WHEREAS a portion of the Chief Headman's division of Salpiti korale, in the District of Colombo, Western Province, was by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor in Council dated September 24, 1891, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 5,091 of October 2, 1891, brought under the operation of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," and by a Notification of the same date was divided into subdivisions, including among others the Mampe-Kesbewa and Moratuwa subdivisions:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Mampe-Kesbewa and Moratuwa subdivisions:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested by section 5 of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby from and after December 1, 1909, alter the said Mampe-Kesbewa and Moratuwa subdivisions by transferring the villages of Kaldemulla, Telawala, Borupane, and Katubedda from the said Moratuwa subdivision to the said Mampe-Kesbewa subdivision.

SCHEDULE.

COLOMBO.

To the north, a line drawn due west from a point on the beach one geographical mile north of Mutwal point to a distance of three geographical miles.

To the south, a line drawn due west from a point on the beach one geographical mile south of the flagstaff to a distance of three geographical miles.

To the west, a line connecting the western ends of the above-named north and south limits.

To the east, the shore contained between the north and south limits.

To the east, the shore contained between the north and south limits.

Legal Quays.

1. The landing jetty and foreshore bounded by Customs road, Munnakkara bridge, Munnakkara island, and Kutiduwa.

2. The foreshore of the preventive station, bounded by Kutiduwa, Esplanade road, and Public Works Department Office.

3. The landing places at Grandpass, Tharakully, Pitipane, Kutiduwa, Munnakkara, Duwa, Grand street, and Sea street, under special sufferance granted by the Sub-Collector.

BERUWALA

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 27, 1909.

Births.-The total births registered were 124 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 15 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1909, viz., 183,872) was 35.2, as against 30.3 in the preceding week, 30.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.-The total deaths registered were 104 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 15 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.5, as against 30.6 in the previous week, 42.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.5 the weekly average rate last year. Infantile Deaths.—Of the 104 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the

preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year. Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 10.

Selected Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 each were in Kotahena and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 each in New Bazaar and Maradana Hospitals, and 1 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya.

2. Fourteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 13 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana Hospitals, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Kotahena, Slave Island; and Kollupitiya, and 1 in St. Paul's. Four deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

3. Nine deaths were registered from Debility (including 6 infants under 1 year), 8 from Enteritis (2 infants), 6 Tetanus (5 infants), 5 Diarrhea (2 infants), 4 Infantile Convulsions, 4 Old Age, and 33 from Other Causes.

4. One death was registered from Enteric Fever (in Kollupitiya), against 3 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eight cases of Enteric Fever were reported, against 16 in the previous week. Three cases of

 Chickenpox were reported, against 5 in the previous week.
 State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 78.6° in the preceding week and
 80.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.962 in. as in the preceding week, against 29.970 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.39 in., against nil in the preceding week and 2.30 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
