ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1909.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: yala crops have been harvested. A fairly good maha crop is generally expected.

Dry grain: no cultivation worth reporting.

Other products: the supply of vegetables was good and prices were reasonable, but fruit was scarce and dear. The flowering and prospects of coconuts were encouraging in consequence of the rain. The crop for the month is reported at 10,518,344 coconuts approximately.

Prices of staple products: rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 7 a bushel; coconuts, Rs. 40 to Rs. 52 a thousand.

Rainfall: the rainfall was abundant. In consequence there were floods in some villages, but they are fast subsiding.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: the yala harvest was generally good, and a fairly good maha crop may be expected, provided the paddy plants are not damaged by the recent rains.

Observations on the health of the inhabitants: there were in some villages a few cases of malarial fever, typhoid fever, dysentery, and chickenpox, otherwise the health of the inhabitants was generally good.

Health of cattle: rinderpest was prevailing to some extent in some villages. In two or three villages there were a few cases of hoof-and-mouth disease. Precautionary measures were promptly taken to prevent their spreading. They are on the decline now.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : preparations are still being made in some places for the maha cultivation. The paddy plants of the earlier sowings were badly damaged by the recent floods.

Dry grain : there is no dry grain cultivation worth reporting in this district.

Other products : (a) fruits and vegetables have been scarce ; (b) the flowering of coconuts was better than during the past few months ; (c) the crop of coconuts for the month is estimated at 1,987,000 nuts.

Prices of staple products : rice, Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 7 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 35 to Rs. 60 per thousand.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : no remarks.

Health of people : there have been a few cases of chickenpox, measles, dysentery, and contagious fever during the month.

Health of cattle : rinderpest and hoof-and-mouth disease still exist in some parts of the district in spite of vigorous measures adopted to stamp them out.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha : the paddy in almost all the divisions is being transplanted, except in Tumpane and Uda Dumbara, in which the fields are being ploughed. Yala : harvesting is over ; prospect of crop : fair.

Dry grain, maha : hill paddy is being sown. Yala : nil.

Rainfall : sufficient.

Prospect of coconut crop : flowering good. Estimated produce for the month of October, 1909 : Udu-nuwara 607,200, Yatinuwara 14,000, Tumpane 18,000, Harispattu 1,100, Uda Dumbara 1,100, Pata Hewaheta 69,000. In other divisions crop not ascertainable.

Prices of staple articles : paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.50 per bushel ; rice, Rs. 5.50 per bushel ; salt, Rs. 3 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 6 per 100.

Health of people : good.

Health of cattle : rinderpest prevailed in Deyannewela in Kandy, and there were a few cases of foot-and-mouth disease in Norwood and Pussellawa.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy, yala cultivation fields : some are young plants, some are ripening, and others are being reaped.

Dry grains : chenas are being sown.

Health of population : good. There were three cases of chickenpox in Kotmale, one in Nanu-oya, and a few cases of sore-eyes and cough in Uda Hewaheta.

Health of cattle : good.

Health of people : normal.

Health of cattle : good.

MANNAR DISTRICT.

Maximum temperature : 92.4° ; minimum temperature : 72.8°.

Rainfall : 10.61 in.

Direction of the wind : south-west.

Paddy : sowing for kalapokam in progress.

Tobacco : gardens are being manured.

Coconuts : in good condition.

Palmyra : nuts, nil.

Dry grain : a small area being cultivated.

Health of people : normal.

Health of cattle : good.

Prices of food stuffs : paddy, Re. 1.62 per bushel ; rice, Rs. 6 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 7 per 100.

MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Prospects of-paddy crop : sowing for kalapokam in manavari lands is already over. The condition of the plants is fair ; sowing is in progress in a few fields under tanks. More rain is needed.

Dry grain : none cultivated.

Other products—coconuts : the trees are in a flourishing condition. The crop for the month is estimated to be 81,600 nuts.

Prices of staple products : paddy, Rs. 2.25 per bushel ; rice, Rs. 5 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.75 per bushel ; ellu, Rs. 6 per bushel ; kollu, Rs. 3 per bushel ; ulunthu, Rs. 4 per bushel ; peas, Rs. 4 per bushel.

Rainfall : there were occasional showers of rain enough for the sowing for kalapokam.

Harvest prospects generally : fair.

Health of inhabitants : fever, pneumonia, and dysentery were prevalent in the Maritime pattu ; in the other parts of the district the health of the inhabitants is fair. There were a few cases of measles in Vavuniya South.

Health of cattle : there was hoof-and-mouth disease in some villages in the Maritime pattu ; in the rest good. Pasture and water supply good.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy : maha sowings in some places were damaged by floods caused by heavy rains.

Food supply : sufficient. Price of imported rice high ; fish, scarce and dear ; vegetables, equal to the demand.

Price of staple food : rice, Rs. 4.80 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; fine grain, Rs. 2 per bushel.

Health of people : the health of the people has been satisfactory, except for a few cases of dysentery and measles.

Health of cattle : no murrain, but there were a few cases of hoof-and-mouth disease in the Four Gravets during the latter part of the month.

Other products : the crop of coconuts obtained during the month fair. No change observed in the flowering of trees.

Rainfall : 25.88 in.

MATARA DISTRICT.

Health of people : fair.

Health of cattle : rinderpest is still prevailing in some parts of West Giruwa pattu. There were 14,391 cases, 13,724 deaths, 568 recoveries in the district up to October 26, 1909.

Coconut crop for the month was about 336,000 nuts.

Prices : Coast rice, Rs. 6 per bushel ; country rice, Rs. 5.75 per bushel ; paddy, Re. 1.75 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.62 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 6 per 100 ; plantain bunches, Rs. 55 per 100 ; Indian corn, Re. 1 per 100 ; salt, Rs. 4.48 per cwt.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy : sowing for munmari cultivation is almost over.

Other grains and other products : dry grain in plants ; some chenas still being cleared and burnt ; prospects of coconut trees good.

Public health : sore-eyes still prevail.

Cattle disease : prevails in four divisions in the south of the district, while five divisions non-infected.

Paddy : Re. 1.80 per bushel.

Rainfall : 4.55 in. in 1908 ; 3.60 in. in 1909.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Paddy crops : maha in some fields are sowing and young, some fields are ploughing, and some being sown.

Fine grain : chenas are being sown. Some chenas sown, and in some chenas young plants.

Prospects of coconut flowering : fair.

Weather : plenty of rain in Hiriya, Dewamedi, Katugampola, and Weudawili hatpattus ; seventeen days' rain in Wann hatpattu ; eighteen days' rain in Dambadeni hatpattu.

Health of people : good.

Health of cattle : cattle murrain is prevailing in Hiriya, Weudawili, and Katugampola hatpattus.

PUTTALAM AND CHILAW DISTRICTS.

Paddy : the yala crop has been harvested, and the maha cultivation has commenced in both districts. Crops in some fields are already growing.

Dry grain : chenas are being sown in Puttalam District. In Chilaw chenas have been sown for maha.

Other products, including coconut : tobacco cultivation is being carried on. Preparations are being made for planting vegetable. Flowering and prospects of coconut fair in Puttalam District and good in Chilaw District. The crop for the month is estimated at 14,278,906.

Prices of staple products : rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6.50 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Rs. 2 per bushel ; cassava, 62½ cents per cwt. ; coconuts, 3 cents to 5 cents per nut ; and vegetable, scarce.

Rainfall of the month : 10.78 in. at Puttalam, 15.50 in. in Pitigal korale Central of Chilaw District, and there was heavy rain in all the other divisions. Various roads were flooded and traffic on them was stopped.

Harvest prospects generally : prospects satisfactory in some places and unsatisfactory in others.

Health of inhabitants and cattle : of inhabitants generally good. Of cattle : rinderpest still exists in some villages, mostly near Battulu-oya.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

ANURADHAPURA DISTRICT.

Rainfall : the registered rainfall at Anuradhapura during the month was 13.63 in. There was sufficient rain throughout the Province during the month.

Cultivation—paddy : cultivation for maha has started in some villages in the Province. Kurakkan : kurakkan chenas are being sown. Those cultivated early have young crops. Tavalu (tank-bed) chenas have tender crops.

Other products : coconut trees flowered satisfactorily during the month. The estimated crop gathered is 10,000 nuts.

Health of people : satisfactory. There were a few cases of measles reported from Kalagam palata.

Health of cattle : rinderpest is prevailing in several villages in Egoda and Meda pattus of Tamankaduwa and in one village in Kalagam palata, and in Nuwarawewa in the town of Anuradhapura and at Bandi-Alankulama in Nuwaragam palata. The epidemic in Tamankaduwa has spread to some extent, but in the other parts of the Province every precaution has been taken to check it, with very satisfactory results.

Village tanks : the village tanks are fairly full.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

BADULLA DISTRICT.

Weather : generally wet.

Paddy : fields are being ploughed for yala sowings.

Chenas : chenas are being sown.

Fruit and vegetables : a moderate supply of fruits and vegetable is available.

Other products : the flowering and prospects of the coconuts are fair.

Health of the people : satisfactory, except for a few cases of fever, measles, and sore-eyes.

Cattle disease : rinderpest still exists in Wiyaluwa, Bintenna, and Buttala divisions.

Prices of staple products : rice, varies from Rs. 5 to Rs. 8.40 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.75 to Rs. 2 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 10 per 100 nuts.

Rainfall : 9.90 in. as registered at the observatory.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy : in Kuruwiti and Nawadun korales maha crops are two months old. In Kadawata, Meda, and Kukul korales maha fields are ploughed and prepared for sowing. In Nawadun korale fields for the second maha are being prepared for sowing. In Atakalan and Kolonna yala crops are being harvested. In Atakalan korale peramaha crops are being prepared for sowing ; prospects are favourable.

Dry grain : in Kuruwiti and Nawadun korales maha chenas and owitas are in blossom. In Kolonna, Kadawata, Meda, and Kukul korales cultivation of chenas and owitas for maha has begun ; prospects are favourable. In Atakalan korale el-wi chenas are thriving well. In Meda and Pannil pattus kurahan crops are still being harvested in some parts. Kurahan chenas in Depattu have been sown.

Other products—coconuts : in Kuruwiti korale flowering prospects are good ; the crop has been estimated at 42,000 nuts. In Nawadun and Atakalan korales there is no particular season for flowering, and the actual crop is not ascertainable. In Kolonna korale flowering prospects are favourable. The crop is estimated at 495 nuts. In Kadawata and Meda korale flowering prospects are satisfactory. Price of coconuts is still high. In Kukul korale flowering prospects are good. The crop is estimated at 200 nuts.

The health of the people is satisfactory. A few cases of chickenpox are reported from Nawadun korale.

The health of cattle generally is good. There were few cases of rinderpest and hoof-and-mouth disease in Kuruwiti korale.

The prices of food products are : rice, Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 7 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 2 to 2.50 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel ; amu, 60 cents to Re. 1 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 4 to Rs. 12 per 100 nuts ; salt, 10 to 25 cents per measure.

KEGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy: maha prospects are good.

Dry grain: hill paddy, iringu, and amu prospects are good. Kurakkan chenas have been harvested. The yield is good.
