## ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

### SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1909.

#### WESTERN PROVINCE.

##### COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: yala crops are being harvested. A fairly good maha harvest is probable.

Dry grain: no cultivation worth reporting.

Other products: the supply of vegetables was good, and prices were reasonable, but fruit was scarce and dear. The flowering and prospects of coconuts were not so good as in the previous month. The crop for the month is reported at 7,110,947 coconuts approximately.

Prices of staple products: rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 6.50 a bushel; coconuts, Rs. 40 to Rs. 50 a thousand.

Rainfall: the rainfall during the month was sufficient for the purposes of cultivation. In some villages, however, there were floods, but they were of short duration.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: a good yala harvest may be generally expected.

Observations on the health of the inhabitants: there were in some villages a few cases of malarial fever, typhoid fever, dysentery, measles, and chickenpox, otherwise the health of the inhabitants was generally good.

##### KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the reaping of the yala harvest commenced during the month, and preparations are being made for the maha cultivation in some places.

Dry grain: no cultivation worth reporting.

Other products: (a) the supply of vegetables and fruits was scanty throughout the whole district, but there was a fair supply of cassava bulbs in the totamunes; (b) the flowering of coconuts was better than during the previous month, and if a severe drought does not follow upon the recent heavy rains, good results may be anticipated. The estimated crop for the month is 3,972,000 nuts.

Prices of staple products: rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 7 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 35 to Rs. 70 per thousand.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: a good harvest could have been expected but for the damage caused to the crop by the recent heavy rains.

Rainfall at Kalutara: total, 15·25 in.; mean, 49 in.

Health of people: satisfactory, there having been only a few cases of chickenpox, dysentery, contagious fever, and measles.

Health of cattle: rinderpest still exists in some villages of Kalutara totamune and Rayigam korale in spite of the vigorous measures taken to stamp out the disease. Hoof-and-mouth disease has also not disappeared yet from the district. Every endeavour is being made to arrest the spread of these diseases and completely stamp them out.

#### CENTRAL PROVINCE.

##### KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: ploughing and sowing in progress; yala: hill paddy in crop.

Dry grain: kurakkan is reaping.

Rainfall: sufficient.

Prospect of coconut crop: flowering good. Estimated produce for the month of August, 1909: Yatinuwara, 155,000; Tunpane, 16,000; Harispattu, 1,100; Uda Dumbara, 1,150; Pata Hewaheta, 64,000. In other divisions crop not ascertainable.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1·50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 5·50 per bushel; salt, Rs. 3 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 6 per 100.

Health of people: good.

Health of cattle: rinderpest broke out in some villages.

##### NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy, yala: some fields are being sown, in others there are young plants.

Dry grain: chena cultivation has commenced.

Health of population: good. There are a few cases of dysentery and measles in Uda Hewaheta.

Health of cattle: good. There were three cases of rinderpest in Uda Hewaheta.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1·50 to Re. 1·75 per bushel; Indian corn, Re. 1·75 per bushel; rice (Coast), Rs. 6 to Rs. 7·50 per bushel; rice (country), Rs. 5 to Rs. 5·50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 8 to Rs. 9 per hundred.

##### MATALE DISTRICT.

Rainfall: 10·64 inches.

Paddy: yala fields in ear and ripening.

Dry grain: menderiya crops are being gathered.

Coconut: (a) flowering promising; (b) 122,800 nuts approximate crop.

Tanks: in Matale North are half full.

Health of people: good.

Health of cattle: cases of hoof-and-mouth disease reported in some villages.

Prices: moderate.

Weather: maximum temperature, 90·7°; minimum temperature, 73°.

Direction of wind: mainly from the south-west.

Harvest prospects generally: harvest over.

Health of people: normal.

Health of cattle: good.

##### MANNAR DISTRICT.

Weather: rainfall, 4·25 in.; maximum temperature, 91·02°; minimum temperature, 73·05°; direction of wind, south-west.

Agriculture: kalapokam fields manured for next year: sirupokam crops being reaped; coconuts, condition fair; palmyra: condition fair; dry grains: nil.

Health of people: normal.

Health of cattle: good.

Price of food stuffs: rice, Rs. 6 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5·50 per 100

## MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Prospects of paddy crop : idaipokam cultivation is over ; sirupokam could not be threshed owing to rain ; preparations for kalapokam in hand.

Dry grain : none cultivated.

Other products—coconut : prospects of coconut trees good. The crop is estimated to be 75,000 nuts.

Prices of staple products : paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; rice, Rs. 4.50 per bushel ; kurakkan, Rs. 2 per bushel ; allu, Rs. 6 per bushel ; kollu, Rs. 3 per bushel ; ulunthu, Rs. 4 per bushel ; peas, Rs. 4 per bushel.

Rainfall : rain fell throughout the district from the middle part of the month.

Harvest prospects generally : good.

Health of inhabitants : unsatisfactory in the Maritime pattus. Fever, pneumonia, and dysentery were prevalent in places. There were twelve cases of acute diarrhoea at Kanukkeni and Mulliavalai, of which four proved fatal.

Health of cattle : fair in the Wannu ; not good in the Maritime pattus. Hoof-and-mouth disease was prevalent to some extent.

## SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

## GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy : yala crop reaped and gathered ; harvest was a fair one.

Miscellaneous : food supply of the people satisfactory. Vegetables and coconuts plentiful. Fish was scarce.

Prices of staple food : rice, Rs. 12 to Rs. 15 per bag ; paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; fine grain, Rs. 2 per bushel.

Health of people : generally satisfactory, except for a few cases of enteric at Totagamuwa and Hikkaduwa in Wellaboda pattu.

## NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

## KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Paddy crops : yala in some fields already reaped, in some matured and being reaped, and others are maturing ; some crops have already threshed. Prospects : good for southern, poor for northern, part of the district. Maha crops young ; some fields are ploughing and sowing, and some fields sown.

Fine grain : yala crops gathered : chenas for maha commenced, and some nearly completed.

Tanks are full in Katugampola and Weudawili hatpattus. Nearly half full in Dewamedu hatpattu.

Prospects of coconut flowering : fair.

Weather : few showers in Hiriyala hatpattu. Nine days' rain in Wannu hatpattu ; off and on small showers, only one heavy shower, in Dewamedu hatpattu ; very fair in Katugampola hatpattu.

Health of people : good.

Health of cattle : cattle murrain is prevailing in all the hatpattus, except Dewamedu hatpattu.

## PUTTALAM AND CHILAW DISTRICTS.

Prospects of maha and yala harvests : no cultivation for maha in Puttalam District. Paddy has been sown to a large extent in Chilaw District for maha and yala. Reaping of yala crop in some places is nearly over. In some blossoming and earing.

Grain : chenas are being cleared for maha cultivation ; mun, meneri, &c., sown for yala have been harvested.

Other products, including statements regarding the flowering and prospects of coconut : preparations are being made in Puttalam District for tobacco cultivation. The hemp cultivation in Pitigal Korale South is gathered. Growth of vegetable is poor owing to drought. Flowering and prospects of coconuts indifferent to bad in Puttalam District, and fair to good in Chilaw District. The actual crop for the month : the crop for the month is 13,975,506.

Prices of staple products : rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6.50 per bushel ; paddy, Re. 1.75 to Rs. 3 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Rs. 2 per bushel ; coconut, 4½ to 5 cents per nut ; fish and vegetable, dear.

Rainfall of the month : 2.45 in. at Puttalam. There were good showers of rain in the Chilaw District.

Harvest prospects generally : prospects are not very satisfactory in Puttalam District owing to insufficient rain and paddy pest. Prospects : fair in Chilaw District.

Health of inhabitants : generally fair. There were some cases of measles and sore-eyes.

Health of cattle : rinderpest has appeared again in Pitigal Korale North and South, but has not yet got a firm hold—only some four cases as yet.

## NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

## ANURADHAPURA DISTRICT.

Weather : the early part of the month was dry, and the latter part wet.

Rainfall : the registered rainfall at Anuradhapura was 5.34 inches. There was rain throughout the Province towards the end of the month.

Cultivation—paddy : the crops on fields cultivated for the yala harvest are reaching maturity. In Tamankaduwa the fields are being reaped. Kurakkan chenas are being cleared. Tavalu (tank bed) chenas are being sown.

Health of people : satisfactory.

Health of cattle : rinderpest prevails in a few villages in Unduruwa korale in Kalagam palata and in Egoda pattuwa in Tamankaduwa and in Anuradhapura town. The total number of cattle affected is 120.

Village tanks : the village tanks are half to quarter full.

## PROVINCE OF UVA.

## BADULLA DISTRICT.

Weather : dry, with occasional showers during the latter part of the month.

Paddy : the maha crop has been gathered.

Chenas : chenas are being cleared for 1909 cultivation.

Fruits : fruits are scarce and dear.

Vegetables : vegetables are scarce and dear.

Other products : the flowering and prospects of coconuts are not satisfactory.

Health of the people : satisfactory, although there were a few cases of fever, measles, sore-eyes, and dysentery.

Health of cattle : rinderpest still exists in Wiyaluwa, Wellassa, Buttala, and Bintenna. The disease is now decreasing.

Prices of staple products : rice varies from Rs. 5.50 to Rs. 7 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.75 to Rs. 2 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 10 per 100.

Rainfall : 7.58 in. as registered at the observatory.

## PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

## RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the maha crops in Kuruwiti and Nawadun korales have been sown ; prospects are not favourable owing to incessant rain. The yala crop throughout almost the whole district are ripe and being reaped and harvested. The weather is unfavourable for harvesting operations.

Dry grain : in Kuruwiti korale perayala crops are blossoming : prospects are favourable. Throughout the district maha chenas are being cleared and prepared for sowing. In Nawadun and Kukul korales crops on yala chenas are ripening and being reaped. In Kuruwiti and Kukul korales owiti crops are being harvested.

Other products—coconuts : in Kuruwiti korale flowering prospects are good ; the crop is estimated at 37,000 nuts. In Nawadun and Atakalan korales there is no particular season for flowering ; the actual crop is not ascertainable. In Kolonna korale the flowering prospects are not very favourable. The crop is estimated at 570 nuts. In Kadawata and Meda korales the flowering prospects are favourable. In Kukul korale flowering prospects are good, and the crop is estimated at 200 nuts.

The health of the people throughout the district is satisfactory, except in some parts in Kuruwiti and murrain. Kolonna korales, where rinderpest is prevailing. Cattle throughout the district is enjoying immunity from murrain.

The prices of food products are rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 per bushel ; paddy, Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel ; amu 75 cents to Re. 1 per bushel ; coconuts Rs. 4 to Rs. 8 per 100 nuts ; salt, 10 cents to 25 cents per measure.

In the event of consent being given by the lessor to the lessee for the erection of any temporary building on the said premises, such building shall be according to a plan to be approved by the Municipal Council of Colombo.

3.
