MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE,

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on July 10, 1909, at 2 p.m.

Present.—C. M. Lushington, Esq., Chairman; D. G. Goonewardena, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; Dr. J. H. Ebell; and D. W. Subasinha, Esq.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on June 12, 1909, were read and confirmed.
2. Report of the Special Committee appointed on April 24, 1909, to report on a petition submitted by the Sub-Inspectors *re* the insufficiency of the commission paid to them for the recovery, &c., of rates and taxes. Resolved.—That the papers be circulated and brought up again at the next Meeting.
3. Report of the Special Committee appointed on June 12, 1909, to report (a) whether the Health Department cannot be worked more economically; (b) whether the fees now charged for conservancy of buckets should be increased; and (c) what system and charges should be adopted as regards the conservancy of premises (Public and Government Offices) where the latrines have to be kept clean by Municipal Officers in addition to the conservancy of buckets. Resolved.—That the report be adopted and that the amended rates do come into force from January 1, 1910.
4. Report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 9, 1909, to report *re* registration of Dairies. Resolved.—That the report be adopted along with the additional by-laws *vide* (Annexure A).
5. Letter No. 9/105,862 dated June 15, 1909, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* proposed Infectious Diseases Hospital and Segregation Camp. Resolved.—That the offer subject to the conditions contained in paragraph 2 of the letter be accepted and that Government be thanked for the same, the Council considering that it is at liberty to apply the amount for the purposes mentioned in the 3rd paragraph of its letter No. 13 of April 24, 1909.

 - (2) Progress Report of Works to end of June, 1909.
 - (3) Sanitary Officer's Report for June, 1909.

Annexure A.

3. *Adulterated Milk*.—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, hawk about, or expose for sale any cow's milk or buffalo's milk which has been adulterated with water or any foreign substance whatever.

4. *Sale and Inspection of Milk, &c.*—No person shall sell or offer for sale any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless he previously informs the person to which he sells or offers it that the cream has been removed.

5. The Medical Officer of Health or Assistant Medical Officer of Health or Veterinary Surgeon or any Municipal Inspector may at any time demand and take for the purpose of analysis samples of any milk which is in possession of a registered dairyman or any person who is found selling, hawking, or exposing milk for sale, and any registered dairyman or other person who refuses to permit samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.

6. In taking samples of milk the Medical Officer of Health or Assistant Medical Officer of Health, Veterinary Surgeon, or Municipal Inspector shall take three samples, and shall at once seal them in the presence of the registered dairyman or other person from whom they are taken, and shall deliver one to such registered dairyman or other person, send the second to a qualified analyst and the third to the Government Analyst. A certificate signed by such qualified analyst, if it states that the sample is adulterated, shall be evidence that the milk from which the sample was taken was adulterated. Should any evidence to the contrary be offered, a similar certificate from the Government Analyst shall be conclusive on the question of adulteration.

7. Printed and numbered cards, in such form as the Chairman shall from time to time direct, and signed by the Secretary, shall be issued annually to every registered dairyman on his application. No person shall sell, hawk, or expose milk for sale, unless he has in his possession a card issued for the current year to a registered dairyman, and unless such dairyman's name is still on the register at the time of the sale.

hawking, or exposing of the milk for sale. Should such person fail to produce on demand by any Municipal or Police Officer such a card for inspection, he shall be guilty of an offence, and such officer may at once arrest him, and shall convey him forthwith after arrest to the nearest Police Station, and the officer in charge of such Police Station shall deal with him as if he had been arrested by a Police Officer without a warrant under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code.

8. Should any sample of milk taken under the provisions of the preceding by-laws prove to be adulterated, the person in whose possession they were found shall be guilty of an offence, or if such person produce at the same time the samples were taken a card such as is described in the preceding by-law and the name of the registered dairyman to whom such card was issued is still on the register, then such registered dairyman shall be guilty of an offence.

Conditions subject to which Retail Licenses are issued.

(1) The purchaser of a license to sell opium by retail shall, immediately on his being declared by the proper authority to be the purchaser, pay in cash one-third of his bid, which sum shall be held by the proper authority as security, but cannot be used for payment of any of the instalments of the amount of the bid, except those for the last two months. He shall pay the amount of the bid in six equal monthly instalments on the last day of every month during the currency of his rent, the first instalment to be paid on January 31, 1910, and shall pay interest at 9 per cent. per annum for every day for which an instalment is in arrear. The security money may be at the request of the purchaser placed in fixed deposit at any bank to be selected by him, and shall be at the risk of the purchaser. Should any instalment not be paid on the due date, the proper authority may re-sell the license, or so much of the term thereof as may be unexpired, at the risk of the purchaser.

(2) The store or premises hereby licensed must be fully described in the body of this license, which shall apply to the premises so described, and nothing more.

(3) The premises hereby licensed shall not have internal communication with any other buildings or premises.

(4) The premises hereby licensed shall be kept clean and in good sanitary condition.

(5) It shall be the duty of the person in charge of the premises hereby licensed to open them for inspection on the demand of any person appointed an Inspector by the proper authority in writing, or of any Police Officer not below the rank of Inspector. The person in charge shall also be bound to produce all books, documents, or accounts with reference to the receipt or disposal of opium which he has in his possession, and to weigh, if especially called on to do so, in the presence of the Inspector or Police Officer, all opium in stock or on the premises at the time of the inspection; he shall also explain to the best of his ability any discrepancy that may be found to exist between the quantity of opium in stock and the quantity which, according to the books, ought to be in stock at the time of inspection.

(6) No opium shall be consumed on the premises hereby licensed.

(7) No opium kept on the premises hereby licensed shall be adulterated or deteriorated in any way.

(8) No disorderly conduct shall be permitted on the premises hereby licensed.

(9) No opium shall be delivered on the premises hereby licensed to any person who is under the influence

of liquor or opium, or who is apparently under the age of fifteen years.

(10) No opium shall be delivered on, or from, or received into, the premises hereby licensed between the hours of eight at night and six in the morning.

(11) There shall be kept on the premises hereby licensed a bound Stock Book with numbered pages. A copy of such book for the premises hereby licensed will be delivered free by the proper authority to the licensee when he takes out his license. If a new book is required it must be purchased by the licensee from the proper authority, to whom the previous book must be delivered.

(12) It shall be the duty of the licensee to see that all receipts and disposals of opium are regularly entered in the Stock Book immediately the transaction takes place, all the columns in the book being correctly filled in and the quantity in stock at the beginning and end of the day being clearly shown.

(13) It shall also be the duty of licensee to see that on or before the second of each month there is transmitted to the Inspector-General of Police a correct copy of the Stock Book and a correct copy of the book required to be kept under condition No. 20.

(14) It shall be the duty of the Inspector-General of Police to issue to the licensee a receipt for such correct copies when they have been received. In the event of the licensee not receiving such receipts within a week of his posting the correct copy, it shall be his duty to communicate with the Inspector-General of Police and ascertain whether such correct copies have been received, and if they have miscarried to supply duplicates.

(15) It shall be the duty of the licensee before he receives his license to submit to the proper authority a list giving the names of the persons whom he proposes to employ on the premises hereby licensed. Such statement shall contain the full name and description of each employé, and specify the nature of the work which he is to perform. All such persons must be over the age of twenty-one years, and the proper authority must be satisfied that they are of good character. No person whose name has not been endorsed on this license by the proper authority shall be employed by the licensee to take charge of, receive, or sell opium on his account, and the licensee shall not permit any one whose name is not so endorsed to perform any of the above duties.

(16) The licensee may from time to time apply to the proper authority to make such alterations as seem desirable in the list of persons employed; such alterations shall be endorsed on this license, and the licensee on receiving a notice from the proper authority to remove any person employed on the premises hereby licensed shall, within one week of his receiving such notice, produce this license to the proper authority, so that the name of such employé may be erased from this license. Such person shall then be disqualified for employment in the premises hereby licensed.

(17) It shall be the duty of the licensee to see that a board having the number of this license, the name of the licensee, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail," legibly painted upon it, is kept affixed to some conspicuous part of the premises hereby licensed.

(18) No business or occupation except the sale of opium or cigars shall be carried on in the premises hereby licensed.

(19) No opium shall be sold except for cash paid on the spot.

(20) It shall be the duty of the licensee to make an entry in the column "Remarks" in the Stock Book, giving the full name and address of the purchaser and giving the quantity sold whenever opium exceeding 4 drams in weight is sold at any one time.

(21) The licensee shall keep on the premises hereby licensed, and have available for use at all times, a true set of scales and the following standard weights:—

Avoirdupois : $\frac{1}{4}$ oz., $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 2 oz., 4 oz., 8 oz., 1 lb., 2 lb., 4 lb., 7 lb.

(22) The licensee shall observe the rules hereinafter mentioned for keeping his books.

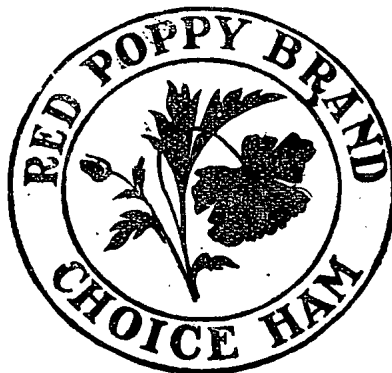
