PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 3 of "The Local Board of Health and Improvement Ordinance, 1876," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any town or towns under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, and revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with the like advice, determine:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the 13th August, 1884, the town of Batticaloa, in the Eastern Province, was brought under the operation of the said Ordinance, and the limits of the said town were defined therein for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation of the 13th August, 1884, by redefining the limits of the said town of Batticaloa:

PART I.—Page 375.

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the limits of the said town of Batticaloa, in the Eastern Province, shall be, for the purposes of "The Local Board of Health and Improvement Ordinance, 1876," as the same are defined in the schedule hereto, as from and after the First day of January, 1895.

1. The island of Puliyantivu, bounded on all sides by the Batticaloa lake.
2. The villages Koddimunai, Uppodai, Tamarakkerni, Tandavanveli, Vaddukadu, part of Uraney, Karuwapankerni, Mattekali, and the whole of Amirtakali, lying within the following limits: north, east, and south the Batticaloa lake, west the Batticaloa lake and the Uraney road from its junction with the North Coast road on the 3rd mile to Mattekali on the Bar Main road.

Resolution as to Collection of New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof, anything which may be contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by a resolution of the 19th day of December, 1894, the Legislative Council established a toll in respect of the ferry on the Valaichenai river, at Valaichenai in the Koralai pattu in the District of Batticaloa, Eastern Province:

And whereas it is expedient to determine at what place the toll in respect of the said ferry shall be collected:

It is hereby notified that the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by a resolution of the 19th day of December, 1894, determined that such toll shall be collected at the place set forth in the schedule hereto, from and after the 1st day of January, 1895.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorizing the Legislative Council, by Resolution, to establish Tolls, and to alter the places where Tolls shall be collected," it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything contained in the "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall be so by any such resolution established, the provisions of the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," and of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1871 shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said Ordinance, apply thereto:

And whereas the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 19th day of December, 1894, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the ferry at Valaichenai, on the Valaichenai river in the Koralai pattu, in the District of Batticaloa, Eastern Province, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1895, and whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said ferry shall be levied:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the ferry on the Valaichenai river at Valaichenai in the Koralai pattu, in the District of Batticaloa aforesaid, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 20 of 1891, intituled "An Ordinance to render more accurate and complete the registration of Deaths," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in Executive Council, to divide any town or place brought within the operation of the said Ordinance into as many localities as he may deem necessary for the registration of deaths, and such localities at any time to alter or abolish :

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the 5th day of November, 1892, the said Ordinance was brought into operation, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1893, within the limits of the town of Colombo as defined by the said Proclamation :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 5th day of January, 1893, the town of Colombo was divided into nine localities as set forth in schedule A thereto for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

And whereas it is now expedient to alter the said localities :

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation revoke and cancel, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1895, the said division of the town of Colombo into nine localities, and do, with effect from the said date, divide the said town into the four localities set forth in the schedule hereto for the registration of deaths.

2. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, or to the Medical Officer in charge of the hospital, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form, and unless accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract. Each tender should be for provisioning one hospital only.

3. Every tenderer will be required to make a deposit (on applying for forms) of Rs. 25; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned after the contract has been signed. The deposit must be made at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and the deposit receipt must be produced to the officer issuing the form as his authority for making the issue. The deposit must be made to the Medical Officer in charge of the Hospital.

4. Provisions should be of the best quality, approvable by the Medical Officer of the Hospital.

5. When required, samples must be deposited.

6.
