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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

IN accordance with the requirements of "The Opium Ordinance, 1899 to 1905," notice is hereby given that the Chairman, Municipal Council, Galle, will receive sealed tenders, as described below, at the Galle Kachcheri up to 1 P.M. on Tuesday, September 7, 1909, for the right to sell opium by retail within the Galle Municipality, viz., (1) High street bazaars, (2) Pettigallawatta, (3) China Garden, (4) Kaluwella.

- 2. Tenders should be made, (a) for the first six months of the year 1910; (b) for the second six months of the year 1910; (c) for the first six months of the year 1911.
- 3. The rent will be sold for six months only, with option of renewal for six or twelve months more at the will of the Chairman.
- 4. No tender will be considered, unless the tenderer is present in person, or by his agent duly authorized in writing, at the Galle Kachcheri at 1 P.M. on September 7, 1909.
- 5. In the event of the tenders not being satisfactory, the Chairman will put up the rents to sale by public auction.

Conditions subject to which Retail Licenses are issued.

- (1) The purchaser of a license to sell opium by retail shall, immediately on his being declared by the proper authority to be the purchaser, pay in cash one-third of his bid, which sum shall be held by the proper authority as security, but cannot be used for payment of any of the instalments of the amount of the bid, except those for the last two months. He shall pay the amount of the bid in six equal monthly instalments on the last day of every month during the currency of his rent, the first instalment to be paid on January 31, 1910, and shall pay interest at 9 per cent. per annum for every day for which an instalment is in arrear. The security money may be at the request of the purchaser placed in fixed deposit at any bank to be selected by him, and shall be at the risk of the purchaser. Should any instalment not be paid on the due date, the proper authority may re-sell the license, or so much of the term thereof as may be unexpired, at the risk of the purchaser.
- (2) The store or premises hereby licensed must be fully described in the body of this license, which shall apply to the premises so described, and nothing more.
- (3) The premises hereby licensed shall not have internal communication with any other buildings or premises.
 - (4) The premises hereby licensed shall be kept clean and in good sanitary condition.
- (5) It shall be the duty of the person in charge of the premises hereby licensed to open them for inspection on the demand of any person appointed an Inspector by the proper authority in writing, or of any Police Officer not below the rank of Inspector. The person in charge shall also be bound to produce all books, documents, or accounts with reference to the receipt or disposal of opium which he has in his possession, and to weigh, if especially called on to do so, in the presence of the Inspector or Police Officer, all opium in stock or on the premises at the time of the inspection; he shall also explain to the best of his ability any discrepancy that may be found to exist between the quantity of opium in stock and the quantity which, according to the books, ought to be in stock at the time of inspection.
 - (6) No opium shall be consumed on the premises hereby licensed.
 - (7) No opium kept on the premises hereby licensed shall be adulterated or deteriorated in any way.
 - (8) No disorderly conduct shall be permitted on the premises hereby licensed.
- (9) No opium shall be delivered on the premises hereby licensed to any person who is under the influence of liquor of opium, or who is apparently under the age of fifteen years.
- (10) No opium shall be delivered on, or from, or received into, the premises hereby licensed between the hours of eight at night and six in the morning.
- (11) There shall be kept on the premises hereby licensed a bound Stock Book with numbered pages. A copy of such book for the premises hereby licensed will be delivered free by the proper authority to the licensee when he takes out his license. If a new book is required it must be purchased by the licensee from the proper authority, to whom the previous book must be delivered.
- (12) It shall be the duty of the licensee to see that all receipts and disposals of opium are regularly entered in the Stock Book immediately the transaction takes place, all the columns in the book being correctly filled in and the quantity in stock at the beginning and end of the day being clearly shown.
- (13) It shall also be the duty of licensee to see that on or before the second of each month there is transmitted to the Inspector-General of Police a correct copy of the Stock Book and a correct copy of the book required to be kept under condition No. 20.
- (14) It shall be the duty of the Inspector-General of Police to issue to the licensee a receipt for such correct copies when they have been received. In the event of the licensee not receiving such receipts within a week of his posting the correct copy, it shall be his duty to communicate with the Inspector-General of Police and ascertain whether such correct copies have been received, and if they have miscarried to supply duplicates.
- (15) It shall be the duty of the licensee before he receives his license to submit to the proper authority a list giving the names of the persons whom he proposes to employ on the premises hereby licensed. Such statement shall contain the full name and description of each employe, and specify the nature of the work which he is to perform. All such persons must be over the age of twenty-one years, and the proper authority must be satisfied that they are of good character. No person whose name has not been endorsed on this license by the proper authority shall be employed by the licensee to take charge of, receive, or sell opium on his account, and the licensee shall not permit any one whose name is not so endorsed to perform any of the above duties.
- (16) The licensee may from time to time apply to the proper authority to make such alterations as seem desirable in the list of persons employed; such alterations shall be endorsed on this license, and the licensee on receiving a notice from the proper authority to remove any person employed on the premises hereby licensed shall, within one week of his receiving such notice, produce this license to the proper authority, so that the name of such employe may be erased from this license. Such person shall then be disqualified for employment in the premises hereby licensed.
- (17) It shall be the duty of the licensee to see that a board having the number of this license, the name of the licensee, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail," legibly painted upon it, is kept affixed to some conspicuous part of the premises hereby licensed.
- (18) No business or occupation except the sale of opium or cigars shall be carried on in the premises sereby licensed.
 - (19) No opium shall be sold except for cash paid on the spot.
- (20) It shall be the duty of the licensee to make an entry in the column "Remarks" in the Stock Book, giving the full name and address of the purchaser and giving the quantity sold whenever opium exceeding 4

(21) The licensee shall keep on the premises hereby licensed, and have available for use at all times, a true set of scales and the following standard weights:

No. 1,076 of March 9, 1909.

George Thomas Edwards, M.B.H.I.—" Improvements in automatic means for producing gas for lighting or heating purposes from petrol or other volatile oil."

Abstract.—This invention relates to improvements in the means for producing gas from volatile oils. The gas is produced by raising the gasometer, by falling weights, so as to suck air through a carburetting chamber supplied with a suitable quantity of petrol. The gasometer is raised, by the falling weights, when gas is to be stored; and is released from the raising devices as soon as it has been raised to the intended height; and then by its weight forces the gas to the place where it is to be used. A subsidiary gas holder is provided as well, to store a sufficient quantity to supply the demand during the period the gasometer is sucking in its fresh store.

The claims include the invention of raising the gasometer by the action of falling weights to create a suction of air through a carburetting device; the combination of the devices for controlling the filling and emptying of the gasometer: the shaft; the drum free to rotate on the shaft; the clutch mehanism to lock the drum on the shaft; the device for disengaging the stop motion and the device for disengaging the clutch; the use of secondary gasometer and the use in the carburetting device of pumice stone, broken or pierced, through or among which the mixture of air and gas is passed.

George William Berry.—" Improvements in Closets or Commodes."

Abstract.—This invention relates to improvements in commodes and in closets intended for use in localities where there is no sewerage system and particularly to that type wherein a vertically revolvable or partly revolvable platter is employed to receive the deposit and pass it to a receptacle beneath.

According to this invention the receiving platter is caused to upset automatically and make a half revolution, so as to deliver the deposit to the receptacle below and to remain upset and to expose upwards a clean dry surface, and so as to close communication between the receptacle and the air and the flies of the chamber in which the commode may be placed. The platter is automatically reversed, so as to expose upwards the surface intended for receiving the deposit, only when the commode is actually used. Means are provided for upsetting and reversing the platter, locking it in the normal position, and delivering a measured quantity of liquid disinfectant. The means employed are links and cranks and balance weights operated by the weight of the person in the act of using or leaving the commode, applied either through a hinged seat or a hinged foot is rest or both.
