpox, 4 cases of measles, and 1 case of smallpox were reported. The smallpox patient is a blind beggar who travels throughout the Province. He states that he lived in Kandy during the whole of January and left for Hatton on the 29th. He returned to Kandy on February 1 with fever and developed the rash on the 4th. His statement cannot be relied on. All necessary steps were taken to prevent the spread of infection.
