## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, July 13, 1894, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated July 7, 1894.

*Present* :—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuik, Mayor and Chairman; Hon. W. R. Kynsey, C.M.G.; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; Capt. F. Bayley; Mr. M. Finlay; Mr. T. Smith; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. C. M. Fernando; and Mr. A. Alwis.

The Minutes of June 8, 1894, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of June 8, 1894, be confirmed.

1-2. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. H. Morgan moved "that the memorial addressed to the Chairman and Members of the Municipal Council by the Assessment Tax Collectors be read, and that the same be considered."

The memorial referred to was laid on the table and was considered.

Hon. W. R. Kynsey moved "that the Council approves of the new form of bond drawn up by the Chairman, and that it is desirable that the recovery of the assessment tax should be expedited either by reducing the commission payable to collectors, notably in arrear, or by the employment of new or additional collectors."

Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried unanimously.

3. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to June 30, 1894, and Progress Reports of Work done during May and June, 1894, were laid on the table.

4. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of June 22, 1894, were laid before the Council :—

- (1) To make provision for an extra clerk for Municipal Court in terms of section 114 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

Resolved, under clause 114 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, that the sum of Rs. 1,000 be transferred from vote No. 59 in the Budget for 1894, "Expenses of Disinfection," and that provision be made from this sum of Rs. 1,000 for the following items :—

(10) Acquisition of land for new road (Colonial Secretary's letter No. 92 of June 21, 1894) through Silversmith street quarry.

Resolved,—That the sum in excess of the Rs. 15,000 voted, viz, Rs. 3,693-25, be paid to the Government Agent, the amount being provided either in a Supplemental Budget or under clause 114 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 by the transfer of sums already voted.

Resolved,—That the foregoing recommendations be approved and adopted.

5. A further letter No. 93 of June 21, 1894, from the Clerk, Executive Council, intimating, with reference to the question of the investment of the Municipal Funds, that the regulations under which the banking of the Government is conducted have governed, His Excellency the Governor in Council in dealing with the Municipal Council's application for the statutory sanction, was laid before the Council, with connected papers, after previous circulation.

Resolved,—That the decision of the Government be accepted, and the fixed deposit of Rs. 30,000 now in the Madras Bank allowed to remain there at 3 per cent. interest.

6. A letter No. 88 of June 11, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the "Municipal Cemeteries Ordinance" (No. 1 of 1894) and the "Municipal Burial and Cremation Grounds Ordinance" (No. 2 of 1894) will be brought into operation from July 1, 1894, was read.

7. Resolved, after discussion, that the following regulations under clause 7 of Ordinance 1 of 1894 be adopted :—

*Regulations in pursuance of the powers vested in the Municipal Council by "The Municipal Cemeteries Ordinance, 1894."*

*Burials.*

(1) All applications for graves are to be made to the keeper of the cemetery within six hours of the time fixed for the burial of the person for whom the grave is wanted.

(2) The keeper, or in his absence the sexton of the cemetery, must intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party, on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

(3) Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

(4) The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his commands are to be obeyed.

(5) No grave shall be less than four feet in depth, or at a distance of less than four feet from any other.

(6) No grave shall be re-opened within a year, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except for post-mortem examinations for the purposes of the criminal law.

(7) The keeper of the cemetery shall send quarterly to the Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages a copy or transcript of the burials as the same are registered in the register book.

(8) Fees not exceeding the following shall be paid in advance under clause 7 of "The Municipal Cemeteries Ordinance, 1894" :—

The above fees are to be paid at the time of the application, provided that it is open to an applicant to dispense with the services of a Minister, in which case the fee of Rs. 5 shall not be due.

Provided that paupers dying in the Government Civil Hospital shall be buried free of charge by the hospital contractor or servants, under the direction of the cemetery-keeper. Provided also that on the production of a certificate signed by a Minister of the Christian religion, a Senior Officer of Police, a Municipal Inspector, or any headman not lower in rank than a Muhandiram, that the friends and relatives of any deceased persons are not able to pay the fees herein authorized for the digging of a grave, the keeper of a cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug, and the corpse to be buried therein, free of charge.

Provided further that the fees payable in connection with Mahomedan burials shall remain as at present.

8. Resolved,—That the following by-laws under clause 5 of Ordinance 2 of 1894 be adopted and forwarded for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council :—

*By-laws under Clause 5 of Ordinance 2 of 1894.*

(1) No burial or cremation of any person dying within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo shall take place except in a cemetery duly proclaimed under Ordinance 12 of 1862, or on premises specially registered under Ordinance 2 of 1894 as a burial ground or cremation ground in the Office of the Municipal Council.

(2) The person applying for the registration of a burial or cremation ground shall annex to his application a figure of survey of the premises by the Surveyor-General or some licensed surveyor.

(3) The person on whose application registration of a burial or cremation ground is made, shall be held to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of regulations.

(4) In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, fresh registration of such ground shall be required.

(5) No burial or cremation shall take place unless the certificate of death required by the Ordinance 20 of 1891 has been produced to the keeper of the burial or cremation ground, or without a certificate from an inspector of Police or a Municipal Inspector that he has reason to believe that application for certificate has been duly made under clause 9 of Ordinance 20 of 1891.

(6) It shall be the duty of the keeper of any burial or cremation ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is keeper, in the form prescribed by the Chairman, Municipal Council, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the Municipal Office and to the Office of the Registrar-General every Monday, or if Monday be a public holiday, the earliest subsequent day not being a holiday.

(7) It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Municipal Council, the Inspector-General of Police, the Registrar-General, or any person authorized in writing by them for the purpose to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

(8) It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

(9) A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and only such fees as are approved by the Chairman shall be charged.

(10) Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

9. A further letter No. 94 of June 22, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, about the proposed diversion of traffic from the road between Uplands and the sea to the road running round the back of Uplands, was laid before the Council, with connected papers, after previous circulation.

Hon. A. de A. Seneviratna moved "that the materials placed before the Council do not disclose any urgency for closing any portion of the Mutwal road, and that the Council desire information as to the extent of road proposed to be closed, and the purpose for which it is to be closed."

10. A memorandum from the Chairman dated July 3, 1894, on the tramway question, with connected papers, was laid before the Council, after having been printed and circulated.

Resolved unanimously that the concession as amended and printed be adopted with the substitution of the words "Municipal Council" for "Municipality" in clauses 14, 15, and 16, and a copy forwarded to Mr. Brunton, with an intimation that unless it be agreed within two months of its receipt all negotiations with his principal, Mr. Mathews, will be considered at an end.

11. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for February, 1894, received with letter No. 52 of June 5, 1894, were laid on the table.

12. The Auditor-General's further remarks on the list of absent officers for 1893 were laid before the Council. Resolved,—That the Auditor-General be informed that his remarks were laid before the Council.

13. The Sanitary Officer's report for first quarter, 1894, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

14. The City Analyst's report dated June 22, 1894, on the town water for June, 1894, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

15. Reports of Inspectors (including Mr. Koch's report for June) on licensed carriages, and kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for July, 1894, were laid on the table.
