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VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF 1909.

I.—Population.

The estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 4,071,375, showing an increase of 16,373 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 4,386 births over deaths, and an excess of 11,987 arrivals over departures of Indian coolies.

2. *Arrivals and departures of Indian coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island during the quarter amounted to 25,256 and of departures to 13,269, as against 30,432 arrivals and 17,484 departures, the averages for the corresponding quarters of the last eleven years.

II.—Marriages.

3. *Marriages.*—4,093 general marriages (*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Muhammadan) were registered during the quarter and 1,400 Kandyan marriages. Their distribution by Provinces and districts is given in Table I. in the Appendix.

4. Table VI. in the Appendix shows the marriages solemnized in the general community in each Province and district in the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the register, &c. Table VII. gives similar information in respect of the Kandyan marriages.

III.—Births and Deaths.

5. *Births.*—The births registered during the quarter numbered 32,841 (41 Europeans, 221 Burghers, 21,486 Sinhalese, 8,805 Tamils, 2,110 Moors, 96 Malays, and 82 Others), and were in the proportion of 33·8 per 1,000 persons living, as against 39·0 in the previous quarter and 34·4 the average of the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. See Table VIII. for each Province and district.

6. *Deaths.*—The number of deaths registered during the quarter amounted to 28,455 (27 Europeans, 170 Burghers, 17,235 Sinhalese, 8,943 Tamils, 1,909 Moors, 88 Malays, and 83 Others), and was equal to an annual rate of 29·3 per 1,000 persons living, as against the average 27·3 for the third quarters in the period 1898–1908 and 29·9 the rate in the preceding quarter. See Table IX. for each Province and district.

7. The births and deaths and their rates for the whole Island are compared with the previous quarter, the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and the average for the third quarters of 1898–1908 in the following Table A. For particulars as to Province and district, see Tables I. and II.:

8. The birth-rate thus shows a deterioration on the average, a deterioration shared by nine out of the twenty-one districts, and was greatest in Kurunegala, Matale, and Negombo. The death-rate also shows a deterioration, which is shared by every district, except Negombo, Matale, Jaffna, Trincomalee, Kurunegala, and Kegalla (see Table II.).

9. *Infantile mortality.*—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 6,423, and were in the proportion of 196 to 1,000 registered births. The rate of infantile mortality varied from 315 (for Tamils) in Mannar, 278 (for Tamils) in Batticaloa, 258 (for Sinhalese) in Matale, and 248 (for Sinhalese), 238 (for Tamils), and 227 (for Moors) in Puttalam, to 166 (for Sinhalese) in Matara, 161 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo, 155 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo, 155 (for Tamils) in Jaffna, 151 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara, and 143 (for Sinhalese) in Galle.

IV.—State of Public Health.

10. The general health of the population during the quarter was worse than usual, the death-rate having risen to 29·3 from the average 27·7 for the third quarters in the period 1898–1908. The deterioration was shared by every Province, except the Northern and the North-Western. The death-rate for the quarter was also slightly higher than in the corresponding quarter of last year (28·1), except in the Western, Southern, and North-Western Provinces. Compared with the previous quarter, the rate, however, shows a slight improvement (of ·6), which is distributed over four out of the nine Provinces, namely, Southern, North-Western, North-Central, and Sabaragamuwa.

11. The healthiest Province during the quarter was, as usual, the Western, with a death-rate for all races of 24·1, followed by the Northern with 24·3; the unhealthiest was, as usual in the quarter, the Province of Uva, with a death-rate of 40·4, followed by Eastern with 40·2. The healthiest district for all races was Negombo with a death-rate of 18·2, and the unhealthiest was Batticaloa with 43·1.

12. Tables III., IV., and V. in the Appendix show the number of births and deaths registered in the several Provinces and districts of the Island and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, and the average for the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. The birth-rates and death-rates for all ages and for infants in the several Provinces and districts of the Island are shown for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for the Tamils only where Tamils form the bulk of the population. In the Puttalam and the Batticaloa Districts, which contain a resident population comprised of Sinhalese, Tamils, and Moors, the rates are given for each of these races.

13. *Western Province*.—The health of the Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who on the first day of the quarter were estimated to number 863,864, or a little less than a third of the entire Sinhalese population of the Island, was slightly worse than usual, their death-rate being 21·2, against the average 20·0. During the quarter they were, however, healthier than in any other Province, and record the lowest infantile mortality among the Provinces, viz., 155 per 1,000 births registered. Two of the three districts show higher death-rates than usual, the exception being Negombo, which records the lowest mortality in the Island (17·1), followed by Chilaw with 18·7. The infantile mortality of the Kalutara District (151 per 1,000 births registered) is the second lowest in the Island, coming next after Galle (143), and followed by Colombo and Jaffna (155 each). The birth-rate of the Province (28·4) was a slight deterioration from the average (30·1), two of the districts sharing in the deterioration, the exception being Kalutara, whose rate (31·0) was normal and the highest in the Province.

14. *Central Province*.—The Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who on the first day of the quarter numbered nearly 329,000, enjoyed slightly better health than usual, their death-rate being 28·7, against an average mortality of 29·6. The improvement in health was shared by every district in the Province. As usual, the least healthy district was Matale (34·4, average 35·4), and the healthiest Nuwara Eliya (23·8, average 26·1). The birth-rate of the Province (33·4), however, shows a deterioration on the average (40·1), all the three districts sharing in the deterioration.

15. *Northern Province*.—The health of the Tamil inhabitants of the Province, who form the bulk of the population, and were estimated to number a little over 321,000 on the first day of the quarter, was normal, their death-rate (24·1) being the same as the mean-rate in the period 1898–1908. Two of its districts, however, show higher rates than usual, viz., Mannar 42·7 (average 36·0) and Mullaitivu 42·1 (average 36·2), while Jaffna District (which contains the bulk of the Tamil population 323,775) shows a slight improvement 22·6 (average 23·0), and was the healthiest in the Province. The infantile mortality of the Mannar District (315 per 1,000 births registered) was the highest in the Island. The birth-rate of the Province (37·5) was worse than the average (38·7), the deterioration being confined to the Jaffna District.

16. *Southern Province*.—The Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who numbered 602,335 on the first day of the quarter, fared worse than usual, their death-rate for the quarter rising to 26·8 from the average (24·8). The deterioration was shared by every district in the Province. It was greatest in the Hambantota District, the unhealthiest in the Province (33·7 from average 26·6), and least in the Galle District (25·5 from average 24·5). The infantile mortality of the Galle District (143 per 1,000 births registered) was the lowest in the Island. The birth-rate of the Province (34·5) was also worse than usual (36·0), a deterioration noticeable in two of its districts, the exception being Galle, where the rate was normal.

17. *Eastern Province*.—This Province, which at the beginning of the quarter was estimated to contain a population of 103,153 Tamils (of whom 85,693 were in the Batticaloa District and 17,460 in the Trincomalee District), 70,615 Moors, and 8,977 Sinhalese, presented death-rates of 45·0, 36·1, and 28·7, respectively, for the Tamils, Moors, and Sinhalese, against their respective averages of 30·3, 27·7, and 33·3 for the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. Thus, the Tamils and Moors, who constitute the majority of the population, experienced worse health than the Sinhalese and than usual. The Sinhalese enjoyed better health. The District of Batticaloa, containing the bulk of the Tamil population, was responsible for the unhealthiness among the Tamils of the Province, its death-rate rising from the average 30·0 to 48·6, while the death-rate among the Tamils in the Trincomalee District declined from the average 31·2 to 27·0. The birth-rate of the Province showed an improvement for the Tamil and Sinhalese sections of the population and a deterioration for the Moor.

18. *North-Western Province*.—The Sinhalese, who form the bulk of the population of the Province, and were estimated to number 331,784 persons on the first day of the quarter, enjoyed better health than usual, their death-rate for the quarter falling to 27·9 from the average (31·5) for the corresponding quarter

quarters of the last eleven years. All its three districts shared in the improvement. The improvement is greatest in the Kurunegala District (from 35·0 to 30·5), and least in the Chilaw District (from 18·9 to 18·7). However, Kurunegala records the highest death-rate in the Province and Chilaw the lowest. The mortality of the Chilaw District was the second lowest in the Island. The Tamils and the Moors of the Province (who are mostly in the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts) fared worse than usual and than the Sinhalese, viz., the death-rate of the Tamils rising to 54·7 from the average 45·9 and of the Moors to 35·1 from 32·6. The Sinhalese birth-rate of the Province (32·0) was a deterioration from the average (40·2); the Moor rate also shows a deterioration, but the Tamil rate was much better than usual.

19. *North-Central Province.*—The North-Central Province, which is the same as the Anuradhapura District, enjoyed slightly improved health, the Sinhalese death-rate declining from the average 32·1 to 31·0. The birth-rate of the Province, on the other hand, showed a deterioration from 41·5 to 38·6.

20. *Province of Uva.*—This Province, which is co-extensive with the Badulla District, experienced worse health than usual, its death-rate rising to 40·0 from the average (37·2). The birth-rate (43·7) was, however, an improvement on the average (41·9).

21. *Province of Sabaragamuwa.*—The health of the Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province during the quarter was better than usual, their death-rate having fallen to 27·1 from the average 28·2. The improvement was confined to the District of Kegalla, where the death-rate fell to 22·8 from the average 26·4, while in Ratnapura it was 32·8 against 30·4. The birth-rate of the Province showed a deterioration from the average 37·3 to 34·0, a deterioration shared by both its districts.

For the health of the estate population (mainly Tamil) in the Central, Uva, Sabaragamuwa, and Western Provinces, see *infra* Chapter VI., "Estate Population."

V.—Causes of Death.

22. The causes of death registered in the Island during the quarter are shown in detail in Table X. in the Appendix, and select causes of death are shown in the following Table B:—

23. *Smallpox.*—This disease caused only one death this quarter, and this was of a Sinhalese in the Kalutara District, who died in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Palatota. The source of infection was traced to an unreported case of smallpox in the village Paiyagala. The epidemic, which began in the Island about the third quarter of 1907, may be said now to have ceased.

24. Among the other causes of death were debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck) 1,236, worms 844, anaemia 827, old age 706, general dropsy 679, dochmias duodenalis 358, thrush 221, abscess 204, malarial cachexia 184, rheumatism 174, tetanus 130, paralysis 126, serofula 105, measles 97, enteritis 85, diabetes mellitus 38, influenza 35, parangi 24, leprosy 12, whooping cough 11, and chickenpox 7.

25. *Deaths by violence; Accidents.*—Of the 421 deaths attributed to accidents, 108 were due to drowning (of which 22 were by falling into wells), 104 to falls from trees (mostly of toddy-drawers), 38 to burns and scalds, 36 to snakebites, 21 to taking poisonous substances, 20 to fall of heavy substances, 15 to injuries at birth, 12 to gunshot wounds, 11 to falls from heights other than trees, 7 each to railway trains and carts, and 2 to motor cars; crocodiles were responsible for 4 deaths; buffaloes for 3; bulls,

elephants, and wasps for 2 each ; and a tiger, a " hikanala " or Brahmin lizard, a scorpion, and a rat for 1 each. Two deaths each were caused by cuts and stabs and suffocation ; 2 were due to injuries from machinery ; and 1 each was due to lightning, wireshoot accidents, and surgical operations.

26. *Homicide*.—Fifty-three deaths were due to homicides (41 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, and 2 Moors), of which 7 each were in Kurunegala and Ratnapura, 5 each in Matale and Jaffna, 4 each in Colombo and Badulla, 3 each in Negombo, Kalutara, Kandy, and Hambantota, 2 each in Nuwara Eliya and Chilaw, and 1 each in Galle, Matara, Batticaloa, Puttalam, and Anuradhapura.

27. *Suicides*.—Fifty-four deaths were due to suicides (2 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 32 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, and 1 Moor), of which 35 were by hanging, 6 by drowning, 6 by gunshot wounds, 4 by poison, 1 each by cuts and stabs and being run over by train, and 1 by other means.

28. *Execution*.—There were as many as 9 judicial executions registered in the Island during the quarter : 6 in Colombo, 2 in Galle, and 1 in Kandy.

VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

29. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates* in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province during the quarter amounted to 3,857 (9 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 125 Sinhalese, 3,671 Tamils, 33 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others), and the deaths numbered 4,137 (2 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 3,953 Tamils, 50 Moors, 5 Malays, and 10 Others), corresponding to an annual birth-rate of 36·4 and a death-rate of 39·0, as against their respective averages of 25·5 and 30·5 for the period of 1898 to 1908.

Deaths are in marked excess over births in Matale, Ratnapura, and Colombo Districts, and in less degree in the Districts of Badulla and Kegalla. The Ratnapura District leads with the highest death-rate of 89·1, followed by Colombo (60·2), and Kalutara (46·8) ; while Nuwara Eliya District shows the lowest death-rate (32·0), followed by Kandy (33·4). The highest birth-rate is noticeable in Kalutara (47·0), and the lowest in Kandy (33·2).

30. The causes of death are shown in detail in Table XI. in the Appendix, and select causes are shown in the following Table C :—

VII.—Health of the City of Colombo.

32. The births registered in the city of Colombo numbered 1,033, and corresponded to an annual rate per mille of 22·3, being ·6 per 1,000 higher than the average (21·7) for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

33. The deaths registered numbered 1,500. To this have to be added 12 deaths of town residents (of which occurred in the Infectious Diseases Hospital and the other 11 in the Enteric Hospital, both at Kanatta, outside the town limits), and which were registered by an extra-urban Registrar, making a total of 1,512, and corresponding to a rate of 32·6 per mille per annum, being ·8 per 1,000 lower than the average 33·4 for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

* By "estate" is meant any land having ten or more acres in cultivation under coffee, tea, cocoa, or cinchona grouped together by Proclamation into a district under the Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 17 of 1880.

34. As usual in the city, the death-rate exceeded the birth-rate, owing mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among the Europeans, Indian Tamils, and Moors), to the presence of hospitals which add to the normal mortality of the city, and to the registration of births being still somewhat defective.

35. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each race for the third quarters of 1909 and 1908 and the average for the third quarters in 1898-1908:—

36. The rates are calculated on the figures for the quarter estimated upon the basis of the population as enumerated and distributed at the Census of 1901. The rates for Europeans, Malays, and the races classed together as "Others," being calculated upon small populations, are not very reliable. Excluding the rates for these sections, the lowest death-rate was among the Moors (30·1, against an average of 30·8), and the highest death-rate was among the Sinhalese 36·3 (average 35·5), followed by 31·6 among the Tamils (average 33·8), and 30·3 among the Burghers (average 25·6). The Malays, who at the last Census numbered 4,493, show a death-rate of 27·5, against 35·8, the average for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

37. The highest birth-rate in the quarter was among the Burghers, 34·9, a rise of 4·7 per 1,000 over the average of 30·2. The Sinhalese follow with a birth-rate of 28·9, showing a rise of 1·7 per 1,000 over the average (27·2) for the period 1898-1908. The low birth-rates for Tamils and Others are due to their population being a floating one and composed chiefly of adult males.

38. Table XII. gives in detail the deaths from various causes in each ward of the city of Colombo and according to each nationality. The number of births and deaths in each ward of the city, their rates per mille per annum, and certain selected causes of deaths during the quarter are shown in the following Table F:—

39. The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being for the most part a floating male adult one. Excluding these wards, the healthiest division of the city was Kollupitiya, with a death-rate of 16·6, while the unhealthiest was Slave Island, which showed a death-rate of 28·4 per 1,000.

40. The following Table G indicates the comparative healthiness of each ward and race in the city on the basis of the infantile mortality:—

41. The infant mortality was 338 per 1,000 births for the whole city, but rose as high as 447 in Kotahena, 420 in Slave Island, and 405 in New Bazaar, falling to 254 in Maradana. Among the races, the Tamils lead with the highest mortality (463), followed by the Moors and Sinhalese. The Moor mortality was as high as 667 in Slave Island and 618 in New Bazaar. The Sinhalese mortality (314 for the city) rose as high as 449 in Kotahena and 409 in Slave Island. The Burghers come next with a rate of 237, rising to 571 in Slave Island. The European rate (62) is the lowest for the city.

42. One death was registered from measles of a Malay in Slave Island.

43. The highest mortality, as usual, was from phthisis and pneumonia, which were responsible for 224 and 194 respectively, followed by diarrhoea and dysentery 181, infantile convulsions 103, debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck) 84, enteric fever 77, tetanus 63, old age 60, bronchitis 54, enteritis 50, dochmias duodenalis 46, worms 40, and starvation 17.

VIII.—Health of the Principal Towns.

44. This chapter deals with the Vital Statistics of the thirty-one towns of the Island proclaimed under sections 31 to 36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895. The Registrars of these towns are qualified medical men. No death occurring there is registered unless the cause is ascertained by the Registrar's personal inspection of the deceased, or certified by a qualified medical man in attendance on the deceased, and no dead body is buried or cremated without registration being effected.

45. Table XIII. in the Appendix shows the population at the last decennial Census of 1901, and the present estimated population and the births and deaths registered during the quarter, their rates, and the infantile mortality in each town, together with the monthly average birth- and death-rates and infantile mortality from July, 1907 (when monthly statistics were first published), to July, 1909, and the mean temperature and rainfall of each town in the quarter.

46. *Population.*—The estimated population of the thirty-one towns is 484,240, or more than one-ninth of the total population of the Island. The population of the city of Colombo (183,878) is a little over three-fifths of the population of all the other towns taken together (300,368).

47. *Births.*—The births registered in the thirty-one towns during the quarter numbered 3,249, of which 1,697 were of males and 1,552 of females, and correspond to an annual birth-rate per 1,000 of 26·62, as against 27·32 during the previous quarter and 29·56 during the corresponding quarter of last year. Of the towns (excluding Vavuniya and Lunugala, which have a population under 1,000), the highest birth-rate for the quarter was observed in Jaffna (43·93), and the lowest in Kurunegala (13·36). In the other towns the birth-rate ranged from 43·08 in Batticaloa, 41·96 in Mullaittivu, 41·13 in Hambantota, to 16·53 in "Hatton and Dikoya," 16·32 in Nuwara Eliya, 15·73 in Anuradhapura, and 13·71 in Kegalla. The city of Colombo records a rate of 22·29, as against 23·30 in the previous quarter and 22·94 during the corresponding quarter of last year.

48. *Deaths.*—The number of deaths registered in the thirty-one towns during the quarter was 4,314, of which 2,446 were of males and 1,868 of females, and correspond to an annual death-rate of 29·20 per mille, as against 29·13 during the preceding quarter and 32·59 during the corresponding quarter of last year.

49. Corrected death-rates as well as crude death-rates are shown in Table XIII. By a corrected rate is meant the rate calculated for the population of each town on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island, and also excluding from the total deaths (as in the crude rate) hospital deaths of estate coolies and other persons who are not town residents. The corrected rate should thus furnish a more satisfactory test of the comparative health of the towns than the crude rate.

50. The death-rate for all towns this quarter (29·20) is slightly higher than in the previous quarter (29·13), but lower than in the corresponding quarter of last year (32·59). Corrected death-rates not being available before the middle of 1907, an average cannot be stated for the quarter for the purpose of comparison. Taking, however, the average of the monthly mortality rates up to June of this year, the death-rate for the quarter shows a decline from this average (32·29). This improvement is noticeable in twenty-two out of the thirty-one towns, the principal exceptions being Panadure, Batticaloa, and Puttalam. The Panadure death-rate has been increasing since June last, when it was 23·06 (average 28·31). The rate rose suddenly in July to 40·36 and to 63·42 in August, which was unprecedented for that town. But in the month following there was a remarkable fall, and the rate has been declining since. The death-rate of Batticaloa began to deteriorate about the beginning of last quarter, and attained its maximum (80·35) in July (the beginning of the present quarter), which was the highest rate recorded in any town during that month, and unprecedented for Batticaloa. The unhealthiness of the town during the quarter was the result of an epidemic of measles, which, as mentioned in my reports for July and August and for the last quarter, prevailed largely from April to the end of July, causing heavy mortality from pneumonia and dysentery, which often supervene when measles is neglected. There were also many deaths from malarial cachexia and malarial fever, probably due to drought and heat. The death-rate has since August begun to decline, reaching 35·94 at the end of the quarter (average 36·16). In the Puttalam town the rate went up suddenly to 59·88 in July from 39·15 in June and rose to 66·79 in August (average 41·70), falling to 27·64 in September and 39·15 in October. The unhealthiness in the quarter is attributed to diarrhoeal diseases, the result of drought and bad water.

51. Of the towns, excluding Vavuniya and Lunugala, the lowest corrected mortality during the quarter was recorded in Nuwara Eliya (15·87), and the highest in Batticaloa (54·95). In the other towns the death-rate ranged from 15·88 in Kegalla, 18·34 in Matara, 18·51 in Moratuwa, and 21·76 in Nawalapitiya, to 42·17 in Matale, 49·54 in Panadure, 49·85 in Anuradhapura, and 51·99 in Puttalam. The city of Colombo shows 30·86, as against 30·83 in the previous quarter and 37·59 in the corresponding quarter of last year.

52. In the following Table H the birth- and death-rates for each town for the quarter are compared with the rates for the third quarter of last year and the average birth- and death-rates for the corresponding quarters of the preceding eleven years:—

53. The death-rates shown in this table are crude rates, inclusive of hospital and jail deaths. For corrected rates, which are available only from July, 1907, see Table XIII.

54. *Infantile mortality.*—The infantile mortality for the thirty-one towns was equal to a rate of 270 per 1,000 births registered, as against 256 in the previous quarter and 267 in the corresponding quarter of last year. In the towns having an estimated population of 5,000 or more, the mortality ranged from 500 in Anuradhapura, 368 in Batticaloa, 366 in Kandy, and 361 in Puttalam, to 208 in Kalutara, 196 in Matara, 160 in Moratuwa, and 136 in Negombo. In Colombo the rate was 336, against 325 during the previous quarter and 360 during the corresponding quarter of last year.

55. *Causes of deaths.*—Table XIV. in the Appendix gives for each town and race the principal causes of deaths registered during the quarter, and shows the infantile mortality separately from the general mortality (one year and over).

56. *Infants.*—Out of the 4,314 deaths from all causes at all ages in the thirty-one towns, 878 or one-fifth were among infants under one year. Of these, the chief causes were 252 *convulsions* (of which 86 in Colombo, 34 in Galle, 22 in Kandy, 17 in Matara, 11 in Kalutara, 9 each in Negombo and Batticaloa), 145 *debility* (of which 38 in Colombo, 22 in Batticaloa, 14 in Jaffna, 10 in Kandy), 91 *pneumonia* (of which 44 in Colombo, 10 in Kandy, 7 in Negombo), 79 *tetanus* (of which 53 in Colombo, 16 in Jaffna), 63 *premature birth* (of which 12 each in Kandy and Jaffna, 10 in Colombo), 56 *diarrhoea* (of which 22 in Colombo, 11 in Jaffna), and 52 *bronchitis* (of which 31 in Colombo, 8 in Jaffna).

57. *General mortality (one year and over).*—Out of the 3,436 deaths of persons one year and over, there were 825 due to *diarrhoea* and *dysentery*, of which 153 were in Colombo, 89 in Kandy, 47 in Ratnapura, 45 in Badulla, 41 in Jaffna, 36 in Batticaloa, 33 in Nawalapitiya, 31 in Matale; 408 to *pneumonia*, of which 150 were in Colombo, 26 in Kandy, 23 in Jaffna, 22 in Trincomalee, 20 each in Batticaloa and Kurunegala; 374 to *phthisis*, of which 223 were in Colombo, 33 in Galle, 22 in Kandy, 19 in Kurunegala, 13 in Jaffna, 12 in Moratuwa; 156 to *dochmias duodenalis*, of which 114 were among Tamils, almost all of whom were coolies; 125 to *enteric fever*, of which 77 were in Colombo, 12 in Moratuwa, 9 in Galle, 7 in Kandy; 104 to *remittent fever*, of which 23 were in Jaffna, 11 each in Negombo and Batticaloa, 10 in Galle; 91 to *malarial cachexia*, of which 25 were in Batticaloa, 13 in Kurunegala; 51 to *bronchitis*, of which 23 were in Colombo; 47 to *simple fever*, of which 14 were in Anuradhapura, 13 in Jaffna, 8 in Colombo; 44 to *Bright's disease* and *nephritis*, of which 17 were in Colombo, 7 in Badulla, 5 in Kandy.

58. *Percentage of principal causes of deaths at all ages.*—Of the total number of deaths at all ages in the towns, diarrhoea and dysentery accounted for nearly 21 per cent., bronchitis and pneumonia nearly 14 per cent., phthisis more than 8 per cent., infantile convulsions more than 7 per cent., debility and fevers each nearly 7 per cent.
