*E. I. Archipelago—Kleine Soenda Islands.*

I.—*Non-existence of the Island near the N.E. extreme of Alor Ombai Island*

Information has been received from the Lieutenant, R. Posthumus Meijjes, and the Commander of the Dutch steamer Flamingo, that the island near the N.E. extreme of Alor or Ombai island does not exist. This island lying in approx. lat.  $8^{\circ} 9' 30''$  S., long.  $125^{\circ} 5' E.$ , has therefore been expunged from the charts.

II.—*Reef with discoloured Water at the N.E. extreme of Alor or Ombai Island.*

The Commander of the Dutch steamer Flamingo reports to have seen at the N.E. extreme of Alor or Ombai island discoloured water of a reef extending about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cables from the shore in an E. direction.

Approx. position: N.E. extreme of Alor or Ombai island; lat.  $8^{\circ} 10' 30''$  S., long.  $125^{\circ} 4' 30''$  E.

III.—*Reef between the Islands Solor and Lomblen or Kawela, Strait of Boleng.*

Information has been received from the Commander of the Dutch steamer Flamingo of the existence of a reef with discoloured water and a depth of 6 fathoms on it, lying on the following bearings:—
