WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to abolish any existing tolls or any tolls which may thereafter be legally established, anything in "The Toll Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution dated the 4th day of August, 1884, do abolish the toll existing at Kalukēle, on the 10th milepost in the Badulla District, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1895.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twelfth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.

Notification Establishing New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal, anything in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding :

It is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers in that behalf by the said 1st section of the said Ordinance conferred, the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 31st day of October, 1894, did by resolution establish a toll opposite the resthouse at Tanamalwila, and between the 28th and 29th mileposts, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1895.

Resolution as to Collection of New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof, anything which may be contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding :

And whereas by a resolution of the 31st day of October, 1894, the Legislative Council established a toll in respect of the Wellawaya road :

And whereas it is expedient to determine at what place the toll in respect of the said road shall be collected :

It is hereby notified that the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by a resolution of the 11th day of November, 1894, determined that such toll shall be collected at Tanamalwila, between the 28th and 29th mileposts, from the 1st day of January, 1895.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified :

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorizing the Legislative Council, by Resolution, to establish Tolls, and the Governor in Executive Council, by Resolution, to establish Tolls, and to alter the places where Tolls shall be collected," it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything in the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding ; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall be so established by any such resolution, the provisions of the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," and of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1871 shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said Ordinance, apply to such tolls :

And whereas the Legislative Council of the said Island, at a public session thereof held on the 31st day of October, 1894, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the Wellawaya road, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1895, and it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said ferry shall be levied :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established at

Tanamalwila, in respect of the Wellawaya road aforesaid, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twelfth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.
