F. B. Rylands.—" Flexible Coupling."

Abstract.—The invention is a hook suspension joint adapted to the suspension of electric fans, electroliers, lamps and the like, which, while remaining secure under all circumstances allows of the easy and quick removal of the suspended object.

There are two elements in the device: one to connect to the object to be suspended, which is provided with a cross bar; the other to receive the suspended object, which is provided with a claw or hook to embrace the cross bar of the other element. Oscillation of the suspended object is possible with such a joint.

Edward Lionel Joseph & Ozonair, Limited.—" An improvement in or relating to the manufacture of tea."

Abstract.—The invention consists in employing ozonised air, free from nitrogen, produced by means of certain apparatus described. The purpose of employing ozonised air is to oxidise and sterilize the tea during the process of manufacture.

The apparatus consists of sets of electrode panels constructed with sheets of dielectric material (such as mica or micanite) with electrodes (metal gauze) mounted on opposite sides. Each grid is mounted in a rectangular frame. A series of panels are mounted side by side in vertical planes in a casing. Air is caused to flow between the panels. A step-up transformer is provided for producing high tension alternating electric currents. [A rotary converter is mentioned as well for the case of direct current supply.] The ozonisation of the air is produced by silent discharge of the high tension alternating current at the electrode panels.
