HUGH CLIFFORD.

HEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 3 of "The Dried Meat Ordinance, 1908," it is enacted that the Governor in Executive Council may from time to time by Proclamation declare that it shall be unlawful to remove dried meat from any revenue district or chief headman's division:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1908, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that it shall be unlawful for any person to remove dried meat from the Chief Headman's division of the Maritime pattus, in the Revenue District of Mullaittivu, specified in the schedule hereto, as from and after September 1, 1909.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the 13th section of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, has been pleased to establish that from and after January 1, 1909, all manure lodged within the manure or any re-shipment warehouse which shall not be re-shipped within five days from the date of landing (of which days the day of landing and the day of re-shipment shall each count as one) shall be liable to warehouse rent at the rate of 50 cents per ton, provided that such manure shall be liable to a single rate for the first eight days from the day of landing, including the day of landing, and after expiry of the eighth day to an additional rate equal to the single rate for every additional seven days or fraction of seven days.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, by virtue of the powers vested in him by the 13th section of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, has been pleased to establish that from and after January 1, 1909, the rate of warehouse rent to be charged upon all imported manure lodged in any King's Warehouse or place provided by Government for the deposit of goods shall be 50 cents per ton, instead of 25 cents as set out in the schedule of the Notification dated December 2, 1887. The manure may remain in the said warehouse or place of deposit on payment of the said rate for any time not exceeding three days, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, after which, as provided by section 3 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1901, the manure shall be liable to double rent for every 24 hours of such time as it may remain in such warehouse or place of deposit thereafter.

REGULATION REFERRED TO.

1. In order to facilitate the despatch of steamers, the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a company owning steamers may enter into a bond binding himself in the sum of Ten thousand Rupees, and by the deposit with the Collector of the sum of One thousand Rupees to hold himself responsible for the payment upon the order of the Collector of any fine or penalty to which the agent or the master of such steamer, or any person employed in any work on behalf of such agent or master of such steamer, shall have rendered himself liable for any breach of "The Customs Ordinances, 1869 to 1909," and for the payment of any fine or penalty on account of the non-delivery of cargo, and for the payment of any other fine or penalty in or about work performed on behalf of the master or agent of such steamer, and for the payment of any dues, rates, buoy rent, or charges for which such steamer or the master, owner, or agent thereof is liable under "The Customs Ordinances, 1869 to 1909."

Provided that where the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a company owning steamers is the local agent for more than one steamer, the property of different owners, or the local agent of more than one company owing steamers, the local agent shall enter into one bond in respect of the one or more steamers or of the one or more companies owning steamers of which he is the local agent, and shall deposit only the sum of One thousand Rupees, which sum shall be taken to be a deposit in respect of each of the steamers of which he is such local agent. The Principal Collector of Customs may, in default of payment on demand by the local agent, deduct out of such sum of One thousand Rupees any fine, dues, rates, buoy rent, charges, or penalty hereinbefore referred to.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power vested in him by sub-section (2) of section 9 E of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, No. 18 of 1892 (as amended by Ordinances No. 11 of 1900 and No. 26 of 1908), and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following by law made by the Sanitary Board of the Batticaloa District in terms of the said Ordinance, and the same is hereby published for general information.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

All householders or other persons who are desirous that the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises should be removed by the scavengers of the Board, shall deposit the same in proper boxes or other receptacles on the edge of the road outside their respective dwellings or shops daily between the hours of 6 A.M. and 8 A.M., and it shall not be lawful for any person to place or caused to be placed such dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse in any street, unless the same shall be contained in boxes or other receptacles as aforesaid, nor after the hour specified, and every such person shall remove such boxes or other like receptacles within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

DY-LAWS framed by the Government Agent of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, being the proper authority in that behalf, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 38 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, No. 9 of 1899, in respect of burial ground at Balangoda, and confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent or any person authorized in writing by him for the purpose to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and all books or documents relating thereto.

2. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth or at a less distance than four feet

from another.

No grave shall be re-opened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.
 The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall

4. The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall be buried within three days of the cremation at a depth of not less than three feet.
5. A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of

every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Government Agent, and only such fees as are approved by the said Government Agent shall be charged.

6. No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation

6. No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation ground without the permission of the keeper of the said ground, who will be held responsible for the due observance of these by-laws.

7. Any person applying to have a burial or cremation in a registered burial or cremation ground shall be bound to obey the lawful orders of the keeper of the said

ground.

8. Any person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground within the limits specified in the schedule to the Proclamation establishing a general cemetery at Balangoda, published in the Government Gazette No. 6,318 dated July 9, 1909, shall apply in writing to the Government Agent to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.

9. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then the person who shall have made the application for the registration of a burial or cremation ground shall be held to be the keeper of the ground, and shall be responsible for any breach of by-laws in respect thereto.

10. In the event of the death or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, application to have the same registered shall be made as provided in by-law 8 aforesaid, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until the registration on such application has been effected, except on the special license of the Government Agent.

11. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial or cremation ground within the proclaimed area of the cemetery of Balangoda to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is the keeper in the form

prescribed by the Government Agent, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the Office of the Government Agent not more than twen y-four hours after a burial or cremation shall have taken place therein.

12. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Government Agent.

13. Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall or

fence approved by the Government Agent.

If the keeper of a registered burial or cremation ground is unable from any cause to perform his duties, or if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Government Agent may authorize any fit and proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keepers of registered burial or cremation grounds.

Any person who is aggrieved by any order given by the keeper of a registered burial ground, or by any act or omission on his part, may complain to the Government Agent, and the Government Agent shall give such orders as may be necessary

to secure the proper observance of these rules.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of a person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. No one shall be allowed to dig a grave, except the persons employed or

approved by the keeper.

3. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

4. Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one

burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

5. The keeper shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his

commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.

6. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth, or at a less distance than four feet from another. No grave shall be re-opened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.

7. No dead body shall be buried without the permission of the cemetery-keeper, and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid.

REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours from the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. The keeper or in his absence the sexton of the cemetery shall appoint the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one arrive at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to

the graves.

3. Should it be necessary for the purpose of preventing any disturbance of one funeral party by the other, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another can be commenced.

4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery,

and his commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.

5. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth, or at a less distance than four feet from another. No grave shall be re-opened within two years, and no vault within six months, from the last interment therein.

6. The keeper of the cemetery shall send to the Chairman of the Local Board monthly a statement of all moneys recovered by him, together with such recoveries.

10. Paupers dying at the Government Civil Hospital may be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants under the direction of the cemetery-keeper. Provided also that on the production of a certificate signed by a minister of the Christian religion, the senior officer of the Police, the Secretary of the Local Board, or any headman having jurisdiction of the town, that the friends and relations of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees therein authorized for a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall allow the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

11. The Chairman or any Member of the Local Board or any person authorized by the Board and the Inspector of the Local Board may visit and inspect at any

time any burial or cremation ground.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date December 19, 1908, issued under the provisions of section 4 of the Cattle Ordinance, No. 10 of 1898, certain regulations, namely, those set forth in the schedule hereto, were declared to be in force from and after January 1, 1909; and whereas by a Notification dated June 10, 1909, it was notified that in consequence of the prevalence of rinderpest the operation of the said regulations had been postponed till January 1, 1910:

And whereas it is inexpedient that the operation of the said regulations should be further postponed in the Northern Province:

Now, therefore, it is hereby notified that the aid Notification has been rescinded so far as it relates to the Northern Province, and that the said regulations shall be in force in the said Northern Province as from and after August 27, 1909.

SCHEDULE.

Cattle Branding Regulations.

- 1. The cost of branding irons (both communal and broad arrow), forms, books, payments to headmen, &c., and other charges incidental to these rules shall be borne by Government and paid for out of votes. The Municipal Council, Colombo, shall bear all charges in connection with the cost of branding within the Municipal limits.
- 2. Branding irons when not in use shall be kept in charge of the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar of the division for which they are to be used, who shall be responsible for their safe custody. Branding irons for the purposes of rule 8 will be kept by the President, Chairman of Village Committee, or Police Magistrate, as the case may be. Within the Municipal limits of Colombo the irons shall be kept by an officer authorized by the Chairman of the Municipal Council.
- 3. Branding irons shall be issued by the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar only to the village headmen and other persons authorized by the Government Agent or by the Chairman of the Municipal Council within the Municipal limits of Colombo to brand cattle, and only when necessary.
- 4. Such headman or other person shall be responsible for the safe-keeping of the branding irons issued to him, and shall not suffer them to pass out of his hands while in his charge, and shall return them without delay to the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, or other authorized person issuing them, together with the list of cattle branded, as soon as the branding for which they are required is finished.
- 5. The Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, or other authorized person issuing them shall note in a book to be kept for the purpose the particulars of the branding irons issued and the dates of issue and return, and will take the signature of the person receiving them in his book, and on their return shall give that person a written receipt for them.
- 6. Every owner or keeper of cattle shall cause all the cattle in his charge not already bearing a communal brand to be branded with the communal brand of the village in which he resides, in the manner hereinafter provided, before they attain the age of twelve months. He shall also cause all the cattle in his charge that are of the age of twelve months and over on the date when these rules come into force to be branded in the same manner within six months from that date, unless they already bear a communal brand affixed under any rules hitherto in force.
 - 7. The communal brand shall be as follows: --

(1) The letter assigned to the district in which the village is situated. For list of letters see Appendix A.

(?) The number assigned to the village as shown in the numerical register of the Province in which the village is situated, or within the Colombo Municipality to the ward or the cattle mart, provided that, if the number consists of one figure only, two crosses (×) shall be branded

number consists of one figure only, two crosses (×) shall be branded between the district letter and the number, and if it consists of two figures only, one cross shall be similarly branded. The cross must be affixed thus (×) and not thus (+).

The above brands shall be of a uniform size, and shall be affixed on the near or left side of the animal.

$A \times \times 3$, $A \times 25$, or A 173.

Note.—The letter A signifies the Colombo District (see Appendix A), and the figures signify the villages corresponding to those figures in the numerical register of the Western Province.

8. A broad arrow shall be affixed to every animal sold by order of any Police Court, Chairman of Village Committee, or President of Village Tribunal, and to no other animal.

The brand of the Police Court, Chairman of Village Committee, or Village Tribunal shall be affixed on the near or left shoulder of the animal.

When the animal has been so branded, the Magistrate, Chairman of Village Committee, or President shall issue to the purchaser a certificate in the form prescribed in the rules for sale and transfer of cattle.

- 9. (1) In the case of animals already bearing private or caste brands at the time when these rules come into operation, no additional private or caste brands shall be affixed to such animal. Such private or caste brands shall be entered in the branding register hereinafter mentioned.
- (2) In the case of other animals all private or caste brands must be affixed on the off or right side of the animal in the presence of an officer authorized to brand cattle, and such brands shall be entered in the branding register.
- 10. Brands for sickness may be affixed at any time, but only in presence of the village headman, or, within the Municipal limits of Colombo, of a Municipal Inspector, who shall within a week of such brands being affixed report the details of them to the chief headman, or, within the Municipal limits of Colombo, to the Chairman, at the same time giving the owner of the animal a copy of the report. No brand for sickness shall be affixed over or so as in any way to interfere with or deface or render illegible any communal brand.
- 11. Cattle once branded shall not be re-branded, except with the special permission in writing of the President or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police

Magistrate, and only when the brands are becoming illegible. The re-branding shall be done in the manner afore-mentioned in these rules. The provisions of the foregoing rules as to branding shall apply to all cases of re-branding, and the particulars of every case of re-branding shall be entered in the branding register, together with a note that the animal has been previously branded. If the new brand is not identical with the old brand, a note to that effect must be made in the cattle voucher.

- 12. Cattle shall be branded only on certain days and at fixed places to be determined by the Government Agent, and within Municipal limits by the Chairman.
 - No person shall—
 - (a) Be in possession of any implement for branding so constructed as to be an imitation, whether exact or not, of any communal brand or part hereof; or
 - (b) Be in possession of any implement for branding for which he cannot satisfactorily account; or
 - (c) Affix any imitation, whether exact or not, of any communal brand to any head of cattle; or
 - (d) Be in possession of any cattle bearing forged, altered, defaced, or unauthorized brands; or
 - (e) Brand cattle unless authorized thereto by the Government Agent, or, within Municipal limits, by the Chairman.
- 14. No person shall at any time alter, add to, or deface any of the brands on any head of cattle.
- 15. All cattle shall be branded in presence of the headman of the village in which the owner or keeper resides, or of the authorized municipal officer, provided that cattle belonging to any headman or authorized officer or any member of his family shall be branded in presence of the headman of any adjoining village or of any headman of superior rank to a village headman, or of any municipal officer of superior rank to such authorized officer. Before permitting any head of cattle to be branded, the officer in whose presence it is to be branded shall satisfy himself of the title of the person applying to have it branded. If the officer has reason to suspect the title, he shall forward the animal to the President or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police Magistrate, who shall deal with it under rule 19, and, if the title be satisfactorily proved, issue a written order to the headman to permit it to be branded.
- 16. The village headman or person authorized under rule 2 to brand cattle shall keep a register in duplicate, according to Form A annexed, of all cattle branded in his presence, and send a copy of the same at the conclusion of the branding, with the branding irons, to the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, or officer authorized by the Chairman of the Municipal Council. The person keeping the register may, on application, issue a copy of any entry in the register, for which he shall be entitled to take a fee of 25 cents.
- 17. The communal brand is under no circumstances to be affixed to an animal already bearing a communal brandmark affixed under any rule now in force.
- 18. When a calf is branded, the dam, if alive, should be produced, and the branding officer should satisfy himself that the calf is the produce of that dam. If the dam is dead, a note to that effect shall be made in the register.
- 19. Cattle not bearing a communal brand, if apparently over the age of twelve months, stray cattle, and cattle bearing altered or defaced or illegible or counterfeit brands, or cattle for which false or suspicious certificates are produced, and acquired cattle, for which the possessor has no certificate, may be seized, wherever kept, by any headman, or police or municipal officer, and shall as soon as possible, after seizure, be produced by him before the President or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police Magistrate, who shall inquire into claims that may be made to such cattle; and if no claim is made within eight days, or if no claim so made is substantiated, may order the sale of them, and credit the proceeds, less reasonable expenses, including expenses of branding with the broad arrow, to the Communal or, within Colombo Municipal Council limits, to the Municipal Fund, or, where there is none, to General Revenue, and shall issue a certificate as provided in rule 8 to the purchaser after causing the cattle to be branded in the manner provided by rule 8. Half the proceeds, less the reasonable expenses above mentioned, may be paid to the headman seizing or informer, if so ordered by the President, Chairman of the Village Committee, or Police Magistrate. Provided that if any person shall, within six months of the sale, prove his title to the satisfaction of the President or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police Magistrate to order the payment to him of the proceeds of the sale, less the reasonable expenses above-mentioned and any sum already paid to the officer seizing or informer.
- 20. The Government Agent or the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Colombo may, in his discretion, exempt from the operation of rule 6 any head of cattle not being of pure native breed. Provided that the owner shall apply in writing for such exemption which the Government Agent or Chairman of the Municipal Council may grant; the Government Agent or Chairman of the Municipal Council of Colombo shall in such case issue a certificate for each head of cattle so exempted in the Form A

in the schedule to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898, substituting for the words "name and residence of seller or donor" the words "exempted by the Government Agent or Chairman of the Colombo Municipal Council, as the case may be, from communal brand"

21. A special officer, appointed under section 4 of the rules for sale and transfer of cattle, may, if authorized in writing by the Government Agent or Chairman of the Municipal Council of Colombo, attend at any place where cattle are being branded, and issue to possessors of acquired cattle, for which they hold no certificate, at the time when such cattle are produced to be branded, a certificate in Form A prescribed in the schedule to Ordinance No. 10 of 1898.

The fee of 15 cents for branding or re-branding any animal shall be paid by the owner to the chief headman of the division or to the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Colombo, within Municipal limits, who shall give a receipt for the amount in Form B annexed. The owner shall hand the receipt to the branding officer, who will brand the animal.
- 24. The fees shall be accounted for as may be directed, and shall be paid to Revenue, and, within the Municipal limits of Colombo, to the Municipal Fund.

OTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter the Third Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place on Tuesday, January 4, 1910, and following days.

Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Public Instruction, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10 with the words "Ceylon Stamp Duty" only, without the words "Judicial" or "Warehouse Warrant" printed thereon, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be on January 4, 1910, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Instruction, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination was sent in, reference may be made to it by mentioning name and date of examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past birth, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900.

3. Clerks in Government service, from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' satisfactory service and are not members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, or Railway Departments, and those clerks employed by Provincial and District Road Committees whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. cations (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the

Director of Public Instruction through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than 2 P.M. on Wednesday, December 1, 1909; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be

absolutely rejected.

- 5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.
- The examination will be held at Colombo only, in the place and under the supervision of the officer specified in Schedule B. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 21, 1909.

Births.—The total births registered were 76 (2 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 34 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 8 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1,1909, viz., 183,872) was 21.5, as against 26.9 in the preceding week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 114 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32 3, as against $29 \cdot \overline{2}$ in the previous week, 34 8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36 5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Dcaths.—Of the 114 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 20 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 3.

Selected Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 14 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island; 2 deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Slave Island, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, and I each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals).
- 3. Ten deaths were registered from Diarrhoea (including 3 infants), 9 from Tetanus (all infants), 7 Dysentery, 6 Dochmius Duodenalis, 6 Old Age, 4 from Worms, 4 Debility (2 infants), 3 Infantile Convulsions, and 30 from other causes.
- 4. Three deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 2 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year), 1 each from New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). During the week 12 cases of Enteric Fever were reported, against 7 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 79.9° in the preceding week and 81.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.905 in., against 29.955 in. in the preceding week and 29.908 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.11 in., against 2.14 in. in the preceding week and 0.15 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
