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MINUTES.

Amendments to Pension Minute.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT has been pleased, with the sanction of the SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE COLONIES, to amend section 29 of the Minute on Pensions dated December 9, 1908, so as to provide that, in the case of officers of the age of 60 years and over, it shall not be necessary for a Medical Board to be appointed to report on their physical fitness for service, but that on receipt of a report from the Head of the Department concerned, furnishing proof that the officer to be retired is 60 years of age or over, and that he has served continuously for a period of 25 years and upwards, a long service allowance will be granted to him. The section of the Minute as amended reads as follows:—

Long Service Allowances for Officers drawing less than Rs. 250 per Annum.

29. Public Officers drawing a salary of less than Rs. 250 per annum retiring on account of illness after serving continuously for a period of 25 years and upwards may, if the Governor be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board, to be nominated by the Principal Civil Medical Officer, that they are physically unfit to discharge the duties of their offices owing to infirmity either of mind or body, be awarded such long service allowance not exceeding Rs. 5 per mensem as the Governor may think just and proper. In the case of officers of the age of 60 years no Medical Board need be appointed, but the Head of the Department should furnish proof that the officer is 60 years of age or over. Those in the receipt of daily pay with continuous service of 25 years and upwards retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one month's salary for every three years' service.

2. The following corrections made in the Pension Minute should be noted:—

(a) The words "section 8" in last line of section 15 should read "section 7."

(b) The words "ten years in all tropical climates" in line 20 of section 21 should read "ten years in all in tropical climates."

HUGH CLIFFORD.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 3 of "The Dried Meat Ordinance, 1908," it is enacted that the Governor in Executive Council may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that it shall be unlawful to remove dried meat from any revenue district or chief headman's division :

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1908, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that it shall be unlawful for any person to remove dried meat from the chief headmen's divisions in the Revenue Districts of Jaffna, Mannar, and Mullaittivu, in the Northern Province, set forth in the schedule hereto, as from and after July 1, 1909.

5. *Vavuniya North*, in the Revenue District of Mullaittivu : bounded on the north by the chief headmen's divisions of Karaichchi and Punaryn-Tunukkai in the Jaffna District, east by the chief headman's division of the Maritime pattus, south by the boundary of the North-Central Province and the chief headman's division of Vavuniya South, west by the chief headman's division of Mantai in the Mannar District.
6. *Vavuniya South*, in the Revenue District of Mullaittivu ; bounded on the north by the chief headman's division of Vavuniya North, east by the chief headman's division of Vavuniya North and the boundary of the North-Central Province, south by the boundary of the North-Central Province, west by the boundary of the North-Central Province and by the chief headmen's divisions of Musali and Mantai in the Mannar District.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Ordinance No. 11 of 1891, intituled "An Ordinance to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable on Firearms and to impose an Export Duty on certain Hides and Horns," as amended by section 3 of the Ordinance No. 13 of 1900, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time prohibit the exportation for commercial or trade purposes of any or all of the articles mentioned in section 3 of the said Ordinance during such period or periods of time as may seem expedient :

And whereas it has been deemed expedient to prohibit the exportation for commercial or trade purposes of the hides and cut horns of spotted deer and sambur during the period hereinafter mentioned :

Now know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation prohibit the exportation for commercial or trade purposes of the hides and cut horns of spotted deer and sambur for a period of seven years as from and after September 1, 1909, till August 31, 1916 (both days inclusive).

RULES REFERRED TO.

23. (13) These rules apply to bags and boxes used by Government Departments and officials, with the exception that the Postmaster-General is authorized, on application, to give permission for such bags or boxes to be attended to within the limits of a postman's delivery without payment of the fee prescribed in paragraph (7).

24. (9) The Postmaster-General is empowered on application to allow tappal books to be used by Government Officials whose offices are beyond the limits of a postman's delivery without payment of the fee prescribed in paragraph (2) (b).

Regulations relating to Rinderpest.

1. (a) It shall be the duty of all persons in charge of cattle which may die of disease in an infected area to burn or bury, or cause to be buried, within six hours after death, the carcasses of the cattle so dying in a grave at least six feet deep from the surface, and such carcasses shall be covered with quicklime, when procurable, before the grave is filled in.

(b) Every person who within an infected area finds the carcass of any cattle lying dead and unburied shall report the same to the nearest headman or police officer, who shall cause such carcass to be forthwith buried in manner aforesaid.

(c) The possessor or occupier of land within an infected area shall cause the fresh dung of all diseased cattle being upon such land, together with the litter (if any), to be burned, tar, when available, being sprinkled over them before the burning.

(d) It shall not be lawful for any person to preserve the hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of the carcass of any cattle dying within an infected area without a permit in writing from the Government Agent of the Province or of the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which such area is situated, or from some person duly authorized by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent aforesaid to issue such permit. Every such permit shall contain the conditions under which such hides, horns, and hoofs may be preserved.

2. It shall be the duty of every person who buries or assists to bury the carcasses of any cattle within an infected area, or is employed in tending diseased or suspected cattle either within or without an infected area, before he approaches healthy cattle to thoroughly bathe his body, and cause his clothes to be boiled in water containing a wine glass full of "kregaline," or "phenol," or "Jeye's disinfectant," or some similar preparation, or to be otherwise disinfected.

3. No person shall expose diseased or suspected cattle in any market, gala, garden, or other public or private place.

4. No person shall carry or cause to be carried along any line of railway, canal, or river, or in any truck, vessel, or boat, or otherwise, any diseased or suspected cattle, or the dung of such cattle.

5. No person shall carry, drive, or lead, or cause to be carried, driven, or lead, along any thoroughfare, road, or highway, any diseased or suspected cattle.

6. (a) It shall not be lawful for any person to keep any diseased or suspected cattle in any chena or unenclosed land or field, or in any land or field immediately adjoining a thoroughfare or highway, without a permit from the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which such person resides, or from some person duly authorized by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent aforesaid to issue such permit.

(b) It shall not be lawful for any person in charge of diseased or suspected cattle to allow such cattle to drink at any running stream or at any pond or reservoir.

7. (a) All cattle within an infected area shall be kept within properly fenced enclosures, or shall be securely tied or tethered. Such cattle shall not be allowed to stray or to run loose, or to drink at any stream or at any pond or reservoir.

(b) Tame buffaloes within an infected area shall be detained and segregated at such place and in such manner as the Government Agent shall appoint.

8. Any officer appointed under the Ordinance, or any person specially authorized in writing by the Government Agent, may destroy any cattle (including tame buffaloes) found straying or running loose within an infected area or kept or dealt with in contravention of the Ordinance or any regulation made thereunder.

No compensation shall be paid in respect of cattle destroyed under this regulation.

9. Any officer appointed under the Ordinance who is specially authorized by the Government Agent for the purpose or any other person so authorized may destroy—

(a) Any animal which he is satisfied is infected with rinderpest.

(b) Any animal which he is satisfied is or has been in the same shed, stable, herd, or in contact with an animal infected with rinderpest.

10. (a) No compensation shall be paid in respect of animals destroyed under regulation 9 (a).

(b) In respect of animals slaughtered under regulation 9 (b), compensation shall be paid to the owner out of moneys voted by the Legislative Council.

(c) The amount to be paid as compensation shall be assessed at the time by the persons by whose order the animal is destroyed, and, where possible, a note of the assessed value shall be given to the owner. Such amount shall be one-third the value of the animal immediately before it was destroyed, so that the amount does not exceed the amount which in the schedule hereto is mentioned as the maximum amount payable for animals of the class to which the animal destroyed belongs.

11. (a) Applications for permits under any of the foregoing regulations or under the Ordinance must be made to the Government Agent of the Province or Assistant Government Agent of the district in which the applicant resides in writing; and signed by the applicant, and must set out clearly the number, age, sex, and brand-marks (if any) of the cattle to be included in the permit, the object for which such permit is required, and the line of road (if any) along which such cattle are to be moved or transported, and must contain an undertaking by the applicant to pay for the cost of disinfecting any cart, wagon, boat, vessel, truck, or other conveyance used for the transport of such cattle.

(b) Permits when issued must be retained in the custody of the applicant, who shall produce the same to the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district, the Police Magistrate of the division or the President of the Village Tribunal within whose jurisdiction the applicant resides, or to any officer appointed by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent for the purpose of issuing permits, or to any village headman within the limits of his local jurisdiction, whenever called upon so to do.

12. Cattle detained under the authority of the provisions of the Ordinance, or of the regulations framed thereunder, shall be supplied with food and water by their owners or by the persons in charge of such cattle at the time of seizure. The officer appointed under the provisions of the Ordinance to enforce the detention of cattle shall, if the owners or persons in charge of the cattle detained neglect or decline to supply food and water in sufficient quantities, provide such cattle with such food and water as he may consider necessary, and the cost of food and water so provided shall be borne by the owner of such cattle, who shall pay the same to the officer before such cattle are released from detention; and if such cost be not paid within three days after demand made for the same, the officer may sell such cattle or so many of them as may be necessary to cover the cost aforesaid and the detention of the cattle up to the day of sale.

13. The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may, subject to the approval of the Governor, appoint officers from time to time to carry out the provisions of the Ordinance and of regulations framed thereunder, and shall pay them such remuneration for their services as the Governor may be pleased to appoint.

14. (a) All regulations and general special orders made under the Ordinance shall be published in the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages.

(b) Service or delivery of a notice or other document required by the provisions of the Ordinance or of regulations made thereunder to be served or delivered shall be served or delivered personally on the person to be affected by such notice or documents, or by posting the same to such person by registered letter.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. In these regulations the terms "Proper Authority" and "Health Officer" have the same meaning as in the regulations dated September 17, 1907, and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of September 20, 1907.

The term "sleeping sickness" includes the stage of the disease known as Trypanosomiasis.

2. The master of every vessel arriving at a port in Ceylon from a port beyond Ceylon shall—

- (a) If the vessel has on board any person suffering or suspected to be suffering from sleeping sickness; or
- (b) If any case or suspected case of sleeping sickness has occurred, or if any person has died or is suspected to have died from sleeping sickness on board, within twelve days immediately preceding the arrival of the vessel, report every such case or death to the Pilot at the earliest opportunity, and shall also comply with such regulations as may be made in regard to—
 - (i.) Stopping at a particular place;
 - (ii.) Refraining from communication with the shore; and
 - (iii.) Taking measures for giving effect to the present rules.

3. If the vessel be at anchor within the limits of a port in Ceylon when such disease first breaks out or such death occurs, the master shall promptly give information to the "Proper Authority."

4. The Pilot on receiving the report mentioned in Rule 2 shall promptly report to the Proper Authority or the Health Officer the circumstances of the case brought to his notice.

5. When the Health Officer receives the notice referred to in Rule 4, he shall without unnecessary delay proceed on board and examine the vessel, and the master shall give him every facility for the examination of the passengers and crew.

6. On the completion of the inspection prescribed in Rule 5, such of the passengers and crew as are found to be free from sleeping sickness shall be allowed to land.

7. In every case in which on board a vessel there is a person or persons suffering or suspected to be suffering from sleeping sickness, the master shall be responsible that the sick person or persons shall be isolated as much as possible until the Health Officer has inspected the vessel.

8. The Health Officer shall remove to a hospital or other place appointed for the purpose every person found on board [suffering from or suspected to be suffering from sleeping sickness, and every such person shall be detained for observation and treatment in the said hospital or place, and shall be isolated in such a manner as will prevent, as far as possible, the communication of the disease to other persons by the agency of biting flies, and shall continue to be so detained and isolated until the Principal Civil Medical Officer certified that he is not suffering from sleeping sickness, or that having suffered from the disease he has been cured.

9. All persons removed to hospital or kept under observation at any place shall obey and conform to the rules, regulations, and orders for the time being in force at such hospital or place.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 26, 1909.

Births.—The total births registered were 105 (3 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 6 Tamils, 15 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1909, viz., 182,058) was 30·1, as against 20·6 in the preceding week, 22·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 132 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 18 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others), including the death of a town resident who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37·8, as against 38·7 in the previous week, 34·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 132 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 1.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 24 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 each were in Kotahena and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Fort, Pettah, and Slave Island; and 7 deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Slave Island, 3 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, 2 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Kollupitiya.

3. Eleven deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Dysentery*, 7 from *Diarrhoea* (of which 4 infants under one year), 7 from *Enteritis* (1 infant), 6 each from *Worms* (2 infants) and *Tetanus* (5 infants), 4 from *Debility* (3 infants), and 36 from other causes.

4. Eight deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 2 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in St. Sebastian, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Kollupitiya, and the General Hospital. During the week 13 cases of *Enteric Fever* were reported, against 22 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·4°, against 82·2° in the preceding week, and 82·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·894 in., against 29·964 in. in the preceding week and 29·910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·53 in., against 0·80 in. in the preceding week and 0·17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
