AMENDED MINUTE BY THE GOVERNOR.

In pursuance of instructions from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction payment of compensation for the fall in exchange on the following terms for the year which commenced 1st January, 1894:—

(a) To officers in the higher branches of the Government Service, compensation sufficient to bring half their salaries up to 1s. 6d. the rupee.

(b) Payment of each month's compensation to be calculated on the rate of exchange which ruled on the last day of the previous month.

(c) These rates will in future be regularly notified in the Government Gazette.
(d) Payment of arrears of compensation to be based on the following rates:

For January, 1894 1s. 2 5/16d. (rate prevailing on 31st December, 1893) 1s. 1 11 32d. February, 1894 1s. 1 3/4d. 1s. 1 5/16d. March, 1894 April, 1894 May, 1894 1s. 0 15/16d. June, 1894 July, 1894 1s. Q 31/32d. 1s. 0 31/32d. 1s. 0 15/16d. August, 1894 1s. 1 13/16d. September, 1894 October, 1894 1s. 1 3/16d. November, 1894 1s. 1 LI/32d. ...

(e) No arrears of compensation to be paid to any officer who has availed himself of the privilege of family remittance since 1st January last.

THE following instructions are to be observed in granting compensation for fall in exchange:-

No compensation shall be paid on any salary which is less than Rs. 250 a year.

2. No compensation shall be paid on any personal or other allowance, whether included in salary or not, without express authority of Government granted after consideration of all the circumstances under which the allowance was granted,

3. No compensation will be paid in respect of that part of the salary of the appointment of an

officer which is paid to him on leave in a gold standard country.

4. An officer acting in a post higher than his own permanent appointment will draw compen-

sation in proportion to the salary he receives.

5. Officers serving on temporary written agreements with the Government will not be entitled to any compensation while so serving, but if confirmed or permanently employed, they will receive the compensation retrospectively from the date of their probationary appointment or of their confirmation, as may be then determined.

6. No compensation is payable to officers employed on the Colombo Harbour Works, or to

Native Police Constables or Rural Police.

- 7. No compensation is payable to officers whose emoluments have been augmented of late years with special reference to the fall in exchange, such as Foremen Platelayers and the like, without express authority of Government granted after consideration of all the circumstances under which the allowance was granted.
- 8. Heads of Departments are to be held responsible that no officer not entitled to compensation is permitted to draw it, and also that no officer is allowed to draw compensation on a larger proportion of his pay than that to which he may be entitled. In all cases of doubt or difficulty compensation should be paid on the smaller proportion, pending reference to Government. Any overpayments will be surcharged and must be refunded forthwith.

N pursuance of instructions from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction payment of an increase of ten per cent. of salary to clerks and to officers in the subordinate branches of the Public Service for the year which commenced 1st January, 1894, on the following terms:—

1. No payment to be made to any officer who has availed himself of the privilege of family remittance since 1st January last, unless he consents to surrender the advantage so obtained by refunding the amounts drawn by him on the Crown Agents.

 No increase shall be paid on any salary which is less than Rs. 250 a year.
 No increase shall be paid on any personal or other allowance, whether included in salary or not, without express authority of Government granted after consideration of all the circumstances under which the allowance was granted.

4. Officers serving on temporary written agreements with the Government will not be entitled

to any increase while so serving.

5. No increase is payable to officers employed on the Colombo Harbour Works, or to Native Police Constables or Rural Police.

6. Heads of Departments are to be held responsible that no officer not entitled to this increase is permitted to draw it.

7. This increase will be counted for pension purposes.

PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

HEREAS by the 19th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz.:-

(a) The period fixed under section 7 for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and

(b) If such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and

(c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under

section 13 have become vested in the Crown:

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest situated in the village Nariyagama, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule A hereto, to be a reserved forest, as from and after the First day of January, 1895.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule, reserving, nevertheless, (1) to the public the right of way twelve feet wide starting from the head sluice and thence proceeding southwards through the eastern side of lots 7,262 and 7,263½ to Manuwangama-eba; (2) and the three-feet footpath starting from the Manuwangama-eba and proceeding first in a northerly direction through lots 7,2633 and 7,263 to near the southern limit of the tank, lot 7,264, and thence in a westerly direction through lot 7,263 to the field, lot Z 635, and thence west to the Manuwangama village boundary, as described in preliminary plan 1,382.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.
