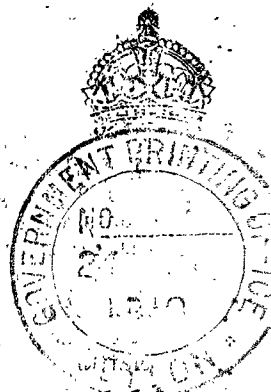

THE CEYLON RAILWAY ORDINANCE, NO. 9 OF 1902.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 5 of the above-mentioned Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following alterations to clause 17 (g) and (k) of the rules relating to the conveyance of traffic by passenger trains published by Notification dated October 11, 1907, with effect from February 1, 1910:—

(g) First and second class return tickets for distances ten miles and under are available for return within three days, inclusive of the day of issue and day of return (i.e., a ticket issued on Monday is available for return not later than Wednesday). Tickets for distances over ten miles and up to and including thirty miles are available for return within seven days, inclusive of the day of issue and day of return, and tickets for distances over thirty miles are available for thirty days, inclusive of the day of issue and day of return.

(k) *Break of journey.*—Holders of first and second class return tickets between stations over thirty miles apart are allowed to break their journey at an intermediate station once on the outward and once on the homeward route, provided that they do not travel more than once in each direction over the same section of the line and that the return journey is completed within the time for which the return ticket is available. When passengers avail themselves of this privilege, they must, on alighting from the train, produce their ticket to the Station Master, who will endorse it "Broke journey at . . . . ." (the name of the station being inserted), and initial and date the endorsement. Passengers holding first and second class return tickets between any stations thirty miles apart, of which Peradeniya Junction is an intermediate station, may travel into Kandy and break journey there, without paying excess fare between Peradeniya Junction and Kandy in either direction. In this case the tickets must be endorsed by the Station Master at Kandy.

RULE REFERRED TO.

In cases where the Surveyor-General, on the requisition of the Government Agent, causes the replacing or repairing of Crown landmarks or the defining of the boundary line of any land to be carried out owing to the failure of any person on whom a notice under section 6 of "The Crown Landmarks Ordinance, 1909," has been served to complete such work within the time prescribed by such notice, an additional sum equivalent to the actual costs incurred by the Surveyor-General in causing such work to be done shall be recovered from such person.

## THE MUNICIPAL COUNCILS' ORDINANCE, No. 7 OF 1887.

## SCHEDULE.

*Fees payable for Encroachments and Temporary Erections, &c.*

(Section 175 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887).

(a) *Decorations.*—Decorations requiring the making of holes in the street, minimum fee Rs. 2'50, for which not more than 5 lineal yards of decoration measured along the road surface may be put up.

For every additional yard 10 cents per lineal yard.

Where two sides of the street are to be decorated, then the length of decoration on both sides of the street shall be separately measured and charged for.

(b) *Pandals* parallel to the side of the street, if on a metalled or gravelled road or on a footway, then Rs. 10 for a length of not more than 20 feet.

If on the grass sides of a road, then Rs. 5 for a length not exceeding 20 feet.

(c) *Pandals* across the street requiring holes or obstruction to the metalled or gravelled portion of the street or of a made up footway, then Rs. 20 for each such pandal.

In addition to these fees a deposit must be made equal to double the amount of such fees, and this deposit will be held as security for the fulfilment of any terms and conditions made in the permit, and the payment of fees is no indication that permission applied for has been granted.

(d) *Scaffolding.*—For every hole, post, bamboo, &c., planted in the street requiring a hole to be made in the street, Re. 1 per month.

For every pole, post, bamboo, &c., erected on the street and not requiring a hole in the street, 50 cents per month per pole, post, or bamboo, &c.

(e) *Hoardings* of the street line not enclosing any part of the street, 25 cents per annum per foot.

(f) *Hoardings* temporarily enclosing some part of the street in accordance with sanction, 10 cents per square foot per month.

## SCHEDULE.

Refuge for animals belonging to the Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, situated in Base Line road, Welikada, Colombo.

**NOTICE** is hereby given, in terms of section 39 of the Land Sale Regulations, that the under-mentioned lands, situated in the Koddiyar pattu of the Trincomalee District, Eastern Province, are to be granted to the Veddas on the following conditions. The object of these grants is to encourage the Veddas to adopt a permanent form of cultivation:—

*Lands.*

- (a) Fifteen acres of land called Palamunai, situated at Illakkantai.  
Boundaries: north and east by Crown salt waste land called Karaichehi, south by Crown salt waste land called Karaichehi and village path leading to Illakkantai tank from Sampur, west by Crown jungle called Palamunai.
- (b) Eighteen acres of open land called Sempikulam, situated at Malamuntal.  
Boundaries: bounded on all sides by Crown land called Sempikulam.
- (c) Eighteen acres of Crown land called Kollenkernikadu, situated at Illankaiturai.  
Boundaries: east by Keyakulam, north, south, and west by Crown jungle land called Kollenkernikadu.
- (d) Eighteen acres of abandoned chenai land called Periyavempoo, situated at Karukaimunai.  
Boundaries: bounded on all sides by Crown land called Periya-aripukkadu.
- (e) Nineteen acres of open Crown paddy land called Mappattaiveli, situated at Ichchilampattai.  
Boundaries: north by Crown land and a stream, east by Crown jungle called Mappattaivelikadu, south by reservation of Public Works Department road to Batticaloa, west by reservation of Public Works Department road to Batticaloa and Crown land called Mappattaivelikadu.
- (f) Seven acres of Crown land called Kalmadu, situated at Singankuli at Ichchilampattai.  
Boundaries: bounded on all sides by Crown land called Kalmadukadoo.

*Conditions.*

- (1) Boundaries are to be defined on the ground by a headman.
- (2) Should the extent allowed be exceeded, rent must be paid for the excess.
- (3) The permit-holder is not allowed to cultivate any other crop except paddy; disobedience of this condition will entail cancellation of the permit.
- (4) Rent at the rate of Rs. 3 per acre should be paid before the crop is reaped, and if the rent is paid and the land cultivated regularly by the licensee for five years in succession, the land will be surveyed free of further charge by the Crown and a title deed will be granted therefor.

"THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899."

**WHEREAS** upon the representation of the "proper authority," to-wit, the Government Agent of the Northern Province, it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that the burial grounds in the town of Mullaittivu, and described in the schedule hereto, are in such a locality as to be dangerous to the health of the inhabitants of the said town, it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 35 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, that burials or cremations in the said burial grounds shall be discontinued as from and after February 1, 1910.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 15, 1910.

**Births.**—The total births registered were 107 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 61 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 30.0, as against 29.2 in the preceding week, 27.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 109 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 11 Moors, 5 Malays, and 7 Others), including the death of a town resident who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.6, as against 30.9 in the previous week, 47.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 109 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

**Still Births.**—The number of still births registered during the week was 2.

**Selected Causes of Death.**—Seventeen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in New Bazaar and Maradana Hospitals, 2 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and Kotahena, and 1 each in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Slave Island, and Kollupitiya.

2. Ten deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. Eleven deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Eight deaths were registered from *Debility* (including 7 infants), 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 *Enteritis* (2 infants), 6 *Diarrhoea*, 3 *Worms* (1 infant), 3 *Tetanus* (2 infants), and 31 from *Other Causes*.

4. Five deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 2 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in New Bazaar and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya. Sixteen cases of *Enteric Fever* were reported, against 9 in the previous week.

5. Twenty-five cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, against 16 in the previous week; and 5 of *Measles*, against 6 in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 80.0° in the preceding week and 79.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.896 in., against 29.909 in. in the preceding week and 29.986 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.78 in., against 0.07 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
