MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on June 23, 1894, at 3 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman (R. W. Ievers, Esq.); Hon. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; R. L. Symes, Esq.; W. Abeyesundera, Esq.; Dr. W. Dias; A. Murray, Esq.; D. G. Gunawardena, Esq.; and N. Dias Abeyesinha, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

2. Read letter No. 19 of June 11, 1894, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Ordinance No. 1 of 1894, entitled "An Ordinance to vest the control of General Cemeteries situated within the Municipal limits in the Municipal Council," and the Ordinance No. 2 of 1894, entitled "An Ordinance to ensure the supervision of Burial and Cremation Grounds situated within Municipal limits," will be brought into operation from July 1, 1894.

Resolved,—That the letter and connected papers be circulated among the Members of the Council and brought

up for consideration at the next Meeting.

3. Submitted the following correspondence:-

(1) Letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary (No. 15 of May 10, 1894) transmitting an extract from the Administration Report of the Principal Civil Medical Officer containing the remarks of Dr. Dias on the sanitary condition of the Galle Municipality, with request of opinion as to whether such remarks are fit for publication.

(2) The reply of the Chairman to this letter (No. 16 of May 15, 1894).

(3) Letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Principal Civil Medical Officer (No. 459 of May 25, 1894) forwarded for the information of the Chairman, Municipal Council, calling upon Dr. Dias to explain what special steps he has taken, as a Member of the Council, to remedy the defects which he represents.

- (4) Letter from the Principal Civil Medical Officer to the Chairman, Municipal Council (No. 730 of June 1894), forwarding a copy of Dr. Dias' report for 1893, and asking that Dr. Dias be afforded the opportunity of establishing his case, and inquiring whether Dr. Dias was not an Official Member of the Council and of the Sub-Committee which selected the site for the reservoir, and whether he duly signed the report approving of it; or if he did not approve of the site, asking for the substance of any protest he made either verbally or in writing against its selection.
- Letter from the Chairman, Municipal Council, to Dr. Dias (No. 187 of 8th June, 1894), forwarding copy of **(5)** the above letter and inquiring what action Dr. Dias had taken in 1893 to remedy the evils of which he complains, and asking for explanation why he suppressed any mention of the remedial measures adopted by the Council for the amelioration of the existing sanitary condition.

(6) Reply of Dr. Dias to the above letter (No. 452 of 22nd June, 1894).

The Chairman addressed the Council and commented at length on the correspondence submitted touching on the following points: (1) the conduct of Dr. Dias charging, in his capacity as Colonial Surgeon, the Municipal Council, of which he is a Member, with gross neglect of the sanitation of the town; (2) hisrepudiation of his signature to the report of the Waterworks Sub-Committee.

Dr. Dias replied in vindication of his conduct.

After a discussion, in which several Members of Council took part, it was proposed by the Hon. Dr. Anthonisz. C.M.G., "that the reply of the Chairman to the inquiry made by Government as to the propriety of the publication of the remarks on the sanitary state of Galle by Dr. Dias be approved by the Council."

Seconded by R. L. Symes, Esq.

In connection with the above resolution the reply was read by request of the Council.

The motion was then put to the vote, and was carried by 8 against 1, the dissentient being Dr. Dias.

4. Pursuant to notice the Hon. Dr. Anthonisz proceeded to move the motion standing in his name, which was as follows:

That until sanitary improvements so urgently called for, and which are of vital importance, have received the required attention—as the supply of pure water to the Fort, the improvement of the Fort drainage, the substitution of dry-earth closets for the cesspits now in use—no expenditure be increased in widening Middle street, as this is not a work of urgent necessity.

At the request of the Chairman, the motion was deferred consideration for next Meeting, as Mr. C. P. Hayley,

who moved for the execution of this work, was absent.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

TN accordance with the requirements of section 3 of the Opium and Bhang Ordinance, No. 9 of 1889, I hereby give notice that the licenses for the sale by retail of opium and bhang within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo, for the year commencing January 1, 1895, will, by resolution of the Municipal Council, be four in number. The said licenses will be put up to sale by public auction at this office at noon on Saturday, October 13, 1894, and they will be issued in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance, and under the following conditions,

(1) That the place licensed shall be subject to inspection, and that no riotous or disorderly conduct be allowed to occur therein.

(2) That the place licensed shall not be kept open for the sale of opium or bhang at any time before the

hour of 6 in the morning or after 9 in the evening.

(3) That the licensee shall cause to be painted or affixed in some conspicuous part of his shop his name, the number of the shop, and the words "Licensed to sell Opium by Retail."

(4) That no person other than the licensee shall sell or expose for sale any opium or bhang under his license, the opinion of the constant of the co either as agent or servant of such licensee, unless the name of such agent or servant be registered in the Office of the Municipal Council with the sanction of the Chairman.

(5) Wholesale licenses will be issued only to retail dealers.
