*E. I. Archipelago.—Singapore Strait.—Intended Light on Sultan-shoal, Selat Singki.*

The construction of a lighthouse on Sultan-shoal, in Selat Singki, Western approach to Singapore, is about to commence.

The beacon now on the shoal will be removed as the work progresses.

A hulk, painted yellow, having one mast, will be moored alongside the shoal during the construction.

Approximate position: lat. 1° 14' 30" N., long. 103° 39' 20" E.

BENGAL.—No. 219.

*Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast.—Wreckage on Oyster Island.*

*Caution.*—The Port Officer, Rangoon, has given notice, dated October 25 last, that the Master of the R. I. M. S. Minto reports that on his last visit to Oyster island a piece of wreckage, which apparently had formed a portion of a steamer's fore-and-aft bridge, was lying on the island. The wreckage in question is made of 4-in. pine, is about 3 to 4 ft. broad and 10 to 12 ft. long, and had two iron stanchions fitted to it on one side only. The underneath part is painted white, and the upper side holystoned. Mariners are accordingly cautioned.

*Australia—Moreton Bay.—Amended Limits of the Pilot Vessels' Cruising Ground.*

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 18 of 1894), with reference to Notice to Mariners No. 18, issued on October 27, 1892, that the outer limits of the Pilot vessels' cruising ground at the northern entrance to Moreton bay, as therein defined, have been extended to the northward and eastward.

The cruising ground is therefore now defined as follows:—Inside an imaginary line drawn from Cape Cliff N. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. (Mount Tempest in line with Cape Cliff) seven and three-quarter miles; thence to the Fairway buoy at the entrance to the North Channel; thence along the eastern edge of the east and Venus Banks to the outer entrance to Freeman channel; thence to Cape Moreton.

*Australia—Cape Moreton, North Point, and Moreton Island—Exhibition of Additional Lights.*

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 19 of 1894), that on and after October 15, the following lights will be exhibited to assist in marking the fairway between Cape Moreton and Smith rock:—

*North Point, Hummock.*—A small light in a square light-room painted white on the summit of the hummock, showing a sector of white light to the eastward between the bearings of S.  $54^{\circ}$  W. and S.  $82^{\circ}$  W., visible about seven miles.

*Secondary Light, Cape Moreton,* bearing N.  $18^{\circ}$  E., and distant 180 yards from the main light. This light in line with the main light indicates the direction of Smith rock.

*Directions.*—Vessels passing between Smith rock and Moreton island must cross the line of lights at Cape Moreton whilst in the sector of white light shown from North Point Hummock.

*Japan—Korea Strait—Tsu Sima.—(1) Fixed White Light on Mitsu Mitsou Sima.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 556 of 1894) that a light is exhibited from a tower recently erected on Mitsu (Misou) sima, off the northern extreme of Tsu sima, Korea strait:—

Mitsu sima light is fixed white, elevated 52 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles, between the bearings N.E.  $\frac{7}{8}$  E. (N.  $55^{\circ}$  E.) and N. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. (N.  $42^{\circ}$  W.).

The lighthouse is a square wood tower, 18 ft. high, painted black.

Approximate position on Admiralty Chart No. 358, lat.  $34^{\circ} 43' 20''$  N. long.,  $129^{\circ} 24' 45''$  E.

*Kiusiu—West Coast.—(2) Fixed White and Red Light on Shirase (Shiro se).*

Also that a light is exhibited from a tower on Shirase (Shiro se), west coast of Kiusiu:—

Shirase (Shiro se) light is fixed, shows white between the bearings E.  $\frac{3}{8}$  N. (N.  $86^{\circ}$  E.) through south to N.W.

$\frac{3}{4}$  W. (N.  $54^{\circ}$  W.), and red to the southward over the shoals Ganashe and Nakashe. It is elevated 45 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.

The lighthouse is a square wood tower, 11 ft. high, painted white.

Approximate position on Admiralty Chart No. 359, lat.  $33^{\circ} 5' 30''$  N., long.  $129^{\circ} 37' 30''$  E.

(3) *Fixed White and Red Light on Odate (Ootate).*

Also that a light is exhibited from a tower on Odate (Ootate).

Odate (Ootate) light is fixed white, with two red sectors showing respectively between the bearings S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. (S.  $43^{\circ}$  E.) and S.S.E.  $\frac{3}{8}$  E. (S.  $27^{\circ}$  E.), and between N.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. (N.  $53^{\circ}$  W.) and N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. (N.  $28^{\circ}$  W.). It is elevated 200 ft. above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.

The lighthouse is a square wood tower 22 ft. high, painted white.

Approximate position on Admiralty Chart No. 140, lat.  $33^{\circ} 1' 20''$  N.; long.  $129^{\circ} 26' 10''$  E.

Variation  $4^{\circ}$  westerly in 1894.

*Cochin China—Siagon or Donnai River.—Fuok Binh Kiang—Dredging of Coral Banks completed.*


