THE following by-laws made by the Mayor and Chairman of the Colombo Municipality under the provisions of section 5 of "The Municipal Burial and Cremation Grounds Ordinance, 1894," and submitted to and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, are published for general information.

### BY-LAWS UNDER CLAUSE 5 OF ORDINANCE 2 OF 1894.

1. No burial or cremation of any person dying within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo shall take place except in a cemetery duly proclaimed under Ordinance 12 of 1862, or on premises specially registered (under Ordinance 2 of 1894) as a burial ground or cremation ground in the office of the Municipal Council.

2. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Municipal Council to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper, if any, of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same, in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.

3. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial or cremation ground is made shall be held to be the keeper of that ground, and to be responsible for any breach of regulations.

4. In the event of the death, or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties, of the keeper for a burial or cremation ground, fresh registration of such ground shall be required; and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration has been effected, except on the special license of the Chairman of the Municipal Council, or, in his absence, of the Assistant Chairman or the Sanitary Officer of the Municipality.

5. No burial or cremation shall take place unless the certificate of death required by the Ordinance 20 of 1891 has been produced to the keeper of the burial or cremation ground, or without a certificate from an Inspector of Police or a Municipal Inspector that he has reason to believe that application for certificate has been duly made under clause 9 of Ordinance 20 of 1891.

6. It shall be the duty of the keeper of any burial or cremation ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is keeper, in the form prescribed by the Chairman, Municipal Council, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the Municipal Office and to the office of the Registrar-General every day.

7. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Municipal Council, the Inspector-General of Police, the Registrar-General, or any person authorized in writing by them for the purpose to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and to have access to all books or documents relating thereto.

8. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order, to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

9. A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and only such fees as are approved by the Chairman shall be charged.

10. Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, September 22, 1894, at 8.30 o'clock a.m.

*Present*:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; Dr. Frederick Keyt.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; B. de Alwis, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 21 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund; also separate Statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1893 to July 31 and August 31, 1894; Progress Reports of Work done brought up to the same dates; Return of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the months of July and August; and Health Officer's Returns.

Resolved,—That the several statements, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting.

3. The Chairman notified that Mr. J. N. d'Esterre had failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings and had therefore, under sections 31 and 32, ceased to be a Councillor.

On motion of the Chairman it was unanimously resolved that Mr. J. N. d'Esterre be restored to office, he being now on his way out to Ceylon.

4. The Chairman's Annual Administration Report for 1893, which had been printed at the Government Press and a copy sent to each Councillor, was submitted to the Municipal Council.

No resolution was passed thereon.

5. Read memorandum dated August 29 from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter of same date to the Director of Public Works on the subject of the repairs to drains in Trincomalee street.

Resolved,—That as a sum of Rs. 5,000 was provided in the Supply Bill for 1894 "for repairs to and renewal of drains, Trincomalee street, Kandy;" and as the Municipal Council have been called upon and required to pay a moiety of the amount for this work, inquiries be made of the Government whether the balance of the Government vote will be available for the repairs or renewal of any other drains on the principal roads in charge of the Public Works Department within the Municipality.

6. The Chairman submitted Supplemental Budget No. 3, which had obtained the approval of the Standing Committee.

It was unanimously resolved that Supplemental Budget No. 3 be sanctioned as follows:—

(a) 12 manhole covers repaired; clearing out gratings; 300 lineal ft. of pavement curbing constructed; 2 cisterns with manhole covers constructed in King street.

(b) 33 cubes of gravel transported; 3 cubes of landslips and drain silt removed; 35 lines of side drains of roads deepened; 400 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared; 17.97 lines of road metalled (King street, Palace square, Temple street).

(c) 3 cubes of landslips and drain silt removed.

(d) 68 lines of sides of roads and drains cleared; 6 cubes of landslips and drain silt removed.

(g) Repairs to latrine boxes; repairs to tools; 5 cubes of gravel transported.

(h) Repairing flagstaff; rail fare on forty-one pieces of timber for fence posts.

(i) Weeding round plants; repairing fences and tree guards; supplying vacancies; trimming hedges.

(k) Purchase of tools.

(l) 2 squares of cement concrete on dam of tank; 2 squares of wall repaired; mining and blasting stone at eastern end of tank; clearing vegetation from banks and clearing out silt.

(m) 3 cubes of landslips and drain silt removed.

(n) Repairs to Gonawatta ferry boat; hauling up and repairs to Lewella ferry boat; caulking and tarring.

(o) Cleaning and painting two fountains.

(p) Wages of watcher.

(q) Working dredger; 178 cubes of silt removed and deposited; purchase of oil, rope, and nails.

(r) Cutting grass and mowing esplanade and recreation ground; weeding esplanade; transport of manure; cutting out anthills on recreation ground.

(s) 16 cubes of earth filling in; 79 lineal ft. of barrel drain constructed in cement concrete invert; 3 cisterns constructed and covers to same; rebuilding boundary wall of St. Paul's church premises; transport of metal and sand; levelling ground; making three frames for flushing sluices.

(t) 22 cubes of excavation and removal of earth; 152 lineal ft. of side drain constructed with cement concrete invert and brick sides; 8 approaches to houses reconstructed over drain.

(u) 5 cubes of retaining wall constructed; 8 cubes of earth filling; clearing out barrel drain; mining and blasting stone; transport of stone for retaining wall.

(v) Excavating and breaking up old drain; 90 lineal ft. of barrel drain constructed with cement concrete invert and brick arch; transport of broken metal and sand; wages of watcher.

(w) Mining and blasting stone for retaining wall; transport of stone; 8 cubes of excavation for foundation; 2 cubes of dry rubble masonry foundation.

(x) 25 cubes of earth excavated and removed; purchase of wire for fence of ricksha stand.

(y) 18 cubes of earth cutting and removal; 40 lineal ft. of dressed stone purchased for curb.

*Present*:—Hon. P. D. Anthonisz; Dr. J. Attygalle; R. L. Symes, Esq.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; N. Dias Abeyesinghe, Esq.; D. G. Goonewardena, Esq.; W. Abeyesundara, Esq.; and C. P. Hayley, Esq.

1. On the motion of Mr. Goonewardena, seconded by Mr. Abeyesundara, the Hon. Dr. Anthonisz took the Chair.

2. Read and confirmed Minutes of last Meeting.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. Symes moved "That it is desirable that a permanent fence (similar to that round the Station premises) be erected round the pavilion, as it is at present used as a sleeping place by vagrants, who make the floor and pillars dirty, and who are otherwise objectionable."

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardena.—Carried.

An estimate for the work from the Superintendent of Roads was submitted.

Resolved,—That tenders be invited for the work, and if the lowest tender exceed the estimate, that the Superintendent be directed to carry it out.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. Hayley moved "That the attention of Council be called to the state of the drains in the Galupiadda ward, and to propose certain improvements."

Seconded by Mr. Abdul Carim.—Carried.

Resolved,—That application be made to Government to extend the cemented drains built by the Public Works Department up to Pettigalewatta, to the point where the new outlet to the Pettigala-ela crosses the Matara road.

Resolved,—That the Superintendent of Works be directed to clean out the cross drains from the Matara road to the sea on one side and the Pettigala-ela on the other.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Hayley moved "That the lighting of the main road to Matara be extended to the Municipal boundary."

Mr. Hayley, by leave of Council, amended the above motion by substituting the word "Police" for "Municipal."

Seconded by Mr. Abeyesundara.—Carried.

Resolved,—That to enable the Council to carry out the above resolution, a lighting rate of 2 per cent. per annum be imposed on all properties bordering the Matara road on either side within Police limits.

6. Submitted a memorandum from the Chairman on the procedure he advises to be adopted in cases of reported infectious diseases.

Resolved,—That the recommendation be sanctioned.

7. Submitted correspondence regarding by-law, chapter XXIV., on trees dangerous to private residences.

Resolved,—That as it has been shown that the by-law is *ultra vires* so far as it relates to private houses, it be not put into force in future.

8. Submitted applications from certain Municipal Officers for increase of pay.

Resolved,—That the applications be referred to the Standing Committee to be considered in connection with the Budget for 1895.

9. Submitted a letter from the Police Magistrate forwarding an application from the staff of his Court for remuneration for the work done by them in connection with Municipal cases.

Resolved,—That the Police Magistrate be informed that the Council is not in a position to grant any remuneration.

10. Submitted an application from the widow of the late latrine overseer for an allowance.

Resolved,—That a gratuity of Rs. 30 be paid her.
