## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY EDWARD MCCALLUM, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS the District Schools Committee of the Colombo District have, in pursuance of sections 19 and 20 of the Rural Schools Ordinance, No. 8 of 1907, made the by-laws set forth in the schedule hereto for the School District of Colombo, Western Province:

Now know Ye, that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us by sub-section (2) of section 20 of the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby confirm the by-laws set forth in the said schedule.

And We do hereby proclaim and declare that they shall come into operation from the date hereof.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventeenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Ten.

## SCHEDULE.

*By-laws made under Sections 19 and 20 of "The Rural Schools Ordinance, 1907,"  
by the District Schools Committee for the Area described  
in the Schedule hereto.*

## 1. In these by-laws—

The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" mean a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in the schedule hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has actual custody of the child.

The term "Code" means the Code for Aided Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "school" means a school specified in the schedule hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning defined in section 20 (1) (b) of "The Rural Schools Ordinance, 1907."

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor.

2. *Children to attend school.*—The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, and the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, or in the case of Mohammadan and Tamil girls, the parent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend one of the schools specified in the schedule hereto, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that no girl shall be required to attend school unless there is a separate school for girls within two miles of her residence.

3. *Time of attendance.*—The time during which every boy or girl shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age.

4. *Religion.*—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 21 (d) of "The Rural Schools Ordinance, 1907."

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which its parent belongs.

5. And provided always that when a boy between 10 and 12 years of age, being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Village School Committee, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic, the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he shall not be required to attend school. And provided that when a girl over 10 years of age is beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Village School Committee, she shall not be required to attend school.

6. Every parent who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 5 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

NOTE.—The following are the portions of the Rural Schools Ordinance referred to in sections 1 and 4 of these by-laws:—

*Section 20 (1) (b).*—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child, if he proves that his child is in regular attendance at a school registered by the Director of Public Instruction for the receipt of a grant in aid, or at a school with regard to which an application for a grant in aid is under consideration, or at a school certified by the Director of Public Instruction to provide adequate and suitable instruction; or if he proves that he has made such other provision for his child's education as the Director of Public Instruction shall certify to be adequate and suitable, or if he produces a certificate from the Director of Public Instruction recommending that the child shall be exempted from compulsory attendance. Provided that no parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend such school, if he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he has reasonable excuse for not causing such child to attend. A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school, if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

*Section 21.*—No school in which religious instruction is given shall be considered a public vernacular school, unless the District Schools Committee is satisfied—

(a) That religious instruction is given only during the times specified in the school time table;

- (b) That religious instruction is not given to pupils of other denominations than that to which the school belongs if the parents object ;
- (c) That pupils who do not attend religious instruction are employed in other studies during the hours allotted to religious instruction ;
- (d) That such pupils, if their parents object to their being present in the room where religious instruction is given, are either allowed to study in some other part of the school premises during the hours when such instruction is given, or their presence in the school during such hours is excused ; and
- (e) That a copy of this section in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages is conspicuously posted up in the school.

The above by-laws were made by the Colombo District Schools Committee at a meeting held on November 30, 1908.

### SCHEDULE.

#### CHAPTER XX.

##### *Bakeries and Eating Houses.*

297. (1) *License.*—No place shall be used as a bakery without an annual license from the Chairman.

(2) *Water connections.*—The person applying for an annual license shall before so doing cause or procure to be laid into the premises a water connection from the water main, and shall cause such connection and all fittings thereof to be kept in proper order and efficient action so as to provide for use on the premises a sufficient supply of water for the purpose of thoroughly washing and cleansing such premises.

298. (1) *Walls to be plastered, floor cemented, and drainage provided.*—Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof impervious, plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed, the floor cemented, and drainage sufficiently provided. A ceiling shall be provided over the table on which the flour is kneaded.

(2) *No bakery to be within thirty feet of a cesspit or latrine.*—No part of a bakery shall be within thirty feet of any cesspit or latrine, nor in a position where bad odours wafted therefrom shall reach it.

299. *No bakery to be used for other purposes.*—No place used as a bakery shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever, or shall have internal communication with any part of a dwelling-house.

300. *Utensils to be kept clean.*—All utensils and other furniture shall be kept clean.

301. *Materials used to be wholesome.*—The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome. There shall be a separate storeroom for flour, and no flour shall be left lying on the floor in any part of the bakery.

302. (1) *Removal of refuse and flushing of drains.*—All refuse and dirt in and about the premises shall be swept off, and the drains well flushed, and the premises at all times maintained in a clean and tidy condition.

(2) *Persons suffering from contagious disease not to be employed.*—No person suffering from a contagious or loathsome disease, or who has recently been in attendance on such person, or who is unwashed or otherwise unclean, shall be employed in a bakery.

(3) *Kneaders to wear aprons.*—All kneaders of flour shall wear large clean aprons.

(4) *Precautions to protect bread, &c., from flies and dust.*—All reasonable precautions shall be taken to protect cakes, bread, and flour from flies and dust.

(5) *Definition of bakery.*—A bakery includes any building or part of a building used for any process connected with the baking of bread for sale.

(6) *Transport of bread.*—No person shall transport bread from any one place to any other place, except in a closed vehicle or a closed basket, tin, or other suitable receptacle. Every such vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle shall at all times be kept thoroughly clean and wholesome, and no person shall commit any act which may tend to render any bread which is being transported dirty or unwholesome.

303. (1) *Eating-houses.*—No person shall, after the passing of these by-laws, keep or manage an eating-house without giving information of that fact to the Chairman within seven days of his commencing to keep or manage such eating-house, and in the case of eating-houses already existing at the time these by-laws come into operation within thirty days of the coming into operation of these by-laws. Any person who shall appear, act, or behave as the person in charge of an eating-house shall be deemed and taken to be the keeper or manager thereof.

(2) The provisions of by-laws 298, 300, 302 (1), and 302 (2) shall apply to eating-houses. An eating-house includes any house or place where cooked rice is kept for sale, other than a house for which a license has been obtained under "The Licensing Ordinance, 1891."

304. *Bakery to be subject to examination.*—Every bakery and the management and the conduct of the business shall be always open and subject to examination by the Chairman of the Municipal Council, the Health Officer, and all persons acting under the authority of the said Chairman.

## "THE MUNICIPAL COUNCILS' ORDINANCE, 1887."

## SCHEDULE.

## CHAPTER XI.

*By-law No. 129.*—By substituting the following by-law for the by-law as published :—

129. The owner or tenant of every stable, cattle stall, cattle halting place, or gala shall have the same covered with a tiled roof and paved with brick, stone, concrete, cement, or asphalt, and provided with suitable paved or cemented drains for conveying the urine and washings into a covered receptacle constructed in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, the contents of which shall be daily removed at the expense of such owner or tenant and disposed of so that no nuisance is caused thereby. Every such stable, cattle stall, halting place, or gala shall be daily washed, and always kept clean, and whitewashed at least once in three months.

By adding the following by-law after by-law No. 129 :—

129 A. The owner or occupier of any of the following places, viz., any livery or hack stable, horse lines, veterinary infirmary, cart stand, gala, cattle shed, or yard in which ten or more sheep or goats or five or more cattle are kept, shall once at least every day remove or cause to be removed all dung, manure, filth, urine, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon the said premises, and shall cause the same to be deposited in such places as the Chairman shall from time to time direct. All such dung, manure, filth, urine, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon such premises will be removed by the Municipal Council on application to the Chairman at such rates as may from time to time be fixed by him.

## CHAPTER XIII.

*By-law No. 207.*—By substituting the following by-law for by-law as published :—

207. *Householders to deposit rubbish in proper receptacles.*—Any person who is desirous that ashes, sweepings, refuse, or other rubbish (other than refuse from premises where any trade is carried on) from his premises shall be removed by the scavengers of the Council, shall deposit the same in covered tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles of such shape and size as shall be approved in writing by the Chairman, on the curb stones or edge of footpaths outside his premises at such hours daily as the Chairman shall from time to time appoint by notice duly given; and shall remove the said tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles within half an hour after the emptying of such tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles by the scavengers. No person shall place any ashes, sweepings, refuse, or other rubbish on any street, except in covered tubs, boxes, or other receptacles as aforesaid, or except at such hours as aforesaid.

By adding the following by-law after by-law No. 207 :—

207 A. *Removal of trade refuse.*—Refuse from premises where any trade is carried on will be removed by the Municipal Council on application to the Chairman at such rates as may from time to time be fixed by him.

By adding the following by-laws after by-law No. 209 :—

209 A. *Persons not to pluck plants or flowers in any public or recreation ground.*—No person using any public or recreation ground belonging to or in charge of the Municipal Council shall commit any nuisance therein, or pluck plants or flowers without the leave of the Chairman, or do any injury to the trees and shrubs in the ground.

209 B. *Picketing animals, &c., forbidden.*—No person shall picket animals or collect carts or form an encampment upon any public ground within the Municipality or on any ground or place belonging to or in charge of the Municipal Council without the written permission of the Chairman.

By adding the following by-law after by-law No. 213 :—

213 A. *Owner or occupier to repair, cut, or trim fences to a certain height.*—The Chairman may require the owner of any land or premises to surround such land or premises with boundary walls or good fences wherever they do not already exist, and where such walls or fences do exist the Chairman may require the owner, lessee, or occupier of such land or premises to put them into a state of proper repair, or to cut and trim the fences, or lower the boundary walls, so that they may

not exceed such height from the base of the adjoining roadway as the Chairman may from time to time determine, or to cut and trim all trees which by overhanging any street are likely in the Chairman's opinion to obstruct or cause damage thereto. Written notice of any requirement under this by-law shall be served on the owner, lessee, or occupier, as the case may be, or posted to his address; and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall comply with the terms of the notice within such time as is mentioned therein, or such extension of it as the Chairman may allow.

By adding the following by-law after by-law 220 :—

220 A. *Hanging mats, &c.*—No person shall hang up or otherwise expose any mats, cloths, or other materials or substances on or at the side of any street.

By adding the following by-laws after by-law No. 221 A :—

221 B. *Public seats not to be misused or used by infected persons.*—No person shall lie down on or put either of his feet on any seat provided by the Municipal Council in any public place or recreation ground.

221 C. No person suffering from any loathsome, infectious, or contagious disease shall sit on or make use of any seat provided by the Municipal Council in any public place or recreation ground.

221 D. *Dirt, rubbish, &c., not to be thrown into the lake.*—No person shall throw, cause, or suffer to be thrown any dirt, rubbish, filth, or other noisome or offensive matter or thing into the Kandy lake, or into any stream or waterway leading into the lake.

221 E. *Sand, &c., not to be removed from the lake.*—No person shall remove sand from the Kandy lake without the written permission of the Chairman, or do any act that is likely to cause damage to the bund of the lake.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power vested in him by section 24 (1) of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887 (as amended by Ordinance No. 8 of 1901), and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the following by-laws made by the Municipal Council of Galle, and to add the same to the by-laws published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903. The said by-laws to be known as rules 1 to 6, chapter XXI. A.

BY-LAWS.

HUGH CLIFFORD,  
Colonial Secretary.

1. *Adulterated milk.*—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, hawk about, or expose for sale any cow's milk or buffalo's milk which has been adulterated with water or any foreign substance whatever.

2. *Sale and inspection of milk, &c.*—No person shall sell or offer for sale any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless he previously informs the person to whom he sells or offers it that the cream has been removed.

3. The Medical Officer of Health or Assistant Medical Officer of Health or Veterinary Surgeon or any Municipal Inspector may at any time demand and take for the purpose of analysis samples of any milk which is in possession of a registered dairyman or any person who is found selling, hawking, or exposing milk for sale, and any registered dairyman or other person who refuses to permit samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.

4. In taking samples of milk the Medical Officer of Health or Assistant Medical Officer of Health or Veterinary Surgeon or Municipal Inspector shall take three samples and shall at once seal them in presence of the registered dairyman or other person from whom they are taken, and shall deliver one to such registered dairyman or other person, send the second to a qualified analyst, and the third to the Government Analyst. A certificate signed by such qualified analyst, if it states that the sample is adulterated, shall be evidence that the milk from which the sample was taken was adulterated. Should any evidence to the contrary be offered, a similar certificate from the Government Analyst shall be conclusive on the question of adulteration.

5. Printed and numbered cards, in such form as the Chairman shall from time to time direct, and signed by the Secretary, shall be issued annually to every registered dairyman on his application. No person shall sell, hawk, or expose milk for sale, unless he has in his possession a card issued for the current year to a registered dairyman, and unless such dairyman's name is still on the register at the time of the sale, hawking, or exposing of the milk for sale. Should such person fail to produce on demand by any Municipal or Police Officer such a card for inspection, he shall be guilty of an offence, and such officer may at once arrest him, and shall convey him forthwith after arrest to the nearest Police Station, and the officer in charge of such Police Station shall deal with him as if he had been arrested by a police officer without a warrant under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code.

6. Should any samples of milk taken under the provision of the preceding by-laws prove to be adulterated, the person in whose possession they were found shall be guilty of an offence, or if such person produce at the time the samples were taken a card such as is described in the preceding by-law, and the name of the registered dairyman to whom such card was issued is still on the register, then such registered dairyman shall be guilty of an offence.

THE following rules made by the District Committee, Hambantota, under section 12 of "The Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, 1905," have been approved by the Governor and the Executive Council, and are published for general information.

*Rules framed by the District Committee, Hambantota, under Section 12 of the Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, No. 8 of 1905.*

1. Three members of the District Committee shall form a quorum.
2. In the absence of the President at any meeting, one of the members present shall be elected as President for the occasion.
3. The Committee shall appoint one of their members as Honorary Secretary for the working of the Ordinance, and shall employ as many clerks and messengers as may be found necessary.
4. The Honorary Secretary shall enter in a book the business to be placed before each meeting, and shall record in another book the minutes of the proceedings of each meeting, and the minutes shall be read and confirmed from time to time at every subsequent meeting, the President signing such confirmation.
5. The meetings of the Committee shall be held at the Gansabhawa building in Ranne on the first Sunday of the months of January, March, June, September, and December of each year, proceedings being recorded in English. The Committee shall, however, meet at any other time or place in the district upon three days' notice in writing being given to the members of the time and place chosen by the President.
6. The President shall have the power to convene a special meeting of the Committee at any time by giving the other members not less than forty-eight hours' notice thereof in writing, and it shall be his duty to convene such meeting if and whenever any two or more members by application in writing request him to convene such a meeting.
7. The President shall likewise convene from time to time a meeting of the Committee for the election of a trustee or trustees for each temple or vihare under section 17 of the Ordinance. The President shall preside at such meeting, but in his absence or in the event of his being a candidate, a President shall be chosen by the electors present. All candidates appointed at such elections shall hold certificates of recognition under the hand of the President, and such certificates shall be the only proof of appointment.
8. A candidate for a trusteeship shall possess all the qualifications described in section 8 of the Ordinance, and the fact of such qualifications shall be verified by an affidavit affirmed to by him.
9. If any trustee of a temple to whom due notice in writing with a certified copy of the charge or charges preferred against him has been given, fail, without showing sufficient cause, to answer such charge or charges, the inquiry shall be proceeded with in his absence. Any such trustee feeling aggrieved by such *ex parte* decision shall be entitled to ask for a re-hearing; provided he shall show sufficient cause for his default of appearance at the inquiry.
10. At the end of each financial year the trustees shall deposit in a bank to be selected by the Committee all surplus funds which they may have in their hands, and shall under the directions of the Committee draw therefrom all such sums as may be actually required for the use and benefit of the different temples.
11. All moneys, whether small or large, received by trustees which come within the meaning of the terms "offerings," "rents," "issues," and "profits" in section 21 of the Ordinance shall be faithfully and correctly accounted for by every trustee, and it shall be the duty of every trustee to keep a receipt book in duplicate (in a form to be issued by the Committee), and to enter therein receipts for all sums and other things received by them as rents and issues. A copy of such receipt shall be issued to the person from whom such rents and issues have been received, and the counterfoil thereof shall be retained as a voucher and produced when accounts are rendered.
12. No person whatever shall on any pretext whatever sell or otherwise dispose of any movable property of any temple without first obtaining the sanction in writing of the Committee, and in case of such sanction being obtained, the sale shall be by public auction.
13. Every trustee shall within three months of his appointment furnish full and correct list of lands belonging to the different temples which were sold, mortgaged, or otherwise alienated before the passing of the Ordinance.
14. No person whatever shall grant any lease of temple land without the sanction in writing of the Committee, and every trustee who with the permission of the Committee grants a lease of land belonging to any temple, shall forward a copy of such lease to the Committee to be filed in their office.

15. The Committee shall have the power whenever they deem it necessary or expedient so to do to authorize one or more of their members or any person or persons to be deputed by them to inspect and report upon the condition and management of any temple and the lands belonging thereto sought to be leased, and the expenses of such inspection shall be paid out of the funds of the particular temple concerned.

16. The Committee shall have power to inspect and examine all the books and movable property and moneys of any temple and the accounts and papers of any trustee by deputing one or more of their members for the purpose at any time and as often as the Committee deems such inspection necessary.

17. All repairs to temples and all improvements thereto shall be effected by the trustees themselves or by giving the same on contract with the approval and direction of the Committee.

18. Money and all other offerings made to any temple shall be verified by the President or a member of the District Committee duly authorized by the District Committee.

19. In the event of the property of a temple or vihare being given in charge of the trustee thereof, it shall be the duty of the member of the district to give charge of the same in the presence of two witnesses and the incumbent of the temple. The member shall be bound to fill up three forms (Form A hereto annexed), one of which shall be delivered to the incumbent of the temple, one to the trustee, and the other to the Committee; and it shall be the duty of the trustee to deliver to the incumbent such property as may be required by him for the use of the temple and obtain two receipts from him, one of which shall be retained by the trustee and the other shall be forwarded by him to the Committee.

20. In the event of the property of a dewale being given in charge of the trustee thereof, it shall be the duty of the members of the district to give charge of the same in the presence of two witnesses. The member shall be bound to fill up two forms (Form A hereto annexed), one of which shall be delivered to the trustee and the other shall be forwarded to the Committee.

21. It shall be the duty of the trustee on or before October 31 in each year to prepare and transmit to the District Committee a statement showing the nature and amount of the probable receipts and the particulars of the proposed disbursements for the next ensuing year.

22. It shall be lawful for the District Committee to revise such statement, and such statement after being revised and passed shall be returned to the trustee, who shall on no account exceed any item of expenditure specified in such statement without the previous sanction in writing of the District Committee.

23. Every temple shall contribute an amount proportionate to its income for defraying the expenses already incurred or to be incurred by the Committee in carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance.

24. The President shall on or before June 30 in each year prepare and submit to the Committee—

(a) Estimates showing the probable receipts of each temple within his jurisdiction.

(b) Estimates of proposed disbursements for the next ensuing year.

25. The Committee shall carefully revise the estimate laid before them by the President, and shall assess and determine the amounts which each temple shall contribute.

26. The President shall deposit in a bank selected by the Committee all contributions from temples, and shall make disbursements under the directions of the Committee by cheques to be drawn by the President and a member of the Committee authorized to draw such cheques. At every monthly meeting of the Committee the President shall submit a statement of receipts and expenditure, and produce his bank books and cheque book for inspection.

27. In the event of any incumbency becoming vacant, the President shall convene a meeting of the *Sangha Sabhawa* by giving not less than fourteen days' notice in writing to its members with a view to appointing a suitable person.

28. The members of the District Committee proceeding on inspection duty and to attend meetings to a distance exceeding four miles shall receive a mileage of 37½ cents per mile going and coming, and if detained a night or more, an allowance of Rs. 3 per night as subsistence allowance.

29. The President be allowed a sum of Rs. 25 per annum to incur expenses on the purchase of stationery.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 19, 1910.

**Births.**—The total births registered were 90 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 44 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 12 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 25.3, as against 25.8 in the preceding week, 25.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 119 (3 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 23 Moors, 1 Malay, and 6 Others), including the death of a town resident who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.4, as against 30.3 in the previous week, 40.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 119 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year and 27 the average for last year.

*Still Births.*—The number of still births registered during the week was 4.

*Selected Causes of Death.*—Sixteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* as in the previous week (against 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana hospitals, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya.

2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 10 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. Two deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Twelve deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Diarrhœa* (including 2 infants), 7 *Debility* (4 infants), 6 *Old Age*, 5 *Enteritis* (1 infant), 4 *Tetanus* (2 infants), 4 *Dochmias Duodenalis*, 3 *Dysentery*, and 33 from *Other Causes*.

4. Six deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 2 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana Hospitals, and one each in Pettah, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 14 cases reported during the week, against 15 in the previous week.

5. One death was registered from *Measles*, of a Malay in New Bazaar. Three cases of *Measles* were reported, against 7 in the previous week; and 24 of *Chickenpox*, against 47 in the previous week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 79·3°, against 78·3° in the preceding week and 80·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·893 in., against 29·933 in. in the preceding week and 29·966 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·12 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0·26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
