THE Government of Ceylon being anxious to promote the cultivation of paddy under Lahugala tank, in Panawa pattu of Batticaloa District, in the Eastern Province, it is proposed that 300 acres of Crown land under that tank be leased to the Vanniya of Panawa pattu and certain villagers, and eventually sold to the lessees under the following conditions:

(1) The land shall be opened up in three blocks of 100 acres each. All the valuable timber on the first block shall be removed by the villagers for the Forest Department on payment to them of Re. 1.50 per tree; and the land shall be cleared during the first year under chena permit at a rental of Re. 1 per acre paid in advance to the Crown.

(2) During the second year the land shall be cleared and cultivated free of rent.

- (3) During the third year and until the land is purchased it shall be cultivated under paddy permits at a rental of Rs. 2 per acre paid in advance to the Crown.
- (4) The land ultimately shall be sold to the lessees who carry out these conditions at Rs. 15 per acre, payable in four instalments, under Sir Henry Ward's Minute, and subject to whatever water-rate may hereafter be fixed by Government.
- (5) In the third year a further extent of 100 acres shall be leased and eventually sold to the lessees on the same conditions.
- (6) The question of leasing a third block of 100 acres in the fifth year shall be at the discretion of Government, and will depend upon the energy displayed and the work done by the settlers on the first and second blocks.
- (7) During the fifth year a deposit of 20 per cent. of the upset price shall be paid for the whole land under cultivation to enable a survey to be made.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No tea seed shall be imported into Ceylon from any place in India, except at the port of Colombo.
- 2. All tea seed imported into Ceylon from any place in India shall be subject to a process of disinfection, unless accompanied by a certificate from a Scientific Officer either of the Indian Tea Association or of the Imperial Department of Agriculture to the effect that it is the product of a district which is not infected with the leaf disease called "Blister Blight" (Exobasidium vexus).
- 3. Tea seed imported from any place in India unaccompanied by such a certificate shall not be admitted into Ceylon unless packed in bags.
 - 4. The process of disinfection will be carried out at the risk of the consignee.

HE following copy of an Order of His Majesty the King in Council of November 22, 1909, providing for the recognition in the United Kingdom of the load line certificates issued to French ships by the French authorities under the French regulations of September 21, 1908, is published for general information.

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section 445 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that where the Board of Trade certify that the laws and regulations for the time being in force in any foreign country and relating to overloading and improper loading are equally effective with the provisions of that Act relating thereto, His Majesty in Council may direct that on proof of a ship of that country having complied with those laws and regulations, she shall not when in a port of the United Kingdom be liable to detention for non-compliance with the said provisions of that Act, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions:

And whereas by section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, provision, as is more particularly therein mentioned, is made for applying to foreign ships when in ports in the United Kingdom certain sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, which relate to load line, without prejudice to any direction of His Majesty in Council given under the said section 445 of the last mentioned Act:

And whereas the Board of Trade have certified that certain statutory regulations which have been approved by the French Government relating to overloading, so far as regards the assignment of load lines to French ships, on and after September 21, 1908, are equally effective with the corresponding regulations in force in this country respecting the assignment of load lines to British merchant ships:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council doth direct that on proof that French ships have complied with the aforesaid French regulations such ships shall not, when in ports of the United Kingdom, be liable to detention for non-compliance with the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to overloading, nor shall there arise any liability to any fine or penalty which would otherwise arise for non-compliance with those provisions.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 8, 1910.

Births.—15 total births registered were 104 (1 European, 17 Burghers, 45 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 20 Moors; 5 Maless, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 29.2, as against 22.4 in the preceding week, 31.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 23 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.9, as against 43.4 in the previous week, 45.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

Injuntile Deaths.—Of the 110 total daths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 47 in the preceding week, in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stall Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 9.

week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Start and San Sebastian. Six deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Seven deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly severage for last than), of which 2 were in Maradana hospitals and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals).
- 3. Fourteen deaths were registered from Debility (including 8 infants), 12 from Enteritis (5 infants), 8 from Diarrhea (3 infants), 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 Old Age, 5 Dysentery, 4 Tetanus (1 infant), and 26 from Other Causes.
- 4. Two deaths were registered from Enteric Fever as in the previous week (against 6 the weekly average for last year), I each in Kotahens and Maradana hospitals. Nine cases of Enteric Fever were reported, against 8 in the previous week.
- 5. Sixteen cases of Chickenpow were reported, against 6 in the previous week; and 6 of Measles, against 11 in the previous week.

The mean temperature of air was 80.0°, against 78.9° in the preceding week and 79.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.909 in., against 30.003 in. in the preceding week and 29.952 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.07 in., against 0.02 in. in the preceding week and 0.23 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
